ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets returned infielder Todd Frazier from his rehabilitation assignment and activated him from the Disabled List...The Mets also returned RHP Anthony Swarzak from his rehabilitation assignment and activated him from the DL...Corresponding roster moves will be made prior to tonight's game...Frazier went 4-9 (.444) with three RBI in three rehab games with Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...He has been on the Disabled List since May 8 with a left hamstring strain...Swarzak was 2-0 with a 10.13 ERA (three earned runs/2.2 innings) with two walks and three strikeouts in three rehab games with Las Vegas (AAA)...Swarzak has been on the DL since April 2, with a strained left oblique.

2018 MLB DRAFT: The Mets selected outfielder Jarred Kelenic from Waukesha West High School (WI) with the sixth overall pick in the first-round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...Kelenic, 18, was listed by *Baseball America* as the best high school hitter in the draft with the third-best strike-zone discipline by a prep player...The 6-1, 196-pounder was the first Wisconsin native ever to be drafted in the Top 10...Kelenic was the only outfielder in high school to be unanimously named to *Baseball America's* prep first team in a pre-season vote of Major League scouting directors...The last time the Mets selected sixth or higher was in 2004 when they took RHP Philip Humber with the third overall selection...With the 48th overall pick, the Mets selected RHP Simeon Woods-Richardson from Kempner High School (TX)...The 6-4, 210-pounder is just 17...He went 3-1 with a 0.23 ERA in five starts during the high school season...Rounds 3-10 of the draft will take place on Tuesday and Rounds 11-40 will be on Wednesday, June 6.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost nine of their last 11 games, including four straight...New York has lost six straight home games and is 12-17 at Citi Field this season.

INTERLEAGUE: New York is 1-1 in Interleague action this year, after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...The Mets will travel to Baltimore on August 14-15...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 186-178...The .511 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs.

VS. BALTIMORE: The Mets have won six straight home games vs. Baltimore and are 10-3 all-time vs. the Orioles in Queens.

METS OFFENSE: New York has scored one run in its last 24.0 innings dating to the ninth inning of Friday night's game...New York has scored two or fewer runs 21 times this season, tied for seventh-most in the majors.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets have scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 41 eighth-inning runs are tied for the second-most in the majors with the Braves...Houston is first with 42.

HOME RUNS: The Mets have homered in nine of their last 11 games...New York has 14 homers during this stretch...The club has 20 homers in its last 17 games and 30 long balls in its last 25 contests.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has three home runs in his last 11 games and four homers in his last 17 contests...Conforto has at least one hit in nine of his last 11 starts.

ORIOLES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won six straight vs. the O's in Queens dating to June 18, 2006.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



JASON VARGAS: Is 2-0 with a 3.46 ERA (five earned runs/13.0 innings) in his last three starts...In two of those three starts he's worked 5.0 scoreless innings...Vargas has compiled a 2.23 career ERA (15 earned runs/60.2 innings) in nine starts vs. Baltimore.

STARTERS: Over its last 16 games, New York starters have a 2.48 ERA (24 earned runs/87.0 innings).

BULLPEN: Over its last 11 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-8 with a 7.94 ERA (40 earned runs/45.1 innings).

SETH LUGO: Allowed three earned runs in May over 22.1 innings (1.21 ERA), including a career-best 17.0 consecutive scoreless innings from May 1-25...Lugo has held lefthanders to a .119 (7-59) batting average, the sixth-lowest mark in the majors (min. 40 at-bats).

NIMMO POWER: Brandon Nimmo has 11 extra-base hits and nine RBI in his last 13 games (five doubles, one triple, five homers)... Nimmo driven in a run in five out of his last seven games...He has three homers in his last seven games...He has a career-high seven homers this season in 127 at-bats...Nimmo had six homers combined over his first two seasons (2016-2017) in 250 at-bats... Nimmo is second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .421 OBP (min. 150 plate appearances)...He is tied for sixth in the majors with four triples.

DEVIN MESORACO: Has five homers, two doubles, 10 RBI and 12 runs scored in 19 games with the Mets since he was acquired from Cincinnati on May 8.

EL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Binghamton's RHP Nabil Crismatt was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 28-June 3...He went 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA (two earned runs/14.1 innings) with nine strikeouts...Crismatt is 7-2 with a 2.66 ERA (19 earned runs/64.1 innings) and 60 strikeouts in 11 starts with Binghamton.

SAL ALL-STARS: LHP David Peterson, RHP Joe Cavallaro, first baseman Jeremy Vasquez and catcher Scott Manea were named to the South Atlantic League All-Star Game...Peterson is 1-4 with a 1.93 ERA (11 earned runs/51.1 innings) and 47 strikeouts in eight starts... Cavallaro is 6-1 with a 2.22 ERA (13 earned runs/52.2 innings) and 56 strikeouts in nine games (eight starts)...Vasquez is hitting .295 with a .404 OBP, 11 doubles, three homers and 26 RBI...Manea has a .397 OBP and is hitting .248 with seven doubles and three homers.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Missed the entire 2008 season after undergoing surgery on his left hip
- » Blood clot in left arm (on 15-Day D.L. from June 18-August 13, 2013)
- » Left flexor strain (two 15-Day D.L. stints in May and June-July, 2015)
- » Tommy John Surgery (2015)...On D.L. from July 22, 2015-September 17, 2016.
- » Non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right hand...Underwent surgery on March 20, 2018 to remove the bone.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his second win of the season in his last start, May 30 at Atlanta while pitching on three days' rest...Needed 65 pitches to complete 5.0-shutout innings...Tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two hits for the second time in his last three starts in the Mets' 4-1 victory over the Braves...Tied his longest outing of the season...Was his first start on three days' rest since May 12, 2009 and the first time in his career he had gone three days between starts...Improved his ERA to 1.80 (three earned runs/15.0 innings) when starting on three days' rest.

VS. ORIOLES: Will face Baltimore for the 10th time in his career and first since August 2, 2017 with Kansas City...Is 2-4 with a 2.23 ERA (15 earned runs/60.2 innings) lifetime against Baltimore...In his last outing against the Orioles, Vargas suffered the loss, pitching 5.0 innings and allowing three earned runs on four hits...Struck out six and walked two at Camden Yards...In four home games against the Orioles, Vargas is 2-0 with a 1.03 ERA (three earned runs/26.1 innings)...Pitched a complete game shutout versus the Orioles as a member of the Los Angeles Angels on May 3, 2013...Also tossed 9.0-scoreless innings at Camden Yards on May 12, 2011 in a no-decision (extra-inning loss).

AT CITI FIELD: Vargas will be making his third start at Citi Field this season...Is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA (six earned runs/9.2 innings) with 10 strikeouts and three walks in his two home starts in the 2018 campaign...In his last start at Citi Field, May 21 vs. Miami, Vargas threw 5.0-scoreless innings, allowing two hits with a season-high seven strikeouts to earn his first win of the year...Is 49-38 in 126 games (117 starts) in his home ballpark throughout his career...Owns a 3.70 ERA (301 earned runs/731.2 innings) in those games.

JUNE: Vargas has won each of his last eight starts in June dating to the 2015 season, posting a 1.87 ERA (11 earned runs/53.0 innings) in those eight starts...Led the majors with six wins last June, winning each time out in the month while compiling a 2.56 ERA (nine earned runs/41.0 innings)...Allowed three or fewer runs in each of his six starts in June last year...Is 18-11 with a 3.76 ERA (101 earned runs/242.0 innings) in 37 career June starts.

ALL-STAR-WORTHY 2017: At the All-Star Break last season, Vargas led the American League in both wins (12) and ERA (2.62), while ranking among the league leaders in WHIP (1.15, 11th) and walks per nine innings (2.12, eighth)...Won seven consecutive starts from May 27-June 30, 2017...Pitched a complete game shutout on June 2 vs. Cleveland, his 12th career complete game and seventh shutout...Was the first pitcher in the majors to reach 10 wins, doing so in his 14th start on June 18...Posted a sub-2.00 ERA in both April and June...Was 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (nine earned runs/41.0 innings) in his six June starts with 23 strikeouts and nine walks.

VARGAS' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
- » Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
- » From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only Mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
- » Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
- » Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
- » Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
- » Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017...Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
- » Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
- » Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (2-4, 5.14)

LAST OUTING: Took a scoreless outing into the seventh inning before exiting with two runners on (both would score) in the Mets' 7-4 loss vs. the Cubs on June 1...Was left with a no-decision after tossing 6.0+ innings, allowing two earned runs on seven hits while striking out four batters and walking two.

VS. AMERICAN LEAGUE: Wheeler is 3-4 in 11-career Interleague starts...Holds a 6.26 ERA (38 earned runs/54.2 innings) with 45 strikeouts in those games...Wheeler will face an AL opponent for the second time this season (also, May 16 vs. Toronto)...Has allowed at least five runs and seven hits in each of his last two Interleague starts after holding his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in his previous four.
