NATIONALS NEWS

MOVING ON

The Washington Nationals open a seven-game homestand on Monday night, starting with a three-game series against the Boston Red Sox before welcoming the Miami Marlins for a four-game weekend series...The series with Boston will mark the Red Sox's first regular season visit to Nationals Park since June 23-25, 2009.

A HAND FOR THE 'PEN

On Saturday (3.1 IP) and Sunday (7.1 IP) at Philadelphia, Washington's bullpen combined to allow just one earned run on four hits in 10.2 innings of work...They struck out 12 batters while issuing just two walks.

- On the season, Washington's bullpen ranks in the National League in WHIP (2nd, 1.16), walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 2.95), inherited runners scored percent (2nd, 23.8) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 3.02).

MAX NEARING HISTORY

Entering tonight's start, **Max Scherzer** has collected 993 strikeouts as a member of the Washington Nationals...With seven more, he will become the 11th player in Major League history to record at least 1,000 strikeouts with two different clubs...Here is the list he will join, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*: **Jim Bunning** (DET/PHI), **Roger Clemens** (BOS/NYY), **Randy Johnson** (ARI/SEA), **Mark Langston** (ANA/SEA), **Greg Maddux** (CHI/ATL), **Mike Mussina** (BAL/NYY), **Nolan Ryan** (CAL/HOU), **CC Sabathia** (CLE/NYY), **Luis Tiant** (BOS/CLE) and **Cy Young** (BOS/CLE).

WELL-DESERVED HONOR

Juan Soto was named National League Rookie of the Month for June on Monday...He hit .317 (26-for-82) with six doubles, six homers, 15 RBI, 18 walks and 19 runs scored in 24 games during the month...He led National League rookies in batting average (.317), on-base percentage (.440), slugging percentage (.610), OPS (1.050), home runs (6) and walks (18). He ranked second in doubles (6), hits (26) and was third with 15 RBI for the month.

- On the season, Soto ranks among all Major League rookies (min. 145 PA), in batting average (.310), on-base percentage (.416), slugging percentage (.571) and OPS (.988).
- Among all National League players (min. 145 PA), Soto ranks in on-base percentage (3rd, .416), OPS (3rd, .988), slugging percentage (6th, .571) and batting average (7th, .310).
- Since May 15, he ranks among National League rookies in walks (1st, 23), home runs (1st, 8), RBI (2nd, 21), runs (2nd, 25), doubles (3rd, 9), and hits (3rd, 39).

#VoteRendon

Anthony Rendon has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games dating to June 15...He is hitting .403 (25-for-62) with 10 doubles, five homers, 13 RBI, six walks and 13 runs scored over this span...He has produced multi-hit efforts in nine of the 16 games...His 15 extra-base hits are tied for the most in Major League Baseball since June 15 with **HOU Alex Bregman**.

- Rendon entered play on June 6 hitting .253/.333/.448 and in 22 games since then, he is hitting .365 with 17 extra-base hits (12 2B, 5 HR)...He is now slashing .293/.359/.531 on the season.
- Rendon's 24 doubles rank third in the National League and are the most among NL third basemen.
- Rendon is one of nine players in the National League with at least 10 home runs and 20 doubles this season, joining **ATL Ozzie Albies**, **CHI Javier Baez**, **COL Trevor Story**, **STL Matt Carpenter**, **ATL Freddie Freeman**, **CIN Scooter Gennett**, **PIT Gregory Polanco** and **SFG Brandon Crawford**.

TREA'S TURNING IT ON

Over his last 12 games, **Trea Turner** is 18-for-47 (.383) with one double, one triple, two homers, four RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and 11 runs scored...He has a .453 on-base percentage and a .574 slugging percentage during this stretch...His 11 runs scored since June 19 are tied for eighth in the National League.

HARPER'S HOMERS

Bryce Harper clubbed his 20th home run of the season on Friday night, a three-run shot in the fourth inning...In doing so, it marked the fourth time in Nationals history (2005-pres.) that a player clubbed at least 20 home runs by the end of June (**Bryce Harper** - 2015 - 24 HR, **Alfonso Soriano** - 2006 - 24 HR, **Adam Dunn** - 2009 - 20 HR).

- On the season, Harper's 20 home runs rank second in the National League behind **COL Nolan Arenado** (21)...Harper's 67 walks are the most in the National League.

FIVE FINGER DISCOUNTS

The Nationals lead the National League with 64 stolen bases...They rank behind the Boston Red Sox (65) and they are tied with the Chicago White Sox (64) for the second-most in Major League Baseball.

- Michael A. Taylor** leads MLB with 23 stolen bases, while **Trea Turner** (22) ranks second.

NATIONALS HISTORY

July 2 (5-7 on this date)

2017 - The Nationals avoided the series sweep thanks to a 7-2 win over the St. Louis Cardinals on ESPN's Sunday Night Baseball. **Bryce Harper** went 3-for-5 with a double, two home runs, four RBI and two runs scored, while **Max Scherzer** struck out 12 batters in 7.0 innings of two-hit, shutout ball to help lead the Nationals over the Cardinals.

IN THE COMMUNITY

July 7: Neighborhood Day

Once again, the Nationals will dedicate a day to recognize and thank their neighbors in Ward 6. The team will provide hundreds of residents with tickets to area residents to watch the Nationals take on Miami. The Nationals and Red Sox will play three games in D.C. this season after playing in Boston during the 2012 and 2015 seasons...Washington has won five of the last seven contests after dropping the first five from 2006-09.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#31 - MAX SCHERZER - RHP

Polished veteran right-hander, three-time Cy Young Award Winner and five-time consecutive All-Star signed a historic seven-year contract with Washington on Jan. 21, 2015...Joined the Nationals after seven Major League seasons with the Detroit Tigers (2010-14) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2008-09)...Is one of just 10 pitchers in Major League history to take home the Cy Young Award three or more times.

AGAINST THE RED SOX: Faces the Red Sox for the 11th time and first time as a member of the Nationals...Is 4-4 with a 6.05 ERA in 10 previous starts.
LAST START: Was saddled with the loss despite allowing just one earned run on four hits in 7.0 innings of work as the Nationals were swept by the Rays, 1-0, on June 26...Lone run was scored in the first inning.

2018 NOTES

- Has recorded 993 strikeouts as a member of the Nationals...Will become the 11th player in MLB history to collect at least 1,000 strikeouts with at least two different clubs.
- Is in the midst of a three-game losing streak, his first three-game losing streak since Aug. 14-28, 2015...Is looking to avoid his first four-game losing streak since Sept. 9, 2009 to April 12, 2010.
- Recorded a nine-game winning streak from (4/9-6/5) which tied the second-longest streak of his career (13 G; 4/6-7/3/13 and 9 G; 8/20/16-4/7/17)...It is the longest winning streak in Major League Baseball in 2018.
- Ranks among National League pitchers in strikeouts (1st, 165), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (1st, 12.95), WHIP (1st, 0.85), opp. AVG (1st, .172), opp. OBP (1st, .232), hits per 9.0 IP (1st, 5.57), opp. OPS (1st, .548), wins (2nd, 10), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 6.11), ERA (3rd, 2.04) and opp. SLG (4th, .316)...Leads all Major League pitchers in Wins Above Replacement according to FanGraphs.com (4.4).
- His 12.95 strikeouts per 9.0 IP would be the third best single-season mark in MLB history behind **H.O.F. Randy Johnson**: 13.41 in 2001 and **H.O.F. Pedro Martinez**: 13.20 in 1999).
- Struck out at least 10 batters in three consecutive starts from May 6-19, tied for the the third-longest streak of his career (6 G; 5/26-6/21/17).
- Did not earn the win, but struck out a season-high 15 batters on May 6 vs. PHI...It was his fifth career 15+ strikeout game...He became the first pitcher in Major League history (since 1913) to strike out at least 15 batters in no more than 6.1 IP according to Baseball-Reference.com.
- Was named National League Pitcher of the Month for April (5-0, 1.62 ERA, 57 SO, 9 BB, .165 opp. AVG) and May (4-0, 2.21 ERA, 63 SO, 10 BB).
- Was named National League Player of the Week for the week of April 9 through 15 (2-0, 1.13 ERA, 21 SO, BB, 3 H).

CAREER NOTES

- His 74 games of 10+ strikeouts are tied for eighth-most in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...He is tied with **Bob Gibson** (H.O.F., 1981) and **Sam McDowell**. **Steve Carlton** (H.O.F., 1994) is next on the list with 84 10+ strikeout games.
- His 39 games of 10+ strikeouts and one earned run or fewer allowed are tied for eight-most in MLB history (since 1913) and most among active pitchers...**Walter Johnson** (H.O.F., 1936) is next on the list with 40 games.
- His 20 games of 10+ strikeouts and zero earned runs allowed are tied for eighth-most in MLB history (since 1913) and second-most among active pitchers (Kershaw - 23)...**Tom Seaver** (H.O.F., 1992) is next on the list with 21 games.
- Scherzer's five career games with 15 or more strikeouts are the most among active players and tied for seventh-most all-time .
- Leads all active starters and ranks second in MLB history with a career 10.35 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (**Randy Johnson** - 10.61).
- His career .197 opp. AVG vs. right-handed batters is fourth-best all-time and second among starting pitchers (**J.R. Richard** - .186).
- Is the only pitcher in MLB with an active streak of six-plus seasons with at least 200 strikeouts.
- Since joining the Nationals in 2015, has taken a no-hitter into the sixth inning in 11 of 114 starts (9.6%), per MASN in-game reporter, Dan Kolko.
- Since 2015, has posted a 0.92 WHIP, behind only **Clayton Kershaw** (0.88) for the best over this stretch.
