## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (80-78) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (66-93)

### September 28, 2018 at Great American Ball Park, Cincinnati, OH --- GAME #159/ROAD #79

#### RHP NICK KINGHAM (5-7, 5.23 ERA) vs. RHP ANTHONY DESCLAFANI (7-7, 4.91 ERA)

**THE PIRATES...** have won seven of their last 11 games and eight of their last 13...Have gone 13-7 in their last 20 games and 15-10 in their last 25...Have gone 26-29 in their last 55 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced a 39-30 record since July 8 and have gone 43-37 in their last 80 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 73-85 after 158 games in 2017 (73-86 after 159).

**SEEING RED:** The Pirates have won six straight games against the Reds and have gone 8-1 in the last nine meetings...This is the longest winning streak against the Reds since 2011 (also six) and a victory tonight would mark the longest since 1991 (nine games)...The Bucs have posted a 12-4 record against Cincinnati this season, while batting .301 (168-for-559) with 25 home runs and 96 runs scored in the 16 games...The pitching staff has posted a 3.04 ERA (145.0ip/49er), which includes a 1.67 ERA (27.0ip/5er) in the last three games played at Great American Ball Park.

**DICKERSON DIALED IN:** In 15 games played against the Reds this season, **Corey Dickerson** is hitting .381 (24-for-63) with eight doubles, a triple, five home runs and 12 RBI...He has homered four times in his last three games played in Cincinnati, where he is hitting .464 (13-for-28) in six games this season...Dickerson went 8-for-16 with four homers in the three-game series played at Great American Ball Park between July 20-22, homering twice on July 21.

**THE LONG BALL:** With 153 home runs hit as a team this season, the Pirates have surpassed last year's total of 151 with three games left to play...The last time the Bucs hit more home runs in a season was 2014 (156)...Pittsburgh has clubbed 14 home runs in the first six games played at Great American Ball Park this year.

**END OF THE ROAD:** The Pirates are scheduled to wrap up the 2018 season with this three-game series in Cincinnati...The Bucs have gone 36-42 on the road in 2018, winning four of their last six games and five of their last eight.

**PROCEED WITH CAUTION:** **Francisco Cervelli** has thrown out 21 runners attempting to steal against him and is now tied with Philadelphia's Jorge Alfaro for the most among National League catchers...Cervelli threw out a career-high 23 runners in his first season with the Pirates in 2015...Among all Major League teams this season, Pittsburgh is tied for fourth with 33 caught stealings by its catchers, trailing only Oakland (42), Baltimore (41) and Milwaukee (34).

**CAN I ASSIST YOU?:** Last night in Chicago, left fielder **Pablo Reyes** recorded Pittsburgh's 34th outfield assist of the season - tied with Detroit for the most among all Major League teams (the Cubs are second in the N.L. with 28)...The Bucco outfielders also led the National League in assists as recently as 2016 with 35.

**PEN PALS:** In the first four games of this road trip, the Pittsburgh bullpen has been charged with one run in 13.2 innings.

**SEIZING THE CENTRAL:** With three games left to play against the Reds, the Bucs have posted a 41-32 record against teams from the N.L. Central this season - the best intradivisional record among the five teams...It is only Pittsburgh's second winning season against the division since it was formed in 1994...The Pirates went 45-31 against their divisional rivals in 2013.

**BUCCO BLANKINGS:** Tuesday night's 6-0 win marked Pittsburgh's 16th shutout of the season, the most by the Bucco pitching staff since 2013 (16)...The 16 shutouts are the third-most in the Major Leagues, trailing only the Cubs (18) and Indians (17).

**WINNING WAYS:** Dating back to July 8, the Pirates have produced the fourth-best record in the National League and the eighth-best in the Major Leagues...Pittsburgh's 40-30 record in that time trails only the Athletics (47-23), Red Sox (46-23), Rays (44-27), Rockies (43-27), Astros (40-27), Cubs (43-30) and Cardinals (41-30)...In addition, the Bucco pitching staff has posted a 3.38 ERA since July 8, the second-lowest mark in the Majors behind the Dodgers (3.24).

**MILESTONE APPROACHING:** **Clint Hurdle** is two wins shy of 1200 career victories as a Major League manager; he would join Bruce Bochy, Mike Scioscia, Buck Showalter and Terry Francona as the only current managers with 1200 career wins.

**SILVER SLUGGING CATCHER:** In addition to leading all Major League catchers in on-base percentage (.376), Bucco backstop **Francisco Cervelli** has set career highs in home runs (12), RBI (57) and extra-base hits (30) this season.

**GOLDEN IN LEFT FIELD:** Among all National League left fielders, **Corey Dickerson** ranks first with a .996 fielding percentage and .959 zone rating...He has made one error in 262 total chances and is tied for second with his career-high seven assists...Dickerson has made a career-high 122 appearances (120 starts) in left field.

**THE OUTFIELD:** Pittsburgh's outfielders have recorded 206 extra base hits this season, the highest total for the club since 2008 (215)...The 206 extra base hits by the Bucco outfielders are also the most among N.L. teams and the third-most in all of Major League Baseball this season, trailing only the Red Sox (229) and Blue Jays (217).

**THE DYNAMIC DUO:** **Jameson Taillon** (14-9) and **Trevor Williams** (14-9) share the team lead in victories...The last time the Pirates had two right-handed pitchers win 14 or more games in the same season was 1978 when **Bert Blyleven** (14-10) and **Don Robinson** (14-6) did so...The last season in which two Pittsburgh pitchers won 14 games or more was 1992; righthander **Doug Drabek** (15-11) and lefthander **Randy Tomlin** (14-9).

**THE NEW "K ROD":** **Richard Rodríguez** leads all National League rookie relief pitchers with 87 strikeouts and is third among all Major League rookie relievers in that department...The only two rookie relievers in MLB with more punchouts are Tampa Bay's **Ryan Yarbrough** (104) and Los Angeles' **Noe Ramirez** (92)...His 87 strikeouts are also the most by a Pirates rookie reliever; righthander **Blas Minor** had the previous rookie record with 84 Ks 1993.

**JAMESON TAILLON:** The 26-year-old righthander will be making his 32nd and final start of the season tomorrow afternoon...His last start was a 5-1 win over Cole Hamels at Wrigley Field Monday night (7.0ip/5h/1r/1er/3bb/5so)...Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and struck out a career-high 11 batters in his previous start on 9/18 vs. Kansas City...Has made 21 straight starts allowing three earned runs or less and has done so in 28 of his 31 starts overall...Has posted a 2.26 ERA (91.2ip/23er) in his last 14 starts and has gone 8-2 with a 2.16 ERA (79.0ip/19er) in 12 starts since the All-Star break.

**vs. CINCINNATI:** 4-3 with a 4.28 ERA (61.0ip/29er) in 11 career starts...Is 3-1 with a 2.84 ERA in four starts this season; tossed a one-hit shutout on 4/8 at PNC Park in a 5-0 victory over Tyler Mahle, lost a 7-2 decision to Matt Harvey on 5/22 at GABP (6.0ip/6er), won a 12-1 decision against Mahle on 7/20 at Great American and won a 3-2 decision (5.0ip/1r) on 9/5 at PNC Park.
