RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers extended their winning streak to four games with a 7-4 win on Saturday afternoon at Comerica Park. With the game tied 4-4 in the bottom of the eighth, John Hicks delivered a go-ahead, two-run single, while JaCoby Jones followed with a sacrifice fly to make the score 7-4. Joe Jimenez worked a perfect ninth inning to pick up the first save of his Major League career. Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits and drove in two runs in the win, while Dixon Machado was 2x4 with two doubles and a run scored. Jeimer Candelario also added a leadoff home run, his ninth round-tripper of the season. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and received a no decision after allowing four runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 7.0 innings. Louis Coleman struck out one in a scoreless eighth inning to notch his third win of the season. The Tigers and Blue Jays wrap up their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's games, the 12-game homestand concludes tomorrow with a split doubleheader vs. New York (AL).

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits in yesterday's game to record his fourth consecutive multi-hit game and his 24th of the season. He ranks tied for second in the Majors with 24 games of two-or-more hits. Castellanos has hit safely in 19 of his last 23 games with at least one at-bat, hitting .396 (38x96) with 14 runs scored, 12 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 12 RBI during the stretch.

CANDY CRUSH: Jeimer Candelario led off yesterday's game with a home run, extending his streak of reaching base safely to 27 games. The homer marked Candelario's first career leadoff homer. Over the 27-game stretch, which is the longest active streak in the Majors, Candelario is batting .279 (29x104) with a .380 on-base percentage, 23 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, six home runs and 16 RBI.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Tigers hit four doubles in yesterday's game, marking the 49th consecutive game that Detroit has recorded at least one double. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team, and is the fourth-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908. The 1996 Cleveland Indians have the longest streak in the last 110 years, recording a double in 75 straight games from May 30-August 19, 1996.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE: Joe Jimenez earned the first save of his Major League career yesterday, throwing a perfect ninth inning. Jimenez has not allowed an earned run in 11 of his last 12 outings, posting a 0.79 ERA (11.1IP/1ER) with 15 strikeouts during that stretch. Jimenez is tied for the American League lead with 31 appearances, while he ranks eighth among AL relievers (min. 25.0 innings pitched) with a 2.54 ERA (28.1IP/8ER).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Tigers clinched their fifth straight home series win with yesterday's victory over the Blue Jays. It marked the first time Detroit have won five straight series at Comerica Park since winning six straight series from May 1/6-June 23, 2016. Overall, the Tigers are 8-8-2 in series this season. With a victory today, the Tigers would complete their first home series sweep over the Blue Jays since August 21-23, 2012.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 7-2 on their 12-game, 11-day homestand, which includes three games vs. Chicago (AL) (2-1), four games vs. Los Angeles (AL) (3-1), three games vs. Toronto (2-0) and two games vs. New York (AL) (June 4). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 19-12 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 18 of their last 25 home games. The Tigers are hitting .275 (291x1060) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 3.98 ERA (287.0IP/127ER).

TIGERS AND BLUE JAYS: The Tigers have won the first two games of their season series against the Blue Jays. Along with the three games this weekend in Detroit, the two teams will also play a four-game series in Toronto from June 29-July 2. The Tigers went 3-3 against the Blue Jays last season, including a 2-1 record at home. The Tigers have not won a season series against Toronto since 2013.

ON DECK: The Tigers conclude their 12-game homestand tomorrow as they host the Yankees in a split doubleheader. New York (AL) picked up an 8-6 win over the Tigers in their only meeting so far this season. The two teams split six games last season, but the Yankees won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. Detroit has not won a season series against the Yankees since 2011 and have not won a home series against New York (AL) since 2014.

#VOTETIGERS: Balloting for the 2018 All-Star Game, presented by MasterCard, is now underway. The 89th midsummer classic will be hosted on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 12th start of the season this afternoon in the series finale vs. Toronto.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer suffered his fourth loss of the season on Tuesday vs. Los Angeles (AL), allowing five runs on six hits with four walks and one strikeout in 3.1 innings.

VS. TORONTO: Fulmer has faced the Blue Jays twice in his career, posting a 2-0 record with a 0.64 ERA (14.0IP/1ER) and eight strikeouts. His last start against Toronto came on July 15, 2017, when he threw 8.0 innings and gave up one run on two hits with one walk and three strikeouts.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has made 28 career starts at Comerica Park, posting a 9-9 record with a 3.60 ERA (177.1IP/71ER) and 125 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Fulmer is 0-3 with a 5.02 ERA (28.2IP/16ER) and 18 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Fulmer has started 16 games in his career against teams from the American League East, posting a 6-4 record with a 3.34 ERA (102.1IP/38ER) and 76 strikeouts. Fulmer has allowed three earned runs-or-less in 12 of his 16 starts vs. AL East teams. His only start vs. an AL East team this season came on May 2 vs. Tampa Bay, when he allowed two runs on six hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

RECORD IN JUNE: Fulmer has made 10 career starts during the month of June, compiling a 5-4 record with a 2.56 ERA (63.1IP/18ER) and 48 strikeouts. In five June starts last season, Fulmer was 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA (33.2IP/16ER) and 24 strikeouts.

RECAPPING FULMER'S MAY: Fulmer made six starts during the month of May, posting a 1-2 record with a 6.32 ERA (31.1IP/22ER) and 30 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .235 (171x727) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .245 (174x710) against him. In 11 starts this season, righties are hitting .255 (28x110), while lefthanded batters are hitting .258 (31x120).

AMONG THE BEST SINCE HIS DEBUT: Fulmer has been among the best pitchers in the American League since making his debut on April 29, 2016. Among active American League pitchers with at least 350.0 innings pitched since April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks seventh with a 3.63 ERA, trailing only Corey Kluber (2.48 ERA), Justin Verlander (2.71 ERA), Chris Sale (3.22 ERA), Ervin Santana (3.33 ERA), J.A. Happ (3.53 ERA) and Carlos Carrasco (3.57 ERA).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

VS. NEW YORK (AL)/AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has faced the Yankees four times in his career, posting a 0-1 record with a 6.20 ERA (20.1IP/14ER) and 21 strikeouts. He started against the Yankees earlier this season on April 13 and took the loss, giving up six runs, five earned, on eight hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings. Fiers has made seven career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 2-1 record with a 3.35 ERA (40.1IP/15ER) and 26 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Fiers is 2-1 with a 4.13 ERA (28.1IP/13ER) and 17 strikeouts.
