TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jay Horwitz' Mets** and **Game 8** (1-6) of a 9-game homestand that included the **Brewers'** first 3-game sweep here since **July 2015** and a **2-1 series loss** to the **Marlins**...is **Game 15** (5-9) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play **13 of 16 games** at **Great American Ball Park** (2-2 vs Atl, 2-1 at Min, 0-3 vs Mil, 1-2 vs Mia, 0-1 vs NYM)...following tomorrow afternoon's game the Redlegs hit the road for 7 games on the **West Coast** at LAD's **Dodger Stadium** (4g) and at SF's **AT&T Park** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: At **.653** (32-17) the Mets have the highest winning percentage at **Great American Ball Park** of any team in the National League, including the Reds (**630-603-1, .511**)...beginning **9/24/13** the Reds have lost **24** of the **last 29 games** vs NYM (**0-2** in 2013, **2-4** in 2014, **0-7** in 2015, **0-6** in 2016, **3-4** in 2017, **0-1** in 2018), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14-9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets... dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**...Reds vs Mets information is on media guide **Page 325**.

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES: Former Reds teammates **Jay Bruce** and **Todd Frazier**, returning here this series as members of the **Mets**, provided 2 of the most memorable moments in **Great American Ball Park** history... in the 3-2 win on **9/28/10 vs Hou**, **Bruce** hit a walkoff homer (off **Tim Lincecum**) to clinch the Reds' first **NL Central Division championship** since **1995**...also in a walkoff, **Frazier** won the **All-Star Game Home Run Derby** here in **2015**.

BATTER UP: In their **last 14 games** beginning **4/23**, the **Reds** lead all **Major League** teams in **walks** and **on-base percentage** (.353) while tying the **Nationals** for the **National League** lead in **runs scored** (78, 5.57 r/g)...in that same span, **Reds pitchers** are **5-9, 4.99**.

RISPY BUSINESS: With a minimum of 25 plate apps with runners in scoring position, **Jesse Winker** ranks fifth in the **Major Leagues** and second in the **National League** in **hitting with RISP** at **.429**...**Joey Votto** is ninth in the majors and fifth in the NL in **hitting with RISP** at **.419** while ranking third in the majors and second in the NL in **on-base percentage with RISP** at **.548**...**Eugenio Suárez** ranks seventh in the NL in **hitting with RISP** at **.400**.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: **Jesse Winker** leads National League rookies in **walks** and **multi-hit games** (tied) while ranking second among NL rookies in **hits** (tied), **doubles** (tied) and **on-base percentage**...with a minimum **80 plate apps** batting **leadoff**, he ranks fifth among all **NL batters** in **batting average** at that position (.269) and fourth in **on-base percentage** (.376)...his **22-game on-base streak**, snapped last night (21-71, .296, .386obp), was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the second-longest **active on-base streak** in the Major Leagues (Phi's **Odubel Herrera**, 35g).

IN A PINCH: In his **last 5 pinch-hit apps**, **Jesse Winker** walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled...he is the first Reds batter to **reach base safely** in **5 consecutive pinch-hit apps** since **Todd Frazier** did it from **4/20-5/2, 2012** and the first Reds batter to **produce a hit** in **4 straight pinch-hit apps** since **Brayan Pena** from **7/8-8/9, 2014**...courtesy **Elias**.

REHABBING: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** (right shoulder strain) **yesterday** without issue threw **19 pitches** during **live batting practice** at the team's player development complex in **Goodyear**...**Thursday**, he is scheduled to throw 1.0 inning in an extended spring training game...RHP **Anthony DeSclafani** (left oblique strain) **tomorrow** is scheduled to pitch in an extended spring training game in **Goodyear** (3ip, 45-50 pitches).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **5-12** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**... bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...later in the year, the team will conduct a thorough managerial search for a permanent replacement...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory** on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win** vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...since 1900, he is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at **least 5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**... the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

THE NEW GUYS: Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA Louisville after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA Pensacola...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' **33 Major League debuts** over the **last 3 seasons** are the most of any team in either league and include **4 this season** (**3B Alex Blandino** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Tanner Rainey** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Zack Weiss** on 4/12 vs StL, **IF/OF Rosell Herrera** on 4/26 vs Atl)...have **5 rookies** on the active roster (**Blandino**, **Herrera**, **OF Jesse Winker**, **RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**) and another rookie on the disabled list (**RHP Rookie Davis**)...the Reds' **Opening Day roster** included **5 rookies** (**Mahle**, **Stephens**, **Weiss**, **Ervin**, **Winker**), **21 players age 30 & under**, **17 players age 27 & under** and **11 players age 25 & under**...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, the average age for the Reds' 25-man **Opening Day roster** (**27 years, 196 days**) was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies** (**26.334**) and ahead of the **Marlins** (**27.351**)...in **2017**, the Reds began a season with **7 rookies** on their **Opening Day roster** for the first time in researchable history, per **Elias**...last year's **Opening Day Reds roster** was the youngest in the Major Leagues (**26.355**).

HR DERBY CHAMPION
 In 2015 at **Great American Ball Park**, **Todd Frazier** became the third Reds player to win the **All-Star Game's Home Run Derby** and only the second player ever to win it at his home field (Chi's **Ryne Sandberg**, 1990)... **Frazier** defeated **Prince Fielder** (14-13), **Josh Donaldson** (10-9) and then **Joc Pederson** on a walkoff (15-14)...listed below are Reds' **All-Star Game Home Run Derby** participants:

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tonight is making his eighth start of the season and his **23rd Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **Mets**...in the **10-4 win** on **4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...was charged with 2 more runs scored off **Cody Reed**...in 2017 led National League rookies in ERA and opponents' batting average (.202) while ranking eighth among rookies in strikeouts...the Reds went 7-8 in his 15 starts...with 8 quality starts ranked second on the staff behind **Scott Feldman's** 9 QS...produced all 8 quality starts in his last 12 apps beginning 7/8 (3-6, 2.84), including 6 QS in his last 8 apps beginning 7/30 (2-3, 2.37)...beginning 7/8 and among pitchers with at least 12 starts, his 2.84 ERA ranked seventh in the Major Leagues behind **Corey Kluber** (1.79), **Justin Verlander** (1.92), **Kyle Hendricks** (2.19), **Luis Severino** (2.40), **Jake Arrieta** (2.48) and **Marcus Stroman** (2.73)...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tomorrow will make his eighth start of the season and his **24th Major League** appearance and start...will be his **third career appearance** vs the **Mets**...was born in **Syosset, NY** and graduated from **Southington (CT) High School**...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

- His next hit will be the 600th of his Major League career.
- Played the last 3 games after missing 4 starts with inflammation in his right shoulder.

- Has a season-high 6-game hitting streak (7-19, .368, 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 4bb, 4r, .478obp)...is the longest active hitting streak on the team.

- On 5/1 vs Mil, in his third Major League appearance made his only start, played 2B...in his first plate appearance singled off Chase Anderson for his first career hit.
