SAN DIEGO NOTES

- The Padres allowed back-to-back homers in consecutive innings today...the last time the club did so was on August 10, 2017 (Scooter Gennett and Eugenio Suarez in the seventh inning, Zack Cozart and Joey Votto in the eighth inning).
- Joey Lucchesi** made his first start since May 14 vs. COL.
- Christian Villanueva** belted his first home run since May 31...his 16 homers are tied for second-most in the National League behind Bryce Harper's 19.
- Cory Spangenberg** has hit safely in his last 10 starts since June 4 with six multi-hit efforts (.390, 16-for-41).
 - Made his second career pitching performance (also: June 5 vs. ATL).
- A.J. Ellis** is riding a six-game hitting streak (.412, 7-for-17), the longest active streak on the team...has reached base safely via hit or walk in 21 of his last 22 games, owning a .443 OBP with eight walks.
 - Is hitting .308 (24-for-78) in 25 games as a starter this season.
- Eric Hosmer** logged his team-leading 21st double of the season...entering the game, his 20 doubles tied for third-most in the National League.
- Raffy Lopez** entered the game in the ninth inning to make his second career appearance at third base (first: Sept. 5, 2017 at BOS with the Blue Jays).

OAKLAND NOTES

- The A's hit back-to-back home runs in consecutive innings for the first time since May 14, 1997 (Jose Canseco and Mark McGwire in the third inning, Canseco and Matt Stairs in the fourth inning).
- Frankie Montas** has worked 6.0-or-more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in four of his last five starts...is now 4-1 with a 2.41 ERA (9 ER, 33.2 IP).
 - Threw a career-high 105 pitches in today's game.
- Chad Pinder** recorded his 10th multi-hit game of the season...is hitting .323 (20-for-62) with four home runs, two doubles, a triple, and nine RBI in 20 day games this year.
- Marcus Semien** is riding a five-game hitting streak, going 6-for-22 (.273) during that span...is 14-for-49 (.286) over his last 12 games to snap a career-high tying 0-for-17 streak (also Sept. 29, 2013-April 3, 2014).
- Franklin Barreto** logged a career-high three RBI and belted his first homer of the season.
- Matt Olson** has hit 11 home runs and 23 RBI in his last 34 games...entering the game, his 14 home runs on the season were the most among American League first baseman and third in the majors.
- Jed Lowrie** homered in back-to-back games for the fourth time this season...has hit 10 of his 11 home runs off right-handed pitchers, nine of his home runs have come on the road.
