BALTIMORE ORIOLES (26-66) vs. NEW YORK YANKEES (59-31)

RHP Dylan Bundy (6-8, 4.08) vs. RHP Sonny Gray (5-7, 5.85)

HOMER HAPPY: SS Manny Machado connected on his 22nd and 23rd home runs of the season in Tuesday night's win over the Yankees... It marked his fifth multi-home run game of the season and the 19th of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Tuesday was Machado's fourth career multi-home run game against the Yankees...He became the second player with at least four multi-home run games against the Yankees by age 26 (Jimmie Foxx, 6)...Machado's 22 career home runs against the Yankees are his most against any opponent.

SCHOOP-ING IT OUT: 2B Jonathan Schoop extended his hitting streak to a season-high nine games (since July 3), after going 2-for-5 on Tuesday...He is hitting .432 (16-for-37) during this stretch, with five doubles, two home runs, four runs scored, and three RBI...It marks his longest streak since hitting in 10-straight games from July 1-15, 2016...His career-long hitting streak is 12 games, September 7-19, 2015...He has recorded six multi-hit games during the streak and has seen his season batting average rise from .197 to .227...He's a career .284 hitter in the month of July, his second-highest monthly average for his career (August, .287)...On Tuesday night, Schoop delivered his third career walk-off hit with an RBI single with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning...The walk-off winner was his first since September 1, 2017 vs. Toronto (RBI double).

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: CF Adam Jones notched a double in the bottom of the ninth inning on Tuesday for the 300th of his career (294 with Baltimore and six with Seattle)...Six players in Orioles history (since 1954) have amassed at least 300 doubles for the O's: Cal Ripken, Jr. (603), Brooks Robinson (482), Eddie Murray (363), Brian Roberts (351), Brady Anderson (329), and Nick Markakis (316).

MAKING HIS MARK: OF/DH Mark Trumbo homered in game one of Monday's doubleheader, his 12th home run of the season...It was his ninth homer since June 17 (23 games), which is tied for the most in the American League during this span and tied for third-most in the majors, trailing only Milwaukee's Jesús Aguilar (11 home runs)...Trumbo led the majors with 47 home runs in 2016...He made his season debut on May 1 at Los Angeles-AL after beginning the season on the disabled list with a right quad strain.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: SS Manny Machado was named the American League starting shortstop for the All-Star Game on Sunday...He will make his fourth career All-Star appearance and second start...Machado was a reserve third baseman in 2013 and 2015 and started in 2016...The 89th Major League Baseball All-Star Game will be played on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington...According to ESPN Stats and Info, Machado will join Alex Rodriguez, Arky Vaughan, and Cal Ripken, Jr. as the only players to start an All-Star Game at third base and shortstop.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER: The Orioles have had 22 All-Stars over the last seven seasons (since 2012)...According to STATS, LLC., the 22 Baltimore All-Stars since 2012 are tied for second-most in the American League and are tied for fifth in the majors...The St. Louis Cardinals lead the majors with 28 All-Stars since 2012...The Orioles are one of 10 Major League teams with at least 20 All-Stars over the last seven seasons.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 70-of-91 games played this season...He currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...His .385 on-base percentage ranks eighth in the AL...His .574 slugging percentage ranks fifth in the AL and eighth in the majors...His 32 multi-hit games are tied for sixth in the AL...His 201 total bases rank fourth in the AL and fourth in the majors...His 12 intentional walks rank second in the AL and are tied for second in the majors.

THE RACE TO 1,000: SS Manny Machado sits at 972 career hits, 28 away from 1,000...He is looking to become the youngest Oriole to record 1,000 hits in their Baltimore career (since 1954)...Cal Ripken, Jr. holds the current mark, reaching 1,000 career hits at 26 years and 296 days old...Machado is also looking to become the fastest Oriole to 1,000 hits in terms of games played...Machado has played in 855 career games as an Oriole and the current record holder is Nick Markakis, who reached the 1,000 hit mark in his 875th career game; second is Eddie Murray who reached 1,000 hits in his 892nd game...OF/DH Mark Trumbo is also closing in on 1,000 career hits, currently sitting at 982, he has collected 343 hits as an Oriole.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Andrew Cashner tossed the Orioles 41st Quality Start of the season last Thursday...The O's 41 Quality Starts this season are tied for fifth in the AL and are tied for seventh in the majors...RHP Dylan Bundy and RHP Kevin Gausman are tied for 18th in the AL with 10 Quality Starts each...Orioles starters have received 206 runs of support this season, which is the fewest in the majors...Overall, O's pitchers have received 330 runs of support this season, which is second-fewest in the majors and the AL (Kansas City, 320).

VS. NEW YORK YANKEES: The Orioles and Yankees play the 10th game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Orioles lead the season series, 5-4...The Yankees won the 2017 season series, 12-7...The Orioles trail the Yankees in the all-time series, 487-582, with the O's trailing 255-276 at home and trailing 232-306 at New York.

THE FUTURE IS NOW: LHP Alex Wells and 3B Ryan Mountcastle have been chosen to participate in the 2018 Sirius/XM All-Star Futures Game in Washington D.C. on July 15...Wells, a native of Newcastle, Australia, will represent the O's as a member of the World Roster, while Mountcastle will compete as a member of the U.S. Roster...Wells signed with the Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in August of 2015, and is currently with Class A-Advanced Frederick...He was named the Jim Palmer Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2017, and entered the season ranked as the No. 13 prospect in the Orioles organization by *Baseball America*...Mountcastle was selected by the Orioles with the No. 36 overall pick of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft, and has spent the season with Double-A Bowie...He entered 2018 as the second-best Orioles prospect by *Baseball America*, and ranked No. 71 on the publication's Top 100 Prospects List.

BROTHERS GOTTA HUG: According to STATS, LLC., on June 19, C Caleb Joseph and INF Corban Joseph became the first set of brothers as teammates since Melvin Upton, Jr. and Justin Upton appeared on the roster together for the 2015 San Diego Padres...Cal Ripken, Jr. and Billy Ripken are the only other set of brothers as teammates in Orioles history (since 1954)...Brothers Dick Brown and Larry Brown also played for the Orioles, but did not appear on the O's roster at the same time.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1987, 2B Bill Ripken was called up from the minors, joining his brother SS Cal Ripken, Jr. and his father MGR Cal Ripken, Sr. on the Orioles roster...It was the first time in Major League history that two brothers were managed by their father...Bill started at second base and Cal started at shortstop, but the two combined to go 0-for-7 as the Orioles lost to Minnesota, 2-1.

DISABLED LIST: Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...RHP Chris Tillman (lower back strain, since 5/11), RHP Pedro Araujo (right elbow strain, since 6/11), OF Craig Gentry (left rib fracture, retroactive to 6/24), and INF Steve Wilkerson (left oblique strain, retroactive to 7/2) are on the 10-day disabled list...RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), LHP Richard Bleier (left shoulder latissimus strain, retroactive to 6/14), and RHP Darren O'Day (left hamstring strain, since 6/27) are on the 60-day disabled list.

COACHING STAFF: The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for Howie Clark (assistant hitting), Roger McDowell (pitching), and Alan Mills (bullpen); the fourth for Scott Coolbaugh (hitting); and sixth season for Bobby Dickerson (third base) and Einar Diaz (coach); while Wayne Kirby (first base) and John Russell (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (648-635, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,530 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 648 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Will be making his 18th start of the 2018 season...Made a career-high 28 starts last season and won a career-high 13 games...The Orioles went 16-12 in his starts, the only Orioles starter with a winning record in their starts (min. two starts)...Threw 90-or-more pitches in 26 of his 28 starts (threw 89 and 76 in his last two starts respectively)...Made 19 Quality Starts last season, tied for the eighth-most in the AL and tied for 16th-most in MLB.

LAST START: Snapped a three-game winning streak, suffering the loss in his last outing on July 6 at Minnesota after tossing 3.1 innings, allowing six runs (five earned), on nine hits, one home run, with one walk and two strikeouts...Was his shortest outing since leaving in the first inning on May 8 vs. Kansas City after allowing seven runs on five hits...Most runs allowed since allowing seven in the start on May 8...Most hits allowed since allowing 11 on May 29 vs. Washington...Has surrendered a home run in nine of his starts this season...Second time this season striking out two-or-fewer batters (zero - May 8 vs. KC)...Threw 61 pitches, 40 strikes.

CAREER VS. NEW YORK-AL: Bundy will be making his first start against the Yankees this season, and the sixth of his career (eighth appearance); in his first seven games against New York-AL, he is 2-3 with a 5.34 ERA (18 ER/30.1 IP), and two Quality Starts...He made three starts against the Bronx Bombers last season, going 1-2 with a 5.29 ERA (10 ER/17.0 IP); he has lost two-straight decisions against them...Five of his seven career appearances (three starts) against the Yankees have come at Oriole Park; he holds a record of 2-1 with a 4.43 ERA (10 ER/20.1 IP) in these five games.

VS. AL EAST: This will be Bundy's seventh start against a divisional opponent this season...He snapped a three-game losing streak against the division with his win on May 13 vs. Tampa Bay, and is 1-4 with a 3.29 ERA (14 ER/38.1 IP) on the year against the AL East...It will mark his 28th career start (39th appearance) against an AL East opponent; he owns a career record of 10-13 with a 4.29 ERA (81 ER/170.0 IP) against the division, including 9-13 and a 4.48 ERA (76 ER/152.2 IP) in his 27 starts...Last season, Bundy went 6-5 and posted a 3.80 ERA (35 ER/83.0 IP) with 10 Quality Starts in 14 games against the division; the Orioles went 7-7 in those games.

TURNING A CORNER: In four June starts, Bundy went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA (6 ER/27.1 IP), compared to going 3-7 record with a 5.00 ERA (34 ER/61.2 IP) through 11 starts in April and May...Bundy has thrown 6.0 innings-or-more in eight of his last nine starts, allowing three runs or fewer in six of those eight outings.

DAYMAN, FIGHTER OF THE NIGHTMAN: Bundy has made eight day starts on the season...He has gone 5-1 with a 1.83 ERA (11 ER/54.0 IP) in eight day games as opposed to being 1-7 with a 6.75 ERA (34 ER/45.1 IP) in nine night games this season...His **daytime ERA is the second-lowest in the majors (min. 40.0 IP), while his nighttime ERA is tied for fourth-highest in the majors (min. 40.0 IP)**...For his career, Bundy has gone 10-6 with a 4.36 ERA (66 ER/136.1 IP) in 29 career day time games (21 starts) and 19-17 with a 3.98 ERA (108 ER/244.0 IP) in 54 career night time games (38 starts).

HURT BY THE LONG BALL: Bundy has surrendered 19 home runs this season, 15 of which came in a seven start stretch (April 26-May 29)...The 19 home runs allowed are the most by an Orioles hurler this season and tied for the fifth-most in Major League Baseball...He surrendered a career-high four home runs on May 8 vs. KC; all of which came in the first inning...He has given up three home runs in two other starts this season...For his career, he has five games in which he has surrendered at least three homers...He is allowing 1.72 HR/9 this season and 1.49 HR/9 for his career...His career-high in home runs allowed in a season is 26, coming last season.

SLOW OUT OF THE GATE: Bundy's first inning ERA sits at 9.00 (16 ER/16.0 IP), compared to a 3.13 ERA (29 ER/83.1 IP) in innings two through nine...Eight of his 19 home runs allowed have come in the first frame...Opponents SLG and OPS percentages off Bundy in the first inning are .652 and 1.033 respectively.

IT TAKES TWO TO TANGO: When Bundy induces an 0-2 count, batters are only hitting .147 (10-for-68) with one home run and two runs batted in...In 0-1 counts, however, batters have found greater success, boasting an average of .429 (15-for-35)...**Bundy is holding right-handed hitters to a .188 (36-for-191) average, the third-lowest in the AL and ninth-best in the majors.**
