Defense

SS Dansby Swanson has 12 defensive runs saved this season, tied for the fifth most by any major league player this season.

He is tied for first among shortstops with San Diego's Freddy Galvis, and is one ahead of Los Angeles' Andrelton Simmons and Chicago's Addison Russell.

The club has made just one error in their last six games and none in their last three. For the season, the Braves have made 40 total errors, the fifth fewest in the majors and the fourth fewest in the N.L.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Blue Jays open a two-game set tonight with the third meeting between the clubs this season...The teams split a two-game series in Toronto, June 19-20.

A Over the last two seasons, the Braves have won four of six games with Toronto...Over their last 16 home games against the Blue Jays, Atlanta is 11-5.

A RHP Julio Teheran is 0-1 with a 10.00 ERA (20 ER/18.0 IP) in four career appearances against Toronto...Lost, 9-0, to tonight's opposing starter, Marcus Stroman on May 18 of last season...Teheran allowed a career-most nine runs, earned, and surrendered a solo homer to Stroman in that start.

A RHP Marcus Stroman is set for his second career appearance against Atlanta...The righty beat Atlanta and tonight's opposing starter, Julio Teheran, last season, 9-0...He tossed 5.2 scoreless innings while hitting his only career home run, a solo shot off Teheran as part of consecutive home runs with Luke Maile.

ALL-STARS: The Braves had four players named to the All-Star team, with 1B Freddie Freeman and OF Nick Markakis voted to start...RHP Mike Foltynewicz and 2B Ozzie Albies were selected as reserves.

A Freeman is set to be the first Braves first baseman to start since Andres Galaragga in 2000...Only three other Braves first baseman have started the game: Fred McGriff (1995, 1996), Hank Aaron (1973) and Joe Adcock (1960).

A Markakis, who has played in 1,928 career games, was named to his first All-Star team this season...No other player in MLB history has played more games prior to their first All-Star game...Ron Fairly held the previous record, playing in 1,866 games before being selected to the 1973 N.L. squad.

A The Braves have four All-Stars for the first time since 2012 (3B Chipper Jones, RHP Craig Kimbrel, 2B Dan Uggla, OF Michael Bourn)...The last time the Braves had at least two starters in the game was 2003, when Javy Lopez and Gary Sheffield started a 7-6 loss at U.S. Cellular Field.

INTERLEAGUE: The Braves will play all of their three remaining Interleague series in Atlanta, starting with these two games against Toronto...Tampa Bay will visit for a two-game series, August 28-29, before Boston comes for a three-game set, September 3-5.

A The Braves are 6-7 (.462) against the American League this season, including 1-2 in Atlanta...They dropped two-of-three to Baltimore, June 22-June 24, on their last homestand.

REACHING BASE: 1B Freddie Freeman has reached four times in each of his last two games, going 3-for-4 with a walk in both contests...Freeman went 11-for-69 with 22 strikeouts and a .247 on-base percentage over his previous 17 games, dating to June 17.

A Freeman ranks second in the National League with a .406 on-base percentage.

HOME AGAIN: The Braves will play 12 of their next 17 games at SunTrust Park and 22 of their next 34...The Braves do not have any more scheduled three-city road trips this season.

A Atlanta is 23-17 (.575) at SunTrust Park this season, the fifth-best home record in the National League.

A The club has allowed 33 of their 93 home runs here, and the team's 0.78 HR/9 ratio at home is the second lowest in the majors...Only San Francisco has a better mark (0.64 at AT&T Park).

MINTER: Since the start of June, LHP A.J.Minter has compiled a 1.17 ERA (2 ER/15.1 IP) with six hits allowed, two walks and 20 strikeouts in 16 games.

A In his first 24 games of the season, Minter walked 13 on his way to a 3.74 ERA (9 ER/21.2 IP).

TWO-OUT RUNS: The Braves continue to lead the N.L. with 176 two-out runs, while their slash line of .270/.355/.445 in such situations leads the majors in all three categories.

A OF Nick Markakis (.351) and 1B Freddie Freeman (.341) are fourth and fifth in two-out batting average.

HOME RUNS: The Braves failed to homer in their four games against the Brewers last weekend, marking the first time in franchise history the club went an entire series in Milwaukee without going deep at least once.

A The Braves are 41-18 (.695) when they hit at least one home run this season, the seventh-best record in the majors.

A The club has gone homerless in 30 games this season, and has won nine of them.

BACK IN THE LINEUP: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. is back in the starting lineup tonight, hitting seventh and playing left field...Acuña Jr. left the game on July 6 with left groin tightness and only had one pinch-hit appearance on Sunday following his injury.

A The Braves are 22-15 (.595) with Acuña Jr. in the starting lineup, and since his debut on April 25 at Cincinnati, the rookie is tied for second on the team with five game-winning RBI.

DOUBLES: 2B Ozzie Albies has a N.L.-high 29 doubles this season and with one more will set the franchise record for most two-base hits prior to the All-Star break...Marcus Giles first set the mark in 2003.

Tonight's Game

- A* Set to make his 18th start of the season and the 180th (183rd appearance) of his career.
- A* Returned to Atlanta following his last start, 7/4 at NYY, with an illness...Was not with the club during its four-game series in Milwaukee.
- A* Faces Toronto for the fifth time in his career, his most such starts against an American League team...Is 0-1 with a 10.00 ERA (20 ER/18.0 IP) in his first four career turns.
- A* Made one start against the Blue Jays last season, 5/18 at SunTrust Park...Went just 3.0 innings and allowed eight hits and a career-high nine earned runs.
- A* Has allowed eight home runs in his 18.0 innings against Toronto (4 HR/9.0 IP).
- A* Makes his 23rd career Interleague start, and his 13th against a team from the A.L. East...Is 1-8 with an 8.07 ERA (55 ER/61.1 IP) in his career against the division, including a 1-5 stretch over his last six starts.
- A* Since Teheran first faced a team from the A.L. East in 2012, his 8.07 ERA against the division is second highest in the majors (min. 10 starts), while his .111 winning percentage (1-8) is tied for lowest.
- A* Atlanta has been outscored 88-42 in Teheran's starts against the A.L. East
- A* Holding right-handed batters to a career-low .184 (33-for-179) batting average, the sixth-lowest mark in the majors.
- A* Of the 33 hits he has allowed to opposing right-handers, 22 have gone for extra-bases (11 doubles, triple, 10 home runs)...Right-handed batters are slugging .425 against him.

2018 Recap

- A* Held St. Louis to just two hits over 6.0 scoreless innings, 6/29.
- A* Was his fifth scoreless start of the season of at least 6.0 innings and four or fewer hits, tied with teammate Sean Newcomb for the most such starts in the majors.
- A* Allowed a season-most seven runs, 6/23 vs. BAL...Surrendered a first-inning grand slam to Mark Trumbo, the fifth grand slam allowed by Teheran in his career...Five grand slams are third most among active pitchers since his debut in 2011.
- A* Held San Diego hitless over 6.0 innings, 6/17...Was the first hitless start of his career.
- A* Became the sixth Atlanta pitcher (eight times overall) to not allow a hit in a start of at least 6.0 innings and the first since RHP Aaron Harang went 7.0 innings on 4/18/14 at New York-NL.
- A* Fanned 11, becoming just the second Atlanta pitcher to strike out double digits in a no-hit outing...Kent Mercker fanned 10 in his no-hitter on April 8, 1994 at Los Angeles (NL).
- A* Reinstated from the 10-day disabled list, 6/16...Missed nine games with a right thumb contusion after going on the D.L. on 6/5.
- A* Tossed just 4.0 innings, 6/4 at SD, before leaving with a right thumb contusion... Allowed five hits and four runs, including a season high-tying three home runs.
- A* Placed on the 10-day disabled list the following day, 6/5...The D.L. stint was the second of his career and his first since 2016.
- A* Lost his second consecutive start despite allowed five hits and two runs over 7.0 innings, 5/30 vs. NYM...Has gone 7.0 innings three times this season, and all three have come against the Mets.
- A* Snapped his scoreless streak against the Mets at 22.0 innings after allowing a run in the fourth inning...His streak was the longest in the majors against the Mets since Teheran also had a 29.0-inning run from 6/21/15 to 9/9/16.
- A* Turned in a "quality" start, 5/25 at BOS, allowing four hits and three runs over 6.0 innings of work...Threw a season-most 109 pitches.
- A* Took the loss after Atlanta fell 6-2...The loss snapped a career high-tying four-game winning streak that dated to 4/16 vs. PHI...Went 4-0 with a 2.06 ERA (8 ER/35.0 IP) over the run, which spanned six total starts.
- A* Allowed a then season-high six runs over 5.0 innings, 5/20 vs. MIA...Left the game trailing 6-0 before Atlanta rallied for a 10-9 win...The Braves are 10-6 in his 16 starts this season.
- A* All six runs scored in the fourth inning, the third time in his career he's allowed six or more runs in one inning...Also did so on 7/28/17 at PHI (5th) and 5/26/15 at LAD (4th).
- A* Won his third consecutive start, 5/14 at CHI, after holding the Cubs to four hits and four runs over 6.0 innings...All four runs scored on a pair of two-run homers.
- A* Allowed two runs in the bottom of the second to snap a 16.0-inning scoreless streak, the second-longest such stretch of his career...Tossed a career-most 23.0 consecutive scoreless innings in 2016.
- A* Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, 5/9 at TB...Allowed four hits and fanned seven... Logged consecutive scoreless starts for the fifth time in his career.
- A* The outing vs. TB snapped a streak of 11 consecutive starts within the N.L. East, dating to 9/6/17.

Career Recap

- A* Signed a six-year contract through 2019, with an option for 2020, on February 14, 2014... Is a two-time National League All-Star (2014, '16).

- Left Friday's game, 7/6 at MIL, with left groin tightness...Did not play Saturday before singling in a pinch-hit appearance on Sunday.
- Has hit in six of his nine games (.281, 9-for-32) since coming off the DL, 6/29 at StL.
- Stroked a two-run homer in the 11th inning, 7/3 at NYY, to give Atlanta the 5-3 win...With his game-winning homer, became the only player to hit a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium prior to his 21st birthday...Prior to Acuña Jr., the youngest player with a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium was MIN's Kent Hrbek (21 years, 95 days) on 8/24/81.
- At 20 years, 196 days, became the youngest player to hit a game-winning, extra-inning home run for the Braves since Andruw Jones (20 years, 3 days) on 4/26/97 vs. SD... The last younger major leaguer with a game-winning homer in extra innings was FLA's Miguel Cabrera (20 years, 155 days) on 9/20/03 at ATL
- Has five game-winning RBI since his MLB debut on 4/25 at CIN, tied for second most on the team over that time frame.
- Reinstated from the 10-day disabled on 6/28...Went to the DL on 5/28 and missed 28 games with a left knee mild ACL sprain, left knee contusion and lower back contusion.
- Became the youngest player to homer for the Braves since Andruw Jones in 1997, hitting a solo shot off Homer Bailey for his first career homer on 4/26 at CIN.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25,
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by Baseball America and USA Today in 2017.

- N.L. Ranks:** doubles (1st, 29), extra base-hits (1st, 50), runs (1st, 69), total bases (1st, 197), multi-hit games (T2nd, 33), hits (T3rd, 108), home runs (7th, 18).
- Selected to his first career All-Star Game in his first full major league season...Was invited to attend as a result of player balloting...Is the first Braves second baseman selected since Dan Uggla in 2012, and the first Atlanta position player selected in his first full season since Jason Heyward in 2010.
- Hit his 29th double of the season, 7/6 at MIL...That total is tied for the most in franchise history prior to an All-Star break with Marcus Giles (2003).
- Since snapping an 0-for-10 stretch at the plate on 6/17, is batting .398 (33-for-83) in his last 18 games...Has 16 runs and nine RBI in that stretch.
- Has 50 extra-base hits on the season, most in the National League and the third most prior to the All-Star break in franchise history...The club record is 53 by Hank Aaron in 1959...Darrell Evans finished with 51 in 1973.
- Has 11 games with multiple extra-base hits this season, six away from the Atlanta franchise record held by Chipper Jones (1999) and Javy Lopez (2003).
- Hit his second career grand slam (also 5/10 at MIA), 6/12, vs. NYM to become the first Braves player with multiple grand slams in a season since B. McCann in 2012.
- Set the franchise record for most extra-base hits (22) by the end of April and tied for the second most in MLB history...Finished one shy of Jermaine Dye's 2000 record.
