METSCELLANEOUS: New York has lost five of its last six games... The Mets are 3-7 in their last 10 games...New York is 20-43 in its last 63 games...The Mets fell to 6-6 in extra-inning games (3-3 at home) with yesterday's 5-4 loss to Atlanta.

AT HOME: New York is 8-10 in its last 18 home games and 10-25 in their last 35 home games...Overall, the Mets are 22-36 at home this year, the second-worst winning percentage (.379) in the National League, behind San Diego (.357).

VS. CINCINNATI: The Mets are 19-5 in their last 24 games vs. Cincinnati dating to September 7, 2014...New York has outscored the Reds, 122-83 during that span...New York has won nine of their last 10 home games vs. Cincinnati, including a franchise record nine straight, June 26, 2015-September 9, 2017.

WELCOME BACK: Reds pitcher Matt Harvey returns to Citi Field for the first time as a visitor...The Mets will show a tribute video at 7 p.m. on CitiVision...Harvey went 34-37 with a 3.66 ERA from 2012-until he was traded to Cincinnati on May 8 earlier this year for catcher Devin Mesoraco...Harvey started the 2013 All-Star Game at Citi Field...He was named MLB's Comeback Player of the Year in 2015...Harvey went 2-0 with a 3.04 ERA (nine earned runs/26.2 innings) during the 2015 postseason to help the Mets reach the World Series.

DEVIN MESORACO: Hit a game-tying solo homer in the ninth inning yesterday vs. Atlanta...It was his fourth ninth-inning home run since joining the Mets...His four ninth-inning blasts are tied for the most in the NL this season (trails only the Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton, five)...Mesoraco has 13 career home runs in the ninth inning, his most in any single frame...Seven of his eight home runs with the Mets have come in the eighth inning or later... The seven such homers are tied for fifth-most in the majors... Mesoraco spent from 2011 until the trade with the Reds.

JEFF McNEIL: Is five-for-his-last-eight (.625) with two doubles and one RBI...McNeil is hitting .310 (9-29) with a .429 on-base percentage and a .483 slugging percentage in his first 11 major league games...At the time of his promotion, his 1.028 OPS was the fifth-highest among all full-season minor league players while his .617 slugging percentage was third-best among full-season minor leaguers...His 71 RBI were the 15th-most in the minors.

AUSTIN JACKSON: Has gone 8-22 (.364) with two homers and four RBI since joining the Mets with a .440 OBP and a .636 slugging percentage (eight games).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored...His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo is 13th in the NL with a .375 on-base percentage and tied for seventh in the majors with six triples...Nimmo has a career-high 14 homers, but just two in his last 39 games.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



NOAH NOTES: Noah Syndergaard is 3-0 with 1.98 ERA (six earned runs/27.1 innings) with 32 strikeouts and four walks in four starts vs. Cincinnati...The Mets are 4-0 in those games... Syndergaard owns a 2.09 career ERA (27 earned runs/116.1 innings) in 18 starts vs. the NL Central...That is the lowest ERA against the division since its inception in 1994 (min. 15 starts)... Syndergaard has not allowed more than three runs in each of his last 13 starts since surrendering four runs in his Opening Day start.

SYN-SENTIONAL: Syndergaard's 2.98 ERA ranks ninth in the NL and his 0.66 homer per nine innings is seventh (min. 80 innings)... Among active pitchers with at least 70 starts, Syndergaard's 2.91 ERA (144 earned runs/445.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 career ERA, Jacob deGrom's 2.78 career ERA and Chris Sale's 2.89 ERA.

BOBBY WAHL: Has tossed 11 scoreless innings in two appearances with the Mets...Wahl was acquired from Oakland on July 21 as part of the Jeury's Familia trade...He had 73 strikeouts in 45.0 minor league innings and 292 strikeouts in 221.2 career minor league innings.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 17-for-54 (.315) with three homers, four doubles and nine RBI, a .377 OBP and a .556 slugging percentage in 15 games since the All-Star break...Conforto is hitting .303 (20-66) with four home runs, four doubles, 12 RBI, 13 runs scored and a .390 OBP over his last 19 games (July 12)... Conforto has a 14.3 percent walk-rate, the 14th-best in the majors

AMED ROSARIO: Is the first Mets player to swipe 10 or more bags in his age-22 season or younger since Carlos Gomez stole 12 bases as a 21-year-old in 2007...He is the ninth Met overall with a double-digit stolen base output before his age-23 season... Rosario is tied for second in the NL with four stolen bases since the All-Star break...Rosario has been successful in nine of his last 11 stolen base attempts...Overall, is tied for seventh in the majors with six triples.

WALKING ROSARIO: Amed Rosario has walked 19 times in his last 29 games, including twice yesterday, after walking eight times in his first 57 games this year.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Wilmer Flores celebrates his 27th birthday today.

LAST TIME OUT: Had his four-game winning streak halted in a defeat at Washington on August 1...Threw 7.0 innings for the first time since May 20 vs. Arizona and allowed three runs, earned, on six hits with four strikeouts and one walk...Has fanned fewer than five batters in three-consecutive starts for the first time in his career (excluding outings of 2.0 innings or fewer last season after returning from a partial tear in his right lat).

SYN VS. CIN: The Mets are 4-0 in his starts against the Reds...Syndergaard himself is 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA (six earned runs/27.1 innings) in those games with 32 strikeouts and four walks...All four of those walks came in his most recent outing against the club on September 7, 2016...His three wins against the Reds are tied for his most against any non-divisional opponent.

SYN-CITI: Syndergaard tonight makes his ninth home start of the season...Has won each of his last three home starts and is 4-1 with a 3.05 ERA (15 earned runs/44.1 innings) overall in eight starts at Citi Field this season with 53 punchouts and 13 walks...The Mets are 6-2 in those eight starts...Has yielded three or fewer earned runs in 27 of his last 30 home starts...Owns a 2.66 ERA (73 earned runs/246.2 innings) in 41 games (40 starts) at Citi Field, the second-lowest ERA among all pitchers with at least 120.0 innings pitched at the ballpark, trailing only staffmate Jacob deGrom and his 2.21 ERA at home.

GRAND CENTRAL: Syndergaard owns a 2.09 career ERA (27 earned runs/116.1 innings) in 18 starts vs. the NL Central...That is the lowest ERA against the division since its inception in 1994 (min. 15 starts)...Has held his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in 14 of his 18 starts against the division (allowed one or no earned runs 10 times)...Has five double-digit strikeout games against NL Central squads, including two this year (March 29 vs. St. Louis and April 15 vs. Milwaukee).

HE'S AN AVENGER: The Mets 16-6 in their last 22 games when Syndergaard starts after a team loss (.727 win percentage)...In those 22 starts, Syndergaard is 10-4 with a 2.46 ERA (37 earned runs/135.1 innings) and 152 strikeouts.

RECENT SYNDERGAARD: Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 13 starts since surrendering four runs in his Opening Day win and has pitched at least 5.0 innings in his last 12 outings...Jacob deGrom (14) is the only pitcher in the majors with a longer active streak of starts of at least 5.0 innings with no more than three runs allowed...Is 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (21 earned runs/71.2 innings) in his last 12 starts.

IN ELITE COMPANY: Syndergaard is one of only four active major league hurlers with at least 70 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...His 2.91 career ERA (144 earned runs/445.2 innings)...Trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 career ERA, staffmate Jacob deGrom's 2.78 career ERA and Chris Sale's 2.89 ERA...Ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.43 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.58) and Max Scherzer (5.67)...Is the only pitcher in modern MLB history (since 1900) to have a SO/BB ratio of 5.0 or greater in each of his first three seasons.

CONTACT: Syndergaard induces soft contact an NL-leading 26.4 percent of the time (second in the majors behind Chris Sale, min. 80.0 innings)...Only 22.6 percent of balls in play against Syndergaard are of the hard-hit variety, the lowest percentage in the majors by over two percentage points (min. 80.0 innings).

REACHED A MILESTONE: On July 20 at the Yankees, Syndergaard fanned his 500th career batter...Became the fastest Mets pitcher to 500 strikeouts (by innings pitched) by reaching the mark in 437.1 innings...Passed Dwight Gooden, who fanned his first 500 batters in 445.1 innings...He is one of six Mets pitchers to have reached the mark before their 26th birthday (Syndergaard turns 26 on August 29), the others are: Dwight Gooden (1,391 strikeouts before turning 26), Tom Seaver (866), Sid Fernandez (765) Jon Matlack (747) and Gary Gentry (563).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JASON VARGAS (2-7, 8.23)

PREVIOUS START: Took the loss in the Mets' 4-2 defeat vs. the Braves on August 2 at Citi Field...Surrendered four runs, earned, on six hits with a season-high-tying seven punchouts and three walks...Was his fifth time this season completing 5.0 innings in a start.

VS. CINCINNATI: Vargas has never made a home start vs. the Reds in his 13 seasons in the majors, with all three of his previous outings against the club coming at Great American Ball Park...Faced the Reds twice in two seasons from 2005-2006...Started vs. the Reds again on May 8 of this season after a 12-year hiatus between starts against the club.

- Clubbed his fourth career walk-off homer to lift the Mets to a 4-3 win in Game 1 of a doubleheader on July 9 vs. the Phillies...Was his 10th career walk-off RBI, most in Mets history...His four career walk-off homers are tied for the most in Mets history with Cleon Jones, Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds and Mike Piazza.
- His 10 walk-off RBI are most in the majors since 2014...According to Elias, Flores' franchise-leading 10 walk-off RBI are second-most among active players who lead their franchise in walk-off RBI and still play for that team...Ryan Zimmerman holds the Nationals/Expos record with 16 walk-off RBI.
- Dating to the beginning of last season, 19 of Flores' 27 home runs have come off righthanders.
