RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers had their four-game winning streak snapped yesterday as they lost to the Blue Jays, 8-4. José Iglesias had a pair of hits, including a double, while Leonys Martin added a solo home run, his seventh of the season. Jeimer Candelario and Niko Goodrum also contributed a hit and a RBI in the game. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing four runs on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers conclude their 12-game homestand today with a split doubleheader vs. New York (AL). Following today's games, the Tigers embark on a brief three-game road trip to Boston (June 5-7).

ROSTER MOVES: The Tigers have announced the following roster moves:

- Optioned RHP Johnny Barbato to Triple A Toledo.

- Selected the contract of RHP Drew VerHagen from Triple A Toledo. The Tigers 40-man roster is now at 40.

- Recalled RHP Sandy Baez from Double A Erie to serve as the 26th man for both games of today's doubleheader.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE: Jeimer Candelario went 1x2 with a RBI and a walk in yesterday's game, extending his streak of reaching base safely to 28 games. Over the 28-game stretch, which is the longest active in the Majors, Candelario is batting .283 (30x106) with a .392 on-base percentage, 24 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, six home runs and 17 RBI.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: José Iglesias doubled in the seventh inning of yesterday's game, marking the 50th consecutive game that Detroit has recorded at least one double. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team, and is the fourth-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908. The 1996 Cleveland Indians have the longest streak in the last 110 years, recording a double in 75 straight games from May 30-August 19, 1996.

LET'S PLAY TWO (AGAIN & AGAIN): The Tigers will play their fifth doubleheader of the season today. Detroit was swept in a twinbill by Pittsburgh on April 1 and split doubleheaders vs. Kansas City on April 20, at Pittsburgh on April 25 and vs. Seattle on May 12. The five doubleheaders are the most the Tigers have played in a season since 2010, when they played six twinbills.

ON THE CLOCK: The 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft begins tonight at 7 p.m. on MLB Network, in which the Tigers have the top pick for the first time since 1997. Along with the top selection, Detroit will also have the 44th pick to begin the second round. The draft continues on Tuesday with rounds 3-10 and Wednesday with rounds 11-40.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 7-3 on their 12-game, 11-day homestand, which includes three games vs. Chicago (AL) (2-1), four games vs. Los Angeles (AL) (3-1), three games vs. Toronto (2-1) and two games vs. New York (AL) (June 4). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 19-13 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 18 of their last 26 home games. The Tigers are hitting .272 (.297x1093) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.10 ERA (296.0IP/135ER).

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: The Tigers and Yankees continue their seven-game season series with a split doubleheader today. Along with today's game, the two teams will play a four-game series at Yankee Stadium from August 30-September 2. New York (AL) picked up an 8-6 win over the Tigers in their only meeting so far this season. The two teams split six games last season, but the Yankees won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. Detroit has not won a season series against the Yankees since 2011 and have not won a home series against New York (AL) since 2014.

TIGERS, YANKEES TO WEAR #42 TONIGHT IN HONOR OF JACKIE ROBINSON: All on-field personnel from

both the Tigers and Yankees will wear uniform number 42 in the second game of today's doubleheader in honor of Jackie Robinson, who made his Major League debut and broke baseball's color barrier with the Brooklyn Dodgers on April 15, 1947. Prior to tonight's game, the winners of the 22nd Annual Jackie Robinson Art, Essay and Poetry contest will be honored, including Meredith Woodman (Art), Diop Russell (Art), Carly Bernard (Essay), Harley Smith (Essay), Emily Jerris (Poetry) and Courtney Fenby (Poetry). Additionally, the 12th Annual Jackie Robinson Most Valuable Diverse Business Partner Award will be given to Russell Carter, owner of Signarama -- a large format color printing company that provides banners and backdrops for Comerica Park. The Tigers have partnered with Signarama since 2016.

ON DECK: The Tigers begin a three-game series at Boston tomorrow night. Detroit went 4-3 against the Red Sox last season, but dropped two-of-three games at Fenway Park. The Tigers have won the season series over the Red Sox in four of the last five seasons.

#VOTETIGERS: Balloting for the 2018 All-Star Game, presented by MasterCard, is now underway. The 89th midsummer classic will be hosted on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C.

Fans can cast their vote at tigers.com/vote for Tigers starters a total of 35 times with the 2018 Camping World MLB All-Star ballot, including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in a 24-hour period.

ABOUT DREW: VerHagen will make his 10th appearance and first start of the season this afternoon in the first game of the doubleheader vs. New York (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: VerHagen last pitched for the Tigers on April 22 vs. Kansas City, allowing two runs on zero hits with two walks and one strikeout in a third of an inning. He started for Triple A Toledo last Monday vs. Norfolk and earned the win, throwing 7.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts.

VS. NEW YORK (AL): VerHagen has faced the Yankees three times in his career, all as a reliever, compiling a 0-0 record with a 4.50 ERA (4.0IP/2ER) and two strikeouts. He made a relief appearance earlier this season on April 13 vs. New York (AL), throwing a scoreless two thirds of an inning.

AT COMERICA PARK: VerHagen has made 39 career outings, including two starts, at Comerica Park, posting a 1-4 record with a 6.57 ERA (49.1IP/36ER) and 29 strikeouts. In seven home relief appearances this season, VerHagen is 0-1 with a 10.50 ERA (6.0IP/7ER) and seven strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: VerHagen has pitched in 17 games, including one start in his career against American League East opponents, compiling a 0-0 record with a 5.25 ERA (24.0IP/14ER) and 17 strikeouts. In three relief outings vs. AL East teams this season, VerHagen has a 0-0 record with a 10.13 ERA (2.2IP/3ER) and three strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: VerHagen has held righthanded hitters to a .259 (58x224) batting average in his Major League career, while lefties have hit .311 (41x132) against him. In 15 appearances, including six starts, between Detroit and Triple A Toledo this season, righties are hitting .128 (10x78) vs. VerHagen and lefthanded batters are hitting .184 (9x49).

AT TOLEDO: VerHagen has made six starts with Triple A Toledo this season, posting a 2-0 record with a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP/4ER) and 41 strikeouts. VerHagen has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his six starts. VerHagen led the International League with a .138 opponents batting average in May, while he ranked second with a 1.32 ERA and 0.77 WHIP and third with 41 strikeouts.

FIRST MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: VerHagen picked up the first win of his Major League career on Opening Day of the 2016 season at Miami, throwing a scoreless inning with one hit and one walk.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 11th start of the season tonight in the second game of the doubleheader vs. New York (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers received a no decision in his last start on Wednesday vs. Los Angeles (AL), allowing one run on seven hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

VS. NEW YORK (AL): Fiers has faced the Yankees four times in his career, posting a 0-1 record with a 6.20 ERA (20.1IP/14ER) and 21 strikeouts. He started against the Yankees earlier this season on April 13 and took the loss, giving up six runs, five earned, on eight hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made seven career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 2-1 record with a 3.35 ERA (40.1IP/15ER) and 26 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Fiers is 2-1 with a 4.13 ERA (28.1IP/13ER) and 17 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Fiers has pitched in 20 games, including 18 as a starter, in his career against teams from the American League East and has compiled a 5-6 record with a 4.18 ERA (112.0IP/52ER) and 102 strikeouts. In two starts vs. AL East opponents this season, Fiers is 0-2 with a 6.17 ERA (11.2IP/8ER) and nine strikeouts.

RECORD IN JUNE: Fiers has pitched in 27 games, including 22 as a starter, during the month of June, compiling a 9-7 record with a 3.12 ERA (135.2IP/47ER) and 120 strikeouts. In five June starts last season, Fiers went 3-1 with a 2.32 ERA (31.0IP/8ER) and 28 strikeouts.

RECAPPIING FIERS' MAY: Fiers started six games during the month of May, posting a 2-1 record with a 4.83 ERA (31.2IP/17ER) and 21 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .253 (358x1417) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .259 (411x1589) against him. In 10 starts this season, lefties are hitting .278 (27x97), while righthanded batters are hitting .285 (35x123).

IMPRESSIVE TIGERS DEBUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.
