ROSTER MOVES—The Rays have placed INF/OF **Daniel Robertson** (left thumb sprain) on the 10-day DL, optioned RH **Austin Pruitt** to Triple-A Durham, reinstated LH **Blake Snell** (left shoulder fatigue) from the 10-day DL and selected INF/OF **Brandon Lowe** (last name rhymes with “now”) from Durham...Lowe, 24, will be making his major league debut.

- + Lowe is batting .297/.391/.558 (113-for-380) with 31 2B, 1 3B, 22 HR and 76 RBI in 100 games between Double-A Montgomery and Durham this season...among full-season minor leaguers, his 31 2B are tied for 7th and his 54 XBH rank 5th...he is tied for 1st among Rays minor leaguers in doubles and ranks 2nd in homers and RBI.
- + Lowe has hit 22 HR in 380 AB between two levels this season, compared to 16 HR in 789 AB over his first two professional seasons.
- + Lowe is ranked by MLB.com as the No. 9 prospect in the Rays organization and the No. 8 second base prospect in the minors.
- + Lowe will become the first player selected by the Rays in the 2015 June Draft to appear in the majors...he was selected in the third round (87th overall) out of the University of Maryland.

FEEL THE HEAT—Today the 2008 AL Champion Rays will be honored in a pregame ceremony, the first time the club has honored them since raising the banners before the home opener on April 13, 2009, a game in which they defeated the Yankees, 15-5...**Scott Kazmir** earned the win that day...20 players and three coaches and **Soot Zimmer** are participating in this weekend’s 10-year reunion celebration and will be introduced in a ceremony beginning at 5:44 p.m. ...they will also be appearing throughout the ballpark at several locations, including the Republic Bank Draft Room for Season Ticket Holders...**Grant Balfour** and **Gabe Gross** (4:10-4:40 p.m.) then **B.J. Upton** and **Kazmir** (4:45-5:15) will sign autographs for free in the 20th Anniversary Exhibit in Center Field Street...**Aki Iwamura**, whose bobblehead (presented by Fanatics) is being distributed to fans tonight while supplies last, will toss the ceremonial first pitch to **Jason Bartlett**... Aki traveled 24 hours and 7,500 miles from Japan to be here.

RAY MATTER—Last night the Rays snapped a 3-game winning streak, and it was the fourth consecutive time they lost when a win would have brought them back to a season-high-tying 4 games over .500...it was the 18th time this season the Rays lost when yielding 3 runs or fewer, most in the majors—no other team has more than 14 losses when doing so—and already tied for 4th-most in a single season in franchise history.

- + At 56-54, the Rays are one game shy of last year’s record through 110 games...this time last season, the Rays were 3.5 GB in the AL East and 0.5 GB of the AL’s second Wild Card...this season, they are 20.5 GB in the division and 8.5 GB of the AL’s second Wild Card.
- + The Rays are 7-7 since the All-Star break and 8-10 in their last 18 games, but they are 22-14 in 36 games since June 22 and 52-41 in 93 games since April 18 following a 4-13 start to the season.
- + The Rays have allowed 3 runs or fewer in three consecutive games, after allowing 6.93 runs per game in the previous 15 games.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—This is the second series of a 9-game homestand against the Angels (3-0), White Sox (0-1) and Orioles...since June 11, the Rays are 20-5 (.800) at home, 2nd-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (.810)...they are 30-14 (.682) at home since April 18 after a 2-7 start.

- + The Rays have won via walk-off six times this season, tied for 3rd in the AL behind the Blue Jays (7) and Athletics (7) and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit three walk-off home runs, more than the previous four seasons (2014-17) combined (2).
- + The end of this homestand concludes a stretch of 15 of 19 games at home from July 20-Aug 9, and they are 6-4 so far.
- + The Rays are 7-1 over their last eight home series since June 11, and they have swept five of these eight home series.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 20-24 (.455) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 41) and 1-run losses (Mets/Orioles, 20)...the 44 1-run games are the most for a team through 110 games since the 2005 Nationals (45) and 2005 Twins (44), and the 24 1-run losses are the most for an AL team through 110 games since the 2015 Athletics (26)...40.0 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.4 pct. of games in the majors...44.4 pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest rate in the majors, ahead of the Astros (43.9 pct.).

- + The Rays started the season 0-5 and 5-12 in 1-run games; since then, they are 20-19 and 15-12 in 1-run games, respectively, and they are

10-5 in 1-run games since June 19 at HOU...45.8 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).

- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 31 games at home: 23 wins, 7 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

RAYS vs. WHITE SOX—The Rays are 69-84 (.451) all-time against the White Sox (38-39 at home, 31-45 on the road)...they are 39-38 in the Rays era and 13-10 (.565) under Manager **Kevin Cash**...the season series is tied, 2-2, and all 4 games have been decided by 1-run margins...both losses have come on go-ahead hits in the 8th inning or later...since Sep 28, 2016, 11 of the 12 games between the clubs have been decided by 2 runs or fewer...the Rays are 11-5 at Tropicana Field against the White Sox since the start of 2013...the clubs split the season series last year, with the Rays going 2-1 at Tropicana Field and 1-2 at Guaranteed Rate Field.

OLD FRIENDS AS FOES—Tomorrow’s encounter with **James Shields** will mark the 12th time in 112 games this season the team will face a starting pitcher who was a former Ray...they are 5-6 thus far in games started by **Alex Cobb** (3-0), **Jason Hammel** (1-0), **Matt Moore** (0-1), **Jake Odorizzi** (0-1), **David Price** (1-3) and **Shields** (0-1)...Odorizzi, Price, Shields, Moore and Cobb all rank among the Rays Top 10 in career ERA, wins, starts and strikeouts...tomorrow is the fifth time the Rays will face Shields, who remains the club’s all-time leader in starts (217), innings (1,454.2), wins (87), complete games (19), CG shutouts (8) and Opening Day starts (4, tied).

- + Shields is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (26.1-IP, 4-ER) in his previous 4 starts against the Rays, most recently April 11 in Chicago (no decision).
- + Tomorrow will be the 39th time a pitcher from the Rays 2008 AL Championship team will start against the Rays...the club is 20-18 in those games against Shields (0-4), **David Price** (6-6), **Jason Hammel** (5-3), **Edwin Jackson** (3-3), **Scott Kazmir** (4-2) and **Matt Garza** (2-0)...the Rays defeated the White Sox, 3-1, in the ALDS that season.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—With his Rays debut, **Brandon Lowe** will become the 20th rookie used by the Rays this season, extending the club record (18 in 2015) and breaking a tie with the Marlins for most in the majors...he will become the 10th player to make his major league debut for the Rays this season, which will tie the Angels, Mets, Orioles and Padres for most in the majors, according to Baseball Reference.

- + Rays rookies have combined for 430 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (414)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 42 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (49)...the Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher in 10 of their 14 games since the All-Star break.
- + 17 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 12 players with less than 1 year of service time...the only pitchers on the active roster with more than 2 years of service time are **Sergio Romo** (10.054) and **Blake Snell** (2.029).
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 26 years, 8 months.

THE OTHER CATWALK—The 12th annual Rays on the Runway returns tomorrow at the Hilton St. Petersburg Bayfront...Rays players, coaches and special “Dream Children” from the Children’s Dream Fund will walk the fashion runway to make dreams come true for children with life-threatening illnesses...players and coaches expected to participate include **Jake Bauers**, **José De León**, **Matt Duffy**, **Jake Faria**, **Kevin Kiermaier**, **Daniel Robertson**, **Jaime Schultz**, **Mallex Smith**, **Ozzie Timmons**, **Joey Wendle** and **Ryan Yarbrough**...proceeds from the event benefit the Children’s Dream Fund, a local nonprofit organization that makes dreams come true for seriously-ill children living on the West Coast of Florida.

MINOR MATTERS—In MLB.com’s updated list, the Rays were ranked as the No. 4 farm system in baseball, behind the Padres, Braves and White Sox—despite being the only team in the Top 10 to graduate three Top 10 prospects (**Willy Adames**, **Christian Arroyo**, **Jake Bauers**) to the majors this year...Rays affiliates this season are 394-268 (.595), the best combined winning pct. for any organization...all nine affiliates currently have winning records, and seven of them are at least 10 games over .500.

COLLECTOR’S ITEM—The Tampa Bay Rays 20th Anniversary Commemorative Yearbook is now available for \$15 at the Rays Republic Team Store...the special edition features a historical blurb on every player to wear the Rays uniform in the franchise’s first 20 seasons (1998-2017).

ZILLA'S RETURN—Was reinstated from the 10-day DL today, and RH **Austin Pruitt** was optioned to Triple-A Durham in a corresponding move...was placed on the disabled list on July 23, retroactive to July 20, with left shoulder fatigue...hasn't pitched for the Rays since July 12 at MIN, when his 3 IP marked his shortest start since Sep 26, 2017 at NYY (1 IP)...the game began following a 2:00 rain delay and he yielded 3 runs, including 2 runs in the 3rd inning on back-to-back RBI doubles from **Robbie Grossman** and **Jorge Polanco**...his line: 3 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 BB, 2 SO, 75 pit, 43 str. ...did not make a rehab start, but threw bullpens on Sunday and Wednesday.

HE LIKES IT HERE—Min. 50 IP, his 0.87 ERA (51.2-IP, 6-R/5-ER) at home leads the majors, ahead of NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.71) and BOS **Chris Sale** (1.95)...has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 11 consecutive home starts since Sep 12, 2017, tied for the longest such streak in the AL (and tied for the 2nd-longest such streak in the majors) since 1913—when earned runs were officially kept in both leagues—according to the Elias Sports Bureau...for the record, in club history the lowest ERA at home over an entire season is held by **David Price** (1.81) in 2012...no AL pitcher has ever finished a season with a ERA at home equal to or lower than Snell's current 0.87 ERA, and it hasn't been done in the majors since LAD **Sandy Koufax** (0.85) in 1964.

WHERE HE BELONGS—Replaced CLE **Corey Kluber** on the AL All-Star Team roster...it was the first selection of his career, and it marked the ninth consecutive season the Rays had a pitcher named an All-Star; only the Yankees (12) have a longer streak in the AL...was the third pitcher used by the AL, and he went 1.2 IP, yielding a homer to **Willson Contreras** on the first pitch of his outing...struck out **Nolan Arenado**, **Matt Kemp** and **Bryce Harper**.

+ His 2.27 ERA was a club record before the All-Star break, ahead of **Jake Odorizzi** (2.30) in 2015.

vs. CHICAGO—Is 2-0 with a 0.59 ERA (15.1-IP, 2-R/1-ER) in 3 starts against the White Sox, all on the road...last faced them on April 10, and his only hit allowed in 6 IP was a ground-rule double by **Tyler Saladino** in the 5th inning; his only run allowed was an RBI groundout to his next batter faced...became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to yield 1 hit or fewer while recording at least 10 SO, first since **Drew Smyly** on April 19, 2016 at BOS.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 16 starts, tied for 3rd-most in the AL behind HOU **Justin Verlander** (18) and BOS **Chris Sale** (17), incl. 2 runs or fewer in nine of his last 11 starts...his 16 starts of 2 runs or fewer are more than any Rays starter from last season (Archer/Cobb/Odorizzi, 14).

+ Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 12 starts, 4th in the AL behind TB **Ryne Stanek** (15), Verlander (13) and Sale (13)...has allowed 1 run or fewer in four of his last 5 starts and in seven of his last 10 starts...three times this season he has allowed 1 run or fewer without recording the win.

LEADERBOARDS—Ranks 3rd in the AL with a 2.27 ERA, behind BOS **Chris Sale** (2.04) and HOU **Justin Verlander** (2.19), and is tied for 5th in the AL with 12 wins...also ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.189, 3rd), WHIP (1.07, 8th) and wild pitches (13, tied for 2nd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .077 opp avg. with RISP, and .050 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...is averaging a career-high 95.5 mph on his fastball, 6th in the AL and tied for 1st among major league lefties...13.5 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 6th-highest in the AL, according to FanGraphs.

+ Led the AL in ERA through games of July 9, joining **David Price** in 2012 as the only pitchers in club history to hold the AL lead in ERA in July or later, according to Stats LLC...his 12 wins before the All-Star break tied Price in 2010 for 2nd in club history behind **Matt Moore** (13) in 2013.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
