**ROSTER MOVES**—The Rays have selected C **Nick Ciuffo** (SHOO-fo) from Triple-A Durham and reinstated OF **Mallex Smith** (viral infection) from the 10-day DL...to make room for Ciuffo on the 40-man roster, C **Adam Moore** was placed on the restricted list...Ciuffo, 23, was selected by the Rays in the first round of the 2013 June Draft and hit .262 (58-for-221) with 11 2B, 5 HR and 28 RBI in 60 games for the Bulls...Smith ranks 6th in the AL with a .307 avg., and is batting .385/.444/.538 (25-for-65) in 16 games since moving to the leadoff spot on Aug 5...in addition, RH **Jake Faria** was added to the taxi squad and will be recalled tomorrow.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have won consecutive games and 11 of their last 13 games since Aug 19, their best 13-game stretch since July 12-30, 2014 (11-2)...they are a season-high 10 games over .500, matching their high-water mark under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash** (40-30 through games of June 20, 2015)...with a win today, the Rays would improve to 11 games over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71, and it would give them their best 14-game stretch since July 9-27, 2013.

- + The Rays have outscored opponents, 65-36, in the last 13 games.
- + The Rays are 24-16 (.600) since the All-Star break, 6th-best winning pct. in the majors and 4th-best in the AL since then.
- + The Rays are 3-1-1 in their last five road series after going 1-7-0 in their previous eight road series...they are 3-2 on this 8-game road trip to Atlanta (1-1), Cleveland (2-1) and Toronto (0-0).
- + The Rays are 8 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card...if they gain a game today, it will be the closest they have been to the second Wild Card spot since they were 7 GB through June 1.
- + The Rays hold a 5-11 record all-time on Labor Day, but are 5-3 at home and 0-8 on the road...last year they beat the Twins, 11-4.

**SQUAD GOALS**—At 73-63, here is what the Rays would need to do in their remaining 26 games to reach the following records:

**RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS**—The Rays are 7-2 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 2-1 on the road), and their loss in the last meeting on Aug 12 at TOR snapped a 5-game winning streak over them...the Rays have allowed 4 runs or fewer in all 9 games against them, 2 runs or fewer seven times and 1 run or fewer four times...they yielded 3 runs in the last series, their fewest allowed in a 3-game series (or more) since Sep 29-Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL (3) and fewest on the road since June 19-21, 2015 at CLE (3)...they have won the season series in eight of the last 10 years and are 192-169 (.532) all-time against them, their most wins against any opponent.

- + This is the second of three consecutive road trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays in the final series of the season from Sep 28-30...while the Rays played the Blue Jays only six times through their first 115 games, this series continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—Yesterday at CLE, the Rays recorded 8 XBH, their most since July 14 at MIN (9)...they have totaled 15 XBH in their last 2 games, and it is their first time with 7 XBH (or more) in consecutive games since May 16-17, 2016 at TOR—for the record, they have never done this in three consecutive games...the Rays are averaging 5.63 runs in their last 11 games, including 5 runs or more in eight of those 11 games and double-digit hits in nine...the Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .257 avg. behind the Red Sox (.268) and Indians (.258), and they rank 3rd with a .329 OBP...in comparison, they were 12th with a .245 avg. and 10th with a .317 OBP last season...they haven't finished in the top five in avg. since 2005 (.274, 3rd), nor in the top five in on-base pct. since 2013 (.329, 3rd).

- + The Rays have three of the AL's top 11 hitters for avg. in **Mallex Smith** (.307, 6th), **Joey Wendle** (.298, 10th) and **Matt Duffy** (.297, 11th)...only once in club history have three qualifying players finished with a .290 avg. or better (Bartlett/Crawford/Zobrist, 2009).
- + The Rays have totaled 121 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors...they are on pace for 144 HR, which would be 84 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 24

games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 26-5 (.839) when hitting multiple homers.

- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 98 SB and 1st with 82 HBP.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 41st time the Rays will use an opener and 23rd time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 72 of 136 games (52.9 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.34 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 40-34 with traditional starters and 33-29 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 54 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 45 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—54.8 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 549 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 666.2 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 50 apps of at least 50 pitches and 24 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 75 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 119 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 2000 Red Sox (120);
- + 58 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1988 Yankees (59);
- + 39 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (40);
- + 27 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers (27) and most in the AL since the 1917 Philadelphia Athletics (34)

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**—Last night **Andrew Velazquez** became the 21st rookie used by the Rays and 11th player to make his major league debut for the Rays this season, both single-season club records...these records will be extended when **Nick Ciuffo** makes his major league debut...15 of the 29 players on the active roster are rookies, including nine of the 15 pitchers (60 pct.)...Rays rookies have combined for 601 games, most in the majors, and Rays rookie pitchers have combined for 475.2 IP, most in the AL...the Rays have used a

rookie starting pitcher in 24 of their 40 games since the All-Star break.

+ According to *The Athletic's Jayson Stark*, the Rays are only the second team since the franchise's inaugural season to use at least eight rookie pitchers in 12+ games and at least eight rookie position players in 12+ games, joining the 2013 Astros that finished 51-111.

**RAYS ON THE TUBE**—FOX Sports Sun will premiere an all-new episode of "Inside the Rays" tomorrow following the conclusion of the Rays-Blue Jays game..."Inside the Rays: Worst to First" recaps the historic 2008 season as the team went from losing 96 games in 2007 to winning 97 games in 2008 and becoming American League Champions.

**LAST OUTING**—Last pitched in relief on Fri at CLE, when he retired his first 2 BF on 8 pitches but needed 15 pitches for the final out of the 8th inning, yielding 2 runs on 2 hits, 1 BB, 2 WP and 3 SB...last started on Tues at ATL, and faced the minimum in the 1st inning, erasing a 1-out single with a caught stealing...was replaced for a pinch-hitter with runners at the corners and 2 outs in the 2nd inning.

**A NEW LOOK**—Has made 22 starts, all since May 26 vs. BAL, three more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...is the first pitcher to total 20 starts and 20 relief apps in a season since TOR **Esmil Rogers** (20 starts, 24 relief apps) in 2013, and the first rookie since MIN **Joe Mays** (20 starts, 29 relief apps) in 1999...before Mays, the last rookie to do it was LAD **Orel Hershiser** (20 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1984.

- + This will be the 41st time the Rays use an opener, all of them since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.76 ERA (32.2-IP, 10-ER) in his 22 starts.
- + Seventeen of his 22 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).
- + Has pitched to a 1.64 ERA (22-IP, 4-ER) in the 1st inning.

**MAKING THE LEAP**—Since the start of June, is 1-2 with a 2.36 ERA (45.2-IP, 12-ER) and .191 opp avg. (31-for-162) in 37 apps (20 starts) to lower his season ERA from 4.66.

- + Ranks among AL rookies in apps (46, 6th) and starts (22, 1st)...min. 50 IP, is 2nd among AL rookies with a .188 opp avg. and 3rd with a 10.90 SO/9 IP ratio.
- + Has only allowed 1 XBH in 83 PA against lefties this season (double).
- + Has pitched to a 4.78 ERA (26.1-IP, 15-R/14-ER) on the road, including a 7.45 ERA (9.2-IP, 9-R/8-ER) in his last 8 road apps (5 starts) since July 15...in comparison, his 0.93 ERA (29-IP, 3-ER) at home is 3rd-best in the majors (min. 20 IP).

**BRINGING THE HEAT**—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

- + Last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Fastball in the organization for a second consecutive season.

**QUIRKS OF THE OPENER**—Has a 11.85 SO/9 IP ratio as a starter...min. 20 starts, that would rank 2nd all-time among rookies behind CHC **Kerry Wood** (12.58) in 1998...the AL rookie record is held by TEX **Yu Darvish** (10.40) in 2012.

- + He has made 6 starts this season without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of LAD **Sandy Koufax** (3) in 1958, among others...from June 7–July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing LAD **Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), LAD **Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and LAD **Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP)...according to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

**FROM THE OTHER SIDE**—Is winless in all 22 starts, passing Jason Hammel (17) in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history...his 22 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)—no other pitcher has made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 8 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing PIT **Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

**ELITE COMPANY**—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Has reached base safely three times in consecutive games...batting .333/.429/.476 (14-for-42) with 2 HR, 6 RBI over his last 12 games (all starts).
- + His avg. was below .200 as late as July 29 (.196)...since then, is batting .330/.411/.515 (32-for-97) with 3 2B, 5 HR and 14 RBI in 29 games (28 starts).
- + Min. 75 PA, since the start of August, ranks among AL rookie leaders in avg. (.330, 2nd) and on-base pct. (.407, 1st)...also ranks 3rd with 31 hits.
- + On Aug 7 vs. BAL., became the fifth in club history to hit a walk-off homer before his 23rd birthday and second this season, joining Jake Bauers.
- + Has appeared in 62 games and made 60 starts (52-SS, 8-2B)...has 12 errors, tied with Matt Duffy for the team lead, including 7 in his last 32 games.
- + Entered the season ranked by Baseball America as the No. 19 prospect in the minors...homed in his major league debut on May 22 vs. BOS.

- + Is 1-for-his-last 21 and 4-for-his-last-58...on Sat at CLE, his 5th-inning double snapped a 0-for-16, his first extra-base hit since Aug 2 vs. LAA.
- + Batting .145/.267/.274 (18-for-124) with 4 HR and 18 RBI in 38 games (35 starts) since the All-Star break, after .252/.368/.496 in the first half.
- + Since his June 7 recall, ranks among major league rookies in doubles (17, tied for 1st), RBI (36, 5th), extra-base hits (28, 4th) and walks (44, 2nd).
- + Has 9 HR in 255 AB with the Rays, compared to 5 HR in 197 AB with Triple-A Durham...his 14 HR between the two levels tie a career high (2016).
- + 28 of his 51 hits (54.9 pct.) this season have gone for extra bases (17-2B, 2-3B, 9-HR), 5th-highest rate in the majors among players with 150 PA.
- + Has appeared in 74 games and made 69 starts (52-1B, 11-LF, 4-DH, 2-RF)...entered the season ranked by Baseball America as the No. 45 prospect.
