HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 23-11 record is the club's second-best 34-game start all-time, behind 24-10 in 2000... their best 35-game starts are 25-10 in 2000 and 23-12 in 2008.
- ♦ The D-backs have the NL's best record (.676) and Majors' third best behind the Red Sox (25-9; .735) and Yankees (24-10, .706).
 - HOME: Yankees (14-5, .737), Red Sox (11-4, .733), Phillies (12-5, .706), **D-backs (13-6, .684)**
 - ROAD: Angels (13-3, .813), Red Sox (14-5, .737), Yankees (11-5, .688), **D-backs (10-5, .667)**, Astros (12-6, .667), Mets (10-5, .667)
- ♦ **Zack Godley** faces the Dodgers for the fourth time this season, having gone 1-2 with a 3.71 ERA (7 ER in 17.0 IP), a .233 opponent average (14-for-60) and 12 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has 9 consecutive scoreless outings (9.1 IP).
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso**, in his last 14 games, is batting .371 (13-for-35) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI and 6 runs scored.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 3-1, vs. Astros for their 10th series win.
- ♦ **Matt Koch** got the win, allowing 1 run in 6.1 innings, over Justin Verlander... on May 1, he led the team to a 4-3 victory over the Dodgers and Clayton Kershaw.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** had a RBI triple and scored on an interference error in the sixth inning to give the D-backs a 2-1 lead then had a RBI single in the eighth inning.
- ♦ The bullpen tossed 2.2 scoreless frames.

ROSTER MOVE

- ♦ The D-backs recalled RHP **Silvino Bracho** from Triple-A Reno and placed RHP **Braden Shipley** on the 10-day disabled list (retroactive to May 5) with right elbow inflammation.

POLLOCK CRUSHES HIS WAY TO WEEKLY HONORS

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** was named NL Player of the Week for April 30-May 6, his fourth career weekly honors and the D-backs second weekly honors this season with Patrick Corbin (April 16-22).
- ♦ In 7 games, hit .423 (11-for-26)/.448 OBP/1.000 SLG with 1 double, 1 triple, 4 homers, 8 RBI, 2 walks and 2 stolen bases.

THIS DAY IN D-BACKS HISTORY

- ♦ On this date in 2001, Hall-of-Famer **Randy Johnson** had 20 strikeouts in 9.0 innings to tie the Major League record (for 9.0 innings) previously set by Roger Clemens (2x) and Kerry Wood... Johnson did not earn a decision as he departed with the game tied 1-1... after allowing 2 runs in the top of the 11th, the D-backs scored 3 run in the bottom of the 11th for a walk-off, 4-3 victory as Mark Grace doubled to tie the game and Matt Williams walked with the bases loaded to win it for manager Bob Brenly.
- ♦ The 20-strikeout feat was later matched by Max Scherzer and has been done just 5 times in MLB history.

EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock**, in 10 games vs. Dodgers, is hitting .351 (13-for-37)/.400 OBP/.946 SLG with 4 doubles, 6 homers, 9 RBI, 3 walks and 3 stolen bases.
 - Since April 17, 2017, in 25 games vs. Dodgers, is hitting .333 (31-for-93)/1.124 OPS with 9 doubles, 9 homers, 18 RBI and 10 walks.
- ♦ Named NL Player of the Month for April (first monthly honors) after ranking among NL leaders in March/April in home runs (T-1st, 9), slugging pct. (2nd, .670), OPS (2nd, 1.021) extra-base hits (2nd, 19) and RBI (3rd, 24).
- ♦ In his last 17 games, is hitting .348 (23-for-66)/1.155 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 7 homers, 17 RBI, 6 walks and 4 stolen bases.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders in OPS (1st, 1.032), SLG (1st, .669), extra-base hits (T-2nd, 22), total bases (2nd, 83), RBI (2nd, 29), homers (T-3rd, 10), stolen bases (T-4th, 8), average (10th, .306).

BOXBERGER LOCKING DOWN THE BACK END

- ♦ **Brad Boxberger** is a perfect 11-for-11 in save opps as his 11 saves are third in the Majors behind Edwin Diaz/SEA (13) and Wade Davis/COL (13).
- ♦ Lone reliever with 10+ save opps who has been perfect (4 other relievers with 5+ saves have been perfect).
- ♦ Has held the Dodgers scoreless in all 5 games (5.0 IP), going 4-for-4 in save opps with 2 hits, 4 walks and 6 strikeouts.
 - Has held NL West scoreless in 8 of 10 games (3 ER in 9.0 IP), going 6-for-6 in save opps with 9 hits, 5 walks and 12 strikeouts.

#13 • NICK AHMED • R/R **6-2 • 195 • 28 (March 15, 1990)**
HOU Series: 0-10 **Homestand:** 4-27, 2B, HR, 2 RBI, 2 R

- ◆ Is hitless in his last 19 at-bats.
- ◆ Had a career-high 5 RBI on March 30 vs. Rockies, tying D-backs record for a shortstop (also: Stephen Drew, April 28, 2011 vs. Cubs).
- ◆ His 35 defensive runs saved at shortstop ranks third in the NL since 2015, behind Brandon Crawford (51) and Addison Russell (48).
- ◆ Limited to 53 games in 2017 after suffering a pair of right-hand injuries.
- ◆ Rated by *Baseball America* as the NL's second-best defensive shortstop in 2017.

#4 • KETEL MARTE • S/R (kuh-TELL) **6-1 • 185 • 24 (Oct. 12, 1993)**
HOU Series: 0-6, BB **Homestand:** 2-15, RBI, 4 BB, R, SB

- ◆ Has not committed an error in his 30 games in 2018 (127 TC; 26 G at 2B and 5 at SS).
- ◆ Is batting .283 (15-for-53) vs. left-handers.
- ◆ Had a 10-game hitting streak (.302; 13-for-43) from April 4-15.
- ◆ In 2017, hit .260/.345 OBP/.395 SLG with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 5 homers, 18 RBI, 29 walks in 73 games...Postseason (4 G): .412, 2 3B, 1 HR, 2 RBI...first player to triple from both sides of the plate (in the Wild Card Game vs. Rockies).
- ◆ Signed a 5-year contract with 2 club options with the D-backs on March 27.

#5 • ALEX AVILA • R/L **5-11 • 210 • 31 (January 29, 1987)**
HOU Series: 0-5, 2 BB **Homestand:** 0-10, 3 BB

- ◆ Is hitless in his last 11 at-bats.
- ◆ His 2.81 catchers ERA is the best in the NL [min. 125.0 IC] ahead of Buster Posey/SF (2.94).
- ◆ In 2017 with the Tigers and Cubs, had 13 doubles, 14 homers, 49 RBI in 112 games.
- ◆ From 2010-17, ranked second in the AL with 133 catcher caught stealing (Salvador Perez, 135) and fourth with a 29.3 caught-stealing pct.
- ◆ 2011 AL starting catcher in the All-Star Game and Silver Slugger Award™ winner.

#2 • JEFF MATHIS • R/R **6-0 • 205 • 34 (March 31, 1983)**
HOU Series: 1-4 **Homestand:** 3-10, BB, R

- ◆ Has reached base via hit/walk in 6 of his last 7 games, hitting .300 (6-for-20) with 1 double, 2 runs scored and 3 walks.
- ◆ Had fifth career walk-off with a 15th-inning single on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ Since 2005, ranks sixth among active players with a 3.76 catchers ERA [min. 5,000 IC].
- ◆ In 2017, was fourth in the NL with a 3.51 catcher's ERA and a 34.5 caught stealing pct.

#3 • DANIEL DESCALSO • R/L **5-10 • 190 • 30 (Oct. 19, 1986)**
HOU Series: 3-8, 2 2B, 2 BB, R, HBP **Homestand:** 7-17, 3 2B, 3B, 2 RBI, 4 BB, 3 R, 2 HBP

- ◆ Is batting .371 (13-for-35)/.479 OBP/.657 SLG with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI, 8 walks and 6 runs scored in his last 14 games.
- ◆ Made his fourth career pitching appearance May 4 vs. Astros (0 ER in 0.2 IP)...hasn't allowed a baserunner in 3.0 career innings, the first position player in the live ball era (since 1920) to retire 9+ consecutive hitters [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Has made 17 starts at third base, 3 at second base and 2 in left field.
- ◆ Since 2010, ranks among active NL pinch hitters in plate appearances (1st, 251), times on base (1st, 75), home runs (T-3rd, 5) and hits (4th, 46).

#36 • JOHN RYAN MURPHY • R/R **5-11 • 205 • 26 (May 13, 1991)**
HOU Series: - **Homestand:** 3-7, 2B, RBI, R

- ◆ Is 5-for-15 (.333) with runners on base.
- ◆ Reached base a career-high-tying 3 times on April 11 @ Giants (2B, HR, BB) [8 times].
- ◆ His homer on April 3 vs. Dodgers was his first since Sept. 4, 2016 vs. White Sox.
- ◆ Played in 5 games for the D-backs in 2017...recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1.
- ◆ In 78 games between Triple-A Rochester and Reno last season, threw out 40.7 percent of attempted base stealers (24-for-59).

#1 • JARROD DYSON • L/L (juh-ROD) **5-10 • 165 • 33 (Aug. 15, 1984)**
HOU Series: 0-4 **Homestand:** 1-10, BB, 3 SB

- ◆ 7 of his 13 hits are for extra-bases (3 2B, 2 3B, 2 HR).
- ◆ Homered twice in a 3-game span from April 24-26 after hitting 1 home run in his previous 62.
- ◆ His 3 extra-base hits vs. lefties are tied for eighth most among NL left-handed hitters [leaders are Freddie Freeman/ATL and Cody Bellinger/LAD (5)].
- ◆ Is 1 of 3 players in MLB with 20+ steals in every season since 2012 (also: Elvis Andrus and Jose Altuve).
- ◆ Ranks seventh among outfielders since 2012 with 68 defensive runs saved [min. 4,000 innings]...is fifth among center fielders in that time (48) [min. 3,000 innings].

#16 • CHRIS OWINGS • R/R **5-10 • 185 • 26 (Aug. 12, 1991)**
HOU Series: 1-4, 2B, BB **Homestand:** 4-21, 2B, BB, R

- ◆ Has made 20 appearances in right field, 6 at second base and 1 in left...is hitting .316 (6-for-19) at second base.
- ◆ Hit the 10th game-tying home run in franchise history with 2 outs in the ninth inning on April 2 vs. Dodgers (off Kenley Jansen).
- ◆ Since 2013, ranks eighth in the Majors with 83.3 stolen base pct. [min. 50 attempts].
- ◆ Set career-highs with 25 doubles, 12 home runs and 51 RBI in 2017.

#44 • PAUL GOLDSCHMIDT • R/R **6-3 • 225 • 30 (Sept. 10, 1987)**
HOU Series: 0-10, 2 BB **Homestand:** 1-25, 4 BB, R

- ◆ Is hitless in his last 23 at-bats.
- ◆ Third in 2017 NL MVP voting...hit .297/.404 OBP/.563 SLG with 34 doubles, a career-high-tying 36 homers and 120 RBI in 155 games in 2017...won his third Rawlings Gold Glove Award® and third Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Award™...among NL leaders in runs (3rd, 117), RBI (4th), walks (4th, 94), extra-base hits (4th, 73), on-base pct. (5th), OPS (5th, .966), go-ahead RBI (T-5th, 29) and total bases (6th, 314).
- ◆ Has made 5 straight NL All-Star teams, the first D-back to do so, and the only NL position player to make each of the last 5 All-Star teams.
- ◆ **NL RANKINGS SINCE 2013:** 1st in go-ahead RBI (146), 1st in RBI (530), 1st in runs (526), 2nd in total bases (1,522), 2nd in SLG (.537), 2nd in OPS (.945), 2nd in OBP (.407), 2nd in walks (506), 2nd in extra-base hits (353), 4th in home runs (152), 4th in hits (851), 8th in AVG (.300) and T-7th in stolen bases (97).

- ◆ Is hitting .438 (14-for-32)/.500 OBP/.719 SLG with runners on base, tied for the NL's second-best OBP and ranks third in average and slugging pct.
- ◆ Against righties, is hitting .329 (25-for-76)/1.014 OPS with 6 doubles, 5 homers, 14 RBI and 11 walks.
- ◆ Reached base in a career high 25 consecutive games from Sept. 28, 2017-April 20.
- ◆ Hit .293/.352 OBP/.444 SLG with 31 doubles, 3 triples, 14 home runs and 57 RBI in 140 games in 2017...set career highs in runs (82), at-bats (525) and doubles.

Is batting .349 (30-for-86) with a .958 OPS in his last 23 games.

- ◆ Is hitting .250 (7-for-28) vs. left-handers.
- ◆ Has appeared in 19 games at third base and 2 at second.
- ◆ Is 1 of 5 players from Arizona State to play for the D-backs (Willie Bloomquist, Jake Elmore, Jake Barrett and Tuffy Gosewisch).
- ◆ Played in a career-high 71 games with the Red Sox in 2017, hitting .211 with 9 doubles, 4 home runs and 27 RBI.
- ◆ Ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Defensive Infielder in the Red Sox' organization from 2013-16 plus Defensive Player of the Year in 2014.

#11 • A.J. POLLOCK • R/R **6-1 • 195 • 29 (Dec. 5, 1987)**
HOU Series: 3-10, 3B, 4 RBI, BB, R **Homestand:** 11-26, 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 8 RBI, 2 BB, 5 R, 2 SB

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS:** 1st in SLG (.669), 1st in OPS (1.032), 2nd in RBI (29), 2nd in TB (83), T-2nd in XBH (22), T-3rd in HR (10), T-4th in SB (8), 10th in AVG (.306).
- ◆ NL Player of the Week for April 30-May 6, hitting .423 with 4 homers, 8 RBI and 1.448 OPS, his fourth weekly honor...also named NL Player of the Month for April.
- ◆ His 15 homers and 46 RBI in 48 games since Sept. 13, 2017 are the most in the NL.
- ◆ Is batting .368 (21-for-57) with 1 double, 2 triples, 6 homers, 15 RBI, 6 walks, 12 runs scored and a 1.194 OPS in his last 15 games.
- ◆ 14 of his 23 hits @ Chase Field have gone for extra bases (6 HR, 6 2B, 1 3B).

- ◆ On April 30 vs. Dodgers, had his first career 3-homer game...D-backs' 12th 3+ homer game and sixth 3-homer game at Chase Field

- ◆ Reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on May 3 (right pectoral strain)...suffered the injury on March 21 diving for a ball in the fourth inning.
- ◆ Acquired on February 20 from the Rays in 3-team trade that included the Yankees.
- ◆ 2017 Rays' MVP (by Tampa Bay BBWAA) set career highs in games (148), runs (78), hits (125), doubles (21), triples (2), homers (30), RBI (78), walks (84), OBP (.351), SLG (.459), OPS (.810) and stolen bases (16).
