TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** won the second of four against Cleveland to improve to 3-2 against the Tribe this year and improve to 10-6 against the AL Central...are 2-1 on the current 11-game homestand and improve to 13-13 at home this year...are now 4.5 games back of Cleveland in the Central and remain in third place behind Detroit...the Twins are now 16-6 in games in which they get a quality start and 18-8 in games in which the starter goes 6.0-plus innings...are 21-1 when leading after 8 innings...fourth straight game scoring seven or more runs, the longest such streak since they did it five straight games from September 21-26, 2017.
- **LANCE LYNN** earned his third straight win after allowing one run on two hits and five walks with five strikeouts over 6.0 innings...over his last three starts, 3-0, all quality starts, and has allowed three runs over 18.2 innings with nine walks and 14 strikeouts after starting the year 1-4, 7.47 ERA (37.1 IP, 31 ER)...his two hits are a season low and the fewest he's allowed in a start since he allowed only one hit to San Francisco on September 2, 2017...after his five walks today is now leading the AL in walks with 38...his 113 pitches are the most he's thrown in a game this season and the most he's thrown since September 27, 2014 against Arizona.
- **BRIAN DOZIER** (2-for-4) tripled in the third and doubled in the sixth and has now hit safely in six of his last seven against Cleveland...this is his 14th multi-hit game and his first with multiple extra base hits since he had two doubles against Detroit on May 22...he is hitting .516 (32-for-62) in multi-hit games this season...of his 14 multi-hit games, this was just the fourth at Target Field this season...in his career he has 108 multi-hit games at Target Field.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (1-for-2) hit a two-run home run in the third inning, his 10th of the year, and is now hitting .372 (45-for-121) since May 1...now hitting .335 (66-for-197) with 10 HR and 26 RBI in 53 career games against Cleveland and is now .387 (12-for-31) with two home runs and nine RBI off Bauer...extended his current hitting streak to eight games, hitting .424 (14-for-33) during the streak...has more runs scored (30) and hits (66) against Cleveland than any other opponent in his career.
- **MAX KEPLER** (1-for-4) singled and drove in a run in the sixth and has now hit in 10 of his last 11 games against Cleveland, hitting .275 (11-for-40).
- **RYAN LAMARRE** (1-for-4) singled and drove in a run in the sixth and has now driven in a run in three straight games, the longest streak of his career.

INDIANS NOTES:

- **THE INDIANS** lost the third of the four game series at Target Field and fall to 30-27 on the year...after winning six straight, have now lost two in a row, only the fifth time this year they have lost multiple games in a row...are now 12-16 on the road this season and 22-14 when they score first...are now 10-3 in their last 13 at Target Field...are 2-3 against the Twins this year and are 14-6 against the AL Central...hold a 2.5 game lead over Detroit in the AL Central...the two errors are the most they've committed in a game since May 13 against Kansas City.
- **TREVOR BAUER** suffered his fourth loss of the year after allowing seven runs (three earned) over 5.2 innings on six hits and three walks with 11 strikeouts, his second straight start with double-digit strikeouts...left the game after allowing an RBI single to Ryan LaMarre, was credited with

three unearned runs in the sixth after Jason Kipnis committed an error earlier in the inning...has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in each of his last 11 road starts, dating back to August 14, 2017 and is now 6-3 in that stretch and has allowed 17 ER over 70 IP...allowed his first triple of the year to Brian Dozier and only his fifth home run, was tied for second in the AL in fewest home runs allowed in 2018.

- **EDWIN ENCARNACION** (1-for-3) extended his current hitting streak at nine games with a single in the eighth inning...hitting .429 (15-for-35) over that streak.
- **FRANCISCO LINDOR** (2-for-5) singled in the third and doubled in the ninth for his 23rd multi-hit game of the year, which is tied for second most in the AL...the double is also his 20th of the year; entered the day one double shy of tying the AL lead in doubles.
- **GREG ALLEN** (0-for-2) stole home on a double steal in the second inning, the first time the Indians have successfully stole home since Francisco Lindor did it at Atlanta June 28, 2016 on a double steal...he's the sixth player in baseball to steal home this year.
