AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will complete their four-game series at Baltimore tonight (1-2 so far)...are 3-3 on their 11-game road trip to finish the "first half"...won 2-of-3 at Toronto over the weekend...will finish the road trip with four games at Cleveland (Thurs.-Sun.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ At 59-31 (.656), have the Majors' third-best record behind Boston (64-29, .688) and Houston (62-32, .660).
- ▶ Are 28G over .500, one shy of their season high (end of play on 7/8 and 7/9)...Sunday marked the first time they were 29G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65)...reached 29G over .500 after 87 games, the second-earliest they reached the mark in the last 61 seasons (since 1958), going 42-13 to start the 1998 season.
- ▶ Are 3.5G behind Boston for first place in the AL East, their largest deficit since the end of play on 4/26 (-4.0G back)...have been in second place for nine straight days...the lead has changed hands 12 times since 5/7.
- ▶ With the third-best record in the Majors, marks the first time since the end of play on 5/2 that Yankees do not have at least a share of one of the top two records in the Majors (had the third-best record at the end of play on 5/2, behind Boston and Arizona)...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 47-27, the Yankees are 50-22).
- ▶ Are 20-3-2 over their last 25 series (since 4/19)...have won four of their last five and seven of their last nine (incl. this series)...are 50-22 in their last 72G...are 43-6 (.878) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 38-5 (.884) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Have not won more than two straight games since winning four straight from 6/18-21.
- ▶ Are 23-17 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees suffered their second "walk-off" loss of the year the Orioles on Tuesday, 6-5...marked just the Yankees sixth loss of the season when scoring at least 6R...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (4.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 2BB, 5K, 1HR) did not record a decision in his first start after being reinstated from the disabled list...**1B Greg Bird** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1SF) hit a three-run HR in the fifth and a sac fly in the seventh...tied his career high with 4RBI...**2B Neil Walker** (1-for-3) hit an RBI single in the seventh...**SS Didi Gregorius** (3-for-4, 2R, 1 double) was the only Yankee to record a multi-hit game...**RHP Chad Green** (2.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 1K, 1HR) snapped his career-long 17.1 scoreless inning streak...**RHP Dellin Betances** (0.2IP, 3H 1ER, 1BB, 1K, 1HP) recorded his third loss of the season after allowing a "walk-off" single to Jonathan Schoop...snapped his 17.2 scoreless inning streak.

PICK UP HICKS: **OF Aaron Hicks** is hitting .341/.451/.829 (14-for-41) with 11R, 2 doubles, 6HR, 10RBI and 8BB in his last 12 games (since 6/26)...is hitting .306 (38-for-124) on the road this season, compared to his .213 (27-for-127) at home...his .969 road OPS is the fifth-highest in the AL and ninth-highest in the Majors.

RISPY BUSINESS: **Yankees batters** have hit .380/.458/.620 (19-for-50) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 22RBI, 1HP and 7BB with RISP over their last five games (since 7/7).

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Yankees are one of two teams this season that have at least three players (Judge-43XBH, Stanton-41XBH, Andújar-40XBH) with at least 40XBH (also Boston-four players)...marks only the third time in the last 81 seasons (since 1938) the Yankees have had at least three players record at least 40XBH in the team's first 90 games (also Matsui, Rodriguez and Sheffield in 2005; Maris, Mantle and Skowron in 1960) and just the seventh such time since 1908 (also three in 1926, three in 1928, four in 1936, three in 1937).
▶ Their 332 extra-base hits this season rank second in the Majors, trailing only Boston (349XBH).

#ASGIANCARLO: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is one of five AL All-Star "Final Vote" candidates...fans can vote for him at yankees.com/vote...voting ends today at 4 p.m. ET.

- ▶ Stanton is the 10th Yankee to appear on the Final Vote ballot and is looking to join **OF Nick Swisher** (2010) and **OF Hideki Matsui** (2004) as winners...the other nominees: **SS Didi Gregorius** (2017), **OF Brett Gardner** (2015), **RHP David Robertson** (2013), **1B Jason Giambi** (2008), **SS Derek Jeter** and **Matsui** (2005), **Giambi** (2003).
- ▶ Is hitting .311/.382/.582 (55-for-177) with 29R, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR, 25RBI and 18BB in 44 road games...owns the sixth-highest road OPS (.964) in the AL.
- ▶ Has hit .354 (23-for-65) with 11R, 5 doubles, 4HR, 10RBI and 7BB in 16G since 6/24...in 24G since 6/16, has hit .344/.406/.635 (33-for-96) with 14R, 7 doubles, 7HR and 16RBI.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** have hit 20HR in their last 10 games (since 7/1)...their Major League-leading 151 home runs this season are tied for the most by a Major League team prior to the All-Star break (also the 1999 Seattle Mariners -151HR).

- ▶ Are on pace to hit 272HR this season (MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ **Yankees batters** rank second in the Majors in runs per game (5.17), SLG (.461), OPS (.792) and XBH (332) and rank third in runs (465).

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE: **RHP Jonathan Holder** has allowed only 2ER in 29 appearances (34.1IP) since being recalled from Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/21...his 0.52 ERA in that span in the lowest ERA in Majors among relievers (min. 15.0IP)...**RHP A.J. Cole** ranks second in that span with a 0.54 ERA (16.2IP, 1ER).

SIR DIDI: **SS Didi Gregorius** has reached base safely in his last 25 games vs. the Orioles (since 10/2/16), hitting .404/.455/.697 (40-for-99) with 24R, 11 doubles, 6HR, 24RBI, 9BB and 4SB in that span...has recorded a hit in 24 of those 25 games.

- ▶ Is hitting .357 (10-for-28) with 4R, 3 doubles, 3RBI, 2BB and 1SB in his last seven games (since 7/4).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** is hitting .366/.508/.822 (37-for-101) with 36R, 7 doubles, 13HR, 31RBI and 28BB in 28 games vs. the Orioles since the beginning of 2017...owns a 10-game hitting streak vs. Baltimore (since 9/17/17).

- ▶ Is hitting .316/.418/.632 (18-for-57) with 14R, 6HR, 9RBI and 10BB in 14G since 6/25.
- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 25HR.

BIRD LAND: **1B Greg Bird** hit his sixth home run of the season and tied his career high with 4RBI on Tuesday at Baltimore (also 4RBI on 8/19/15 vs. Minnesota and 8/30/17 vs. Cleveland).

- ▶ 13 of his 25 hits this season have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 1 triple, 6HR).
- ▶ Since 6/26, has reached base safely in 9-of-14 plate appearances with runners in scoring position (4H, 5BB), hitting .500/.643/.875 with 1HR and 7RBI.

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 33,941 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

- ▶ Through 46 home gates, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (fifth All-Star nod), **OF Aaron Judge** (second), **RHP Luis Severino** (second) and **INF Gleyber Torres** (first) were named to the AL All-Star team...Judge was elected by the fan vote, while Chapman, Torres and Severino were elected via the Player Ballot...the Yankees have at least four All-Stars for the second straight year (five in 2017).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 11, 2010: Longtime Yankees PA announcer Bob Sheppard passes away at his home in Baldwin, Long Island, at age 99.

July 11, 1939: Yankee Stadium plays host to its first-ever All-Star Game as the 7th Midsummer Classic is held in the Bronx. The American League, led by 10 Yankees All-Stars, emerges with the 3-1 win. Joe DiMaggio goes 1-for-4 with a solo home run.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 12, 1989: Ron Guidry retires after spending his entire 14-year Major League career with the Yankees (1975-88). Guidry went 170-91 with a 3.29 ERA in 368 games (323 starts).

July 12, 1951: At Cleveland's Municipal Stadium, Allie Reynolds no-hits the Indians in a 1-0 Yankees victory over Bob Feller. It is the first of two no-hitters for Reynolds that season, also turning the trick on 9/28 in Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Boston.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (5-7, 5.85 ERA)

RHP Sonny Gray will make his 18th start of the season in tonight's series finale at Baltimore...the 28-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...has lost three straight starts and has not completed 3.0IP in back-to-back starts...tossed 2.0IP and allowed 5R on 6H in a 6-2 loss at Toronto on Friday...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 97-of-140 career starts...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

LAST START: Started on Friday at Toronto and took his third straight loss (2.0IP, 6H, 5ER, 2BB, 4K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP)...did not allow a run in the first and stranded three Toronto baserunners, but allowed five runs on five hits in the second, including a Justin Smoak three-run home run...has allowed at least 1HR in three straight starts, tied for the third-longest streak of his career (the last longer streak was 4GS from 9/12-28/17).

VS. BALTIMORE: Is 4-4 with a 4.64 ERA (42.2IP, 22ER) in eight career starts against Baltimore...has made four starts vs. Baltimore as a Yankee, going 3-1 with a 3.74 ERA (21.2IP, 9ER)...is 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA (26.0IP, 13ER) in five career starts at Camden Yards.

- ✦ In two starts vs. Baltimore this season, is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0IP, 4ER), going 6.0IP in each of those starts...last started at Camden Yards on 6/1, allowing 4H and 1ER in 6.0IP...also earned the win on 4/7 at Yankee Stadium (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K)...used just 11 pitches in the first two innings to retire 6BF in order in that game.
- ✦ In his last three starts at Camden Yards (since 8/17/15), is 2-1 with a 1.04 ERA (17.1IP, 2ER).

IN THE ROAD GRAYS: In eight road starts this year, is 3-4 with a 4.07 ERA (48.2IP, 22ER)...in 15 road starts with the Yankees, is 5-8 with a 3.27 ERA (85.1IP, 31ER)...did not allow more than 2ER in any of his first seven road turns as a Yankee (8/3/17-4/1/18), tied for the third-longest streak by a Yankee since 1965.

- ✦ Is 3-3 with a 3.24 ERA (41.2IP, 15ER) in his last seven road starts, with opponents hitting .212 (32-for-151) over the stretch.
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his last seven road starts (since 4/30 at Houston).
- ✦ Four of his nine road starts have been quality starts.
- ✦ Has received zero runs of support in 4-of-9 road starts this season.
- ✦ Is 24-24 with a 3.32 ERA (404.1IP, 149ER) in 69 career road appearances (67 starts).

2018: Has tossed at least 5.0IP in nine of his last 12 starts after failing to complete 5.0IP in four of his first five starts, including a career-high-tying streak of three straight (4/12-4/25).

- ✦ His 126BF with runners in scoring position are tied for second-most in Baseball...opponents are hitting .257 (27-for-105) with 14BB and 26K with runners in scoring position.
- ✦ Has given up 29-of-55ER this season in the first and second innings and has pitched to a 7.68 ERA (34.0IP, 29ER) in first two innings, compared to a 4.62 ERA (50.2IP, 26ER) after the second inning.
- ✦ Opponents are batting .197 (13-for-66) with 5BB, 30K and 3HR in plate appearances ending with a slider (Brooks Baseball).
- ✦ His 47.7% groundball rate is the lowest in his career, while his 23.1% line-drive rate and 35.6% hard contact rate are career highs (FanGraphs)...has a career-worst 9.9% walk rate.

THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER AT CLEVELAND: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (14-2, 2.12 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his 20th start of the season in Thursday's series opener at Cleveland...the 24-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...his 14 wins lead the Majors...needs 5K to reach 500 career strikeouts...his 2.12 ERA is the third-best in the AL and the fourth-lowest in the Majors (deGrom-1.79, Verlander-2.05, Snell-2.09)...is sixth in the AL and eighth in the Majors with 143K...earned his 14th win of the season on Saturday at Toronto (5.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 2BB, 5K, 2HR)...did not earn his 14th win in 2017 until his 31st start and final start of the season (9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 straight starts, the longest active streak in the Majors and the second-longest streak by a Yankees starter in franchise history (trails only Russ Ford's 20-start streak over two seasons from 1910-11)...the Yankees are 17-2 in his starts, the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.
