SEATTLE MARINERS:

- Seattle recorded its 8th walk-off win of the season (last: Sept. 2 vs. Oakland).
 - Seattle recorded its 35th come-from-behind win of the season (had 36 in 2016).
- Nelson Cruz** hit a walk-off 2-run home run in the 9th inning, his 5th career walk-off home run.
 - Last walk off home run was Sept. 10, 2010 vs. NYY while with Texas.
 - It was his 10th career walk-off hit, his 3rd this season (last: July 22 vs. NYY).
- Nelson Cruz** has homered in 3 consecutive games for the 4th time this year.
 - Pushed his career-high RBI season total to 114, which leads the AL.
- Erasmus Ramirez** tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings (3x, last: Sept. 18, 2012 vs. Baltimore).
 - Struck out a career-high tying 10 batters (3x, last: July 22, 2014 vs. New York-NL).
 - First Mariners start with 8.0+ IP and 10+ strikeouts since Taijuan Walker on Sept. 13, 2016 vs. LAA).
 - Retired the final 18 batters he faced after giving up a leadoff home run in the 3rd inning.
 - Has a 3.79 ERA (24 ER, 57.0 IP) with 52 strikeouts in 10 starts since joining Seattle.
 - Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 7 of his last 8 starts.
 - Has limited opponents to 2 earned runs or less in 6 of his last 8 starts.
- Mitch Haniger** (1x4) is batting .345 (29x84) in the month of September with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, and 10 RBI, in 20 games... Has hit safely in 16 out of those 20 games with 9 multi-hit games.
- Robinson Cano** extended his hitting streak to 7 games, batting .393 (11x28) with 4 runs scored, 1 home run, 5 RBI and 2 walks.
 - Has recorded a hit in 15 of 20 games this month, batting .372 (29x78) with 11 runs scored, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 15 RBI, 2 HBP and 6 walks.
 - Recorded a team-leading 45th multi-hit game.
- Yonder Alonso** broke a 0x14 streak and drove in the game-tying run with an RBI single in the 7th inning.
- Seattle snapped its 6 game losing streak and remains 5 games out of the 2nd AL Wildcard spot with 8 games to go.

CLEVELAND INDIANS:

- The Indians loss snaps their 14 game road winning streak.. Streak was the 5th longest in AL history and the longest in club history.
- Austin Jackson** (1x3, 2B, BB) extended his hitting streak to 6 games... During the streak he is batting (11x24) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 2 RBI, 2 walks, and 3 multi-hit games.
 - Was the only Indians player to reach base safely 2+ times.
- Trevor Bauer** has pitched at least 6 innings and allowed 2 or fewer runs in 8 of his last 11 starts, and has allowed 1 run or less in 6 of those 11 starts.
 - Tossed 7+ innings and allowed 1 run or less for the 4th time this season.
- Giovanny Urshela** hit his first home run of the season... Had not hit a Major league home run since 9/14/15.

CLEVELAND MANAGER TERRY FRANCONA:

On what Ramirez did to slow the bats down tonight:

“Well for one I thought he pitched really well. I mean he located the fastball, and then off of that, whether it was a changeup, cutter, breaking ball, he really pitched a good game. We had a couple swings early where we just missed, but other than Gio (Urshela), he really just pitched a really nice game.”

On what he thought of Trevor Bauer:

“You know I thought he was really good. I know he gets frustrated when he doesn't strike a lot of guys out, but he followed Roberto the entire way, and I thought he did a heck of a job. You know, high pitch count because he ran so many counts deep, but still he gave up 1, and I thought he did a really good job of following Roberto.”
