Scouter Gennett leads the National League in hitting, just .003 ahead of **Christian Yelich** of the Brewers...in the first half of the season **Gennett** hit .326 to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since **George Foster** in 1979...listed below are the only Reds players ever to finish the season leading the National League in batting average.

Eugenio Suárez is hitting .295 and is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**Bos' J.D. Martinez** (.337, 39 HR, 115 RBI) is the only other player in the Major Leagues to match those numbers in the **Triple Crown** categories...**Oak's Kris Davis**, hitting .246, is the only other player with at least **30 HR** (40) and **96 RBI** (105).

Scouter Gennett is 1 of only 5 players to produce at least **46 HR** and **178 RBI** in his first **2 seasons** with the **Redlegs**...he is trying to become the first player in franchise history to do it while **hitting at least .300** (.307, 297-966)...courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau**.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Amber luni's Pirates** and **Game 2** (2-1) of a 6-game road trip that included a **2-1 series win** at **StL's Busch Stadium**...the Reds have beaten the Cardinals in **3 straight series** for the first time since **1979**...is **Game 14** (4-9) in a stretch of **16 straight games** vs **National League Central** rivals that features **13 games on the road** (1-2 at Mil, 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 vs Mil, 2-1 at StL, 0-0 at Pit)...following this series the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** on **9/6** to face the NL West Division's **Padres** (4g) and **Dodgers** (3g) before heading out for their final road trip of the season (3g at Cubs, 3g at Mil, 4g at Mia).

SERIES NOTES: The Pirates' **3-game sweep** from **7/20-7/22** at **Great American Ball Park** was their first **3-game series sweep** of the Reds since **9/27-9/29, 2013** (3-game series at GABP)...the Reds went **13-6 vs Pit** in **2017**, their first **13-win season vs Pit** since **2009** (13-5)...**Reds vs Pirates** information is on media guide **Page 327**.

YELLOW, BLACK & BLUE: Beginning in 2013, **Reds pitchers** hit **65 Pirates batters** (including **20 in 2016**, **10 in 2017** and **2 in 2018**), second-most by any Major League staff against any opponent...in that same span, **Pirates pitchers** hit **57 Reds batters** (including **9 in 2016**, **7 in 2017** and **5 in 2018**), tied for sixth-most vs any opponent (**Mariners** hit **68 Rangers** batters, the most vs any opponent)...over the past 6 seasons, including 2018, **Pirates pitchers** lead the Major Leagues in number of batters **hit by a pitch** with **419**, followed by the **White Sox** (**398**) and **Reds** (**390**).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **56-63** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

POSTSEASON: Class AA Pensacola clinched its fourth consecutive **Southern League playoff** appearance with last night's 4-3 win at Tennessee...the Blue Wahoos will begin their title defense on Wed at Biloxi...Class A Daytona will be participating in the **Florida State League** playoffs...**Billing** can clinch a **Pioneer League** playoff spot today with a win, coupled with a Helena loss.

REACHING BASE: The Reds have 2 of the National League leaders in **on-base percentage** in All-Stars **Joey Votto** (1st, .420) and **Eugenio Suárez** (12th, .377)...injured Reds rookie **Jesse Winker** (.405) ranked second in the NL through **7/31** but as of **8/1** no longer has enough plate apps to qualify among the leaders.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **16-25-2** in their **43 series**, including **11-9-1** in the **last 21 series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2** in their last 8 series vs **first-place teams** (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle**, **3-1 vs Phi**, **2-1 vs Ari**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits**, **batting average** and **on-base percentage**...All-Star **1B Joey Votto**, All-Star **2B Scouter Gennett**, All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** and **SS José Peraza** all rank among the NL leaders in several statistical categories.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award** and the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is 4 by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...as a **pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen** is **3-for-11** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-18** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...6 times in his career and 5 times this season entered games as a PH and remained in the game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

SLAMMING: The Reds, Red Sox and Indians are tied for the Major League lead with **9 grand slams**, tying Cin's **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duval** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the WSox on **5/16/1953 at NYY**.

Today's Pitcher - #32 Matt Harvey, RHP

RED HOTS

Matt Harvey this afternoon is making his 20th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **ninth career** appearance and **start** vs the **Pirates**, his fourth of the season, and his fourth career start at **PNC Park**...in his **last 4 starts** is **1-0, 3.18** (22.2ip, 8er)...his **23 starts** and **126.2 innings pitched** are his highest totals since **2015** (29gs, 189.1ip)...the Reds were **8-27** before he was acquired on **5/8** and **51-51** since then...in the 7-1 win on **8/18 vs SF** didn't allow a hit until **Joe Panik's** infield single with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning...in the 9-2 loss on **7/22 vs Pit** allowed 8 earned runs and 4 HR (3.2ip), both career highs, snapping a streak in which he did not allow more than 2 earned runs in any of his **previous 5 starts** (4-0, 1.86)...that **4-game winning streak** was his longest since he won his **first 5 starts** in **2015**...his **ERA for the Reds** in his other 18 starts is **3.84** (96ip, 41er)...between starts on **6/8 vs StL** (3hr) and **7/22 vs Pit** (career-high 4hr) produced season-high homerless streaks of **37.0 innings** and **6 starts**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

- Has a 5-game hitting streak (7-21, .333, 2 2b, 2hr, 7rbi)...in his last 13 apps produced 5 HR and 12 RBI...has an RBI in each of his last 4 apps (7rbi).
