**NEW YORK YANKEES NOTES**

- The Yankees dropped to 1-3 on their seven-game homestand...are still 9-4 in their last 13G...are 8-8 at home this month.
  - Fell to 20-8 (.714) vs. the AL Central this season...have lost three of their last four games vs. the AL Central, but are 24-8 in their last 32G vs. the division (since 9/18/17).
  - Marked only their second loss when leading after eight innings (also 8/5 at Boston – led, 4-1, entering the ninth)...are 69-2 in such games.
- DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) **hit his 300th career home run**, a two-run shot into the right field seats off Francisco Liriano with two outs in the third...snapped a 10-game homerless stretch from 8/19-29, one game shy of his longest drought of the season (11G from 4/5-19)...was 2-for-26 (.077) in his previous 7G.
  - By hitting his 300<sup>th</sup> HR in his 1,119<sup>th</sup> career game, became the fifth-fastest player to reach the mark, trailing only Ralph Kiner (1,087 games), Ryan Howard (1,093), Juan González (1,096) and Alex Rodriguez (1,117).
  - At 28 years, 295 days old, became the ninth-youngest player to reach 300HR, trailing Alex Rodriguez (27y, 249d), Jimmie Foxx (27y, 328d), Ken Griffey Jr. (28y, 143d), Andruw Jones (28y, 144d), Albert Pujols (28y, 170d), Mel Ott (28y, 171d), Eddie Mathews (28y, 187d) and Mickey Mantle (28y, 258d).
- SS Gleyber Torres** (3-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) tied a career high with 3H (also 7/2 vs. Atlanta)...hit a two-run HR in the fourth, his 21<sup>st</sup> of the season...is tied with Ronald Acuña Jr. for second-most among MLB rookies, behind Miguel Andújar (22)...10 of his 21HR have come with runners on base...has reached safely multiple times in all 4G on the homestand (7-for-12, 4BB).
  - Has multiple hits in two straight, 4-of-7 and 7-of-12, hitting .419/.510/.628 (18-for-43) with 8R, 3HR, 7RBI, 8BB and 2SB over the longer span (since 8/18).
  - Reached 21 career HRs in his 96<sup>th</sup> game at the age of 21 years, 260 days...in Major League history, only eight players as young as Torres reached the milestone in as few games (Ronald Acuña Jr., Tony Conigliaro, Carlos Correa, Bob Horner, Albert Pujols, Frank Robinson, Giancarlo Stanton, Darryl Strawberry).
  - His 21HR are third-most by a Yankee prior to turning 22 years old (Mickey Mantle-57, Joe DiMaggio-29).
- 1B Luke Voit** (2-for-4, 2R) hit a two-run HR in the seventh inning, his first HR at Yankee Stadium...has 4HR in his last 7G...was his fifth HR of the season (4HR with the Yankees, 1HR with St. Louis).
  - Has hit safely in seven of his last 8G...has hits in 10-of-14 games as a Yankee, batting .357/.400/.643 (15-for-42) with 8R, 4HR, 11RBI and 3BB.
- Yankees hitters** had their 31<sup>st</sup> game with at least 3HR, the second-most in a season in Yankees history (33 in 2004)...are 25-6 in those games.
  - Marked the second time this season that both teams hit at least 3HR in a game at Yankee Stadium (also 7/3/18 vs. Atlanta, 3HR for both).
- LHP J.A. Happ** (4.1IP, 10H, 5ER, 0BB, 3K, 1WP, 3HR) started and did not record a decision...marked his shortest start and most runs allowed in six starts since joining the Yankees on 7/26...was his first start as a Yankee without a win.
  - Allowed a season-high 3HR, his most since 7/9/17 vs. Houston (3HR).
  - Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (16.0IP, 16ER) in three starts vs. Detroit this season.
- RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 2H, 3ER, 1BB, 3K, 2HR) gave up back-to-back HRs to Victor Martinez (game-tying) and Niko Goodrum (go-ahead) in the ninth inning to suffer his second blown save and fourth loss of the season...allowed 2HR in a game for the first time in his career...had allowed just 2ER in 33.2IP (0.53 ERA, 12H, 14BB, 58K, 1HR, 4HP) over his previous 35 appearances since 5/27.
  - Extended his AL record by notching a strikeout for the 35<sup>th</sup> consecutive relief appearance (since 5/29)...is tied for the fourth-longest streak in Major League history, behind Aroldis Chapman (49), Corey Knebel (46) and Bruce Sutter (39).
- RHP Chad Green** (1.2IP, 1H, 3K), **RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 2K) and **LHP Zach Britton** (1.0IP, 1K) combined to retire 12-of-13 batters.
- Yankees pitchers** allowed a season-high-tying 5HR (also 8/13 vs. the Mets).
- In his fourth rehab game at Triple-A Scranton/WB vs. Syracuse, **C Gary Sánchez** (right groin strain) started at catcher and went 0-for-4...threw out an attempted base stealer.

### DETROIT TIGERS NOTES

- The Tigers snapped their five-game losing streak...recorded their 23<sup>rd</sup> comeback win of the season...have won five of their last seven series openers since 8/10...are 2-2 vs. the Yankees this season.
- **Detroit batters** hit a season-high 5HR (previous: 4HR, four times)...marked their most home runs since they hit 6HR on 9/5/17 vs. Kansas City...entered tonight's game with the fewest home runs in the Majors.
- **LHP Francisco Liriano** (4.1IP, 7H, 5R/4ER, 2BB, 2K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision...is winless in his last 16 starts, posting a 5.71 ERA (75.2IP, 48ER) in those games...is the longest such stretch of his career (previous: 14GS from 9/15/13-5/25/14).
  - Has allowed at least 4ER in each of his last three starts.
  - Is 4-4 with a 3.68 ERA (63.2IP, 26ER) in 13 career games (11 starts) vs. the Yankees...is 0-3 with a 5.96 ERA (25.2IP, 17ER) in six games (five starts) at Yankee Stadium.
- **RF Nick Castellanos** (1-for-4, 2R, 1BB) threw out Brett Gardner attempting to advance to third base in the third inning...the assist was the 10<sup>th</sup> for Castellanos this season, tying him with Andrew Benintendi and Mitch Haniger for the American League lead...**Mikie Mahtook** added an outfield assist in the seventh inning, throwing out Gleyber Torres to end the inning...as a team, the Tigers lead the Majors with 33 outfield assists.
  - Is hitting .397 (50-for-126) vs. left-handers this season.
- **3B Jeimer Candelario** (1-for-5) hit his second career leadoff HR (also on 6/2/18 vs. Toronto off J.A. Happ) and his 16<sup>th</sup> home run of the season.
- **SS Ronny Rodriguez** (2-for-5) hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the fourth inning...has picked up a hit in 10 of his last 12 games, batting .300 (12-for-40) with 3R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI and 1BB over that span.
- **DH Victor Martinez** (2-for-5, 4RBI) recorded his 12<sup>th</sup> career multi-HR game (last: 2HR on 7/21/17 at Minnesota)...marked his fifth career game with home runs from both sides of the plate (last: 7/1/16 at Tampa Bay)...hit a two-run HR in the fifth and a game-tying two-run HR in the ninth...marked his ninth career game-tying or go-ahead HR in the ninth inning or later (last: go-ahead HR in the 15<sup>th</sup> inning on 8/9/16 at Seattle).
  - Now has 533RBI with Detroit, surpassing Billy Rogell (531) for the most by a switch-hitter in franchise history.
- **2B Dawel Lugo** (1-for-4) made his Major League debut and recorded his first hit with a sixth-inning double.
- **1B Niko Goodrum** (4-for-5, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1SB) hit a tie-breaking HR in the ninth inning...marked his first career go-ahead HR in the ninth inning or later...tied his career high in hits (also 7/1/18 at Toronto and 7/7/18 vs. Texas).
- **RHP Shane Greene** (1.0IP, 1K) tossed a perfect ninth inning to record his 28<sup>th</sup> save of the season.
