RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers evened their series against the Indians with a 4-2 win in 12 innings on Saturday at Comerica Park. With the game tied 2-2 in the 12th inning, Jeimer Candelario hit a two-out, two-run walk-off home run to lift Detroit to victory. Victor Martinez had two hits and a RBI in the win, while José Iglesias was 1x4 with a triple and a RBI. Mike Fiers started for the Tigers and threw 7.0 strong innings, giving up one run on five hits with one walk and eight strikeouts. The Detroit bullpen combined to throw 5.0 innings of one-run ball with Warwick Saupold pitching 2.0 shutout innings to earn his fourth win of the season. The Tigers and Indians play the rubber game of their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game and an off day on Monday, the homestand continues on Tuesday with three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

CANDY CRUSH: Jeimer Candelario launched a two-out, two-run home run off Cody Allen in the 12th inning of last night's game for his first career walk-off hit and home run. The walk-off victory was the fifth for the Tigers this season, which is tied for the most in the American League.

EARTH, WIND AND FIERS: Mike Fiers turned in his best start of the season yesterday, throwing a season-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on five hits with one walk and a season-best eight strikeouts. Fiers has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his last three starts, posting a 1.96 ERA (18.1IP/4ER) with 18 strikeouts during the stretch. With yesterday's outing, Fiers lowered his career ERA against the Indians to 2.04 (35.1IP/8ER) in six career starts.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: Miguel Cabrera went 1x4 with a pair of walks in yesterday's game. With his two hits, Cabrera now has 2,676 hits in his Major League career and is one hit shy of tying Luis Aparicio for 72nd in MLB history (see chart below).

MIGGY ON THE MARK VS. KLUBER: Miguel Cabrera has had success in his career against today's Indians starter, Corey Kluber. Cabrera enters today's game with a .383 (23x60) batting average, three doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI vs. the righthander. Among active players with at least 20 at-bats against the two-time Cy Young Award winner, Cabrera ranks second with a .733 slugging percentage, while he is fourth with a .383 batting average and fifth with a .422 on-base percentage.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 1-1 on their current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (1-1) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 21-15 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 20 of their last 30 home games. The Tigers are hitting .265 (328x1238) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.03 ERA (335.0IP/150ER).

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers are 3-6 against the Indians this season, including a 3-2 record at Comerica Park. The Indians have won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons and have gone 33-13 against Detroit since the start of the 2016 season.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 13-15 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 5-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 3-6 vs. Cleveland, 1-2 vs. Minnesota and 4-6 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has

finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

ON DECK: After an off day Monday, the Tigers continue their six-game homestand on Tuesday as they begin a three-game series against the Minnesota Twins. Detroit is 1-2 against the Twins this season after losing two-of-three games at Target Field from May 21-23. The Tigers have won the season series over Minnesota in five of the last seven seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 31-35 (.470) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,099-1,074 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ZIMMERMANN INJURY REHAB UPDATE: RHP Jordan Zimmermann is scheduled to make an injury rehabilitation start with Single A West Michigan on Monday night vs. South Bend. The start will be Zimmermann's third injury rehab start after making two appearances with Triple A Toledo. Zimmermann has been sidelined since May 8 (retroactive to May 6) with a right shoulder impingement.

ABOUT ARTIE: Lewicki will make his eighth appearance and second start of the season this afternoon in the series finale vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Lewicki made his first start of the season for the Tigers on Tuesday at Boston, suffering the loss after giving up four runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 3.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Lewicki's only career outing against the Indians came earlier this season on May 16, when he pitched 4.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and four strikeouts.

AT COMERICA PARK: Lewicki has made seven career appearances, including one start, at Comerica Park, compiling a 0-1 record with a 3.72 ERA (19.1IP/8ER) and 12 strikeouts. In four home appearances this season, Lewicki has a 0-0 record with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP/1ER) and nine strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Lewicki has made six starts at Toledo this season, compiling a 3-3 record with a 5.06 ERA (32.0IP/18ER) and 29 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .333 (18x54) batting average against Lewicki in his career, while righties have hit .348 (24x69). In 13 appearances, including seven starts, between Detroit and Triple A Toledo this season, righthanded hitters are batting .296 (40x135) and lefties are hitting .329 (23x70).

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Lewicki made his Major League debut on September 4, 2017 vs. Kansas City, throwing 5.0 innings and allowing five runs on 11 hits with one walk and one strikeout. Lewicki struck out Alex Gordon in the second inning for his first Major League strikeout.

PILING UP THE WINS IN 2017: Lewicki earned 14 wins last season between Double A Erie and Triple A Toledo, ranking tied for sixth among all Minor League pitchers. Lewicki won 10 of his final 11 decisions in the minors in 2017. During the 12-start stretch, Lewicki had a 10-1 record with a 2.55 ERA (74.0IP/21ER) and 68 strikeouts.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Lewicki was selected by the Tigers in the eighth round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia. As a senior at Virginia, Lewicki helped the Cavaliers to the College World Series, compiling an 8-1 record with one save and a 1.31 ERA (68.2IP/10ER). Lewicki threw 23.1 innings without allowing an earned run in the NCAA Tournament.

ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his 10th appearance and sixth start of the season on Tuesday night in the series opener vs. Minnesota.

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy suffered his first loss of the season on Wednesday at Boston, allowing five runs on eight hits with two strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. MINNESOTA/AT COMERICA PARK: Hardy has made 18 career appearances, including one start, against the Twins, compiling a 1-0 record with a 3.74 ERA (21.2IP/9ER) and 13 strikeouts. He started against Minnesota earlier this season on May 21 at Target Field and threw 5.0 innings, allowing two runs on seven hits with four strikeouts. Hardy has appeared in 90 games, including three starts, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling an 8-1 record with a 3.10 ERA (104.2IP/36ER) and 77 strikeouts. In three home starts this season, Hardy is 2-0 with a 2.60 ERA (17.1IP/5ER) and 12 strikeouts.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in four of his five starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 2-1 record with a 3.81 ERA (28.1IP/12ER) and 18 strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.
