**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the third contest (1-1) of an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (May 10-13; 1-1), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20)...LAA is 7-3 this month to move into a first place tie with Astros in A.L. West (after 38 games in 2017, LAA trailed Houston by eight games)... Halos are 10-12 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA holds an MLB-best 14-4 road record, best 18-game away start season in club history... Halos are 8-3-1 in 12 series completed... Next road trip is an 11-day, 10-game swing to **Toronto** (May 22-24), **New York Yankees** (May 25-27) and **Detroit** (May 28-31).

**TWO LATE:** Two of Angels' last four home losses have come with a lead heading into the 9th frame (also April 27<sup>th</sup> vs. NYY).

**HERE'S WHAT'S LEFT:** Tyler Skaggs' seven starts with two-or-fewer runs are tied with **Blake Snell** for most among 2018 **left-handers**... **Justin Upton** hit his 10<sup>th</sup> HR last night – first Angel **left fielder** with 10+ HRs since **Josh Hamilton** (21) in 2013.

**PLAYER POINTS:** **Martin Maldonado** is hitting .545 (12/22) this month after a .156 clip in March/April... Has collected three 3-hit games his last six games and already has five 3-hit games in 2018 - **first Angels catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009**... **Shohei Ohtani** has a hit in 15 of 17 of his starts at DH and is batting .471 (8 for 17) in his last six contests... His five home runs are tied for A.L. lead among rookies (**Tyler Austin**).

**START ME UP:** LAA starting pitchers have gone 5+ innings of no-run baseball in six of last 10 games... Halo starters have fashioned 2.14 ERA this month (see below).

**MOVIN' ON UPTON:** **Justin Upton** has homered in a career-best four straight games and in five of his last six games... Angels' club record is five consecutive games done once – **Bobby Bonds** from August 2-7, 1977... Has six home runs in his last nine games and five home runs in his last six games... Is hitting .351 (13/37) with six home runs and 14 RBI over his last nine games.

**SIMBA SIZZLIN':** **Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games and has reached base safely in 18 straight contests... Has reached base safely in 34-of-last-71 PA (.479 OBP)... Hitting .429 (24/56) with nine extra-base hits (6 2B, 2 HR, 1 3B) and 15 RBI his last 14 games... His .351 clip this season ranks second in A.L.

**CLOSE TO COBB:** **Albert Pujols** enters tonight's game with 1,939 career RBI to rank ninth all-time... Next up on the all-time list is **Ty Cobb** with 1,944 RBI (source Baseball Reference).

**MORE ON ALBERT:** **Pujols** connected for his 628<sup>th</sup> career two-bagger Thursday (11<sup>th</sup> all-time) to move within four of Top 10 all-time (**David Ortiz**, 632).

**WALK IN THE PARK:** **Mike Trout** has 17 BBs across his last 18 games... With his 600<sup>th</sup> career free pass May 8, became the 5<sup>th</sup> player with 600 walks/200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining **Mickey Mantle, Eddie Mathews, Mel Ott & Jimmie Foxx**.

**3,000!!!** With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32<sup>nd</sup> player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Has matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).

**TWO-WAY SHOHEI:** **Ohtani** is just the fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971... Tied club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)... **Named A.L. Rookie of the Month for April**... As a DH, batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS... In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign - Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP NICK TROPEANO**

**1-2, 3.42 ERA**

*Holding right-handers to a .159 (7/44) batting average this season*

- **WELCOME BACK:** Making fifth start of the season for Angels and third at home...Reinstated from disabled list prior to tonight's game (missed nine games on disabled list with right shoulder inflammation); did not make a rehab appearance in minor leagues.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on May 1 vs. Baltimore...Tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit and two walks with five strikeouts...Only hit allowed was two-out double by **Manny Machado** in 1<sup>st</sup> inning.
- **AT HIS BEST vs. THE WEST:** Against A.L. West foes, is 6-3 with a 3.53 ERA (74 IP – 29 ER)...Against all other teams, is 2-6 with a 3.96 ERA (77.1 IP – 34 ER).
- **RISP-Y BUSINESS:** Since 2016, has held opponents to a .145 (9/62) batting average with runners in scoring position...Opponents are also 3-for-40 (.075) with two outs and runners in scoring position against him since 2015.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Is 5-4 with a 3.00 ERA (96 IP – 32 ER) and 91 strikeouts in his career in the first half of the season compared with a 3-5 record and 5.04 ERA (55.1 IP – 31 ER) after the All-Star Break.
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** In two career games (one start) against the Twins, is 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2 IP – 1 ER)...Did not factor in decision in only start vs. Minnesota on April 17, 2016 at Target Field after pitching 5.2 innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts...Made only relief appearance of Major League career on Sept. 20, 2015 at Minnesota and worked one scoreless inning.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 13 career games at Angel Stadium, is 3-4 with a 4.57 ERA (69 IP – 35 ER)...In two starts at home this season, is 0-1 with a 3.86 (11.2 IP – 5 ER)...Seeking first winning decision at Angel Stadium since May 18, 2016...Set career-high with 11 strikeouts in final start of 2015 season on Sept. 29, 2015 vs. Oakland.
- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Made season debut with Angels on April 12 at Kansas City, marking first Major League appearance since July 18, 2016 (vs. Texas)...Was recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to the game.
- **THE INJURY:** Missed entire 2017 season recovering from Tommy John surgery, performed in August 2016.
- **WITH THE BEES:** Made one start for Triple-A Salt Lake on April 6 vs. Albuquerque and tossed 3.2 innings scoreless innings allowing three hits and three walks with seven strikeouts.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Appeared in three Cactus League games (two starts) for Angels this Spring, going 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA (8.2 IP – 3 ER) with 11 strikeouts and two walks...Also appeared in minor league games and intrasquad games...Worked 5.1 scoreless innings with nine strikeouts in final Spring start on March 18 at Surprise Stadium vs. Rangers.
- **HALOS STARTERS:** With first start on April 12, became eighth different starting pitcher used by Angels through the first 14 games of a season, which set a new franchise record...Halos have now used nine different starters this year.
- **WIN STREAK:** With winning decision in first start of year, extended his win streak to three games (dating back to May 18, 2016), which matched the longest win streak of his career.
- **CAREER NOTES:** In 29 career games (28 starts), is 8-9 with a 3.75 ERA (151.1 IP – 63 ER)...In 25 games (24 starts) for Angels, is 7-6 with a 3.61 ERA (129.2 IP – 52 ER)...Native of West Islip, NY...Originally drafted by Houston in fifth round of 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Stony Brook University...Acquired by Angels on Nov. 5, 2014 with C **Carlos Perez** in exchange for C **Hank Conger**.

**RHP SHOHEI OHTANI (3-1, 4.10 ERA)**

Making sixth start of the season as a pitcher and sixth at home...First career pitching appearance vs. Minnesota (in two games vs. Twins as a DH, batted .375 (3/8) with one double, one HR and two RBI...Earned the win in last start on May 6 at Seattle after tossing 6+ innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts; carried a shutout into the 7<sup>th</sup> inning before allowing a two-run home run to Ryon Healey...Has registered a quality start in three of five outings this season...His 32 strikeouts through his first five games as a pitcher are second most in Angels history (35 by Bo Belinsky).

- Earned second win of the season Thursday in first outing of the homestand.

- Has held lefties to a .182 (8/44) batting average this season.

**#38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)**

**AGE: 25**

- Charged with first career loss last night after allowing three earned runs in 1.1 IP.
- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings Wednesday at Colorado.
- Charged with first blown save last Saturday at Seattle after allowing all three batters faced to score...Yielded go-ahead HR to Mike Zunino in 8<sup>th</sup> inning.
- Opened career with 6.1 shutout frames across first six outings for Angels.
- Made Major League debut April 23 in hometown of Houston...Recorded first career strikeout vs. **Carlos Correa** with two on and two out in the 8<sup>th</sup> inning.
- In six total minor league games between Double-A Mobile and Triple-A Salt Lake, has worked 8.2 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts.
- Opened the year with Mobile and pitched in three games before being promoted to Salt Lake on April 14.
- Originally drafted by Angels in 14<sup>th</sup> round of 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Houston, TX...Attended St. Piux X HS (Houston, TX) and University of Texas San Antonio.

**#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP)****AGE: 26**

- Has not been charged with a run in nine of last 10 appearances.
- Pitched one scoreless inning across two outings on last road trip.
- Credited with win on May 1 vs. BAL, but had second blown save of year after allowing two runs in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning...Fourth career blown save in 9<sup>th</sup> inning or later.
