TWINS NOTES:

- THE TWINS won the fourth game of four against Cleveland...improve to 25-30 overall this season and 4-12 in one run games...last four game series win at home was July 9-12, 2015 Detroit and last four game series win home or road was earlier this season vs. Chicago-AL to improve to 4-2 against the Tribe this year and improve to 11-6 against the AL Central...are 3-1 on the current 11-game homestand and improve to 14-13 at home this year...are now 3.5 games back of Cleveland in the Central.
- KYLE GIBSON did not earn a decision for the eighth time this season despite facing the minimum number of batters through four innings, recording four 1-2-3 innings...allowed his first run of the game in the fifth inning, a solo home run to Edwin Encarnacion ending his 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed just two hits and two runs in 5.2 innings, while striking out seven...one of the runs charged to Gibson was via a three-run home run surrendered by Ryan Pressly when he came in for relief in the sixth inning, giving up the Twins lead...his eight no decisions are more than he recorded in all of last season.
- EDDIE ROSARIO (3-for-5) hit a solo home run in the first inning, his 11th this season then recorded a go-ahead solo home-run in the seventh inning, and the game winning home run in the ninth, a two-run shot...marks his second career three home run game and the ninth time (eighth player) in Twins history since 1961 there has been a player have a three-home run game...entering today was tied with Eduardo Escobar (10) for most home runs on the team...hitting .378 (48-for-127) since May 1, entering the game he was tied for second-most hits in MLB in this span with 45 (first, Francisco Lindor with 46)...now hitting .342 (69-for-202) with 11 HR and 30 RBI in 54 career games against Cleveland...extended his current hitting streak to nine games, hitting .447 (17-for-38) during the streak...has more runs scored (33) and hits (69) against Cleveland than any other opponent in his career...leading the team with 40 RBI and in multi-hit games with 21.
- EDUARDO ESCOBAR (1-for-4) recorded his 20th double of the season in the first inning...entering the game was one short of being tied for most doubles in MLB, Jose Abreu, Francisco Lindor and Kevin Pilar all had 20 doubles through yesterday's games.
- BRIAN DOZIER (2-for-4) has now hit safely in seven of his last eight against Cleveland after recording a second inning single...recorded his first
 home run at Target Field this season in the bottom of the seventh inning, ninth of the season...marked his 15th multi-hit game of the season,
 third most on the team.

- BOBBY WILSON (1-for-4) recorded a single in the second inning today...has now recorded a hit in five of six games at Target Field this year, hitting .238 (5-for-21) with four RBI.
- MIGUEL SANO (0-for-3) with a first inning walk, has now reached base in eight of nine games at home this season.
- ADDISON REED allowed a solo home run to Michael Brantley in the eighth inning marking the second time in career allowing homers on consecutive appearances, the other April 28 & 29, 2017 at Washington.
- RYAN LAMARRE (3-for-4) extended his hitting streak to a season-long four games...hitting .438 (7-for-16) during the streak...recorded his first career-stolen base in the fourth inning and first three-hit game of his career

INDIANS NOTES:

- THE INDIANS lost the fourth game of four against the Twins and the third in a row...drop to 30-28 on the season and lead the Central by just 2 games now...are now 17-10 after a loss and 12-17...are the first team this season in MLB to have five players with double digit home runs.
- MIKE CLEVINGER surrendered just his fifth home run off the season, but third in his last four starts to Eddie Rosario in the first inning...lasted 6.0 innings and allowed four runs on seven hits, walking three and striking out two while allowing two home runs...the two home runs allowed marked the first time this season he has allowed multiple home runs in a start and the sixth time in his career (last, August 21, 2017 vs. Boston).
- EDWIN ENCARNACION (2-for-4) extended his current hitting streak to 10 games with a solo home run in the fifth inning, recording the first hit and run for the Indians of the game...hitting .436 (17-for-39) over that streak...entering the game was tied for 20th on the all-time home run list at Target Field with 13, now ranks first on the all-time list of Target Field home runs by an opponent passing Jose Bautista (14) with 15...also entering the day ranked tied for seventh with 21 career-home runs against the Twins among active players in MLB....has recorded a home run in every-other game over the last nine games...this marked his third multi-home run game of the season and 31st of his career
- FRANCISCO LINDOR (0-for-3) reached base safely for the seventh game in a row, hitting .400 (12-for-30) during that span.
- YAN GOMES (1-for-4) recorded his seventh double of the season in the seventh inning...entering the game was 18th in MLB for extra-base hits against the Twins since 2012 (27).
- MICHAEL BRANTLEY (1-for-4) recorded his 10th home run of the season in the top of the eighth inning, tying the game 5-5...snapped an 0-for-16 skid.
- JASON KIPNIS (2-for-4) recorded his 12th multi-hit game of the season with two singles...has now hit in five of six games this season against the Twins.
