WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the Royals last night, 5-3, and have a 1-0 record to begin this 10-day, 10-game road trip to KC (1-0), BAL (4 G), and TB (3 G)...team has won 4 of 5 and is 17-13 (.567) since 6/9, 6th-best in A.L. in that stretch...club has a 5-4 record in July and has dropped 7 of 12, 8 of 14, and 12 of 22...Texas has won 18 of 32 and 31 of 56...club has 39-35 (.527) record beginning 4/20, 5th-best in A.L./10th in MLB, this after opening year at 5-10.

• At 44-45 (.494), Rangers are 8th in the A.L. in winning percentage...club has been under .500 for 11 straight dates, but is seeking to reach the .500 mark tonight for the 1st time since 6/28 (39-39)...Texas has had a winning record on just 3 occasions in the last 51 days, last 39-38 on 6/27...club was 54-35/54-36 thru 89/90 G in '16.

• Club has been season-high 3 G above .500 twice, last on 5/21 (24-21), and was a 2017 high 7 games under .500 (13-20) on 5/8...season best 10-G win streak 5/9-19 was 4th-longest in franchise history...the Rangers are 5-3-2 in their last 10 overall series, needing to win one of final 2 G this weekend for another series victory.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers are in 2nd place in the A.L. West, 16.5 games behind HOU...days in each position in 2017 (alone or tied): 1st-0 days, 2nd-34, 3rd-25, 4th-31, 5th-13...Texas has gained ground in the A.L. West just 3x in the last 27 days...the 16.5-G deficit at the break was the Rangers' 2nd-largest in last 14 seasons (-21.0 GB in 2014)...season-high 17.0-G deficit both 7/4-5, team's greatest at any point since end of the 2014 season (-31.0 GB)...the Rangers are still just 2.0 GB of a wild card spot in the A.L.

VS. KANSAS CITY: Rangers are 5-0 vs. KC in 2017 and have won a club-record 11 straight against the Royals since last loss 7/22/16 at KC...the 11-G win streak is T4th-longest ever by any club against KC (see below)...team's 11-1 (.917) record vs. KC since start of last season is highest win pct. for any team against another in 2016-17 (min. 10 G)...Rangers are 7-2-2 in last 11 series at The K...Texas has edge in all-time series at 258-255-1, but Royals have leads of 143-116-1 in KC and 138-112 at The K...Rangers have won 5 of last 7 games in this park, but dropped 7 of 13...still own 22-14 (.611) record at Kauffman since start of '08.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have won 2 of last 3 away games, but have dropped 4 of 6, 5 of 8, and 7 of last 12 road tilts since a season-best 6-G road win streak from 5/28-6/13...club is still 11-7 in road contests since 5/28...prior to this 11-7 span, the club had won just 6 of its previous 17 away contests...the Rangers' .432 (19-25) road winning percentage is 9th in the A.L...club was 24-20/25-20 in 2016.

• Rangers are opening on road post-AS break for 4th straight season and 7th time in 8 years...have lost 1st series after break for 4 straight years (2-1 at SEA in 2012)...10-G road trip after AS break would be longest for TEX since 2006 (11 G at BAL/TOR/BOS/CWS), and this will be 3rd straight year with a 9+ G trip following the break.

FOR THE WIN: Cole Hamels enters tonight's game with a 4-0 record, 2nd-best win streak to begin a season in his career (5-0 in 2016)...he has gone 26-6 (.813) over 52 starts since the 7/31/15 trade to the Rangers, best win pct. in A.L. (min. 25 decisions) in that span and 2nd-best in MLB (Kershaw-.829, 34-7)...Hamels is also 3-0, 1.27 (3 ER/21.1 IP) in his 3 starts against KC with Texas.

ST. ROBINSON IN HIS CADILLAC DREAM: Drew Robinson started last night for a 3rd consecutive TEX game...he has reached safely in each of his 1st 4 ML starts, and team is 3-1 in those games.

A COMEBACK: Texas overcame a 3-run deficit in last night's win, matching the largest come-from-behind victory for the club this season (also 5/30 vs. TB)...Rangers had not won after trailing by 3+ runs on the road since 8/9/16 at COL (trailed 5-1, won 7-5)...last night was the club's 14th win decided in the 7th inning or later.

THE LONG BALL: Texas scored all 5 runs last night on a pair of HR, as 25 of the team's 37 runs (67.6%) in 7 G since 7/3 have scored via HR...for the season, 223 of club's 449 runs (49.7%) have come on HR, 3rd-highest pct. in MLB to TOR (52.5%, 196/373) and OAK (49.9%, 193/387).

• Club's 137 HR rank 3rd in MLB (150-HOU, 140-MIL) and club has homered in 73 of 89 games...only HOU has homered in more games in '17 (75).

• With a 3-R and a 2-R HR last night, TEX now has 61 HR with runners on base in '17, 3rd in MLB to only NYY (72) and WAS (62).

A BIG SWING: Adrian Beltre hit a game-tying 3-R HR in the 6th inning last night, ending the Rangers' 16-inning scoreless streak in which the club had produced 3 total hits...it was the 2nd time this season for a Ranger to hit a HR of 3+ R in the 6th-or-later to turn a multiple-run deficit into a tie game or give the club a lead...the other: Elvis Andrus in 7th inn. on 5/30 vs. TB...last night's blast also tied Beltre for the team lead in 3-R HR (3) with Shin-Soo Choo, this despite Beltre missing the team's 1st 51 contests in '17.

PASSING YAZ: Beltre's HR last night was career no. 453, breaking a tie with Carl Yastrzemski for sole possession of 38th place on the all-time list...the 3-R blast also gave him 1601 career RBI, 32nd player in history to surpass the 1600 mark...with 2980 hits, Beltre is 20 shy of becoming the 31st player in MLB history to reach the 3000 mark.

TAKING A NAP: Mike Napoli's go-ahead pinch 2-R HR in the 7th last night was the 1st pinch HR by a Ranger since 5/19/15 at BOS (Leonys Martin off Koji Uehara in 9th)...last night was just the 3rd GA pinch HR by a Ranger in the last 17 seasons (2001-17): Adrian Beltre on 5/5/12 at CLE, Jurickson Profar on 9/26/13 vs. LAA (walkoff), and Napoli last night.

• Last night was Napoli's 2nd career pinch HR, the other was last year w/ CLE on 4/21/16 vs. SEA off Joaquin Benoit...Napoli has 5 HR in July, tied for the ML lead with MIA's Giancarlo Stanton and CLE's Jose Ramirez.

PEREZ DELIVERS: Martin Perez earned the win last night, matching his season high with 7.0 IP...he is 3-0 in his last 4 starts and has exited with either Rangers leading or game tied in 5 straight outings...Perez's 5 wins rank 2nd on the staff (6-Darvish).

ANOTHER DEEP START: Last night was the 4th time in the last 5 G for the Texas rotation to pitch 7.0+ innings...over those 5 contests, TEX starters have a 1.56 ERA (6 ER/34.2 IP) to drop season figure from 4.44 to 4.24, 4th in the A.L...Rangers' 46 quality starts rank 3rd in A.L. (51-BOS, 47-DET).

CLAUDIO CLOSES: Alex Claudio earned his 2nd career save last night (both in '17) with a perfect 9th...it was the Rangers' 1st save since 6/27 at CLE (Matt Bush), as 11 G without a save was Rangers' longest span since 13 G from 4/18-5/3/15...with 2 saves, Claudio ranks 2nd on the staff in rescues in 2017 (10-Bush).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

**#35 Cole Hamels, LHP
(4-0, 3.51)**

TONIGHT: The 33-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 9th start of the season tonight in the middle installment of this 3-game series in Kansas City to start the "2nd half"...has compiled a 13.1-inning scoreless streak over his last 2 starts, longest active streak in the A.L. and 4th-longest in MLB (STL's Brett Cecil-15.2 IP, PIT's Jameson Taillon-15.1 IP, PHI's Luis Garcia-13.2 IP)...will be working on 7-days' rest since his last outing prior to the All-Star break, a 10-0 win over the Angels last Friday in Arlington...in his last 2 starts: 2-0, 1.26 ERA (2 ER/14.1 IP), 1 BB, 12 SO, .111 opp. avg (5-45)...has gone 2-0, 4.34 (9 ER/18.2 IP) in 3 G/GS since his return from the DL, raising season ERA from 3.03 to 3.51...is 4-0, the 2nd-longest season-opening win streak of his career (5-0 in 2016), and he also has a team-high 3 wins lost - games in which he exited in position to win before the bullpen gave up the lead...has received 6+ runs of support in each outing and is receiving 9.29 RS per 9...is 26-6 (.813) in his 52 reg. season starts with Texas, and team is 38-14 (.731) in those games...combined to post at least 200.0 innings and 200 strikeouts in a season for the 5th time in his career in 2016...has earned the win in each of the Rangers' division-clinching games over the past 2 seasons...Texas is 4-4 in his 8 starts, winning 2 straight.

LAST START: Won his 2nd straight start in 10-0 victory over the Angels last Friday in Arlington (7.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R-ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR, 95 pitches/65 strikes)...combined with Jeremy Jeffress and Jason Grilli on the 3-hit shutout of the Halos...retired 24 straight batters dating back to his previous start in Chicago until Martin Maldonado's 2-out single in the 2nd inning...matched his 2nd-highest ground ball total of the season with 11...had 8+ swinging strikes for the 2nd straight start after just 2 such starts in his 1st 6 outings.

VS. THE ROYALS: Is 3-1 with a 3.67 ERA (11 ER/27.0 IP) over 4 career starts vs. the Royals, including 3-0, 1.27 (3 ER/21.1 IP) in 3 starts with Texas...picked up his 1st win of the season in a 6-2 win on 4/21 vs. the Royals in Arlington (8.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR, 107 pitches/71 strikes)...his run allowed scored just 2 batters into the game, as he held the Royals to 2-for-last-25 with 2 BB to end his outing... all 3 hits allowed were extra-bases (2 2B, 3B)...had 11 ground outs to match 2nd-highest total in a start this season.

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 1-0 with a 5.09 ERA (13 ER/23.0 IP) in 4 road starts this season...7 of 14 runs allowed on the road came in one start on 6/26 at CLE...has gone 2-0 with a 3.75 ERA (15 ER/36.0 IP) in last 6 road starts dating back to 9/10/16...opponents are batting .233/.333/.260 on the road compared to .191/.260/.298 in Arlington.

2017: Lucroy (4.20 ERA) has caught 5 of 8 starts and Chirinos (2.53 ERA) has caught 3 outings...through 8 starts, his swing and miss percentage (16.4%), SO/9 (4.91), and SO% (13.8) are all career lows...has never finished a season with a SO% lower than his 20.6 figure in 2009...has held LHB 5-for-31 (.161)...batters leading off an inning have reached in 20 of 53 frames (10-for-43 with 8 BB and 2 HBP), and are 0-for-14 with a BB in last 2 starts...opposition is batting .200 (7-35) with RISP, but have just one at-bat w/RISP over his last 2 outings (1-for-1 on 7/1 at CWS)...opponents by time through order: 1st PA-.213 (13-61); 2nd PA-.206 (14-68); 3rd PA-.213 (10-47); 4th PA-.250 (1-4)...has received 5+ runs of support in each outing and is receiving 9.29 runs of support per 9...has team-high 3 wins lost - games in which he exited in position to win before the bullpen gave up the lead...his 2 errors are T4thmost among A.L. pitchers...in ND on 6/26 at CLE, had leads of 7-1 and 9-3 but could not escape the 5th inn. in eventual 15-9 TEX loss.

DISABLED LIST: Was on the disabled list, 4/30-6/25, with a right oblique strain, an injury he suffered while warming up prior to a scheduled start on 5/2 at HOU...was the longest DL stint of his career, as he had never missed more than 29 days (3/26-4/23/14)...was placed on the disabled list on 5/3 and threw for the 1st time on 5/24...threw off the mound for the 1st time in bullpen session on 6/4...was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (1 ER/8.2 IP) in a pair of rehab starts with Double-A Frisco...made his 1st rehab start on 6/16 vs. San Antonio (3.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R-ER, 0 BB, 3 SO, 35 pitches/25 strikes)...following his outing, Hamels threw an additional 22 pitches in the bullpen...last outing was on 6/21 vs. Midland (5.2 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 81 pitches/56 strikes).

ALL I DO IS WIN: His 15 wins in 2016 were T2nd-most in his career (17 in 2012, 15 in 2007)...has gone 26-6 (.813) over 52 starts since the 7/31/15 trade to the Rangers, best win pct. in A.L. (min. 25 decisions) in that span and 2nd-best in MLB (Kershaw-.829, 34-7)...according to STATS LLC, he was one of just 5 pitchers since 1913 to win at least 19 of his 1st 22 decisions with a single club, joining Vida Blue as only pitchers to do it for an A.L. club...won a career-high 12 consecutive decisions from 8/23/15-5/22/16 before loss on 5/27/16 vs. PIT...it matched the longest win streak by a starter in Rangers history (Bobby Witt - 12 G in 1990) and was the longest by a left-hander.
— Has been the winning pitcher in each of the Rangers' division-clinching victories the past 2 seasons: 10/4/15 vs. LAA and 9/23/16 at OAK.
