OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-9) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (7-4)

SATURDAY, APRIL 14, 2018 — SAFECO FIELD — 6:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a two-game series with the Dodgers on Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 0-2-2 over the first four series of the season...this marks the first time the A's have not won one of their first four series of the season since 2001 when they started 0-4-0 before winning series number five...are 2-3 over the last five games but have lost five of the last seven...are 5-9 for the season, one win off the 6-8 pace at this point last year...spent the first day of the season tied for first, the second day tied for second and every day since then in fourth (seven days) or tied for fourth (seven days)...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world titles (7).

CLUTCH: Matt Chapman has hit five home runs this season and 19 in his Major League career...of those 19 home runs, 12 of them have either given the A's the lead (nine), or tied the game (3)...three of his five homers this season have given Oakland the lead...Chapman's five home runs are tied for the most in the American League with Chicago's Matt Davidson and Los Angeles' Mike Trout and one home run behind Washington's Bryce Harper for the Major League lead.

CAN'T HOLD ME: Khris Davis has hit 16 home runs in 39 career games against Seattle...the only club he's homered against more is Texas (18)...of those 16 homers against the Mariners, 7 of them have come at Safeco Field, including two last night...all 16 of his home runs against Seattle have come in the last 34 games, including six in his last nine games.

WALK THIS WAY: Matt Joyce walked three times last night, his eighth career game with 3+ walks (last: July 3, 2017 vs. CWS)...his 11 walks this season are tied for third in the American League behind Boston's Andrew Benintendi (12) and New York's Aaron Judge (12)...his .412 on-base percentage ranks behind just Matt Chapman (.424) on the A's.

HEATING UP: Khris Davis has recorded three straight multi-hit games, including multi-run efforts in two straight...in his last three games, he is hitting .500 (7-for-14) with four runs, one double, three home runs and five RBI...in his previous eight games (April 1-8), he hit .103 (3-for-29) with one RBI...in his first three games of the year, he hit .400 (4-for-10) with three runs, two doubles, one home run and four RBI.

MULTI-HIT MADNESS: Matt Chapman recorded his eighth multi-hit game of the season last night and is tied for the Major League lead in multi-hit games with San Diego's Eric Hosmer and Los Angeles-AL's Albert Pujols...Oakland has collected 34 multi-hit games as a team, the third most in the Majors behind Los Angeles-AL (51) and Boston (36)...Chapman leads the club with eight, and is followed by Khris Davis and Jed Lowrie (5).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 37 runs over the first six games of the road trip (6.17 per game), which includes one run last Sunday and no runs on Tuesday, after tallying 27 in eight games on the last homestand (3.38 per game)...the A's season batting average is .263, which is third best in the American League (Los Angeles, .294) and third best in the majors (Pittsburgh, .272 & Boston, .263)...rank fourth in AL in on-base percentage (.336)...are sixth in the AL with a .250 (25-for-100) average with RISP overall...have stolen just three bases, which is the fewest in the AL tied for the fewest in the majors (Dodgers, Marlins, Mets).

PITCHING: The A's walked three batters yesterday and have issued a Major League low 29 walks in 124.0 innings (2.10 per nine innings)...however, have allowed a .277 opponents batting average, which is second highest in the majors to Texas (.282)...allowed two home runs last night and now have a streak of five consecutive games with two or more home runs allowed (13 home runs total)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since April 29-May 5, 1997 when they had a seven-game streak, the Oakland record...have surrendered 20 round-trippers for the season, which is the second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 23)...tied for the lead in the majors with 12 wild pitches...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors...have a 5.94 ERA (33 er in 50.0 ip) over the first six games of the road trip after posting a 3.89 ERA in eight games on the first homestand.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on the first road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (0-1)...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for fifth best home record in A.L. but tied for the second worst road record.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's venture out of the state of California for the first time this three-game series with Seattle...are scheduled to play each of their first 22 games on the west coast and this series is the only one outside of California...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and are currently on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning Monday...had off on Monday and Thursday this week after playing 11 games in 11 days to start the season...will have another off day next Thursday and the A's are scheduled to play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

THIS AND THAT: The A's defeated Alex Wood on Wednesday for their first win in a game started by a left-handed pitcher this year...are 1-4 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-5 against right-handers...the A's are 4-2 when scoring first, 1-7 when the opponent scores first...have a 4-5 record in night games and are 1-4 during the day.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): Monday vs. White Sox...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Núñez, Phegley, Pinder, Powell)...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL, Hendriks was placed on the DL today and Núñez and Phegley are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's went 7-12 against Seattle last year and lost the season series for the fifth straight season...prior to this streak, had not lost more than four straight season series to Seattle...are 37-59 (.385) against Seattle dating back to start of 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any A.L. team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...went 4-5 in Oakland last year and 3-7 in Seattle...have a four-game losing streak at Safeco Field...all-time, the A's are 341-283 against the Mariners...that includes 184-127 in Oakland, 156-155 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-91 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is tied for the Major League lead...Jonathan Lucroy has thrown out 6-of-10 (60.0%) attempted base stealers and the six caught stealings are the most in the majors...has tossed out 183 dating back to 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span...Marcus Semien is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all 13 games.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1971 Reggie Jackson hits his 100th home run in an Oakland uniform to become the first Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...in 1974 Jim Hunter strikes out Toby Harrah in the first inning of the A's 4-2 win against Texas...it is his 1000th strikeout as an Oakland Athletic, making him the first Oakland pitcher to reach that plateau...two years later, in 1976, Vida Blue strikeouts out four Texas Rangers to give him 1000 career strikeouts...he finished his A's career with 1315 career strikeouts, an Oakland record...in 2001 Miguel Tejada hits the 10000th home run in Athletics history in a 9-8 loss to Texas.

2-2, 3.88 ERA (22 er in 51.0 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 2-for-4 (50.0%)

- Allowed two homers on Friday night, and now have given up a league-worst nine homers this season.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss on 4/6...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since June 4, 2017 vs Washington.
- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)...had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

52 RHP RYAN BUCHTER

- Allowed his first runs of the season, both unearned on 4/6 at Los Angeles...with a homer to Luis Valbuena last Saturday night, he allowed his first earned run since Sept. 11, 2017 vs Chicago-AL.
- Had his 19 road game scoreless streak snapped with a homer to Valbuena last Saturday...it was the first run he has allowed on the road since July 20th of last season (16.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 6 bb, 10 so).
- Against Seattle, is 1-0 with a 12.30 ERA (5 er, 3.1 ip) with 7 strikeouts...allowed 4 ER on June 2, 2016.
- Has a 2.12 ERA (7 er in 29.2 ip) in 29 career appearances in April.
- Was acquired from Kansas City with Brandon Moss and cash for Jesse Hahn and Heath Fillmyer, Jan. 29, 2018.
- Begins his fourth season in the majors with his fourth team (Atlanta, San Diego, Kansas City, Oakland)...is also on his fourth Opening Day roster.

Last Year: Began the season with San Diego and was traded to Kansas City July 23...combined for a 4-3 record, one save and a 2.89 ERA in a career-high 71 appearances overall...allowed a .187 opponents batting average, including .159 with RISP.

- Has not allowed a hit over his first four games (6.0 ip).
- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams...has pitched in 218 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17-18) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
- Is on his 10th Opening Day roster (2008-09, 17-18 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Is 0-1 with 3 saves and a 3.74 ERA (9 er, 21.2 ip) with 20 strikeouts in 23 relief appearances against Seattle.
- Has a 1.81 ERA (19 er in 94.2 ip) in 92 career appearances in April.

Last Year: Began the season as the A's closer and saved a team-leading 16 games before Blake Treinen took over in July...was 16-for-23 (69.6%) in save opportunities, which was the second lowest percentage in the majors...compiled a 4.27 ERA in 63 games.

- Did not allow a run in his first four outings but has surrendered runs in back-to-back outings.
- Is 0-1 with a 6.59 ERA (10 er, 13.2 ip) with 11 strikeouts in 16 relief appearances against Seattle.
- Is in his fifth season in the majors but is on his second Opening Day roster...his first was last year with Oakland.

Last Year: Made a team-leading 72 appearances in his first full season in the majors and was 2-2 with a 3.48 ERA and .240 opponents batting average...ranked fifth in the American League in games pitched but tossed just 51.2 innings.

- Begins his fourth season in the majors.

- Was credited with each of the A's first two wins and is one of two American League relievers with two wins (Bleier, BAL).
- Has a 12.46 ERA (6 er, 4.1 ip) with 5 so in 5 games vs. Seattle...allowed all six runs in his last three outings...scoreless in his first two outings.
- Compiled a 3.95 ERA in eight April appearances last year but has a 7.36 ERA (30 er in 36.2 ip) in 37 career appearances in the month.
- Begins his ninth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2015-17 with the Dodgers).

Last Year: Began the season with the Dodgers and was traded to the A's Aug. 15...combined for a 1-2 record and a 4.22 ERA in 49 appearances in his seventh season in the majors...had career highs in strikeouts (63) and innings pitched (59.2).

- Was placed on the 10-day DL with a groin strain.
- Allowed two runs on three hits without recording an out in his lone appearance against Los Angeles-NL on Tuesday...it was the sixth time in his career that he has made an appearance without recording an out.
- Is 0-2 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er, 29.2 ip) with 32 strikeouts in 19 appearances, including 2 starts against Seattle.
- Posted a 6.00 ERA in nine appearances in April last year and has a 6.55 ERA (41 er in 56.1 ip) in 35 career appearances in the month.
- Is in his eighth season in the majors and is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2012-13, 15-18)...it is his third straight with the A's.

Last Year: Was 4-2 with a save and a 4.22 ERA in a career-high 70 games...also had career highs in strikeouts (78), saves and wild pitches (6) and a career-low in opponents batting average (.229)...tied for eighth in the American League in games pitched.

- Signed with the A's as a free agent on December 7, 2017...has a two-year deal with a club option for 2020.
- Begins his 11th season in the majors with his sixth different team (Florida, 2006; Arizona, 2007-09; San Francisco, 2012-15; Washington, 2016; Los Angeles-AL, 2017)...is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2008-09, 14-18).

Last Year: Signed a minor league deal with Los Angeles (AL) Feb. 15, made the Angels Opening Day roster and spent the entire season in the majors...appeared in a career high 60 games and went 5-2 with a career-high four saves and a career-low 2.76 ERA.

- Allowed a three-run homer last Friday at Los Angeles (AL) for his first blown save of the season...it was his first blown save since Aug. 4, 2017, also at Los Angeles (AL), and it snapped a streak of 13 consecutive saves.
- Is 1-1 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er, 3.1 ip) with 2 strikeouts in 4 relief appearances in his career against Seattle, all in 2017.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster...the previous three came with Washington (2015-17).

Last Year: Was acquired from Washington in the Sean Doolittle/Ryan Madson trade on July 16 and ended up saving 13 games for the A's...went 3-4 with a 2.13 ERA in 35 games with Oakland and combined for a career-high 16 saves and a 3.93 ERA overall.

- Is a .276 (27-for-98) career hitter against Seattle with four doubles, two triples, six home runs and 16 RBI in 26 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...has three career home runs at Safeco Field, which are second only to his 12 in the Coliseum.
- Appeared in two games with Nashville, hitting .250 (2-for-8) with one run, one double, one home run and one RBI.
- Hit .362 (17-for-47) with three doubles, four home runs and 10 RBI in 23 games during Spring Training.

Last Year: Split his season between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...hit .208 with five home runs and 14 RBI in 57 games over four stints with the A's in his third season in the majors...also batted .283 with 12 home runs and 50 RBI in 75 games with the Sounds.

26 MATT CHAPMAN

- Is 7-for-23 (.304) on the road trip after hitting .400 on the homestand.
- Had his eighth multiple hit game of the season Friday, which is tied for the most in the American League...also leads AL in total bases (37), slugging (.698), tied for first in home runs (5), tied for second in RBI (12), tied for second in hits (19), tied for sixth in runs (12), fourth in batting (.358) and 8th in on-base percentage (.426).
- Three of his five home runs have come with runners on base.
- Had his career-high nine-game hitting streak snapped on Tuesday...went 15-for-33 (.455) with nine runs, three home runs, eight RBI and six multiple hit games during the streak...had a career-best streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 2-6.
- Is one of four Athletics to start all 14 games (Davis, Lowrie, Semien).
- Batted .178 with two home runs and six RBI in 17 games during the spring.

Last Year: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 15 and hit .234 with 14 home runs and 40 RBI in 84 games in his Major League debut...led Major League rookies in doubles (21) and extra base hits (37) after the All-Star Break.

- Recorded his 16th multi-homer game on Friday night as clubbed two homers for the first time in the 2018 season.
- Is 7-for-14 over his last three games after going 3-for-29 (.103) over his previous eight games.
- Is batting .381 (8-for-21) in five starts as a left fielder, .188 (6-for-32) in nine starts at designated hitter.
- Is a .216 (30-for-139) career hitter against Seattle but has 16 home runs and 34 RBI in 39 games...the home runs and RBI are second only to his 18 home runs and 39 RBI against Texas.
- Is one of four Athletics to start all 14 games (Chapman, Lowrie, Semien).
- Batted .127 in 20 games this spring...had 12 RBI on his seven hits.

Last Year: Hit a career-high 43 home runs after slugging .42 in 2016 to become the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons (Jimmie Foxx, 1932-34)...added a career-high 110 RBI...ranked second in the AL in HR and third in RBI.

- Is 6-for-25 (.240) over his last 10 games after hitting .286 in the season-opening four-game series against Los Angeles (AL).
- Has started nine games, all against right-handed pitchers...is 0-for-1 with a walk in two plate appearances against lefties...last year, he made 109 of his 123 starts against righties...over the last six years, he has made 453 of his 479 starts (94.6%) against righties.
