RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped the series opener to the Rays, losing 10-9 in 10 innings on Monday night at Tropicana Field. Nicholas Castellanos had three hits and scored three runs, while Niko Goodrum added two hits and three RBI. José Iglesias and Victor Martinez also contributed two RBI in the loss. Francisco Liriano started for Detroit and received a no decision after allowing seven runs on eight hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 2.1 innings. Blaine Hardy took the loss, giving up a run on two hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 1.1 innings. The Tigers and Rays play the second game of their three-game series tonight. Following the series vs. Tampa Bay, the road trip continues with three games at Houston (July 13-15).

NICK THE STICK: Nicholas Castellanos had a three-hit game last night to record his 13th game with three-or-more hits this season, which ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Seattle's Jean Segura (15). Castellanos also ranks tied for third in the American League with 110 hits, while he is fourth with 34 multi-hit games, tied for fourth with 27 doubles, tied for sixth with 188 total bases, eighth with 45 extra-base hits, tied for ninth with three triples and 10th with a .306 (110x359) batting average.

GOODY TWO SHOES: Niko Goodrum hit a pair of doubles and drove in two runs last night and has now hit safely in eight-of-nine games in July. In eight games this month, Goodrum has a slash line of .421/.436/.711 with eight runs scored, six doubles, one triple, one home run and five RBI.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Victor Martinez drove in two runs in last night's game and now has 515 RBI in his Tigers career. With his two RBI last night, Martinez passed Tony Clark (514) for the second-most RBI by a switch-hitter in franchise history, trailing only Billy Rogell (532)...Victor Reyes had two hits in last night's game and has now hit safely in 13 of his last 20 games with at least one at-bat. Over that stretch, he is hitting .327 (18x55).

FARMER'S ALMANAC: Buck Farmer threw a scoreless inning in last night's game to extend his shutout streak to 13 appearances. Over the 12.0 inning stretch, Farmer has allowed just eight hits, limiting opponents to a .186 (8x43) batting average, while striking out eight.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 28th one-run game of the season last night, falling to 14-14 in those contests with a 10-9 loss in 10 innings. Detroit's 28 one-run games are the fourth-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 38, Seattle, 37 and Houston, 29), while their 14 one-run wins are tied for the fourth-most in the league. In addition to the 27 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 21 games that have been decided by two runs.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Joe Jiménez was selected as an American League All-Star for the first time in his career on Sunday. In 44 appearances this season, Jiménez has posted a 4-1 record with three saves, a 2.85 ERA (41.0IP/13ER) and 46 strikeouts. He has limited opponents to a .224 (35x156) batting average and has a 1.15 WHIP. Jiménez currently ranks tied for fourth in the American League with 44 appearances, while he is tied for eighth among AL relievers with four wins and tied for 10th with 13 holds. At 23 years old, Jiménez is the youngest Tigers all-star since 1992, when Travis Fryman was selected to the All-Star Team at the age of 23.

V-MART VS. THE RAYS: Victor Martinez has performed well in his career against the Tampa Bay Rays. In 90 career games against the Rays, Martinez has posted a .341 (121x355) batting average with 45 runs scored, 18 doubles, 14 home runs and 73 RBI. Among active players, Martinez ranks third with a .341 batting average vs. Tampa Bay, while he is sixth with a .391 on-base percentage and eighth with a .510 slugging percentage. Martinez has a .351 (67x191) batting average with 25 runs scored, eight doubles, 10 home runs and 37 RBI in 47 career games at Tropicana Field.

TIGERS AND RAYS: The Tigers and Rays have split the first four games of their season series. Detroit has lost four straight games at Tropicana Field and has an all-time record of 36-37 in Tampa Bay. Detroit is 3-2-2 in season series against the Rays since 2011.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-1 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Tampa Bay (0-1) and three games at Houston (July 13-15). Detroit is currently in a stretch that will see them play 20-of-28 games away from Comerica Park leading up to the All-Star break. The Tigers are 15-30 on the road this season and have lost 10 of their last 12 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .239 (372x1558) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.81 ERA (381.2IP/204ER).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 40-53 (.430) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,108-1,092 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 18th start of the season tonight at Tampa Bay.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd suffered his seventh loss of the season on Thursday vs. Texas, allowing seven runs, six earned, on seven hits with three strikeouts in 4.0 innings

VS. TAMPA BAY: Boyd has made two career starts against the Rays, compiling a 1-0 record with a 3.27 ERA (11.0IP/4ER) and 12 strikeouts. He faced the Rays earlier this season on May 1 and earned the win, giving up one run on seven hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Boyd has pitched in 38 games, including 36 as a starter, on the road in his career, compiling a 7-17 record with a 6.02 ERA (182.1IP/122ER) and 162 strikeouts. In nine road starts this season, Boyd is 1-5 with a 5.55 ERA (47.0IP/29ER) and 44 strikeouts.

AT TROPICANA FIELD: Boyd will be making his first career appearance at Tropicana Field tonight.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Boyd has made 15 career starts against teams from the American League East, posting a 2-4 record with a 5.81 ERA (74.1IP/48ER) and 65 strikeouts. In five starts vs. AL East teams this season, Boyd is 2-0 with a 3.13 ERA (31.2IP/11ER) and 29 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Boyd has started nine games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 5-2 record with a 5.56 ERA (43.2IP/27ER) and 42 strikeouts. In three July starts last season, Boyd went 3-0 with a 4.19 ERA (19.1IP/9ER) and 16 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .264 (79x299) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .274 (325x1187) clip. In 17 starts this season, lefties are hitting .232 (19x82) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .230 (60x261).

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

ABOUT JORDAN: Zimmermann will make his 12th start of the season tomorrow afternoon in the series finale at Tampa Bay.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann improved his record to 4-0 by earning the win on Friday vs. Texas, allowing just one run on four hits with a season-high 11 strikeouts. Zimmermann's 11 strikeouts marked his sixth career double-digit strikeout game and were his much punchouts since June 8, 2014 at San Diego, when he struck out 12.

VS. TAMPA BAY/AT TROPICANA FIELD: Zimmermann has faced the Rays six times in his career, posting a 1-1 record with a 3.68 ERA (36.2IP/15ER) and 29 strikeouts. He faced the Rays earlier this season on April 30 and received a no decision after throwing 7.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and five strikeouts. In three career starts at Tropicana Field, Zimmermann has a 0-0 record with a 5.29 ERA (17.0IP/10ER) and 13 strikeouts.
