- ◆ The D-backs are 22-13 (.647) since May 28, tied for the second-best record in the NL with the Cubs and behind only the Dodgers (.676; 23-11).
- ♦ The D-backs are 18-10 in series openers.
- ♦ Arizona is 15-7 in its last 22 home games vs. Padres.
- Paul Goldschmidt is batting .402 (43-for-107)/.496 OBP/.804
   SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 11 homers, 28 RBI and 19 walks in his last 27 games.
