

REDS BATTERS

16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

Road Trip: 5-13 (.385), 1rbi

- Is the Reds' nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award for representing baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.
- Hit safely in 7 of his last 8 apps (11-25, .440, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .600slg, .548obp).
- Beginning 8/13 hit safely in 15 of his last 19 apps (20-64, .313, 4 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 4rbi, .500slg, .421obp), raising his season BA from .243.

38 CURT CASALI, c

Road Trip: 1gs, 1-5, 1 2b

- In his last 19 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .328 (19-58, 5 2b, 2hr, 12rbi, .385obp).
- Has made 24 starts at C, most recently in Sun's 10-inning, 6-4 win at StL...this season also made his first career apps at 1B (6g, 3gs) and at 2B (1g on 7/20 vs Pit).
- On 5/31 was acquired from the Rays for cash considerations...the next day was promoted to the 25-man roster to replace C Tony Cruz, who was optioned to Louisville.
- On 1/18 was signed by the Rangers to a minor league contract...on 3/21 was released...on 3/22 was signed by the Rays to a minor league contract...prior to his trade to the Reds spent the season at Class AAA Durham (28g, .274, 5 2b, 4hr, 20rbi).

4 BRANDON DIXON, inf/of

Road Trip: 1g at P, 1g in RF, 1-1, solo HR

- Homered off Bud Norris in the 10th inning of Sun's 6-4 win at StL.
- Last started Thu vs Mil, played 3B (0-4).
- Has made 16 starts (10gs at 1B, 2gs at 2B, 1gs at 3B, 3gs in RF), including a start at 1B on 6/27 at Atl when he entered the game in the bottom of the first following Joey Votto's ejection in the top of the inning.
- In 49 apps for Louisville hit .346 (18 2b, 2 3b, 6hr, 23rbi, 9sb).
- Made 2 scoreless pitching apps (1ip on 8/13 vs Cle, 0.1ip on 8/31 at StL).

27 PHILLIP ERVIN, of

Road Trip: 4g, 3gs in LF, 2-14

- Since his All-Star break promotion, has started 30 of the Reds' 42 games (16gs in LF, 12gs in RF, 2gs in CF) and in 39 apps overall since then is hitting .304 (35-115, 7 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 21rbi, .487slg, .359obp).
- In 48 games for Louisville hit .289 (12 2b, 4 3b, 5hr, 38rbi, 10sb).

17 TIM FEDEROWICZ, c

Houston: 10g, .206, 3 2b, 2rbi

- Last name is pronounced fed-ah-ROW-ritch.
- Today was promoted from Louisville with OF Gabriel Guerrero and RHP Tyler Mahle.
- On 12/6/17 was signed by the Astros to a minor league contract...on 6/8 was designated for assignment and then outrighted to Fresno...on 7/26 was designated for assignment a second time, refused the outright assignment and elected free agency...on 8/3 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract and was sent to Louisville.
- Hit .328 in 38 apps for Fresno (13 2b, 6hr, 22rbi), .244 in 23 apps for Louisville (6 2b, 1hr, 9rbi) and .206 in 10 apps for the Astros (3 2b, 2rbi).
- Has made 129 Major League apps for the Dodgers, Cubs, Giants and Astros.

3 SCOTTER GENNETT, 2b

Road Trip: 9-17 (.529), 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi

- Is a first-time All-Star.
- Has a 4-game hitting streak, all multi-hit games (9-17, .529, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi).
- In his last 18 apps beginning 8/15 is hitting .423 (30-71, 5 2b, 2 3b, 2hr, 13rbi, .634slg, .435obp), raising his season BA from .304...in his last 7 apps produced four 2-hit games and two 3-hit games (14-28, .500, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi, .750slg, .533obp), raising his season BA from .310.
- Has 17 games with at least 3 hits, the most in the National League (Mil's Christian Yelich 2nd, 15).
- In the first half hit .326 to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...no Reds batter has finished a season leading the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Since All-Star break is hitting .308 (48-156, 8 2b, 2 3b, 4hr, 19rbi, .462slg, .365obp).

61 GABRIEL GUERRERO, OF Minors: 130g, .293, 24 2b, 5 3b, 19hr, 81rbi, 4sb

- Today was promoted from Louisville with C Tim Federowicz and RHP Tyler Mahle.
- Began the season at Class AA Pensacola (26g, .296, 9 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 16rbi, 3sb)...on 5/7 was promoted to Louisville and for the season led the Bats in HR (104g, .292, 15 2b, 4 3b, 17hr, 65rbi, 87gs in RF, 15gs in CF)...led all Reds minor leaguers in RBI (81) while ranking third in HR (19) and eighth in hitting (.293).
- In 2017 was a non-roster invitee to Reds Major League spring training camp but spent 2018 spring training in minor league camp.
- His throwing arm was rated the best in the International League in a poll of managers.
- Will become the ninth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, IF Blake Trahan).
- Is a nephew of 2018 Cooperstown Hall of Fame inductee Vladimir Guerrero and former Major Leaguer Wilton Guerrero and a cousin of Vladimir Guerrero Jr..

6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

Road Trip: 4-17, 2 2b, 1bb, 2r

- Hit .306 in August, raising his season BA from .225 to .244.
- Hit safely in 6 of his last 7 apps (11-29, .379, 3 2b, solo HR)...in his last 22 apps beginning 8/8 is hitting .318 (27-85, 5 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13, leads all Major League players with 272 stolen bases and leads all Major League center fielders with 52 assists.
- With 29 stolen bases ranks among the National League leaders...in each of the last 4 seasons finished second in the league in stolen bases...was caught stealing on each of his last 4 attempts.
- His 272 stolen bases rank fifth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Bob Bescher is fourth with 320 steals and Joe Morgan the all-time leader with 406.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 12 outfield assists, 1 shy of last year's career high...LF Adam Duvall led the Major Leagues last season with 15 outfield assists...no Reds center fielder has produced more than 13 assists in a season since Vada Pinson had 19 assists in 1961.

15 DILSON HERRERA, inf

Road Trip: PH on Fri at StL, P9

- Last started Thu's 11-inning, 2-1 loss vs Mil, played 2B (1-4, RBI-double).
- Was promoted on 7/6...has made 4 starts at 2B (last, 8/30 vs Mil), 2 starts at 3B (8/21 at Mi, 8/22 at Mil) and 5 starts in LF (last, 8/25 at Chi).
- This season made his first Major League apps in LF (9g, 5gs), at 1B (1g on 8/8 at NYM) and at 3B (4g, 2gs).
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Road Trip: 2-12, 1 2b, 1rbi, 2r

- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).

- In his last 22 apps beginning 8/10 produced 9 multi-hit games (27-89, .303, 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 6rbi, 2sb)...in his last 82 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .311 (103-331, 18 2b, 4 3b, 7hr, 33rbi, 12sb, .352obp).
- Leads the team in starts at 2 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (48gs) and second (51gs), and ranks second batting seventh (22gs, Barnhart 26gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...from 7/15-8/15 made a season-high 26 consecutive starts batting first and since then has made his last 15 starts batting second while Billy Hamilton has led off.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Road Trip: 4-12, 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3bb, 2hbp

- In 9 apps since he came off the disabled list last Saturday is hitting .188 (6-32, 3 2b, 1hr, 3rbi)...had been on the DL since 7/18 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder suffered on 7/14 at StL when he hit the outfield wall while making a catch.
- Has made a team-high 58 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- Has made 31 career starts batting leadoff, including 26 times this year (33-111, .297)...in his 31 career starts batting leadoff hit .301 (40-133), including .302 (39-129) in his 30 starts batting leadoff for the Reds.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Road Trip: 4-16, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- His 31 HR, 100 RBI and .934 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Yesterday went 0-for-3, snapping his 5-game hitting streak (7-21, .333, 2 2b, 2hr, 7rbi)...in his last 14 apps produced 5 HR and 12 RBI...has an RBI in 4 of his last 5 apps (7rbi).
- Is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with three 10-game hitting streaks (13g, 13g, 10g), joining Atl's Nick Markakis (12g, 11g, 11g) and Freddie Freeman (16g, 10g, 14g), Hou's Yuli Gurriel (11g, 12g, 13g) and Alex Bregman (12g, 10g, 11g) and KC's Whit Merrifield (12g, 12g, 12g)...Suárez' career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10) are the longest by any Reds batter this season
- From 7/23-7/27 homered in 5 straight apps to tie the club record for consecutive games with a HR.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf

Road Trip: 1gs at SS, 1-3

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In yesterday's 5-1 loss at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Became the eighth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino).
- Was promoted on Saturday from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 4-13, 1 2b, 2rbi, 4bb, 4r

- Is 4-for-18 (.222, 1 2b, 2rbi, 4bb, 4r, .348obp) in 5 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Thursday...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks...is the only batter in the NL and 1 of only 5 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Has reached base safely 223 times...is trying to become the 12th player in history to reach base via hit, walk or HBP at least 300 times in a season 4 times (Jeff Bagwell, Wade Boggs, Barry Bonds, Jimmie Foxx, Lou Gehrig, Todd Helton, Rogers Hornsby, Stan Musial, Pete Rose, Babe Ruth, Ted Williams).
- Made 109 starts batting third in the order, 1 start batting cleanup (5/8 at Cubs) and 8 starts batting second, including 7 straight starts batting second from 8/4-8/15.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Road Trip: 4g, 1gs in LF, 1-7, 1bb

- In his last 13 apps is hitting .310 (9-29, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1rbi), raising BA from .267.
- Has made 16 starts in RF (last, 8/24 at Cubs), 3 starts in CF (last, Thu vs Mil) and 1 start in LF (Sun at StL)...in Sun's 10-inning, 6-4 win at StL made his second appearance and first start of the season in LF (0-4, 1bb).
- During Scott Schebler's most recent stint on the disabled list started 18 of the Reds' 26 games (17gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 13 of those 18 starts (19-68, .279, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, 6r).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYI vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYI.
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
