THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-0 thus far on their 11-game homestand with two wins over the Orioles the last two nights...today they will play the third of four with Baltimore...after tomorrow afternoon's series finale with the O's, the Twins will host Kansas City for three from Monday-Wednesday, followed by four against Tampa Bay from Thursday-Sunday, leading up to the break...the Twins have gone 22-20 at home this season (6-3 in their last nine).

WE'LL TAKE TWO-IN-A-ROW: The Twins beat the Orioles last night at Target Field by a score of 6-2, winning their second straight game for the first time since winning two straight June 19-20 vs. Boston...Lance Lynn (6-7) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 11 hits, their fifth time with double-digit hits in their last eight games...Max Kepler went 1-for-4 with a home run (9) and two of the Twins five RBI.

MAUER DOUBLES UP: Joe Mauer hit his 414th career on Wednesday, and now needs just one to pass Kirby Puckett and move into first place on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

TWINS AND BIRDS: Since 2017, the Twins are 9-3 vs. the O's, their best vs. any AL opponent in that span...the Twins are 4-1 vs. the Orioles this season and 18-8 in their last 26...a win today would secure the season-series over Baltimore for the third time in the last four seasons.

- ☛ Max Kepler has hit safely in 11 of 12 career games against the Orioles, hitting .391 (18-for-46) with six doubles, one triple, four home runs, 15 RBI, six walks, a .462 OBP and a 1.288 OPS.
- ☛ Joe Mauer is a career .339 (98-for-289) hitter against the Orioles, with 20 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 44 RBI, 47 runs scored and a .404 on-base percentage in 76 games.
- ☛ Robbie Grossman is hitting .358 (19-for-53) with six doubles, nine RBI, six walks and a .424 on-base percentage in 16 career games against the Orioles.

STEADY EDDIE: Eddie Rosario has hit safely in 63 of 84 games played this season with multiple hits in 33 of those...the Twins record for multi-hit games in a season is 74, held by Kirby Puckett in 1989 (Molitor's 1996 total of 72 ranks third)...Rosario's rankings among AL players on the season: tied for fourth in multi-hit games (33), sixth in hits (104), eighth in AVG (.310), ninth in SLG (.551), 10th in OPS (.901), and 11th in runs (58).

BIRTHDAY BOYS: Twins radio broadcasters Dan Gladden and Cory Provus are both celebrating their birthdays today...the Twins are 20-35 all-time on their birthdays, the fourth fewest wins of any day in July...the Twins beat the Orioles on their birthday last year by a score of 6-4...they share a birthday with Gladden's former broadcast partner John Gordon, comedian Jim Gaffigan and musician Ringo Starr.

- ☛ Gladden appeared in five career games on his birthday, hitting .526 (10-for-19) with one double, four RBI, five runs scored and three three-hit games.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS (AND ORIOLES) HISTORY: In 1995, the Twins traded right-handed pitcher Scott Erickson to the Orioles in exchange for right-handed pitcher Scott Kligenbeck and a player to be named later...Kligenbeck appeared in 28 games (7 starts) for the Twins, going 1-3, 8.30 ERA (77.0 IP, 71 ER) while Erickson pitched seven seasons for the Orioles, going 79-68, 4.73 ERA (1287.2 IP, 677) in 200 games (197 starts)...in 2004, in a 12-0 shutout of the Royals, Kyle Lohse helped establish a club record throwing the team's third consecutive shutout, following Johan Santana and Brad Radke who started the streak of 27 scoreless innings, also a franchise record.

OneMN: The Twins in conjunction with the Timberwolves and Lynx, MN United FC and Saint Paul Parks and Recreation, earlier hosted over 100 kids for a day of fun featuring various activities, mascot visits, prize giveaways, bounce houses and more...representatives from each team's academy taught kids baseball, basketball and soccer drills while encouraging teamwork, participation and fun.

- ☛ Joe Mauer has put 58.5% of his swings in play (93/159) with two strikes this season -- 2nd highest in MLB among hitters with at least 126 PA's; League Avg: 38.0%.
- ☛ Jake Cave is batting .467 (7-for-15) on low non-fastballs over the last 30 days (12 Games) -- best in MLB among hitters with at least 37 PA's; League Avg: .193

LAST START: Gibson did not factor into the decision in his last start against Milwaukee on July 2...allowed four runs (3 earned) on eight hits and two walks with three strikeouts over 5.0 innings...left the game with a lead, but Fernando Rodney blew his fifth save of the year in the ninth inning...unearned run came on a 3B Williams Astudillo error in the fifth inning with bases loaded and two outs...went 2-for-2 at the plate with a run scored, first Twins pitcher since Tommy Milone (April 20, 2016 vs. MIL) to get multiple hits in a game.

AGAINST THE ORIOLES: Gibson is making his ninth career start and second of the year against Baltimore...in eight starts, is 3-2, 5.06 ERA (42.2 IP, 24 ER) with 24 walks and 36 strikeouts...last start against the Orioles was March 31, earned the win after shutting out the Orioles over 6.0 no-hit innings with five walks and six strikeouts...left the game with a no-hit bid after throwing 102 pitches...last loss to Baltimore was July 9, 2017, allowed seven runs on nine hits and two walks with one strikeout over 4.0 innings.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: After a rough first half of 2017, Gibson finished the second half of the season 7-3, 3.76 ERA (76.2 IP, 32 ER) with 22 walks and 70 strikeouts...since July 16, 2017, Gibson is 9-9, 3.65 ERA (177.1 IP, 72 ER) with 64 walks and 166 strikeouts and is holding opponents to a .246 average...his ERA is 10th in the AL over that span while his 166 strikeouts ranks tied for 14th among pitchers with more than 175 IP over that stretch.

SWING AND A MISS: Thus far in 2018, Gibson has recorded 96 strikeouts through 17 starts and owns a strikeout rate of 22.6 percent and a swing-and-miss rate of 26.2 percent, tied 16th best in the AL...his career strikeout rate is 16.8 percent while his career swing-and-miss rate is 22.7 percent.

KEEP THE K'S COMING: Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2017 with 6.89 K/9...through 17 starts in 2018, Gibson is striking out 8.58 batters-per-9.0 innings, 20th in the AL.

LIMITING THE DAMAGE: Gibson has only allowed 25 XBH this season, tied for second fewest allowed in the AL and tied for 7th fewest in baseball among starters with at least 17 starts...opponents are slugging .365 against Gibson, 13th lowest in the AL...Gibson has given up 12 doubles, which is tied for second fewest in the AL among starters with at least 17 starts, and 11 home runs, tied for 8th best in the AL...his .233 opponent batting average is 16th in the AL.

ROAD RUNNER: In 2018, Gibson is holding opposing hitters to a .197 average on the road, which is fourth lowest in the AL, and is 11th in the AL in road ERA with 2.84, holding opponents scoreless in three of his nine road starts this year...has only allowed two home runs and 13 extra base hits on the road this year, tied for fifth fewest in the AL among starters with eight road starts...over his career, Gibson has had success on the road, posting a 26-24 record across 71 starts away from Target Field as compared to his 20-29 record at home...since 2016, Gibson has posted a 13-8 record on the road, in contrast to his 7-19 record at home...his road ERA in that span is 4.12 as compared to 5.28.

2017 RECAP:

- Was the Twins third starter to begin the season.
- Optioned to Triple-A after six starts, going 0-4 and allowing 24 earned runs over 26.1 innings on 39 hits.
- In return to Twins, recorded his first win on May 22 against Baltimore.
- Won his final six decisions, allowing 11 runs over 31.2 innings in the six wins, notching the longest win streak of his career.
- Made his 100th career start on April 12 at Detroit...the first pitcher to make 100 starts for the Twins since Francisco Liriano from 2005-11...was the 25th pitcher in Twins history to make 100-plus starts for the club.

KILLING TWO BIRDS WITH ONE STONE: Gibson induced 26 double plays in 2017, ranking third in the AL...his 1.48 GDP/9 ranked fourth in baseball among pitchers who threw more than 150 innings in 2017...since 2014, Gibson has induced the most GDP in the majors with 106 and is second in GDP/9 with 1.22 (Martin Perez - 1.61)...has induced 10 double plays in 2018, most on the team and owns a 0.89 GDP/9 rate, good for eighth in the AL.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Gibson has held opponents to a .205 average (15-for-73) with runners in scoring position, eighth best in the AL among pitchers who have faced 55 batters...of those 15 hits, only three have gone for extra bases (one home run, two doubles) and has struck out 201 batters...over his career, is opponents are hitting .266 (197-for-740) with RISP.

- Given 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
- Earned the win in his MLB debut 6/29/13 vs. KC allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings.
- Named the Twins Minor League Player of the Week for May 12, 2013 after tossing a CG SHO.
- Named an Arizona Fall League Rising star in 2012 and the AFL Player of the Week, 10/23/12.
- Selected to the 2011 Futures Game where he tossed 1.1 inning, allowing two hits.
- Named to the 2010 Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star Team.
- Named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week, May 3, 2010.
- Selected in the first round (22nd overall) by the Twins in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri as a senior...major was communications.
- Originally selected by Philadelphia in the 36th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of Greenfield Central High School in Greenfield, IN.
- Named to the All-Big 12 honorable mention team in 2007 and 2008 and All-Big 12 First-Team in 2009 as the Tigers' Friday night starter.
