**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the ninth contest (5-3) of a 10-game, 11-day trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (2-1) & Chicago White Sox (Sept. 7-9; 1-0)...LAA has won three of last four and is 6-4 last 10 games... Halos are 20-24 since the break...Angels have spent last 72 days in fourth place...19 of 20 remaining games are with divisional foes: six with Texas (6 at home), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston...Following the trip, Angels return home to face Rangers (Sept. 10-12) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16).

**ALL ABOUT OHTANI:** With his 19<sup>th</sup> HR last night, Shohei Ohtani passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie home runs by a Japanese native...Ohtani reached the mark in 83 non-pitching games...With his next HR, he will be the second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82<sup>nd</sup> game in 1986)...Ohtani is the fifth Halo rookie to have 4+ home runs in a three-game span, joining Tim Salmon, J.T. Snow, Wally Joyner and Lee Thomas (STATS LLC).

**FISH FACTS:** Mike Trout's three of five career hits against James Shields are home runs...Last night Trout tied the Angels' record reaching base 4+ times for the 16th time this season. He has equaled the mark set by Brian Downing in 1987. (STATS LLC)...Trout leads the Majors with 111 walks.

**SHO OFF:** With his next home run, Ohtani will be the eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...He is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS) and the first player since Babe Ruth in 1919 with at least 50 IP and 15 HR in a single season...Ohtani is the only player in MLB this season with multiple games of two home runs and a stolen base (11 other players have 1 such game) – ESPN STATS

**OHTANI MEDICAL UPDATE:** On Wednesday, Ohtani underwent an MRI on his right elbow which revealed new damage to his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL). UCL reconstruction surgery is the recommended plan of care. Updates to come when appropriate.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Since August 14<sup>th</sup>, David Fletcher is batting .379 (25/66) in 16 road affairs...RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Ohtani)...Ohtani is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (D. Palka, CWS).

**YOUTH SERVED:** In his last eight outings, Jaime Barria is 6-1 with 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER)...Has allowed one earned run or less five of last six starts...Leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 10 GS).

**PUJOLS SURGERY:** On August 30<sup>th</sup>, Albert Pujols underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks...Pujols ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22<sup>nd</sup> with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5<sup>th</sup> w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & ARod).

**MINOR MENTIONS:** Salt Lake shortstop Luis Rengifo split time on three minor league levels this season (A+ Inland Empire – 41 G, AA Mobile – 40 G & AAA Salt Lake – 46 G). The Venezuelan prospect combined to hit .299 (150/502) with 109 runs, 30 doubles, 13 triples, seven home runs, 64 RBI and 41 stolen bases in 127 games played. Rengifo, who batted leadoff for the Bees, boasted a .399 on-base percentage this season...LHP Patrick Sandoval (Mission Viejo HS), made seven combined starts in Angels' system at Mobile (AA) & Inland Empire (A+) allowing just three earned runs in 34.1 IP (0.79 ERA; 3 R, 3 ER, 18 H, 14 BB, 48 K)...All told, he went 11-1 with two saves and a 2.43 ERA (122.1 IP – 28 ER; 29 BB, 145 K) in 26 games 20 starts) this season.

**2019 SCHEDULE:** Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Angels previously played internationally in San Juan, Puerto Rico for a three-game series with Montreal in 2003... Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

**HI, MY NAME IS...** 58 players (35 pitchers-15 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...14 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

**THE NEW ME:** In 67 games in return from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .278 (68/245) with 50 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 HRs & 44 RBI (hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games)...Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18<sup>th</sup> rank tied for fourth in A.L.

**TROUT TRIFECTA:** Trout is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of 25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks by age-26 season-or-younger...Joins Jeff Bagwell (3), Bobby Abreu (3) & Barry Bonds (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

**GOLD STANDARD:** Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 206 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 909 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

**GLOVE STORY:** With 67 errors committed, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 151 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 41.2 caught stealing pct. (28 of 65), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

**BULLPEN BITS:** 3.72 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0 % to score (49 of 223)...Bullpen has logged 534 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 198 games pitched lead A.L. (164.2 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 134 games pitched and Blake Parker ranks tied for third in the span (132 games pitched).

**THIS N' THAT:** 35 players are on Angels' current active roster...Club is 19-26 when lefty starts (50-46 vs. RHs)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+32)...Halos' 184 HRs hit rank fifth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.62 (531 PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .298 (50/168) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,639 wins) ranks 18<sup>th</sup> on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17<sup>th</sup> with 1,769)...A. Heaney is one strikeout shy of 150, would be first Halo to reach the mark since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162).

**TWO KIDS:** Mike Trout & Willie Mays are only players with only 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (Trout is only player in A.L. history)...Trout turned age 27 on August 7<sup>th</sup>...His 62.3 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

**HOT HALOS:** Over his last five starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.81 ERA (32 IP – 10 ER)...Andrelton Simmons has 10 RBI his last nine games (3 HR last 7 G)...Ohtani is riding a five-game hit streak (.444; 8/18, 4 HR, 7 RBI) and has homered in three straight games and five of last nine contests overall (6 HR total)...Ohtani is batting .361 (26/72) with three doubles, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 20 runs scored and five stolen bases over his last 26 games...Jose Fernandez has hit safely in 13 of 19 games with Angels this season (hits in 10 of 13 starts)...18 of last 21 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless... David Fletcher has hits 18 of last 21 games (nine multi-hit efforts) and is batting .349 (30/86) with 14 runs, six doubles, a triple and 10 RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 18 of last 20 outings (1.02 ERA; 17.2 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has successfully reached base in 222 of his last 23 games with 18 runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and 27 walks in that span.

**@ WHITE SOX:** Angels lead 2018 season series 3-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped nine of last 13 in Chicago...Angels are 35-20 overall vs. CWS since 2011.

**RANGERS ON DECK:** Halos lead 2018 season series 8-5 (3-1 at home)...Six games remain with Texas (all at home)...Angels are 29-19 in Arlington since 2014...David Fletcher is batting .414 (12/29) against Texas this season.

(1996) Angels turned the fifth triple play in club history in a 4-2 victory at Minnesota.

**September 9**

(1971) Second baseman Billy Parker becomes the first player in MLB history to hit a 'walk-off' home run in his MLB debut...The HR comes with two outs in the 12<sup>th</sup> frame; (1989) Devon White stole for the cycle (2B, 3B, Home) in an 8-5 win over Boston, only player in club history to do so; (2012) Mike Trout hits a lead-off homer for the second straight game in a win vs. Detroit, 3-2.

**1-0, 2.53 ERA**

*Tossed first career shutout on July 16, 2016 vs. White Sox*

- **WELCOME BACK SHOE:** Making third start of the season (all on the road)...Second start since being reinstated from disabled list on Monday at Texas.
- **INJURY WOES:** Was placed on disabled list after season debut (March 31 at OAK) with a right forearm strain (missed 134 games)...Last season, exited start vs. Yankees on June 14, 2017 with a right forearm strain and missed remainder of year on DL...In 2016, missed final month of the season after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Seattle's **Kyle Seager** on Sept. 4 at Safeco Field.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in return to mound on Monday at Texas after tossing five scoreless innings and allowing two hits and one walk with three strikeouts.
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Did not factor in decision in season debut on March 31 at Oakland...Carried a shutout into the sixth inning before yielding three runs in the 6<sup>th</sup> frame...Was placed on DL following the start.
- **REHAB START:** Made one rehab appearance with Adv.-A Inland Empire on Wednesday vs. Lake Elsinore and pitched 4+ no-hit innings, allowing one run (unearned) with two walks and six strikeouts.
- **GOOD NIGHT SHOE:** Has a career record of 34-19 with a 3.67 ERA (417 IP – 170 ER) in night games, compared with a 5-11 record and 4.51 ERA (107.2 IP – 54 ER) in day games...Last season, was 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA (55.2 IP – 22 ER) in night games, compared with a 0-3 record and 6.95 ERA (22 IP – 17 ER) in day games.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Owns a 4.57 career ERA (335 IP – 170 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.56 ERA (189.2 IP – 54 ER) after the All-Star Break...Tonight marks his second start after the All-Star Break in the last two seasons.
- **VS. CHICAGO (A.L.):** In five career starts vs. White Sox, is 2-2 with a 4.18 ERA (32.1 IP – 17 ER)...Won only start vs. White Sox last season on May 17, 2017 at Angel Stadium (6.1 IP, 9 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 1 BB, 9 SO)...Tossed first career complete game and shutout in start vs. White Sox on July 16, 2016 at Angel Stadium, allowing just six hits and no walks with 13 strikeouts...Established career highs in innings and strikeouts that night.
- **AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD:** In two career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (12 IP – 9 ER) and eight strikeouts...Tonight marks first appearance at the ballpark since April 19, 2016.
- **2017 RECAP:** In 14 starts for the Angels last season, went 6-3 with a 4.52 ERA (77.2 IP – 39 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 69 strikeouts at the time of season ending injury (June 14)...In last seven starts, was 5-1 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP – 17 ER), before suffering the right forearm strain in final start against the Yankees...Yielded 15 home runs last year across his 14 starts...24 of 41 runs allowed scored via HR.
- **HOME COOKING:** In last 16 home starts, is 9-2 with a 2.78 ERA (103.2 IP – 32 ER) with 111 strikeouts...In that span (since May 21, 2016), ranks fourth in A.L. in home ERA (min. 15 GS) behind **Corey Kluber** (2.16), **Blake Snell** (2.44) and **Justin Verlander** (2.76).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Owns a 39-30 record and 3.84 ERA (524.2 IP – 224 ER) with 464 strikeouts in 96 games (88 starts) across parts of six seasons for Angels...Has made Angels Opening Day roster each of last five years.

### #48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP)

AGE: 29

- Worked one scoreless inning last night in third appearance of road trip.
- Earned fifth win of season on Aug. 15 at San Diego; sets new career-high in wins
- 70 appearances are second most in Major Leagues this season and are the most by a left-hander in Angels history (previous was 66 games by Mike Holtz in 1997).
- Has stranded 40 of 47 inherited runners this season...47 IR are tied for the most in the Majors...85.1% stranded rate is fifth best in Majors.
- Retired first batter faced in 53 of 67 outings the year.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (5 games; 2 IP) and 10 ER against all other opponents (55.2 IP).
- 48 appearances before the All-Star Break are an Angels record.
- Matched season high with three strikeouts on May 27 at Yankee Stadium.
- **Last Outing:** 9/7 @ CWS (1 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 1 SO)      **Holds:** 11      **Saves/Opps:** 0/3

### #38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)

AGE: 25

- Has not allowed a run in 11 of last 13 outings.
- Stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season.
- Charged with loss Aug. 16, at TEX after allowing season-high four earned runs.
- Struck out all four batters faced on 8/10 vs. OAK...First Angels pitcher to do so (min. 4 BF) since Cory Rasmus (4 BF – 4 SO) on Oct. 4, 2015 at TEX.
- Earned third win of season Aug. 3 at Cleveland after working one perfect inning.
- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings on July 29 vs. Mariners.
