## NATIONALS NEWS

### MARLIN SEASON

The Washington Nationals welcome the Miami Marlins to Nationals Park this weekend for the first time this season...The Nationals enter this series riding an 11-game winning streak over the Marlins...Washington's 11-game winning streak over Miami tied for the longest winning streak against a single opponent in Nationals history (2005-pres.)...Washington also posted an 11-game win streak over Seattle from June 10, 2005 to Aug. 30, 2014.

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Washington's 11-game winning streak over Miami is the second-longest active winning streak by one team over another...The Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim are in the midst of a 12-game winning streak over Philadelphia (6/10/03 - pres.) and the Los Angeles Dodgers have won 12 straight over the New York Mets (5/28/16 - pres.).

### TREA MAGNIFIQUE

Over his last 15 games, **Trea Turner** is 22-for-61 (.361) with one double, one triple, two homers, four RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and 11 runs scored...He has a .418 on-base percentage and a .508 slugging percentage during this stretch.

- Turner's 22 multiple-hit games this season are the fourth-most among National League shortstops behind SFG **Brandon Crawford** (27), COL **Trevor Story** (25) and CIN **Jose Peraza** (24)...He has hit safely in 19 of 25 games with nine of his multi-hit performances coming in that span.

### EXTRA! EXTRA!

**Anthony Rendon** clubbed his 12th home run of the season on Monday night against the Red Sox...He has homered in three of his last six games and has hit safely in 17 of his last 19 games dating to June 15...He is hitting .368 (28-for-76) with 10 doubles, six homers, 14 RBI, six walks and 14 runs scored over this span...

- Rendon's 24 doubles rank fourth in the National League and rank first among National League third basemen.
- His 16 extra-base hits are tied with COL **Nolan Arenado** and STL **Matt Carpenter** for the most in MLB since June 15...On the season his 36 extra-base hits rank just out of the top 10 (11th) in the National League.
- Rendon entered play on June 6 hitting .253/.333/.448 and in 25 games since then, he is hitting .343 with 18 extra-base hits (12 2B, 6 HR)...He is now slashing .289/.352/.526 on the season

### WELL-DERIVED HONOR

**Juan Soto** was named National League Rookie of the Month for June on Monday...He hit .317 (26-for-82) with six doubles, six homers, 15 RBI, 18 walks and 19 runs scored in 24 games during the month...He led National League rookies in batting average (.317), on-base percentage (.440), slugging percentage (.610), OPS (1.050), home runs (6) and walks (18). He ranked second in doubles (6), hits (26) and was third with 15 RBI for the month.

- On the season, Soto ranks among all Major League rookies (min. 150 PA), in batting average (.306), on-base percentage (.419), and OPS (.971)...He ranks second in slugging percentage (.552) behind NYY **Gleyber Torres** (.555).
- Among all National League players (min. 150 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (3rd, .419), OPS (4th, .971), batting average (10th, .306), and slugging percentage (10th, .552).
- Since May 15, he ranks among National League rookies in home runs (1st, 8), walks (1st, 26), runs (2nd, 25), hits (T2nd, 41), RBI (T3rd, 21) and doubles (3rd, 9).

### HARPER'S HOMERS

**Bryce Harper** clubbed his 21st home run of the season on July 2, a solo shot in the eighth inning...Harper's 21 home runs rank second behind only COL **Nolan Arenado** (22) for the most in the National League.

- Harper's 35 extra-base hits are tied for second-most among National League outfielders, trailing ATL **Nick Markakis** (36).

### FIVE FINGER DISCOUNTS

The Nationals rank second in the National League in stolen bases with 64 stolen bases...They rank behind the Chicago White Sox (68) and Boston Red Sox (65) and Milwaukee Brewers (65) for the most in Major League Baseball.

- **Michael A. Taylor** is tied for the MLB lead with 23 stolen bases with ATL **Ender Inciarte**, while **Trea Turner** (22) is tied for third with SEA **Dee Gordon** (22).

## NATIONALS HISTORY

### July 5 (7-4 on this date)

2014 – The Nationals blanked the Cubs, 13-0, behind a Nationals record (2005-pres.) eight doubles. **Anthony Rendon** (3-for-4, 3 2B, 2 RBI, 3 R), **Jayson Werth** (3-for-4, 2 2B, 2 RBI, 2 R), **Ryan Zimmerman** (4-for-5, 2 2B, 3 RBI, 2 R) and **Wilson Ramos** (2-for-5, 2B, RBI, R) led the 19-hit offensive attack, while **Gio Gonzalez** tossed 8.0 shutout innings to earn his sixth win.

### MIAMI MARLINS

Assistant hitting coach **Joe Dillon** made his MLB debut on May 18, 2005 with the Florida Marlins... In 2004, he was named the Florida Marlins Minor League Player of the Year...**Bryce Harper's** 23 home runs are the most he's hit against any opponent and are 11th-most all-time against the Florida/Miami Marlins.

### THE SERIES

The Nationals have won 11 straight games over the Marlins dating to Aug. 9, 2017...Washington has outscored Miami 71-20 during the streak.

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#58 - JEREMY HELLICKSON - RHP

A veteran of eight Major League seasons joined the Nationals on a Minor League deal with an invite to Major League Spring Training in mid-March... Was the 2011 American League Rookie of the Year for Tampa Bay...Took home the Gold Glove in 2012...Has made more than 27 starts in six of his eight Major League seasons...Pitched for Tampa Bay from 2010-14 while Nationals manager Dave Martinez served as the club's bench coach.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Makes his 13th career start against the Marlins, first since May 29, 2017 as a member of the Phillies...Is 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 12 previous starts against Miami...Threw one of his two career shutouts against the Miami Marlins on Sept. 17, 2016 as a member of the Philadelphia Phillies.

LAST START: In his first start since returning from the 10-day disabled list, allowed three earned runs on seven hits in 4.2 innings as the Nationals fell to the Phillies, 3-2...Hellickson was saddled with his first loss of the season.

2018 NOTES

- Has issued just eight walks this season, fewest among MLB pitchers with at least 10 starts this season...His five home runs allowed are tied for the second-fewest in MLB (min. 10 GS).
Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on June 30...Injured his right hamstring after recording one out on June 3 at Atlanta.
Prior to his injury suffered on June 3 at Atlanta, allowed just four earned runs in 27.2 innings spanning his five previous starts (1.30 ERA)...He fanned 25 batters, walked two, and opposing batters were just 19-for-75 (.200) against him.
At the time of his injury, he ranked (among pitchers with at least eight starts) eighth in the National League with a 2.30 ERA...He also ranked among National League pitchers (min. 8 GS) in opp. OBP (4th, .261), WHIP (2nd, 0.93), walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 1.26), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 5.67).
Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in seven of his eight starts prior to his injury...Allowed one earned run or fewer in four of the eight.
Was again efficient in 5.0 innings of work on May 29 at Baltimore...Allowed two earned runs on six hits...Earned his second win of the season and the Nationals improved to 6-2 in his starts, including five straight wins.
Allowed one earned run for the second consecutive start on May 22 vs. San Diego...Allowed five hits, struck out five batters and issued just one walk in 5.1 innings of work...Did not factor in the decision as the Nationals walked-off the Padres.
Allowed just one earned run on three hits in 5.0 innings of work in his second start of the season against the Diamondbacks on May 13...He struck out five batters while walking just one.
On May 8 at San Diego, he took a perfect game into the seventh inning to earn his first win of the season...A single by Franchy Cordero in the seventh inning broke up the bid...Tossed 6.2 scoreless innings, giving up just two hits and striking out a season-high eight batters.
Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings on May 3 against Pittsburgh to help Washington complete the four-game sweep...Surrendered just three hits while striking out four...Did not issue a walk.
In his third start for the Nationals allowed two earned runs on five hits in 5.1 innings of work as Washington fell to Arizona, 4-3, on April 28...Both earned runs came via the home run.
Allowed three earned runs on three hits in 5.2 innings on April 22 at LAD...Did not factor in the decision as the Dodgers took the lead in the 7th inn.
Made his Nationals debut on April 16 at NYM...Allowed two earned runs on seven hits in 4.2 innings in Washington's 8-6 victory.
