WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won a season-high tying three straight games as they conclude a brief three-game trip this afternoon in Tampa Bay.
- RHP James Shields, who is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (4 ER/26.1 IP) in four career starts against his former team, is scheduled to start for the White Sox.
- The Sox have won the first two games of this series by one run each, including a come-from-behind, 2-1 victory last night.
- Following today's game, the White Sox return to Chicago for six games in seven days vs. the Yankees (8/6-8) and Cleveland (8/10-12).
- The Sox went 2-4 on their last homestand vs. Toronto (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2) from 7/27-8/2 and 3-4 on their last trip from 7/20-26 at Seattle (1-2) and the Angels (2-2).

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are in position to record their first three-game sweep since 8/8-10/17 vs. Houston and first on the road since 4/25-27/16 at Toronto.
- The Sox have recorded back-to-back wins with five hits or less for the first time since 7/9-10/15 vs. Toronto and at the Cubs.
- The White Sox have won five of their last eight road games after losing 12 of their previous 14.
- Sox starting pitchers own a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP) over the last three games, allowing 10 hits.
- Twelve of the last 13 games between the White Sox and Rays have been decided by two runs or less.
- José Abreu has homered in a career-high tying three straight games (third time) and is hitting .404/.462/.894 (19-47) with five doubles, six home runs, 11 RBI and 14 runs scored over his last 12 games ... Abreu has nine homers and 29 RBI in 29 career games vs. Tampa Bay.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Tim Anderson led off the ninth inning with a double and scored the winning run on a Matt Duffy throwing error on Leury García's bunt single as the White Sox defeated Tampa Bay, 2-1.
- Carlos Rodón posted a no decision, allowing one unearned run on three hits over 6.0 IP to lower his ERA to 1.56 (6 ER/34.2 IP) over his last five starts, best in the major leagues.
- José Abreu homered for the third straight game, a solo shot off Blake Snell to tie the game at 1-1.
- Juan Minaya retired all five batters he faced, Xavier Cedeño earned his second win in as many appearances, and Thyago Vieira pitched a scoreless ninth with two strikeouts for his first career save ... Vieira and Atlanta's Luis Gohara (one in 2018) as the only Brazilians in major-league history to record a save.

SHIELDS, 10 YEARS LATER

- James Shields returns to Tropicana Field this weekend to help celebrate the 10-year anniversary of Tampa Bay's 2008 club, which won the American League East title and reached the World Series in its first-ever postseason berth.
- Shields, who was selected by the Rays in the 16th round of the 2000 draft, is the franchise leader in numerous categories, including wins (87), IP (1,454.2), starts (217), strikeouts (1,250), complete games (19), shutouts (8) and quality starts (132) and pickoffs (24).

PROSPECT PROWESS

- The White Sox farm system is ranked as No. 3 in baseball according to MLB Pipeline's updated rankings and includes seven of the Top 100 prospects.
- OF Eloy Jiménez (No. 3), RHP Michael Kopech (13), OF Luis Robert (25), INF Nick Madrigal (32), RHP Dylan Cease (44), RHP Dane Dunning (64) and OF Blake Rutherford (88) all are ranked in MLB Pipeline's Top 100.

LAST NIGHT ON THE FARM

- Class AA Birmingham RHP Dylan Cease threw 6.0 scoreless IP vs. Mobile, allowing just one hit with no walks and nine strikeouts ... Cease is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (4 ER/36.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts over his last six starts.
- Class A Winston-Salem INF Nick Madrigal, the Sox first-round draft pick (No. 4 overall), struck out last night for the first time in his professional career in his 73rd plate appearance (20th game).

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have homered in 13 of their last 14 games (21 total) and have hit 37 in their last 26 (since 7/3), tied for the fifth-highest total in the major leagues.
- José Abreu has hit six home runs in his last 12 games, Avisail García has 10 homers in his last 27, and Daniel Palka has connected on nine in his last 23.

WHITE SOX VS. TAMPA BAY

- The White Sox have won three straight games to take a 3-2 lead in the season series.
- The Sox are in position to record their first three-game sweep at Tropicana Field since 5/28-30/12.
- All five games have been decided by one run.
- The White Sox are hitting .205/.309/.366 (33-161) with a 2.54 ERA (13 ER/46.0 IP) and have outscored the Rays, 16-15.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 85-69 ... they are 45-31 in Chicago and 40-38 in Tampa Bay.

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 188-226 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 9-9 vs. the AL East this season (5-3 on the road) and have won five of their last six games.

20/20/20/20 VISION

- José Abreu is attempting to become the 18th player in major-league history to hit 20-plus home runs in each of his first five seasons ... Pete Incaviglia (1986-90), Eddie Murray (1977-81), Tony Conigliaro (1964-69), Ted Williams (1939-42, 1946) and Joe DiMaggio (1936-40) are the only players to accomplish the feat exclusively in the American League (source: Baseball Reference).
- Abreu already is the first player in White Sox history to hit 20-plus home runs in each of his first four seasons.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- José Abreu has joined Magglio Ordóñez (1999-2003) as the only players in White Sox history to hit 30-plus doubles in five straight seasons ... he and Matt Carpenter are the only players to hit 30-plus doubles in each of the last five seasons (2014-18).
- Abreu also has joined Frank Thomas (nine), Paul Konerko (eight), Ordóñez (five), Ray Durham (five), Willie Kamm (five) and Bibb Falk (five) as the only players in Sox history with five-plus seasons of 30-plus doubles.

PILING UP CROOKED NUMBERS

- Yoán Moncada is one of eight major-league players this season to record at least 20 doubles, five triples, 10 homers, 45 RBI and 10 stolen bases, joining the Cubs Javier Báez, Boston's Andrew Benintendi and Colorado's Trevor Story.

STOLEN BASE ... STOLEN BASE!

- The White Sox rank fifth in the major-leagues this season with 77 stolen bases and are the only team to feature five players with 10 or more steals.
- The last time five or more Sox players recorded 10-plus stolen bases was 2005 (Jermaine Dye, Willie Harris, Tadahito Iguchi, Pablo Ozuna, Scott Podsednik and Aaron Rowand).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (14 HR/21 SB) is one of seven players in the major leagues this season with at least 14 home runs and 20 stolen bases, joining Andrew Benintendi, Mookie Betts, Starling Marte, José Ramírez, Mike Trout and Trea Turner.
- Anderson, who is on pace for 21 homers and 31 steals, is looking to join Alex Ríos (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966) as the only players in White Sox history to record 20-plus homers and 30-plus steals in one season.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,363 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,360) and 45 more than Oakland (1,1318), the next-closest American League team.

ON THE AIR

- Tomorrow's White Sox-Yankees game has been selected by ESPN for a national broadcast ... the game will be blacked out on ESPN in the Chicagoland viewing area, and will air locally on NBC Sports Chicago ... first pitch remains at 7:10 p.m. CT.
- TV analyst Steve Stone will be off for the Sox series from 8/13-15 at Detroit ... Tom Paciorek will fill in alongside Jason Benetti.

ON DECK: VS. NEW YORK YANKEES

- The White Sox open a six-game, seven-day homestand tomorrow night vs. the Yankees ... RHP Dylan Covey (4-7, 5.57) is scheduled to start the series opener.
- The White Sox went 3-4 against the Yankees in 2017 to fall to 1-10-3 in the last 14 season matchups ... the Sox are 13-7 at home against the Yankees since 2012.
- The Sox have played every American League team this season except the Yankees.

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 25th appearance (24th start), 11th (10th) on the road and first vs. Tampa Bay ... is looking for just his second road win of the season (first on Opening Day at Kansas City).
- Needs three appearances for 400, 45.2 IP for 2,600.00 and eight-strikeouts for 2,200 in his career.
- Ranks second in MLB with 12 losses in 2018 ... his 39 losses since 2016 are the most in the major leagues.
- Is 0-7 with a 6.06 ERA (33 ER/49.0 IP), 1.47 WHIP, .269 opponents average and 42 strikeouts over his last nine road appearances ... has allowed five earned runs or more in four of the starts.
- Has worked at least 6.0 IP in 16 of his last 19 starts since 4/25 vs. Seattle ... is 3-11 with a 4.25 ERA (57 ER/120.2 IP), 1.21 WHIP, .227 opponents average and 3.06 RSA (41 RS) during the 19-start span.
- Is 13-32 with a 5.44 ERA (227 ER/375.1 IP), 293 strikeouts, 78 home runs allowed and a 1.46 WHIP over 67 appearances (66 GS/30 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
- Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in starts (2nd, 374), IP (2nd, 2,430.2), pitches thrown (2nd, 38,165), quality starts (5th, 229), opponents GIDP (5th, 196), strikeouts (7th, 2,088) and wins (11th, 136).

LAST START

- Suffered his 13th loss on 7/31 vs. Kansas City after allowing four runs on five hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over 7.0 IP.
- Surrendered two-run home runs to Ryan O'Hearn and Brett Phillips.
- Held the Royals scoreless on one hit through the first four innings ... retired his first 10 batters faced before allowing his first hit in the fourth on an Alex Gordon single.
- Departed the game with the White Sox trailing, 4-2, after throwing 104 pitches (61 strikes) ... allowed more than three runs at home for the first time since 4/25 vs. Seattle, snapping a streak of nine outings.

BITTEN BY THE BIG INNING

- Has allowed 24 of his 73 earned runs (32.9 percent) over the span of six individual innings (5.0 IP) in six starts in 2018 ... his season ERA would be 3.17 (49 ER/139.0 IP) without the below six innings.

LOW AND SLOW

- Opponents are hitting just .226 (97-430) since 5/1, the 11th-lowest mark in the American League (Chris Sale's .171 average is the lowest) ... his .173 opponents average in May was the fourth-lowest in the AL.
- Is limiting opponents to the following averages: .210 (54-257) at night, .207 (56-270) vs. left-handers, .192 (67-349) with nobody on base and .220 average (73-332) at Guaranteed Rate Field.

HELP WANTED

- Owns a 3.68 run support average as a starter in 2018, the 10th-lowest in the American League ... received two runs or less of support in 14 of his last 18 starts (one or less eight times) and three or less in 18 of the last 21 (2.79 RSA; 41 RS/132.1 IP) since 4/11 ... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
- His 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support from 4/11-6/7 was his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13).
- His 3.22 RSA in 2016 was the lowest in baseball and the lowest of his career.
- Owns a 4.32 RSA (180 RS/374.2 IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (66 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (16x), one (11x), two (13x), three (7x), four (4x), five (6x) and six-plus (9x) ... has received two runs or less of support in 60.6 percent (40-66) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 20 home runs this season, including 16 in his last 12 starts ... allowed three homers in each outing on 6/2 vs. Milwaukee and 6/7 at Minnesota after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
- Has allowed 87 homers since 2016 and 120 since 2015 ... the 120 home runs allowed since 2015 are the most in MLB, and his 1.67 homers per 9.0 IP mark since 2015 (645.0 IP) is the fourth-highest mark.

GO EAST, YOUNG MAN

- Is 47-44 with a 3.88 ERA (337 ER/782.1 IP), 636 strikeouts, eight complete games and three shutouts over 119 career starts (71 quality starts) vs. the American League East.
- Has gone 11-3 with a 3.70 mark (54 ER/131.1 IP) in his last 21 outings (14 QS) vs. the division ... owns a 4.45 run support average (65 RS) during that span.
- Ranks among the active MLB leaders vs. the AL East in complete games (T3rd), IP (4th), starts (4th), strikeouts (5th) and wins (6th).

OPENING DAY HONORS

- His season debut marked his eighth career Opening Day start following four with Tampa Bay (2008-10, '12), two with Kansas City (2013-14) and one with San Diego (2015).
- Is 2-2 with a 4.98 ERA (26 ER/47.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts in the eight OD outings.
- Tied the Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw for the fourth-most Opening Day starts among active pitchers ... joined Edinson Vólquez as the only active pitchers to start season openers for four different teams (STATS).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- His start on 7/13 vs. Kansas City was his 20th of the season ... joined Cole Hamels and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers to make 20-plus starts every season since 2006 ... recorded at least 10 wins, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts every year from 2007-15 ... was an AL All-Star with Tampa Bay in 2011.
- Is 3-6 with a 5.46 ERA (36 ER/59.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts in the postseason (11 GS/4 QS) ... pitched in the postseason with Tampa Bay (2008, 2010-11) and Kansas City (2014), including three World Series starts.

RAYS REUNION

- Pitched for Tampa Bay from 2006-12 after being selected by the club in the 16th round of the June 2000 First-Year Player Draft ... went 87-73 with a 3.89 ERA (629 ER/1,454.2 IP), 1,250 strikeouts and 10 complete games over 218 appearances (217 starts) with the Rays ... was a 2011 American League All-Star.
- Is the franchise leader in wins, starts, complete games, shutouts (eight), IP, strikeouts and QS (132).
- Was a member of three postseason teams (2008, 2010 and 2011), including the 2008 AL pennant-winning club ... started Game 2 of the World Series vs. Philadelphia.
