## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 8-4 in their last 12 home games vs. NL East opponents and 13-6 in their last 19 overall games vs. NL East.
- ♦ 15 of the D-backs' last 18 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 9 times; 2 runs - 4 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz**, in his last 4 starts, is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (2 ER in 28.0 IP), .184 opp. average and 20 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 27 games, is hitting .408 (42-for-103)/1.236 OPS with 9 doubles, 9 homers, 22 RBI and 13 walks.
  - Has reached base safely in 40 of his last 41 games.
- ♦ **David Peralta**, in his last 21 home games, is batting .471 (41-for-87)/.489 OBP/.759 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 14 RBI and 3 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has reached base via hit or walk in 18 straight home starts (hit safely in 16 games), hitting .385 (25-for-65)/1.059 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 11 RBI and 11 walks.

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 5-3, vs. Braves.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** (11-5) allowed 1 run with 9 strikeouts in 6.0 innings...his 223 strikeouts are tied with Dan Haren for the eighth most in a season in franchise history.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** extended his hitting streak to 8 games and reached base 5 times going 2-for-2 with a homer and 3 walks.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** had a 2-run double in the third inning.

## GOLDSCHMIDT HITTING .300

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .300 for the first time this season, after being at .198 on May 22...in 91 games since May 23, is batting .350 (124-for-354)/.443 OBP/.661 SLG/1.104 OPS with 22 doubles, 2 triples, 28 homers, 69 RBI and 56 walks.
- ♦ Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau, Goldschmidt is the first player in the liveball era (since 1920) to increase their batting average to .300 or higher in a season in which it was under .200 at some point after at least 200 plate appearances.

## GOLDSCHMIDT'S SIGHTS ON RECORDS

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt's** next home run at Chase Field will be his 100th, the lone player to reach the mark.
- ♦ His 649 walks are 1 shy of Luis Gonzalez's club record 650 walks.
- ♦ Is the franchise leader (min. 1000 PA) with a .299 average, .400 OBP, .536 SLG, .935 OPS...is second (to Gonzalez) with 1,073 games (1,194), 703 runs (780), 1,168 hits (1,337), 262 doubles (310), 209 homers (224) and 709 RBI (774).

## DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 21 games remaining (11 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .543 winning pct. is higher than the Rockies (.524) and Dodgers (.498) [source: ESPN.com].
  - 13 games vs. NL West foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
  - 8 games vs. first place teams from other divisions: 2 vs. Braves (@ home), 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).
- \*\*\*Entering Thursday's game, the D-backs next 17 games are against teams currently in first place: ATL, COL, HOU, CHC and COL...per Elias Sports Bureau, if each team leads their respective divisions at the time of those games, the 17-game streak vs. first-place teams would be a Major League record...the current record is 14 by the 1993 Orioles (TOR, CHW, KC, CHW) and 1996 Tigers (TEX, NYY, TEX, CLE).

**BUCHHOLZ AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ In his 12th Major League season...signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.
- ◆ 2-time AL All-Star (2010, '13).
- ◆ 2-time World Champion (Red Sox in 2007, '13).
- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wil-son Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Sixth in 2010 AL Cy Young voting (17-7, 2.33 ERA).
- ◆ Boston's supplemental first round pick (No. 42) in 2005 (for Pedro Martinez leaving for free agency).

**WHAT TO KNOW...**

- ◆ In his last 6 starts, is 3-1 with a 1.32 ERA (6 ER in 41.0 IP), .220 opp. average and 32 strikeouts.
- ◆ His 1.55 ERA (11 ER in 64.0 IP) in his last 10 starts since June 17 is the first in the NL/third in the Majors [min. 50.0 IP], behind Chris Sale/BOS (0.53) and Blake Snell/TB (1.42).
- ◆ Among NL starters since June 1 (min. 8 GS), his .875 winning pct. (7-1) ranks second to Austub Gomber (1.000; 5-0) and his 2.11 ERA is second behind Jacob deGrom (1.76).

**LAST START**

- ◆ Tossed 5.0 innings of 1-run baseball, allowing 4 hits with 4 strikeouts, but did not figure in a 3-2 loss @ Dodgers on Sept. 2.

**VS. BRAVES**

- ◆ Is 1-1 with a 6.06 ERA (11 ER in 16.1 IP), .273 average, 9 strikeouts, 13 walks in 3 starts.
- ◆ Last matched up against Atlanta on April 28, 2016, taking the loss after allowing 5 runs on 8 hits in 6.1 innings.

**HOME COOKIN'**

- ◆ Is 3-0 with a 2.73 ERA (9 ER in 29.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 29 strikeouts and 7 walks in 5 starts @ Chase Field.
- ◆ Has allowed 2 or fewer runs in 4 of his 5 starts at home and 1 or fewer 3 times.

**STREAKING**

- ◆ Has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 10 consecutive starts since June 17, tied with Zack Greinke (June 18-Aug. 7) for the longest streak by a D-backs pitcher this season.

**PLAYER PROFILE**

- ◆ Wore No. 11 in Boston because he was given the nickname "Sticks" as a kid for being skinny.
- ◆ Married to Lindsay, a former model on the TV show "Deal or No Deal" and featured in *People* magazine's "100 Most Beautiful People"... introduced by Donald Trump at a 2008 UFC event in Anaheim and married at Trump National Golf Club in Palos Verdes, Calif. in 2009.

**QUITE AN AUGUST**

- ◆ In 5 starts in August, is 3-1 with a 1.25 ERA (5 ER in 36.0 IP), .220 opp. average and 28 strikeouts.
- ◆ Among NL starters in August (min. 4 GS), was seventh in ERA, tied for seventh in runs allowed and 12th in innings.

**SINCE JOINING THE SQUAD**

- ◆ Since his D-backs debut on May 20, ranks among NL leaders in ERA (2nd, 2.05), winning pct. (T-4th, .778), baserunners per 9.0 innings (7th, 9.59), walks per 9.0 innings (8th, 1.96), opp. OBP (8th, .268), WHIP (8th, 1.03), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (15th, 3.75).

**5.0+ INNINGS, 3 RUNS OR LESS**

- ◆ His 10 straight starts with 5.0+ innings and 3 runs or less are the most by a D-backs starter this season (8, Patrick Corbin, March 29-May 9).
- ◆ His streak is tied for third-longest by a D-backs starter since 2011 with Patrick Corbin (Oct. 2, 2012-May 20, 2013), behind Zack Godley (11, April 26-July 5, 2017).

**VS. LEFTIES**

- ◆ Left-handers are hitting .209 (14-for-67) in his last 6 starts...overall, lefties are hitting .193 (32-for-166).

**RISP-Y BUSINESS**

- ◆ Limiting opponents to a .157 average (18-for-115) with runners on base and .155 average (9-for-58) with runners in scoring position, including .143 (4-for-28) with RISP and 2 outs.

**HOT STREAK**

- ◆ Prior to his August 10 start @ Reds (L, 0-3), won 4 straight starts from June 24-August 4, going 4-0 with a 2.31 ERA (6 ER in 23.1 IP), .233 opponent average and 25 strikeouts.
