TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 8, 2003: Hideki Matsui hits a grand slam in his Yankee Stadium debut, leading the Yankees to a 7-3 win over Minnesota.

April 8, 1985: At 46 years, 7 days old, Phil Niekro becomes the second-oldest Opening Day starter of all-time. Niekro makes the start at Boston, allowing 5R in 4.0IP while picking up the loss in a 9-2 Yankees defeat.

April 8, 1974: Hank Aaron breaks Babe Ruth's all-time HR record, hitting No. 715 off former Yankee and then-Dodger Al Downing.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 9, 1996: With snow falling even before Joe DiMaggio's ceremonial first pitch, the Yankees defeat the Kansas City Royals, 7-3, in the Bronx home opener. Newcomer Tino Martinez (replacing Don Mattingly) get booed during pregame introductions.

April 9, 1989: Rickey Henderson records his 800th career stolen base in a 4-3 loss to the Cleveland Indians.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 3-2 on their six-game homestand...swept 2G from Tampa Bay and are 1-2 vs. the Orioles...following an off day on Mon., will begin a six-game road trip: 3G at Boston (Tue.-Thurs.) and 3G at Detroit (4/13-15).

- ▶ Have alternated two wins with two losses over their first 9G this season (W-W-L-L-W-W-L-L-W)...have not been below .500 at any point this season.
- ▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.
- ▶ Are 3-2 thus far on a stretch of 16 of 22G at home (4/3-26).
- ▶ Seven of the Yankees' first 10G are day games (4-2).
- ▶ Have two scheduled off days (4/9, 18) before starting a season-long stretch of games on 18 straight days (4/19-5/6).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Saturday, the Yankees defeated the Orioles, 8-3, at Yankee Stadium...tied a season high with 11H...**RHP Sonny Gray** (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K) earned his first win of the season...**CF Brett Gardner** (2-for-3, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI, 2BB) got aboard four times...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI) extended his RBI streak to 5G, his club-record *home* RBI streak to 14G and his *home* hitting streak to 15G...**SS Didi Gregorius** (0-for-2, 2R, 2BB, 1SB) has drawn 5BB in the first 3G of the series...**C Austin Romine** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI) collected his first RBI since 8/13/17 vs. Boston...**2B Ronald Torreyes** (3-for-4, 2R, 1 double) has multiple hits in three of his last six games dating back to 9/25/17...**LF Jace Peterson** (1-for-3, 1BB) made his Yankees debut and collected his first hit as a Yankee with a sixth-inning single...**RHP David Robertson** (1.2IP, 4K) struck out 4-of-5 batters faced...**Yankees relievers** combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings (2H, 0BB, 6K)

- ▶ Marked just the second time since the 2016 All-Star break that the Yankees scored at least 8R in a game without a HR (also 0HR in a 10-1 win on 8/27/17 vs. Seattle).

NO BULL: **Yankees relievers** combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings (2H, 0BB, 6K) to close out Saturday's win...threw just 43 pitches (Warren-13, Robertson-20, Cessa-10).

- ▶ Have 52K in 34.2IP this season, as their 13.50 K/9.0IP ratio leads all big league bullpens.

SS Didi Gregorius went 0-for-2 but drew 2BB in Saturday's win...**leads the Majors with a 1.413 OPS and is second with a .900 slugging percentage, trailing only Bryce Harper (.917)**...is fourth in MLB with 10RBI, tied for fifth with five doubles and ranks sixth with a .513 OBP.

- ▶ Has 11 hits in 2018, including nine for extra-bases (5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR), **tied with Boston's Xander Bogaerts for the most XBH in MLB this season.**
- ▶ Is the eighth Yankee since 1908 to tally at least 9XBH through the team's first 9G of a season, trailing only Derek Jeter 11XBH in 1999) and Alex Rodriguez (10 in 2007).
- ▶ Is **tied for second in the AL with 8BB** in 39PA in 2018 (20.5%)... drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years w/ NYY...did not draw his eighth (and ninth) walks last season until his 58th game of the year (7/3/17).
- ▶ Has 1SB in each of his last 2G (Fri-Sat. vs. Baltimore), marking his first career consecutive games with SBs.
- ▶ Had his 18-game hitting streak vs. Baltimore snapped on Saturday (10/2/16-4/6/18)...was the longest Yankees hitting streak against the O's since Robinson Canó hit in 19 straight from 6/1/10-7/29/11...batted .405 (30-for-74) with 17R, 8 doubles, 6HR and 21RBI during the streak.
- ▶ In 5G on this homestand, is batting .438/.609/1.125 (7-for-16) with 7R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI, 6BB and 2SB.

THE FULL MONTY: Dating back to 9/16/17, **LHP Jordan Montgomery** has allowed 1-or-0 runs in each of his last four starts, going 2-0 with a 1.21 ERA (22.1IP, 14H, 3ER, 7BB, 18K) during the stretch...opponents are hitting .184 (14-for-76), all singles (no XBH) and LHB are 2-for-15 with 0BB...has never allowed more than 2H to LHB in a game in his career.

THEY SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY: **RHP David Robertson** (born 4/9/85) turns 33 years old on Monday.

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** has RBI in five straight games, the longest RBI streak in the Majors this season.

- ▶ With 2RBI on Saturday, extended his **club-record streak of home games with at least 1RBI to 14, tied for the fourth-longest in the Majors since RBI was made an official statistic in 1920** (see chart)...during the streak (since 9/18/17), is batting .354/.484/.917 (17-for-48) with 15R, 3 doubles, 8HR, 21RBI and 13BB.
- ▶ Has hit safely in 15 straight games at Yankee Stadium (since 9/17/17), **the longest active home hitting streak in the Majors among players currently on 40-man rosters.**
- ▶ His 58 career home runs are tied for the most by any player through 191 career games in Major League history...the all-time record for HRs through 200 career games is 59 by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.
- ▶ Since the start of 2017, is hitting .397 (29-for-73) with 33R, 6 doubles, 12HR, 28RBI and 25BB in 22G vs. Baltimore...in 13 home games in that span, is hitting .422 (19-for-45) with 24R, 4 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI and 15BB.

GOING, GOING, GIAN: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** has 270 home runs in 995 career games...marks the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

- ▶ Reached 2,000 career total bases with a first-inning single in Friday's loss vs. Baltimore.
- ▶ Has homered against all but five of the 30 MLB clubs: Baltimore, Cleveland, Kansas City, Miami, Minnesota...is 5-for-36 (.139) with 0XBH in his career vs. Baltimore.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** rank fourth in the Majors with a .204 opp. BA and a 2.74 ERA (49.1IP, 15ER).

- ▶ **Have held opponents to a .114 BA (4-for-35) with RISP.**
- ▶ Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of their first nine starts, just the second Yankees rotation since at least 1908 to accomplish the feat (also 1952)...no Yankees rotation has begun the season w/ 10GS of 3R-or-less since at least 1908.

WAIT FOR IT: In a span of seven batters in the seventh and eighth innings on Saturday (not incl. Gregorius IBB), three Yankees hitters each saw 10 pitches in their plate appearances: Brett Gardner's leadoff walk and Tyler Austin's two-run single in the seventh, and Jace Peterson's leadoff walk in the eighth.

- ▶ **Yankees hitters** worked 7BB and had just 3K in Saturday's win...marked just the second game since the start of 2015 in which the Yankees drew at least 7BB while striking out no more than three times.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** lead the AL and are tied for the MLB lead this season w/ 43BB...are seeing an average of 4.09 pitches per PA, third-highest in MLB (PHI-4.35, STL-4.19).

BIG TOE: **INF Ronald Torreyes** went 3-for-4 with 2R and 1 double while batting ninth on Saturday...has multiple hits in three of his last 6G dating back to 9/25/17...since joining the Yankees at the start of 2016, has recorded at least 2H and 2R out of the No. 9 spot in the order seven times, while all other Yankees players have combined for eight such games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. BALTIMORE: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (0-0, 1.80 ERA)

LHP Jordan Montgomery will make his second start of the season today vs. Baltimore...the 25-year-old started the Yankees' home opener on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay, taking a no-decision after giving up 2H and 1R in 5.0IP...has given up 1R-or-fewer in four straight starts, *all at home* (dating back to 9/16/17) and has not allowed a HR during the stretch (22.1IP)...has lost just once in his last 10 starts since 8/5/17, and is 2-1 with a 3.08 ERA (49.2IP, 17ER) over the span...made his first Opening Day roster in 2018 after going 9-7 with a 3.88 ERA (155.1IP, 67ER) in 29 starts as a rookie in 2017...never allowed more than 4R in any of his 62 career minor league games (58 starts)...was selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST START: Started the Yankees' home opener on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay and received a no-decision after going 5.0IP and giving up just 2H and 1ER with 4K...tied a career high with 4BB.

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 6-3 with a 3.34 ERA (86.1IP, 32ER) in 16 career starts at Yankee Stadium (15 in 2017, one in 2018)...his 0.73 HR/9.0IP ratio (7HR/86.1IP) at Yankee Stadium is the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher (Betances - 0.51 HR/9.0IP and Robertson - 0.73 HR/9.0IP) since the the Stadium opened in 2009 (min. 75.0IP)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11-of-16 starts...is his fifth consecutive home start, dating back to 9/16/17.

- ✦ Has not allowed a HR over his last eight home starts (since 7/25/17), the second-longest streak of homerless starts at the current Yankee Stadium (David Phelps-9 from 9/19/12-6/2/14).

VS. BALTIMORE: Made five starts against the Orioles in 2017 and went 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA (27.0IP, 8ER)...in three starts at home, tallied a 2-0 record with a 2.50 ERA (18.0IP, 5ER)...earned the victory in his last start against Baltimore on 9/16/17, while shutting out the O's in 6.0IP (4H, 1BB, 6K)...has started against Baltimore more than any other club.

- ✦ Is 4-2 with a 3.04 ERA (71.0IP, 24ER) in 14 career starts vs. AL East opponents.

SPRING TRAINING: Made six appearances (five starts) in official Grapefruit League play, going 2-2 with a 3.43 ERA (21.0IP, 8ER) and 20K...led the Yankees in innings pitched and strikeouts...also threw in a minor league spring game on 3/27.

2017: In his first Major League season, went 9-7 with a 3.88 ERA (155.1IP, 140H, 72R/67ER, 51BB, 144K, 21HR) in 29 starts.

- ✦ Finished sixth in AL Rookie of the Year voting, receiving one second-place vote and one third-place vote...led AL rookies in starts, strikeouts and innings pitched...tied for second in wins (Los Angeles-AL's Parker Bridwell, 10-3)...finished second in strikeouts among MLB rookies to Colorado's Germán Márquez (147).
- ✦ His 144K were the sixth-highest single-season total by a rookie in Yankees history: Russ Ford (209 in 1910), Al Downing (171 in 1963), Stan Bahnsen (162 in 1968), Doc Medich (145 in 1973) and Ray Caldwell (145 in 1911).

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER AT BOSTON: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (2-0, 1.38 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his third start of the season on Tue. at Boston...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to the off day on Monday...is the first Yankees starter to win his first two outings of a season since Andy Pettitte reeled off three straight wins to begin 2013...is one of 13 pitchers to begin this season 2-0...made his first career Opening Day start, yielding 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings in a win on 3/29 at Toronto...at 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP, 5ER) in three starts this spring...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: In Wednesday's 7-2 win vs. Tampa Bay, won his second consecutive start to begin the season by yielding 2ER over 7.1IP (5H, 1BB, 7K)...gave up an RBI double to Cron in the first, and his second run scored against the bullpen in the eighth on a Span sac fly...was the deepest a Yankees starter had pitched within the team's first 6G since Andy Pettitte tossed 8.0IP on 4/4/13 vs. Boston.

ROAD RULES: Allowed just 1H over 5.2 scoreless appearances to win his first road start of the year on Opening Day in Toronto.
