NATIONALS NEWS

HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY!

The Washington Nationals will face off against the Boston Red Sox in their annual Fourth of July 11:05 a.m. contest today at Nationals Park...Washington is 7-6 on July 4th since 2005 and since the 11:05 a.m. tradition began in 2012, the Nationals are 4-2 on the Fourth of July.

WELCOME BACK, BIG CITY

The Nationals returned from rehab and reinstated infielder/outfielder **Matt Adams** from the 10-day disabled list and designated left-handed pitcher **Tim Collins** for assignment on Wednesday...Adams returns to the active roster after missing 16 games with a fractured left index finger...Prior to being placed on the disabled list, Adams hit .275 with seven doubles, 13 home runs, 36 RBI, 16 walks and 24 runs scored in 57 games... The Nationals went 26-12 in his 38 starts prior to the injury.

- From April 25 to June 16, Adams ranked third in the National League with 11 home runs and was tied for seventh with 32 RBI over this span.
- On the season, he ranked just outside of the top 10 in the National League with 13 home runs when he was placed on the disabled list on June 16.

#VoteRendon

Anthony Rendon clubbed his 12th home run of the season on Monday night against the Red Sox...He has homered in three of his last five games and has hit safely in 16 of his last 18 games dating to June 15...He is hitting .375 (27-for-72) with 10 doubles, six homers, 14 RBI, six walks and 14 runs scored over this span... His 16 extra-base hits are tied with COL **Nolan Arenado** for the most in MLB since June 15.

- Rendon entered play on June 6 hitting .253/.333/.448 and in 24 games since then, he is hitting .347 with 18 extra-base hits (12 2B, 6 HR)...He is now slashing .289/.354/.530 on the season.
- Rendon's 24 doubles rank tied for third in the National League and are tied for the most among NL third basemen with STL **Matt Carpenter**.

HARPER'S HOMERS

Bryce Harper clubbed his 21st home run of the season on Monday night, a solo shot in the eighth inning... Harper's 21 home runs rank second behind only COL **Nolan Arenado** (22) for the most in the National League.

- Over his last 12 games, Harper is hitting .278 (10-for-36) with a .481 on-base percentage (15 walks/15 strikeouts) and a .639 slugging percentage (7 2B, 2 HR).

TREA'S TURNING IT ON

Over his last 14 games, **Trea Turner** is 20-for-57 (.351) with one double, one triple, two homers, four RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and 11 runs scored...He has a .413 on-base percentage and a .509 slugging percentage during this stretch.

WELL-DESERVED HONOR

Juan Soto was named National League Rookie of the Month for June on Monday...He hit .317 (26-for-82) with six doubles, six homers, 15 RBI, 18 walks and 19 runs scored in 24 games during the month...He led National League rookies in batting average (.317), on-base percentage (.440), slugging percentage (.610), OPS (1.050), home runs (6) and walks (18). He ranked second in doubles (6), hits (26) and was third with 15 RBI for the month.

- On the season, Soto ranks among all Major League rookies (min. 150 PA), in batting average (.308), on-base percentage (.421), and OPS (.978)...He ranks second in slugging percentage (.570) behind NYY **Gleyber Torres** (.913).
- Among all National League players (min. 150 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (2nd, .421), OPS (4th, .978), batting average (9th, .308), and slugging percentage (10th, .556).
- Since May 15, he ranks among National League rookies in home runs (1st, 8), walks (1st, 26), runs (2nd, 25), hits (T2nd, 41), RBI (3rd, 21) and doubles (3rd, 9).

FIVE FINGER DISCOUNTS

The Nationals are tied with the Milwaukee Brewers for the National League lead in stolen bases with 64 stolen bases...They rank behind the Chicago White Sox (67) and Boston Red Sox (65) for the most in Major League Baseball.

- **Michael A. Taylor** leads MLB with 23 stolen bases, while **Trea Turner** (22) is tied for second with SEA **Dee Gordon** (22) and ATL **Ender Inciarte** (22).

NATIONALS HISTORY

July 4 (7-6 on this date)

2015 – The Nationals tallied six runs – including two first-inning home runs – against **Madison Bumgarner** en route to the 9-3 win over the Giants on July 4th. **Michael A. Taylor** got things going with a lead-off blast on the first pitch he saw. Two batters later, while using a stars and stripes patriotic-themed bat, **Bryce Harper** clubbed a two-run homer into the Nationals' bullpen in right field.

IN THE COMMUNITY

July 7: Neighborhood Day

Once again, the Nationals will dedicate a day to recognize and thank their neighbors in Ward 6. The team will provide hundreds of residents with tickets to area residents to watch the Nationals take on Miami. A variety of residents will also be recognized for their contributions to the community during the pregame ceremonies, including the ceremonial first pitch.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#23 - ERICK FEDDE - RHP

Former first-round pick (No. 18) in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft has provided depth to Washington's starting rotation since making his debut in 2017...Has made three starts in his Major League career...Entered the 2018 season rated as the No. 3 prospect in Washington's Minor League system per Baseball America...As a starter, has recorded 8.7 strikeouts per nine innings across 60 career Minor League starts.

AGAINST THE RED SOX: Has never faced the Boston Red Sox.

LAST START: Earned his first career win behind 12 runs of offensive support on June 29 at Philadelphia...Allowed five earned runs on eight hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work as the Nationals topped the Phillies, 17-7.

2018 NOTES

- Did not issue a walk in his previous two Minor League starts prior to his promotion on June 13...Has posted a 4.07 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 11 Triple-A starts (61 SO/15 BB).
- He tossed 5.0 innings giving up four runs on six hits, while walking one and striking out three against the New York Yankees on June 13 ...Did not earn a decision in the Nationals 5-4 win over the Yankees.
- Made his first MLB start of the season on May 23 vs. San Diego...Allowed three earned runs on six hits in 5.2 innings of work as the Nationals fell to the Padres, 3-1...Struck out six batters while walking just one.
- Began the season with Triple-A Syracuse...Made eight starts, going 1-1 with 4.35 ERA (20 ER/ 41.1 IP) before being recalled on May 23.
- On May 18 vs. Lehigh Valley (PHI), tossed 6.2 innings, allowing one unearned run on four hits...Struck out six and walked two.
- Fanned a season-high 10 batters on May 7 vs. Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (NYY).
- Started the season strong, allowing three earned runs in 15.0 IP (1.80 ERA) across his first three starts.
- Tossed shutout appearances on April 8 at Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (5.0 IP, 4 H, BB, 2 SO) and April 20 at Louisville (5.0 IP, 2 H, BB 7 SO).

2017 NOTES

- Began the season with Double-A Harrisburg before being promoted to Triple-A Syracuse on June 13...Made seven starts for Harrisburg (2-3, 3.16 ERA, 35 SO, 14 BB, 3 HR) and 10 appearances out of the bullpen (1-0, 2.63 ERA, 19 SO, 4 BB, HR).
- Began his stint with Syracuse in the bullpen (6 G, 1-0, 3.86 ERA, 7 SO, BB) before moving to the rotation (6 GS, 0-2, 5.11 ERA, 18 SO, 4 BB).
- Had his contract selected from Syracuse on July 30...Made his MLB debut that day against Colorado (4.0 IP, 10 H, 7 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO).
- In his second start, Aug. 6 at CHI, struck out seven batters in 5.1 innings of work...Enjoyed four MLB stints with Washington.
- Placed on the 60-day DL on Sept. 4 with a right forearm flexor strain, ending his 2017 season.

2016 NOTES

- Went 8-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 23 games (22 starts) between Single-A Potomac and Double-A Harrisburg.
- Ranked second among Nationals farmhands in ERA (3.12) and fourth in strikeouts (123).
- Posted a 4.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio (123 SO/29 BB).
- Was named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week on July 17.
- From May 23 to Aug. 5, posted a 0.62 ERA (4 ER/57.2 IP), struck out 60 batters and walked 10 while posting a 4-1 record over 11 games (10 starts).
- Entered the season rated as the No. 82 prospect in all of baseball, according to *Baseball America*...For the second straight season, boasted the "Best Slider" in the organization, per BA.

- Pronounced fed-EE...Graduated from Las Vegas High School...Attended the University of Nevada-Las Vegas.
- Was named the 2014 Mountain West Pitcher of the Year and to the All-Mountain West First Team...Named a Louisville Slugger Second-Team All American by Collegiate Baseball and to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- A graduate of Las Vegas High School where he played alongside Nationals outfielder Bryce Harper... Was also an all-state soccer player and helped lead LVHS to a soccer state championship in 2009... Was selected by SDP in the 24th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but chose to attend UNLV.
