NATIONAL LEAGUE ALL-STARS

1B Joey Votto was a **National League All-Star** for the second straight season and for the sixth time in his career...**2B Scooter Gennett** and **3B Eugenio Suárez** were first-time **All-Stars**.

NATIONAL LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

2B Scooter Gennett in **May** (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League **Player of the Month Award** since **Jay Bruce** in **May 2011**...was **Gennett's** first career monthly award...twice in a 3-week span that month he was named **Player of the Week** (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27).

NATIONAL LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Scooter Gennett twice in a 3-week span (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27) was named **Player of the Week**, the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since **Bruce** in **2012** and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since **Dave Parker** in **May 1985**...**1B Joey Votto** was **NL Player of the Week** for the week of **4/23-4/29**.

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on **5/10** announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** remained the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

THE ROSTER: The Reds used **53 players** overall, **25 position players**, **28 pitchers** and **4 position players who pitched** (**IF Cliff Pennington**, **IF/OF Alex Blandino**, **OF Phillip Ervin**, **IF/OF Brandon Dixon** twice)...tied the 2016 single-season club record for **pitchers used in a season** (32)...the club record for players used in a season remains **57** (2003).

HURLING: The Reds used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Phillip Ervin** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Tanner Rainey**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford**, **RHP Keury Mella**, **RHP Jesús Reyes**).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: The Reds' **38 Major League debuts** over the last 3 seasons are second-most in the Major Leagues (Padres 39)...the **9 Reds players** who made **Major League debuts** this year included **IF Alex Blandino** (4/10 at Phi), **RHP Tanner Rainey** (4/10 at Phi), **RHP Zack Weiss** (4/12 vs StL), **IF/OF Rosell Herrera** (4/26 vs Atl), **IF/OF Brandon Dixon** (5/22 vs Pit), **RHP Jesús Reyes** (8/4/night at Wsh), **OF Aristides Aquino** (8/19 vs SF), **IF Blake Trahan** (9/3 at Pit) and **OF Gabriel Guerrero** (9/4 at Pit)...the Reds' **2018 Opening Day roster** included **5 rookies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **OF Phillip Ervin**, **OF Jesse Winker**), **21 players age 30 & under**, **17 players age 27 & under** and **11 players age 25 & under**...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, the average age for the Reds' 25-man **Opening Day roster (27 years, 196 days)** was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies (26.334)** and ahead of the **Marlins (27.351)**...in **2017**, the Reds began a season with **7 rookies** on their **Opening Day roster** for the first time in researchable history, per **Elias**...the **2017 Opening Day Reds roster** was the youngest in the Major Leagues (**26.355**).

APRIL 19: The Reds went **64-80** after **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT: With **4/19 promotions** to the Major League staff of **Pat Kelly** and **Danny Darwin**, **Dick Schofield** moved from bench coach to manager at Class AAA Louisville, roving outfield/quality control coach **Darren Bragg** joined the Louisville staff as bench coach, and minor league rehabilitation coach **James Baldwin** became Pensacola's pitching coach.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory on 4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win vs the Mariners on 6/23/11**...the Reds' **4-1 win on 5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...since 1900, **Riggleman** is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at **least 5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **17-31-3 in their 51 series**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds went **5-2-2** in their last 9 series vs **teams in first place** when those series began (16-15, .516, 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cle, 3-1 vs Phi, 2-1 vs Ari, 0-3 vs Cle and 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 at Chi)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** included **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively led the Major Leagues in **hits** (715), **battling average** (.282) and **on-base percentage** (.355)...**All-Stars 2B Scooter Gennett** and **3B Eugenio Suárez** were on the **Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award** watch lists at their positions, along with **RHP Michael Lorenzen**...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** led the National League in on-base percentage for the seventh time...**SS José Peraza** tied Cle's **Francisco Lindor** for the Major League lead in hits among shortstops and ranked **T4th** in hits among all National League batters.

DYNAMIC DUO: In May, **Scooter Gennett** (8hr, 24rbi) and **Eugenio Suárez** (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in the same month since **Adam Dunn** (12hr, 27rbi) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11hr, 29rbi) did it in **August 2001**...**Dunn** and **Griffey** were the first Reds duo to do it since **Johnny Bench** (9hr, 32rbi) and **George Foster** (9hr, 38rbi) in **June 1977**...since **RBI** became an official statistic in **1920**, **Gennett** is the only **Reds second baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and **Suárez** is the only **Reds third baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **29 RBI** in a calendar month (May 2018).

SLAMMING: Reds batters produced **11 grand slams**, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and tied with the **Indians** for the most in the Major Leagues...the **11 grand slams** fell 1 shy of the **National League** single-season record (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals) and 3 shy of the **Major League** record (14 slams, 2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the Reds produced **9 grand slams** in the first half, tying the **2010 Yankees** for the most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a club record for **grand slams in a calendar month**...the Reds' **11 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Joey Votto** (2), **Scooter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit), **José Peraza** and **Scott Schebler**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to hit a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the **WSox** did it on **5/16/1953** at **NYN**.

SILVER SLUGGER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** (.290, 1 2b, 4hr, 10rbi) is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award**...he is on the watch list for the award...prior to his last 3 pitching apps of the season, all starts, was trying to become the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...his **4 home runs** included 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is 4 by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...**as a pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen** went **3-for-13** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and is **4-for-20** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **home runs on 4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...7 times in his career, including 6 times this season, entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in the game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...over **5 consecutive plate apps** from **6/7-6/30**, he **singled**, **homered** (pinch hit), **walked**, **homered** and **homered** (pinch-hit grand slam)...became the first Major League pitcher to homer in **3 consecutive** at bats since Col's **Mike Hampton** in **2001**...on 6/7 vs Col **Lorenzen** pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off **Tyler Anderson**, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any **Reds batter** or by any **Major League pitcher**...information courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau** and **Stats**.

LAST 17 GAMES: Beginning **9/11**, Reds batters were held to **3 runs or fewer** in **14** of the **last 17 games** of the season... from **9/15-9/23** they scored only **10 runs** in **9 games**, their first streak of **10 runs or fewer** over any **9-game stretch** since **6/10-6/22, 1945**...over the **last 17 games** of the season beginning **9/11**, Reds batters hit **.204**, including **.113 with RISP**, with **32 runs scored** (1.88 r/g)...Reds pitchers over the **last 17 games** went **5-12** despite a **3.46 ERA**...the Reds were **shut out** 14 times, their highest total since **2014** (17 SHO) and including **5 times** in the **last 14 games**...on the final road trip of the season, the Reds were shut out **once** by the **Cubs**, **twice** by the **Brewers** and **twice** by the **Marlins**...were shut out **5 times overall** this season by the Brewers, the most in a season by any opponent since the **1960 Pirates** shut out the Redlegs 5 times.

POSTPONED: The **postponement** on **3/29 vs Wsh** was the first for the Reds on **Opening Day** because of **inclement weather** since the first 3 games of the **1966 season vs the Mets** all were rained out...the **postponement** was only the **14th** at **Great American Ball Park**, this the facility's **16th season**...also on **3/29**, the **Pirates** and **Tigers** were rained out in Detroit...the **26 other teams** played in the earliest **Opening Day date** in Major League Baseball history, not including games played outside the United States or Canada...had the Reds, Nationals, Pirates and Tigers played, for the first time since **1968** each team would have played its first game of the regular season on the same day...there were only **20 Major League teams** in **1968**.

JOHN McSHERRY: While the postponement on **3/29 vs Wsh** was the first since **1966** for the Reds on **Opening Day** because of **inclement weather**, the **1996 opener** vs the **Montreal Expos** was canceled 7 pitches into the game when home plate umpire **John McSherry** died of a massive heart attack...**McSherry** was starting his **26th season** as a National League umpire...the game was played the next day...additionally, the **1968 opener** for every team was delayed for 2 days following the assassination of **Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.**, while the **1990** and **1995 seasons** were delayed by labor disputes.

AL 8, NL 6 (10): **1B Joey Votto** (1-3, solo HR in 10th inning off Tor's **J.A. Happ**) was an **All-Star** for the sixth time...**2B Scooter Gennett** (pinch-hit, 2-run HR in 9th inning off Sea's **Edwin Díaz**) and **3B Eugenio Suárez** (0-1, HBP by Hou's **Charlie Morton**) were first-time **All-Stars**...**Gennett's** dramatic 2-run HR in the bottom of the ninth inning tied the game at 5-5, the third game-tying HR in the ninth inning or later in **ASG history** (**Ralph Kiner** 1960, **Fred McGriff** 1994)...**Gennett** became the **21st player** and **second Red** (**Gus Bell**, 1954) to produce a **pinch-hit HR** in the **All-Star Game**...his homer was the **seventh** of the game, establishing a new **All-Star Game record**...he donated the baseball to the **Hall of Fame** in **Cooperstown**...**Votto** is 1 of 7 players and only the **second Red** (**Tony Perez**, 1967, 15th inning) to produce a home run in extra innings in the **All-Star Game**...he is the only player **born in Canada** to homer in the **All-Star Game**.

STREAKED: **Joey Votto** did not play on **4/12 vs StL**, snapping at **202 games** his streaks of **consecutive games played** and **consecutive games started**...prior to **4/12** he had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on **9/2/16**, when **Ivan De Jesus Jr.** played 1B...during his 202-games started streak, **Votto** played **1,733.1** of the Reds' **1,782.1 innings** in the field (97%)...was the longest **games started streak** by a Reds player since **Pete Rose** started **370 straight games** from **1973-1976**...in 2017 **Votto** became only the **fourth player** in franchise history to **start** at least **162 games** in a season, joining **Rose** (1965, 163gs in 1974, 1975), **Leo Cardenas** (163gs in 1964) and **Vada Pinson** (1963)...**Votto's** 202-game streak was the Major Leagues' **second-longest active streak** of starts in his team's games behind Royals **SS Alcides Escobar** (342g)...**Votto** played in at least **200 straight games** for the **third time** in his career (**226g** from **9/5/12-5/15/14**, **204g** from **5/10/11-6/30/12**, **202g** from **9/3/16-4/11/17**)...among Reds in the **Wild Card era**, only **Aaron Boone's** 241-game streak from **4/1/02-6/28/03** is longer than **Votto's** 3 streaks...courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau**.

ON YOUR SIX: In the 15-9 win on **4/27 at Min**, **Joey Votto** tied his career high by reaching base safely in 6 plate apps (single, double, HR, 2 walks, hit by a pitch)...he also did it on **5/18/13 at Phi** (4h, 2bb)...before **Votto** did it in **2013**, the last Reds batter to reach base safely **6 times** in a **9-inning game** was **Sean Casey** on **5/19/1999 at Col**...**Votto** is the first Reds batter to do it twice since **Johnny Bench** did it at **Wrigley Field** on **6/14/1975** and again there on **7/22/1979**...**Votto** was 1 of 16 Major League batters this season to reach base 6 times.

WALK IN THE PARK: During the **3-1 series loss** to the Cubs from **5/18-5/20** at **Great American Ball Park**, **Reds pitchers** issued **30 walks** to establish a new club record for **walks** in a **4-game series**...in those 4 games vs Chi issued **8, 8, 8** and **6 walks**...the previous record of **29 walks** in a **4-game series** was established from **8/13-8/15, 1937 vs Cubs** and then matched in a series vs the **Astros** from **7/10-7/13, 1969** and another series vs the **Pirates** from **9/16-9/18, 2016**.

HOME COOKIN': In the 9-game homestand from **4/30-5/9**, **Eugenio Suárez** became the first Reds batter to produce **15 RBI** in a homestand since **Jay Bruce** had **15 RBI** in 7 games from **8/8-8/14, 2011**...in his 9 apps vs the **Brewers**, **Marlins** and **Mets** at **Great American Ball Park**, **Suárez** hit **.313** (10-32, 3 2b, 3hr, .688slg, .395obp)...courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau**.

25 IN 20: With a team-high **25 RBI** in his **first 20 apps**, **Eugenio Suárez** tied the franchise record for **most RBI** by a player in his **first 20 games** of a season...finished the season with **104 RBI**, sixth-most in the National League...played in his **20th game** on **5/8 vs NYM** and produced **4 RBI** to give him **25** on the season...**George Crowe** (1958), **Vada Pinson** (1962) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (2006) each produced **25 RBI** in his **first 20 games** of those respective seasons...courtesy **Elias**.

MINOR MATTERS: Class A Daytona's **Ibandel Isabel** (E-bahn-DELL) produced **36 home runs** to establish new franchise (32 by **Brandon Sing** of the Daytona Cubs in 2004) and **Florida State League** records (33 by **Edward Levy** in 1950 & **James Fuller** in 1971)...after joining the Tortugas on **4/19**, **Isabel's** 36 HR were the most by any minor league player.

- Is the Reds' nominee for the prestigious Hank Aaron Award, which recognizes the outstanding offensive performer in each league...joins a list of Reds nominees that include Joey Votto (5 times), Jay Bruce (2 times) and Devin Mesoraco...Votto won the award following his 2010 MVP season.
- Is on the watch list for the Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...led all Major League second basemen in hits, RBI and slugging percentage while ranking second in batting average (1st in NL) and HR.
- Led all National League batters in 3-hit games (18) while ranking second overall in hitting, T3rd in multi-hit games (53), sixth in hits, third in BA vs RHP (.317), fifth in both road BA (.319) and night BA (.316) and ninth in day BA (.299).
- Hit .310 to finish second to batting champion Christian Yelich of the Brewers (.326) in his bid to become the first Reds batter to lead the National League in hitting since Pete Rose batted .338 in 1973.
- In the first half hit .326 (.521slg, .373obp) to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...after the All-Star break hit .286 (.442slg, .333obp).
- Led the Reds in hitting, runs, total bases (286), multi-hit games (53) and starts batting cleanup (76gs)...also hit leadoff (1gs, 4/9 at Phi), second (18gs), third (23gs), fifth (24gs) and sixth (1gs, 5/5 vs Mia).
- Established career highs in games, at bats, runs, hits, walks, batting average and on-base percentage, total bases and extra-base hits.
- Pinch hit in the bottom of the ninth of the 10-inning, 8-6 American League win in the All-Star Game at Nationals Park and hit a 2-run HR off Sea's Edwin Díaz that tied the game at 5-5...was the third game-tying HR in the ninth inning or later in All-Star Game history (Ralph Kiner 1960, Fred McGriff 1994)...became the 21st player and second Red (Gus Bell, 1954) to produce a pinch-hit homer in the All-Star Game...Gennett's home run was the seventh of the game, establishing a new All-Star Game record...he donated the baseball to the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.

- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.

- Is 1 of only 4 third basemen in Reds history to produce at least 30 HR (Todd Frazier, Tony Perez twice, Deron Johnson).
- Is on the watch list for the Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...among National League third basemen ranked second in HR and RBI; third in hits, slugging and extra-base hits; and fourth in hitting and on-base percentage.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranked among the overall National League leaders in RBI (6th), HR (7th), slugging percentage (8th, .526), OPS (10th, .892), BA vs LHP (9th, .320), RBI ratio (2nd, 5.1ab) and HR ratio (2nd, 15.5ab).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).

- For the seventh time in his career led the National League in on-base percentage (.417)...is 1 of only 6 players in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7)...reached base safely in 127 of the 144 apps in which he had a plate appearance.
- Also among the National League leaders ranked third in walks, fifth in BA with RISP (.339), eighth in BA on the road (.311) and 10th in BA vs RHP (.298)...led the team in walks.
- Recorded at least 100 walks for the sixth time, tying Joe Morgan's franchise record.
- On 7/27 vs Phi drew his 136th career intentional walk (off Jake Thompson), a new franchise career record (Johnny Bench, 135 IBB)...finished the season with 138 career IBB.

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the bottom of the 10th inning of the American League's 8-6 win at Nationals Park, hit a solo HR off Tor's J.A. Happ...is 1 of 7 players and only the second Red to produce a home run in extra innings in the All-Star Game (Tony Perez, 1967, 15th inning)...is the only player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the National League's Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- From 8/17-8/29 was disabled with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016...missed 12 games while he was disabled.
- Prior to his disabling missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games...missed his first full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202 games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
