PREGAME FESTIVITIES

Promotional Giveaway: The first 10,000 fans will receive a **1968 Willie Horton Bobblehead**, sponsored by Dunkin' Donuts.

Game Ball Delivery: The game ball will be delivered by **Staff Sergeant Jason Walters** of the United States Army from Livonia, MI. Staff Sergeant Walters is a field artillery man who has been deployed to Iraq and has proudly served in the United States Army for nine years.

National Anthem: The national anthem will be performed by the **Langsford Men's Choir**.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers evened their series against the Rangers with a 3-1 win on Friday night at Comerica Park. Jordan Zimmermann started for Detroit and improved his record to 4-0 on the season, throwing 8.0 strong innings and giving up just one run on four hits with 11 strikeouts. Joe Jiménez pitched a scoreless ninth inning to notch his third save of the season. Offensively, James McCann belted a two-run home run, while JaCoby Jones hit a solo homer. The Tigers and Rangers play the third game of their four-game series this afternoon. Following this weekend's series vs. Texas, Detroit closes the first half of the season next week with a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Tampa Bay (July 9-11) and three games at Houston (July 13-15).

AIR JORDAN: Jordan Zimmermann turned in his longest outing of the season last night, throwing 8.0 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with a season-high 11 strikeouts. Zimmermann's 11 strikeouts marked his sixth career double-digit strikeout game and were his most punchouts in a game since he struck out 12 on June 8, 2014 at San Diego. Over his last six starts, Zimmermann has posted a 3-0 record with a 1.22 ERA (37.0IP/5ER) and 34 strikeouts. Opponents have recorded just a .163/.193/.225 slash line against him over that stretch.

FOR STARTERS: With Jordan Zimmermann's outing last night, Tigers starting pitchers have thrown 6.0-or-more innings in nine of the last 10 games, dating back to June 27. Prior to June 27, Detroit starters had gone at least 6.0 innings just once in the previous 12 games. Since June 27, the Tigers starting rotation leads the Majors with 66.0 innings pitched, while they are second in the American League with a .227 (56x247) opponents batting average and fourth with a 3.55 ERA (66.0IP/26ER).

FIRE THE McCANNON: James McCann threw out Delino DeShields attempting to steal second base in the third inning of last night's game. McCann now has 12 catcher caught stealings on the season, which ranks second in the American League, trailing only Oakland's Jonathan Lucroy (14). Since the start of the 2015 season, McCann ranks third among active catchers with 79 catcher caught stealings, trailing only Lucroy (94) and Salvador Perez (80).

NOT WASTING ANY TIME: The Tigers played their quickest game of the season last night at two hours and five minutes. The game was Detroit's fastest nine-inning game since October 2, 2010, when they played a two hour game at Baltimore. Last night's game was tied for the second quickest in the Majors this season.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Today's game marks the 24th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 13-10 against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .274 (199x727) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers lead the American League with a .274 batting average vs. lefties, while they are third with a .440 slugging percentage and fourth with a .331 on-base percentage. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .432 (35x81) batting average vs. lefties, while he is second in the big leagues with a .483 on-base percentage vs. southpaws and fourth in the American League with a .691 slugging percentage.

TIGERS AND RANGERS: The Tigers are 2-3 against the Rangers this season. Detroit has lost the season series to Texas five times in the last six seasons, with the Tigers' only series victory coming in 2014. Detroit has dropped nine of its last 11 games vs. the Rangers played at Comerica Park.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 1-1 on their current four-game homestand. Detroit, which snapped a five-game home losing streak last night, is 24-22 at Comerica Park this season. The Tigers are hitting .258 (405x1571) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.09 ERA (425.0IP/193ER).

WESTWORLD: Detroit is 8-12 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 29 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (45-74, .378).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 39-51 (.433) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,107-1,090 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

BACK TO THE FUTURES: RHP Matt Manning (Team USA) and INF Dawel Lugo (Team World) were selected for the 2018 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, which will be played on Sunday, July 15 at 4:00 p.m. ET at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C. Manning, who is rated as the second-best prospect in the Tigers organization by MLB Pipeline.com, has made 12 starts this season between Single A West Michigan and Single A Lakeland, posting a 4-3 record with a 3.12 ERA (60.2IP/21ER) and 85 strikeouts. Lugo, who is ranked as the No. 12 prospect in the Tigers organization, has played in 79 games with Triple A Toledo, hitting .273 (91x333) with 40 runs scored, 19 doubles, three triples, two home runs and 34 RBI.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 17th start of the season this afternoon vs. Texas.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers turned in his longest outing of the season on Monday at Toronto, but did not factor into the decision after allowing one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 8.0 innings. The outing was Fiers' longest since he threw a no-hitter on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

VS. TEXAS: Fiers has made seven appearances, including six starts, in his career against the Rangers, posting a 1-3 record with a 8.10 ERA (36.2IP/33ER) and 33 strikeouts. He faced the Rangers earlier this season on May 8 and picked up the win, giving up two runs on six hits with five strikeouts in 5.1 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made 10 career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 3-2 record with a 2.85 ERA (60.0IP/19ER) and 45 strikeouts. In eight home starts this season, Fiers is 3-2 with a 3.19 ERA (48.0IP/17ER) and 36 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Fiers has appeared in 32 games, including 30 starts, in his career against teams from the American League West, posting a 6-11 record with a 5.63 ERA (171.0IP/107ER) and 147 strikeouts. In four starts against AL West opponents this season, Fiers is 1-2 with a 3.13 ERA (23.0IP/8ER) and 16 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Fiers has started 20 games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 7-7 record with a 2.78 ERA (120.0IP/37ER) and 120 strikeouts. In five July starts last season, Fiers went 2-2 with a 2.89 ERA (28.0IP/9ER) and 40 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fiers currently ranks seventh in the American League with 1.94 walks per nine innings.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR JUNE: Fiers was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA (30.0IP/11ER) and 27 strikeouts. He limited opponents to a .239 (28x117) batting average during the month.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .251 (374x1493) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .257 (426x1657) against him. In 16 starts this season, lefties are hitting .249 (43x173), while righthanded batters are hitting .262 (50x191).

IMPRESSIVE TIGERS DEBUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer turned in a quality start on Tuesday at Chicago (NL), but did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on seven hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. TEXAS/AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has faced the Rangers three times in his career, compiling a 1-1 record with a 4.58 ERA (19.2IP/10ER) and 18 strikeouts. He faced Texas earlier this season on May 7 in Arlington and received a no decision, giving up five runs on four hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings. Fulmer has made 32 career starts at Comerica Park, posting a 10-11 record with a 3.55 ERA (205.1IP/81ER) and 144 strikeouts. In nine home starts this season, Fulmer is 1-5 with a 4.13 ERA (56.2IP/26ER) and 37 strikeouts.
