AT A GLANCE: The New York Yankees will play their second exhibition game of the spring today at the Pirates' LECOM Park in Bradenton, marking the their first road contest...will be the first of two spring games between the teams in 2018 (also 3/15 at GMS Field)...will play 32 total spring games...are slated for 16 home games and 16 road games...will play seven night games, including five at home (Mon. vs. Philadelphia, 3/12 vs. Minnesota, 3/16 vs. Houston, 3/19 vs. Tampa Bay and 3/21 vs. Baltimore) and two on the road (3/9 at Atlanta at Lake Buena Vista, 3/26 at Atlanta at SunTrust Park)...each of the Yankees' home night games will start at 6:35 p.m....marks the Yankees' 23rd consecutive season at Steinbrenner Field (1996-2018), formerly Legends Field, and the 116th season in franchise history.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Friday at Steinbrenner Field, the Yankees defeated Detroit, 3-1, in the spring opener for both clubs...RHP Luis Cessa got the start and allowed 1ER in 2.0IP (2H, 0BB, 2K, 1WP)...the Yankees' bullpen followed with 7.0 scoreless IP (4H, 3BB, 6K), including 2.0IP from RHP Ben Heller (2H, 3K, 1WP)...RHP David Hale also tossed 2.0IP (1H, 1BB, 1K) and was credited with the win...RF Giancarlo Stanton (0-for-1, 1BB) started and made his debut in pinstripes...PH/DH Jorge Saez (2-for-3) had a two-out two-run single in the sixth...SS Tyler Wade (2-for-2, 1R, 1 double) was the other Yankee with a multi-hit game.

▶ The Yankees wore the caps of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas H.S. Eagles baseball team during batting practice and game...the caps will be autographed and auctioned off...additionally, the club held a moment of silence prior to the national anthem.

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees secured their 25th consecutive winning season last year (1993-2017)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it marks the second-longest such streak among Major League teams all time, trailing only the Yankees' run of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64...the team also secured its 26th consecutive winning season *at home* (went 51-30 at home in 2017), extending its run since 1992...according to *Elias*, it is the second-longest such streak in Major League history, trailing only the Yankees' 47-year home winning streak from 1918-64.

THE SKIPPER: In 2018, **Manager Aaron Boone** enters his first season at the helm of the Yankees making his managerial debut...is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, will join his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper, leading the Kansas City Royals from 1995-97, then guiding the Reds from 2001-03, a stint during which he managed Aaron...is one of nine active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), Craig Counsell (Milwaukee), Terry Francona (Cleveland), Dave Martinez (Washington), Mike Matheny (St. Louis), Paul Molitor (Minnesota) and Dave Roberts (Los Angeles-NL)—credit: ESPN Stats & Info.

NEWCOMERS: This spring, the Yankees welcome to Major League camp eight players who were not with the organization in 2017: INF/OF Brandon Drury, INF Danny Espinosa, RHP David Hale, LHP Wade LeBlanc, C Chace Numata, INF/OF Jace Peterson, OF Shane Robinson and OF Giancarlo Stanton...of this group, LeBlanc has previously played for the Yankees (one relief appearance in 2014), while seven have Major League service time (all but Numata).

▶ The Yankees spring roster also features 12 players partaking in a Major League camp for the first time in their careers: RHP Albert Abreu, RHP Domingo Acevedo, RHP Cody Carroll, RHP Cale Coshow, RHP Raynel Espinal, INF Thairo Estrada, OF Estevan Florial, INF Kyle Holder, RHP Brian Keller, LHP Trevor Lane, RHP Jonathan Loaisiga and RHP Dillon Tate...all but Abreu, Loaisiga and Tate are homegrown players originally drafted or signed by the Yankees.

▶ The Yankees coaching staff also features a number of new faces: bench coach **Josh Bard**, assistant hitting coach **P.J. Pilittere**, third base coach **Phil Nevin**, first base coach/outfield instructor **Reggie Willits** and Major League quality control coach/infield instructor **Carlos Mendoza**...additionally, **Jason Brown** returns in his new role of catching coach.

23 AND COUNTING: This year marks the 23rd season the Yankees have held spring training at George M. Steinbrenner Field in Tampa, Fla...the complex originally opened prior to the 1996 season as Legends Field...during a pregame ceremony on 3/27/08, was renamed as George M. Steinbrenner Field in honor of the club's late principal owner...since its inception, GMS Field has also served as home for the Yankees' Single-A Florida State League affiliate, which changed its name from the Tampa Yankees to the Tampa Tarpons for the 2018 season...prior to relocating to Tampa in 1994 (the team played at Red McEwen Field at the U. of South Florida from 1994-95), the Yankees trained in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

GEORGE M. STEINBRENNER FIELD GATE OPENING TIMES AND SECURITY PROTOCOLS: New in 2018, Steinbrenner Field will open its right field gate to those with valid tickets beginning three hours prior to the scheduled first pitch of that day or evening's game...the right field gate is accessible via the main plaza in front of the stadium as well as from the Dale Mabry Highway pedestrian overpass that connects to the Raymond James Stadium parking lots...parking lots will open 4 hours prior to every home game...until 2 hours prior to the scheduled first pitch, fans will be permitted in the outfield sections of the stands only (including the BayCare | St. Joseph's Hospitals HealthZone in left field, center field, and the right field terrace).

▶ Throughout the spring, fans attending Yankees home spring training games are strongly encouraged to arrive early and budget an appropriate amount of time for MLB-mandated metal detection screening upon entry.

▶ Tickets for home spring Yankees games are available at the Steinbrenner Field box office, online at www.steinbrennerfield.com and www.yankees.com/spring, or by calling Ticketmaster at (800) 745-3000...fans with inquiries regarding single-game tickets, season tickets, group tickets and special event availability may call the box office directly at (813) 879-2244.

▶ *At Yankee Stadium in 2018*, gates will open three hours prior to scheduled first pitch times for *select games* with details to be announced at a later date.

THINGS TO ENJOY AT STEINBRENNER FIELD: Prior to the 2017 season, Steinbrenner Field underwent significant ballpark enhancements, including a new entrance gate in right field by the Dale Mabry Highway overpass and a two-level team store by the home plate entrance...bullpen clubs on the first and third base lines provide great social gathering spaces for all fans to enjoy...fans are now be able to walk a complete loop around the entire stadium with newly installed concourses and seating in the outfield...more shaded areas have been added to the stadium...fans will also be able to enjoy a redesigned menu courtesy of Legends Hospitality.

FOR STARTERS: RHP RHP Domingo Germán (0-1, 3.14 ERA in 2017) will make his first spring start for the Yankees...went 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 6R/5ER, 9BB, 18K) in seven relief appearances over four stints with the Yankees in 2017...combined with Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre to go 8-6 with a 2.88 ERA in 20 games (19 starts)...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 12/11/15.

▶ *On Sunday at Philadelphia*, LHP Jordan Montgomery will be making his first spring start for the Yankees...in his first Major League season, went 9-7 with a 3.88 ERA (155.1IP, 140H, 72R/67ER, 51BB, 144K, 21HR) in 29 starts over five stints with the Yankees (4/12-7/8, 7/14-8/6, 8/11-19, 8/30, 9/1-end of season)...opponents hit .236 (140-for-592); LH .195 (17-for-87); RH .244 (123-for-505)...had 2.7 WAR and a 4.07 FIP (FanGraphs)...the Yankees went 13-16 in his starts.

2017 SEASON IN REVIEW

ROLL CALL: The Yankees used 51 players in 2017 (P-25, C-4, INF-14, OF-7, DH-1), their fewest since 2012 (45)... 21 players made their Yankees debuts in 2017 (12 MLB debuts)... seven players spent the entire season on the Yankees' active roster with no D.L. stints: Betances, Gardner, Headley, Judge, Romine, Severino and Torreyes... of the 51 players, 50 played for the team before 8/5 (only C Erik Kratz was added in the final eight weeks)... the Yankees did not use a position player on the mound for the second consecutive season... a total of 18 players combined for 24 stints on the D.L., with Tyler Austin, Starlin Castro, Aaron Hicks, Matt Holliday, CC Sabathia and Adam Warren making multiple trips.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: At 28 years, 334 days, on Opening Day 2017, the average age of the Yankees' Opening Day active roster was its youngest in at least the last 25 years... marked the second straight year the Yankees' average age on Opening Day was under 30 (29.099 in 2016).

WE WERE ON A BREAK: The Yankees were 46-30 (.605) after the All-Star break, the second-best record in the AL (Cleveland, 55-20, .733) and fourth-best in the Majors... was their 25th consecutive season with a winning record after the break (1993-2017)... is the second-longest such streak in Major League history, after their own 32-year streak from 1933-64.

WALK-OFF FAME: The Yankees had five "walk-off" wins in 2017: 4/28 vs. Baltimore (Holliday three-run HR); 6/23 vs. Texas (Torreyes RBI single); 7/8 vs. Milwaukee (C. Frazier three-run HR); 7/27 vs. Tampa Bay (Gardner solo HR); 7/29 vs. Tampa Bay (Gardner RBI single).

SURVEY SAYS... : The Yankees' 75.0% success rate on replay challenges was the highest in the Majors in 2017 (40 challenges: 30 overturned, 2 confirmed, 8 stand)... have led Major League clubs in replay challenge success rate in three of the four seasons of the replay review system (since 2014), also winning 73.3% of challenges in 2015 (22-for-30) and 82.1% of challenges in 2014 (23-for-28).

- Jan. 13** Agreed to terms with **RHP Dellin Betances, RHP Sonny Gray, SS Didi Gregorius, OF Aaron Hicks, RHP Tommy Kahnle, C Austin Romine, LHP Chasen Shreve** and **RHP Adam Warren** on one-year, non-guaranteed contracts, thus avoiding arbitration.
- Feb. 20** Acquired **INF/OF Brandon Drury** from the Arizona Diamondbacks in a three-team trade, in which Arizona acquired OF Steven Souza, Jr. from the Tampa Bay Rays and **RHP Taylor Widener** from the Yankees, and Tampa Bay acquired **INF Nick Solak** from the Yankees and LHP Anthony Banda and two players to be named later from Arizona... designated **OF Jabari Blash** for assignment.
- Feb. 21** Traded **OF Jabari Blash** to the Los Angeles Angels in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
