METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 0-1 on their five-game road trip...The Mets are 1-9 in their last 10 games, 5-21 in their last 26 games and 7-26 in their last 33 contests...New York is 5-20 in June...New York has gone 11-straight series without a series win (nine series losses, two splits) since sweeping Arizona from May 18-20.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 18-21 on the road this season... New York is 5-13 in its last 18 road games...New York swept a three-game series in Miami, April 9-11, earlier this year.

FIRST MLB START: Pablo Lopez will be the fourth pitcher to make his first major league start against the Mets this year...The three others have combined to go 2-0 and allow two runs in 17.0 innings.

SINCE MAY: The Mets are 15-38 since May 1...The club is hitting .229 with 56 homers during that span...The pitching staff has posted a 4.63 ERA since the beginning of May.

HOMERS: The Mets have hit 23 home runs in their last 20 games and 37 homers in their last 33 games, but, 26 of those have been solo blasts.

FLORES FLOURISHING: Wilmer Flores has driven in nine runs in his last six games and 12 RBI in his last 11 games...Flores has reached base in his last 14 games with a plate appearance, tied for the longest streak of his career (also: April 11-27, 2015)... Over his last 33 games, Flores is batting .297 (30-101) with eight doubles, four home runs, 20 RBI, 11 runs scored, 10 nine walks and a .353 OBP.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has a .446 OBP since joining the Mets on May 22...Has reached base safely in each of his last 14 games dating to June 15 (.520 OBP in that time)...Bautista is hitting .355 (11-31) with five doubles, two homers, nine RBI and 10 runs scored over his last 12 games...He has drawn 15 base-on-balls in his last 14 games and 24 walks in 34 games with the Mets since May 22.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: He has a 15.2% walk rate for the year, ranking ninth in the majors...Conforto has four doubles, three homers, 12 walks and eight RBI in his last 15 games...Conforto is batting .268 (15-56) with a .400 on-base percentage during that span.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is hitting .367 (18-49) with two doubles, two homers, eight RBI and five runs scored in his last 11 games... Seven of the 11 games have been multi-hit efforts...Cabrera has 44 RBI this season, his second-highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...Cabrera had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half.

METS-MARLINS NOTES: The Mets have had a winning record in Miami in two of the last three years.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom has allowed one earned run or less in 10 of his last 12 starts...He had a franchise-record eight straight starts allowing one or fewer runs from April 21-June 2... He has allowed one run or less in 56 of his 123 career starts (46 percent).

SECOND TO DOC: DeGrom has 1.69 ERA after his first 16 starts this year, the second-lowest mark in team history after 16 starts... Only Dwight Gooden had a lower ERA (1.68 ERA) in 1985.

RANKINGS: DeGrom leads the majors with a 1.69 ERA...He's third in the NL and ninth in the majors with 126 strikeouts, fourth in the NL in WHIP (1.01) and is second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .549 OPS...He leads the NL and ranks second in the majors with a 1.46 road ERA.

BULLPEN: The pen has 21 losses, the most in the majors...The pen is 3-13 with a 6.40 ERA (82 earned runs/115.1 innings) in their last 33 games (since May 25).

FROM ELIAS: Tim Peterson has held righthanders to 0-21, which is the longest hitless start-of-career streak for any Mets pitcher... Peterson has allowed one run in his last 9.1 innings and two runs in his in first 11.1 innings (1.59 ERA) in the majors.

BRANDON NIMMO: Is third in the NL and eighth in the majors with a .395 on-base percentage, fourth in the NL and 12th in the majors with a .551 slugging percentage and is fourth in the NL and ninth in the majors with a .946 OPS...He is tied for fourth in the majors with six triples...Nimmo is tied for second in the majors with 12 hit by pitches...Nimmo has a career-high 12 home runs...He has 10 homers since May 23 tied for the ninth-most in the majors during that span...Nimmo's previous professional career-high was 11 homers in 97 games (392 at-bats) with Las Vegas (AAA) in 2011.

AMED ROSARIO: Walked a career-high three times last night...Is hitting .282 (11-39) with a .349 OBP over his last 14 games.

MINOR PROMOTIONS: Anthony Kay, New York's 2016 first-round pick, was promoted to St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League...Catcher Ali Sanchez was promoted to St. Lucie and RHP Stephen Nogosek was promoted to Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League.

LAST START: DeGrom tonight makes his 17th start of the season and third against Miami...In his last start, tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, on five hits while striking out six...Suffered his third loss of the season despite registering his eighth-straight quality start in the Mets' 8-3 defeat at Citi Field...Fell to 1-3 in his last four starts (has a 2.17 ERA in that stretch).

VS. MIAMI: DeGrom tonight faces the Marlins for the third time this season and 15th time in his career...Last pitched vs. Miami on May 23 at Citi Field...Took a no decision despite tossing 7.0-shutout innings...Allowed four hits and two free passes while striking out eight in that start...Has not recieved a decision in two starts vs. Miami this season and holds a 2.77 ERA (four earned runs/13.0 innings) vs. the club in 2018... Allowed four runs, earned, in 6.0 innings in his last start at Marlins Park on April 10.

deGROMINANT RUN: Since April 21, deGrom owns a 1.18 ERA (10 earned runs/76.1 innings) in 12 starts, the best mark in the majors, yet the Mets are 3-9 in those 12 outings...During that time, has struck out 96 and walked 21...His 32.0 percent strikeout rate ranks third in the NL in that span and his 0.35 HR/9 rate leads the league.

ROAD WARRIOR: Is 3-1 with an NL-best 1.46 road ERA (eight earned runs/49.1 innings) in eight road starts this season...That is the third-lowest road ERA through 79 team games in Mets history...Only Nolan Ryan (1.01 ERA/five road starts in 1971) and Bob Ojeda (1.29 ERA/seven road starts) have had a lower road ERA to this point in the season (min. five road starts)..

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the majors with a 1.69 ERA (19 earned runs/101.1 innings)... His 126 strikeouts this season are third-most in the NL and ninth-most in the majors... Ranks second in the league with a .549 opponent OPS and paces the league with a 0.44 HR/9 rate...Leads all major league pitchers with a 4.9 WAR according to Baseball Reference.

deGROMETRICS: According to FanGraphs, only Aaron Nola (26.7 percent) has limited hard contact more than deGrom (27.8 percent) in the NL this season...DeGrom also produces the second-most soft contact (24.1 percent), behind teammate Zack Wheeler (24.7 percent)...Leads the majors with a 2.14 FIP...Has stranded 84.7 percent of his baserunners allowed this season, second in the NL (Jon Lester, 86.2 percent).

ESCAPE ARTIST: Has held opponents to a .130 (9-69) batting average with RISP this season, third-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the NL...That includes a 3-36 (.083) mark with RISP and two outs...Opponents are 5-55 (.091) with 29 strikeouts with RISP in his last 11 starts overall...Opponents are hitless in 12 at-bats with one sac fly and nine strikeouts with the bases loaded vs. deGrom this year.

EXTRA BASES: Has allowed nine extra-base hits in his last three starts (seven doubles, one triple, one homer) after allowing 10 XBH total in his first 13 starts of the season... Only 25 percent (19 of 75) of the hits deGrom has allowed this season have gone for extra bases (13 doubles, one triple, five homers)...His .286 opponent slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors...His 19 extra-base hits allowed in 101.1 innings are tied with teammate Zack Wheeler for the fewest among the 100 MLB pitchers with at least 75.0 innings pitched this season.

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in 10 of his 16 starts this season, tied with Justin Verlander, Blake Snell and Mike Foltynewicz for the most such starts in the majors...In his 123-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 56 times (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 123-career games...Has 18-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, fourth-most in the majors since his debut...Only Jake Arrieta (25), Clayton Kershaw (22) and Chris Sale (21) have more.

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD: Has allowed home runs at a rate of 0.44 HR/9 this season (five home runs/101.1 innings), the lowest rate in the league...Had a 0.45 HR/9 rate in his rookie season in 2014...Only three Mets pitchers have had multiple seasons with a HR/9 rate under 0.50 in at least 130.0 innings (Dwight Gooden, five times; Tom Seaver, three; David Cone, two).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (3-5, 3.69)

LAST START: Pitched a season-high-tying 7.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on six hits with seven strikeouts and no walks in the Mets' 4-3, walk-off victory on June 26 vs. Pittsburgh...Was his fifth-career start with at least seven strikeouts and no walks (first since May 20, 2016)...Was his fourth quality start in five trips to the mound in June.

GONE FISHING: Matz has pitched 13.1-consecutive scoreless innings at Marlins Park, including back-to-back scoreless outings there...In three-career starts in Miami, he is 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA (two earned runs/18.1 innings)...Stephen Strasburg is the only visiting pitcher to make three-straight scoreless outings at Marlins Park.
