PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (64-49) vs ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (63-52) Wednesday, August 8, 2018 – 3:40 EDT – Chase Field – Game 114 – Road 58 RHP Vince Velasquez (8-8, 3.80) vs LHP Patrick Corbin (8-4, 3.31)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Arizona Diamondbacks, 5-2, at Chase Field in Phoenix ... Stater Nick Pivetta (W, 7-9) tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed 5 hits with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts ... Philadelphia jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the 3rd inning as Nick Williams cranked a solo home run ... Philadelphia plated another four runs in the top of the 8th to take a 5-0 lead ... Arizona would rally back and trailed 5-2 heading into the bottom of the 9th ... Pat Neshek tossed a scoreless frame, needing only five pitches (all strikes) to pick up his 2nd save of the year.
- VINNY ON FIRE:** Today's starter **Vince Velasquez** has allowed 2 ER or fewer in each of his last six starts (since 6/25), posting a 1.39 ERA (5 ER, 32.1 IP) and 0.96 WHIP (13 BB, 18 H) in that span ... On July 22 vs SD, Velasquez completed 5.0 innings without allowing a hit, the third time he has done so this season (others: 5/28 at LAD & 6/14 vs COL) ... Per Elias, the last Phillies pitcher with three such starts in a season was Hall-of-Famer Steve Carlton in 1979 (4 such starts) ... Over the past five seasons combined (2013-17), Phillies starters had three such starts total ... Overall, Velasquez has posted a 3.80 ERA (48 ER, 113.2 IP) this season in 22 games (21 starts) ... If you remove his start on June 8 vs MIL (10 ER, 3.2 IP), Velasquez has a 3.11 ERA (38 ER, 110.0 IP) in 21 of his 22 games this season (20 starts).
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 113 games, the Phils are a season-best 15 games above .500 at 64-49 and have scored 498 runs and allowed 459 (+39) ... Last season, through 113 games, they were 29 games under .500 at 42-71 and had scored 451 and allowed 547 (-96) ... **The Phillies, only two games shy of matching their entire 2017 win total, didn't notch their 64th win last season until September 27.**
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 16 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 11-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds in Cincinnati (1-3, 7/26-29) ... Philadelphia's 11 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres, Dodgers and Marlins.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** Last night marked the 40th time this season that the Phillies have drawn five or more walks in a single game ... Philadelphia has a 27-13 record in those 40 contests (.675) ... Only the Cubs (43) have more five-walk games than the Phillies this season.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 15 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 17.8%), **Rhys Hoskins** (11th, 14.6%) and **Cesar Hernandez** (13th, 14.3%) ... They rank 2nd MLB in walk rate (10.0) and also pitches per plate appearance (4.01) and are 3rd in walks (432), behind only LAD (442) and CHI (433).
- ARMS RACE:** Philadelphia's starting rotation has amassed a National League-best 59 quality starts this season (next: WSH, 55 QS) ... Additionally, the Phils rotation ranks 2nd in FIP (3.58), WHIP (1.19), opponent OBP (.299) & opponent SLG (.383), 3rd in ERA (3.67) & opponent OPS (.682), 4th in innings pitched (635.2) & strikeouts (624) ... **Over their last eight starts (since Nola's gem in Boston on 7/30), the Phillies rotation has posted a 1.46 ERA (9 ER, 55.1 IP) with 45 strikeouts to only 7 walks (6.43 SO/BB ratio).**
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 18 games over .500 at 63-45 (.583) and rank 2nd to the Chicago Cubs (.593) for the best winning percentage in the National League since April 5 ... Sunday's win over the Marlins brought the Phillies to 22-21 vs the NL East this season, giving them a .500 record or better against every division in the majors that they have played ... At 64-49 (.566) on the year, the Phillies currently own a 1.5 game lead over the Atlanta Braves for first place in the National League East.
- BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9, and in 237 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .284/.384/.592 with 36 runs, 14 2B, 16 HR, 44 RBI and 32 walks ... The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (23 HR, 38 BB) ... This season, Hoskins ranks 1st in the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.44, next: CLE's Jose Ramirez, 4.36) and among all NL players, 7th in RBI (72), 8th in walks (66), 10th in OPS (.883) and T-10th in homers (22) ... Friday night marked the 150th game of Hoskins' young career ... His .938 career OPS (648 plate appearances) is the second-best mark among all Phillies players dating to 1900, through the first 150 games of a career, trailing only Hall-of-Famer **Chuck Klein** (1.041 OPS) ... Among all players, through their first 150 games with the Phillies, Hoskins has the fourth-best OPS since 1900, trailing only **Lefty O'Doul** (1.080), **Klein** and Hall-of-Famer **Jim Thome** (.956) ... Among all major league players who have made their debut since the year 2000, Hoskins has the eighth-best OPS through 150 games to begin a career ... Hoskins, 25, crushed his 40th career home run in his 149th career game on 8/2 vs MIA, becoming the 2nd-fastest Phillies player to 40 career home runs (fastest: Klein, 148 G).
- SNAKE BITTEN:** Philadelphia is just 3-9 against the Diamondbacks since the start of last season, and have been outscored 57-37 in those 12 games ... It is their worst record against any team in baseball since the start of 2017 (min. 10 games) ... A win today would give the Phillies their first series victory over Arizona since the 2016 season when they swept a three-game series at Chase Field, June 27-29.
