ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets will name RHP Jacob Rhame the 26th man for today's doubleheader, recall LHP P.J. Conlon from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League, recall infielder Ty Kelly from Las Vegas (AAA), place infielder Todd Frazier on the 10-Day DL with a left rib cage muscle strain and option RHP Chris Flexen to Las Vegas (AAA)...Rhame will wear #35, Conlon will wear #60 and Kelly will wear #66...Rhame is 0-1 with one save and a 6.75 ERA (10 earned runs/13.1 innings) in 13 games with New York this year...He was 1-2 with nine saves and a 3.76 ERA (11 earned runs/26.1 innings) in 20 games for Las Vegas (AAA)...Conlon is 0-2 with a 11.12 ERA (7 earned runs/5.2 innings) in two starts for the Mets this year...He was 3-5 with a 6.39 ERA (49 earned runs/69.0 innings) in 13 starts for the 51s... Kelly was hitting .272 (72-265) with 17 doubles, five triples, seven homers and 38 RBI in 79 games for the 51s this year.

ALL-STAR: Jacob deGrom was named to the NL All-Star team... He was also an All-Star in 2015 and became the first pitcher in All-Star Game history to strike out three batters (Stephen Vogt, Jason Kipnis, José Iglesias) in an inning with 10 pitches or fewer in Cincinnati...DeGrom leads the majors with a 1.79 ERA, is second in the NL and eighth in the majors with 142 strikeouts, second in the NL in WHIP (0.99) and is third in the majors with a .297 slugging percentage against mark...DeGrom is the 13th pitcher in team history to be named to multiple All-Star Games.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 4-6 in their last 10 games... New York is 8-25 in its last 33 games and 10-30 in its last 40 contests...The Mets have been shut out in back-to-back games (both by Tampa Bay) and have been shut out eight times this year (seven at home)...New York has gone 14 straight series without a series win since sweeping Arizona from May 18-20...The Mets are 18-42 since May 1.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Mets have won 19 of their last 24 series vs. the Phillies...New York is 41-20 vs. Philadelphia since the start of the 2015 campaign, including 3-1 this year...New York has out-homered the Phillies, 106-49 since the start of the 2015 season... According to Elias, no major league team has hit as many home runs against one opponent since 2015 season as the Mets have hit against the Phillies - 106.

DOUBLEHEADER NOTES: The Mets will play their second of three currently scheduled doubleheaders today...The Mets split a pair in Atlanta on May 28...New York also has a doubleheader on August 16 at Philadelphia...The last time these two clubs met in a doubleheader was September 24, 2011 at Citi Field when the Mets swept both games...The last time the Phillies swept a doubleheader from the Mets was September 13, 2009 at Philly.

AT HOME: New York is 1-2 on their season-high 11-game homestand...The Mets have lost 17 of their last 20 home games... New York is 15-28 at home this year.

NOAH SYNDERGAARD: Pitched 5.0 innings for Brooklyn last night vs. Staten Island...He allowed two hits, one run, issued one walk and struck out seven...Syndergaard threw 71 pitches, 46 strikes...He has been on the DL since May 26 with a strained ligament in his right index finger.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won double-digit games vs. the Phillies each of the last six years, the longest such streak in franchise history.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



BRANDON NIMMO: Is 11th in the NL with a .386 OBP, ninth with a .901 OPS and 11th with a .515 slugging percentage...He has a career-high 12 homers and is tied for fourth in the majors with six triples.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Has two homers and five RBI in his last six games...He is hitting .329 (24-73) with two doubles, four homers, 13 RBI, eight runs scored and a .402 OBP in his last 18 games...Cabrera has 15 homers, surpassing last year's total of 14...Cabrera has 49 RBI, his second-highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...He had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half...The only Mets second baseman with 50 or more RBI in the first half was Edgardo Alfonzo, who did it twice (58 RBI in 2000 and 55 RBI in 1999).

FLORES FLOURISHING: Over his last 40 games, Wilmer Flores is batting .295 (38-129) with 11 doubles, five home runs, 21 RBI, 13 runs scored, 10 walks and a .340 OBP (dating back to May 4).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has four homers, 15 RBI and 14 runs scored over his last 19 games...Bautista has drawn 20 base-on-balls in his last 21 games.

JARRED KELENIC: Will be promoted to Kingsport (R) of the Appalachian League...His first game with them will be tomorrow... The Mets first round pick this year was hitting .413 (19-46) with two doubles, two triples, one homer, nine RBI and a .451 OBP with the Gulf Coast Mets.

JASON VARGAS: Will make a minor league rehab start for Brooklyn (A) tonight at Staten Island...Vargas has been on the DL since June 22 with a strained right calf.

NO FEES PROMOTION: The Mets will pick up all ticket fees on orders placed through Thursday, July 12 at 11:59 p.m...This limited time offer applies to all 38 remaining regular season home games... Tickets can be purchased at mets.com/tickets or by phone 718-507-TIXX.

NATIONAL PLAY CAMPAIGN: The Mets will host a National Play clinic tomorrow at Citi Field from 12 p.m.-2 p.m...Dominic Smith and the Mets training staff will participate...PLAY (Promoting a Lifetime of Activity for Youth) was formed to raise awareness about children's health issues and delivering healthy messages of an active lifestyle and being more active.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 6.1 innings and left in line for the win, yet was dealt his eighth no-decision of the season in the Mets' 8-6 loss on July 3 at Rogers Centre... Wheeler allowed two runs, earned, on three hits while walking three and fanning five strikeouts...Was his fourth-straight outing of at least 6.0 innings and his third quality start in his last four trips to the mound.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: Wheeler today faces the Phillies for the first time this season and ninth time in his career...Is 3-1 all-time vs. Philadelphia with a 2.82 ERA (14 earned runs/44.2 innings)...Has won each of his last three decisions vs. the Fightin' Phils...Today's outing marks his sixth start versus the club at Citi Field...In his five starts against the club at home, Wheeler is 1-1 with a 2.36 ERA (seven earned runs/26.2 innings)...In his most recent start against Philadelphia, July 1 of last season at Citi Field, the righty took the no-decision in the Mets 7-6 victory...In that start, Wheeler threw 3.2 innings, giving up two runs, unearned, on two hits while walking two and fanning four.

THE 7.0 LINE: Wheeler has pitched 7.0 innings in each of his last three home starts, the second-longest streak by a Mets pitcher this season (Jacob deGrom had four-straight 7.0-inning home starts from May 18-June 8)...Had three home starts of at least 7.0 innings in his career prior to this streak...Two of his last three home outings have been scoreless (June 6 vs. Baltimore and June 27 vs. Pittsburgh), the first two scoreless home starts of his career.

AT CITI: Is 0-2 in his last five home starts despite posting a 1.91 ERA (seven earned runs/33.0 innings) in that span...Overall, Wheeler is 0-5 with a 4.41 ERA (24 earned runs/49.0 innings) in eight starts at home this season (the Mets have lost all eight starts)...In 38-career home starts, Wheeler is 8-20 with a 4.78 ERA (113 earned runs/212.2 innings)...Has fanned 207 and walked 95 batters at home.

JULY: Wheeler will be making his 16th-career start in the month of July...In 15-career July starts, he is 6-2 with a 2.85 ERA (28 earned runs/88.1 innings)...His six wins in July are tied for his most in any month (also, six wins in August) while his 2.85 ERA is his lowest in any single calendar month in his career.

QUALITY WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his 16 starts this season, including 10 of his last 12 starts...Seven of those 12 starts of at least 6.0 innings have been quality starts...Five of his last seven starts have been quality outings, including three of his last four...Has nine quality starts overall after posting six quality starts in all of 2017 (17 total starts)...The Mets have as many wins (two) in his 12 starts of 6.0 or more innings as they do in his four starts of fewer than 6.0 innings.

BY INNING: This season, Wheeler has a 5.63 ERA (10 earned runs/16.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA is 4.10 (36 earned runs/79.0 innings)...Wheeler has a 4.94 career ERA (45 earned runs/82.0 innings) in the first inning...Owns a 3.79 career ERA (162 earned runs/384.2 innings) in all subsequent innings.

CAREER-BEST STRIKEOUT PACE: Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.54 K/9 ratio (443 strikeouts/466.2 innings)...In his 16 starts this season, he is striking out batters at a rate of 8.62 K/9 (91 strikeouts/95.0 innings)...Has fanned seven or more batters in eight of his 16 starts this season, including three of his last four outings...His 91 strikeouts are tied with the most he's produced in his first 16 starts of a single season in his career (also had 91 strikeouts through 16 starts in 2014).

NL EAST: In 37 career starts within his division, Wheeler is 12-14 with a 3.41 ERA (83 earned runs/219.1 innings)...Has fanned 211 batters and walked 84 in his matchups vs. divisional foes...In 2017, Wheeler started six games against the NL East, going 1-2 with a 4.20 ERA (14 earned runs/30.0 innings) while striking out 29 batters and walking 12.

LAST TIME OUT: Oswalt faced Toronto on July 4 at Rogers Centre, receiving a no-decision in the Mets' 6-3 win after pitching 4.0 innings and giving up two runs, earned, on five hits with one walk and two strikeouts.

IN THE MAJORS: Oswalt will be making his fourth-career major league appearance (third start)...Will be his first appearance at Citi Field...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his MLB debut in team history...Is one of two Mets hurlers in franchise history to record four or more strikeouts in a relief outing for his major league debut (also, Buzz Capra in game one of a doubleheader on September 15, 1971).

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has appeared in two games (one start) over four stints with the Mets...Has made 10 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 5.32 ERA (28 earned runs/47.1 innings)...Has 49 strikeouts and 18 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso...Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Has four quality starts in 10 outings at Triple-A.

SPRING RECAP: Posted a 2.84 ERA (two earned runs/6.1 innings) this spring in four Grapefruit League games, striking out five and walking none...Did not allow a run in three of his four Grapefruit League outings, all of which came in relief.

IN THE MINORS: In 96 games (90 starts) in the Mets minor league system, Oswalt is 41-22 with a 3.55 ERA (195 earned runs/495.0 innings)...Went 12-5 with a 2.28 ERA (34 earned runs/134.1 innings) in 24 starts with Double-A Binghamton in 2017 en route to being named a Mid-Season and Post-Season Eastern League All-Star as well as the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year.

OSWALT'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Graduated from Madison (CA) High School in 2012...Was committed to UC Santa Barbara as a position player (third base/shortstop).
- » Selected by the New York Mets as a pitcher in the seventh round of 2012 First-Year Player Draft.
- » In 2014, his first season at the A-level, was named to the Mid-Season New York-Penn League All-Star Team representing the Brooklyn Cyclones.
- » In 2016, he pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League, going 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 earned runs/27.0 innings) in seven starts for the Scorpions.
- » Was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after going 12-5 with a league-leading 2.28 ERA with Binghamton...His 2.28 ERA led all Double-A pitchers.
- » Was tabbed as the Mets' Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year for his 2017 campaign at Binghamton.
- » In 2017, finished second in the Eastern League in victories (12), third in WHIP (1.18) and fifth in opponents average against (.236) and fifth in opponents average against (.236).
- » Also in 2017 was named to the Eastern League's mid-season and post-season All-Star teams.
- » Made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings out of the bullpen with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his major league debut.
