TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** lost to Seattle in a makeup from earlier this season and fell to 1-2 against the Mariners this year...today's game was a makeup from April 8th when the game was postponed due to expected snow and cold temperatures at Target Field...tonight's game started after a rain delay of one hour and 42 minutes...the Twins have lost consecutive games for the first time since dropping three straight to Cincinnati and Toronto from April 30-May 2...fall to 7-8 at home and 1-2 against the Mariners in 2018...the Twins will visit Seattle for a three game set from May 25-27...the Twins now fall to 5-5 against American League West opponents this year...only their second time getting shutout in 2018 (last 4/9 vs. HOU)...fall to 3-7 in one-run games.
- **JAKE ODORIZZI** did not factor into the decision after shutting out Seattle through 6.0 innings, allowing four hits and one walk with seven strikeouts...entered the game 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 IP, 2 ER) at Target Field in three starts...gave up leadoff doubles in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings but stranded all three of them...shut out the Mariners through 6.0 innings, his second outing of 6.0+ shutout innings this season (3/28 at Baltimore)...did not allow a home run for the first time since April 10 against Houston, snapping a five-game streak in which he allowed a home run.
- **JOE MAUER** (1-for-4) singled in the sixth inning to extend his hitting streak against the Mariners to nine games and is now hitting .306 (11-for-36) since the beginning of 2017 against Seattle...is now hitting .333 (10-for-30) in nine games as a designated hitter in 2018.
- **ROBBIE GROSSMAN** was ejected in the bottom of the fifth for arguing balls and strikes, his first career ejection.
- **EHIRE ADRIANZA** (1-for-3) singled in the third inning for the Twins first hit of the game...now hitting .304 (7-for-23) against lefties this year.
- **MATT MAGILL** held the Mariners scoreless in 1.0 inning of work in the 7th, his fourth consecutive scoreless outing and sixth overall since his contract was selected by the Twins.

MARINERS NOTES:

- **THE MARINERS** beat the Twins 1-0 and took the third out of three games against Minnesota at Target Field in 2018...the M's are now 9-6 over their last 15 games and 19-13 over their last 32 games...won their fourth game of 2018 in which they scored three or fewer runs and improve to 4-12 in such contests...this was the Mariners 19th game against an AL Central opponent, earning their 12th win of the season against the division, which is best in baseball...Seattle concluded their seven game road trip going 4-3...Seattle entered the day with a .609 winning percentage on the road, the fifth best in the AL and are now 15-9 on the road...improve to 8-6 in one-run games.
- **WADE LEBLANC** did not factor into the decision after shutting out Minnesota through 6.0 innings, allowing only three hits and striking out 4...retired the first eight batters of the game before allowing a hit to Ehire Adrianza in the third but then retired the next five batters he faced...this was his third start of the year for Seattle, entering the game was 0-0 with a 1.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 1 ER) as a starter and 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (22.2 IP, 8 ER) overall...this was his second straight start without giving up a walk and fifth time overall without giving up a free pass in 2018.

- **DEE GORDON** (1-for-4) doubled to lead off the eighth inning and scored the first run of the game...Gordon is now hitting .414 (24-for-58) with five doubles in his last 13 games.
- **JEAN SEGURA** (2-for-3) singled in the first inning and doubled in the fourth to finish the seven-game road trip hitting .414 (12-for-29) with three runs scored and seven RBI...his sacrifice bunt in the eighth led to an error by Logan Morrison, which allowed the first run to score.
- **JAMES PAZOS** pitched a scoreless seventh inning to extend his scoreless innings streak to 13.1 over his last 12 games...entered the game tied for the second longest scoreless innings streak in the AL
