### VS. TAMPA BAY

The Mariners and Rays meet for the 7th and final time (5-1) this season...Seattle swept a 3-game series vs. the Rays at Safeco Field, June 1-3...the Mariners are 14-4 in their last 18 games vs. the Rays, dating back to the start of the 2016 season:

**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners conclude a 6-day, 6-game road trip covering over 5,600 miles with the final game of a 4-game series with Tampa Bay (2-1)...opened the road trip splitting a 2-game set with Houston (1-1)...the Mariners will return home to Seattle on tomorrow to begin a 7-day, 7-game homestand that features 3 games vs. the Angels and 4 games vs. the Red Sox...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners have won 7 of their last 9 games, 11 of their last 15, 16 of their last 21 and 18 of their last 25...Seattle is 26-13 in its last 39 games, 31-16 over its last 47 games and 36-20 in its last 56 games...Seattle is 12-11 during the day and 29-12 at night...Seattle is 20-12 at Safeco Field, 20-12 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...tied with Texas (6-1) and trail only Toronto (7-1) for the ML-lead in extra-inning wins.
- **Walk it Off** - the Mariners (5) are tied with the Yankees for 3rd-most walk-off wins in the ML, trailing only the Cardinals (7) and Braves (6)...each of the Mariners 5 walk-off wins has come during extra-innings.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** leads the Major Leagues with 29 multi-hit games, ranking ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (27) and Nicholas Castellanos-DET (26)...Segura leads the Majors with 12 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (11).
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 28-8 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-16 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Scoreless** - RH **Chasen Bradford** has an active 8.2 scoreless innings streak over his last 8 games (5/17-c)...his scoreless streak is currently the T11th-longest active streak in the American League.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 17 of their first 20 series, posting a series record of 11-3-5, including going 7-1-3 on the road (records does not include current series outcome).
- **It's a Dee Thing** - the Mariners are 10-1 when Dee Gordon starts at second base this season.
- **Ouch** - **Nelson Cruz** is tied for the Major League lead with Kris Bryant-CHI and C.J. Cron-TB with 10 HBP...his 10 HBP are the 2nd-most in his career, trailing only 12 HBP in 2017.
- **What an Arm** - **Mike Zunino** has thrown out 10 of 24 attempted base stealers (41.7%, 14 SB, 10 CS) this season (excludes all pitcher caught stealings), including 6 of 8 attempted base stealers in the 7th inning or later.

**FACEBOOK WATCH**...the Angels at Mariners game Wednesday, June 13 is a Facebook Watch game, as chosen by Major League Baseball...as such, it's available exclusively on Facebook Watch or the Mariners Radio Network (it is NOT available on ROOT Sports)...fans can watch the game on their desktop, mobile device or by streaming it to their TV.

**BEASTS AGAINST THE EAST**...Seattle is 7-2 (.778) in 9 games against the American League East this season...beginning today, 15 of the Mariners next 18 games will be against AL East opponents, including 14 consecutive games against the AL East, June 14-28...after this 18-game stretch the Mariners will only have 10 remaining game against the AL East: Aug. 2-5 vs. the Blue Jays, Sept. 3-5 vs. the Orioles and Sept. 7-9 vs. the Yankees...dating back to May 28, 2017, the Mariners are 20-15 vs. the AL East, including going 12-7 during this stretch at Safeco Field.

**HOT START**...Seattle is 40-24 (.625) through its first 64 games of the season, its 3rd-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (50-14/.781) and 2003 (43-21/.672)...the Mariners currently tied with the Astros for the lead in the American League West...prior to this season, the last time the Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

**AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES**...since May 16, the Mariners starters are 11-2 (team is 16-7 overall) with a 2.51 ERA (41 ER, 147.0 IP) with 107 strikeouts and 32 walks in 23 games...Seattle **starters** lead the Major Leagues in ERA during that span, ranking ahead of Chicago-NL (2.72/37.1 ER, 122.1) and St. Louis (2.73/41 ER, 135.0 IP)...the 147.0 innings pitched by Mariners **starters** are the most in the Majors since May 16...during this same stretch, Mariners relievers are 5-5 with 9 saves and a 2.69 ERA (20 ER, 67.0 IP).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN**...**Jean Segura** is batting .370 (50x135) with 28 runs scored, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 21 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks and 9 stolen bases in 31 games on the road this season, including batting .439 (25x57) with 11 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 1 HBP, 1 walk and 4 stolen bases in his last 13 road games (5/9-c)...among all American League players, his .370 road average is the 3T2nd-highest this season, along with Andrelton Simmons-LAA (.370/40x108) and trailing only Jose Altuve-HOU (.410/57x139)...he also ranks 2nd in hits, T2nd in runs, T6th in doubles, 7th in on-base percentage (.399) and T11th in RBI.

**RIBBIES**...Seattle boasts 3 of the top-11 players in the American League in RBI on the road this season...**Kyle Seager** ranks leads the Majors with 28 road RBI, while **Mitch Haniger** ranks 3rd in the AL with 25 RBI and **Jean Segura** ranks T11th with 21 road RBI.

**LET THERE BE LIGHT**...dating back to April 25, **Dee Gordon** has hit safely in 9 consecutive day games (with AB), batting .400 (14x35) with 5 runs scored, 1 double, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 1 walk and 3 stolen bases...overall this season, Gordon is batting .325 (25x77) with 10 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 2 HBP, 2 walks and 6 stolen bases.

**IN A GROOVE**...dating back to May 16, **Ben Gamel** has hit safely in 14 of his last 17 games (with AB), including at least 1 hit in 14 of his 15 starts...during this stretch, he is batting .389 (21x54) with 7 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks and 3 stolen bases...during this stretch his .389 batting average is the 3rd-highest in the American League (min. 50 AB), trailing only Jose Altuve-HOU (.396/36x91) and **Jean Segura**-SEA (.395/34x86)...Gamel has also reached base safely in all 9 games he has appeared in vs. the Rays, including at least 1 hit in 7 games...overall is batting .414 (12x29) with 4 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 RBI, 1 HBP and 6 walks.

**AS YOU KNOW**...dating back to April 26, **James Paxton** is 4-0 with a 1.75 ERA (11 ER, 56.2 IP) in his last 8 starts...**AND AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Paxton has tossed at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 -or-fewer runs in each of his last 8 starts...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Paxton's 8 consecutive starts tossing at least 5.0 inning and allowing 3-or-fewer runs is the 2nd-longest such streak in his career?...Paxton's current streak trails only a career-high 9-game streak, June 27-Aug. 10, 2017.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 14th start of 2018, his 88th career MLB start, and 3rd career start vs. the Rays today.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game...named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
- Is 3-6 with a 4.95 ERA (37 ER, 67.1 IP) in 12 career starts in the month of June.

**LAST OUTING**...earned his 5th win of the season in the Mariners 7-1 win at Houston on June 5...allowed 1 run on 9 hits and 1 walk while striking out 6 batters across 7.2 innings pitched...faced the minimum in the 1st, 5th, 6th and 7th innings...sole run came on an RBI double with one out in the 2nd inning; Paxton struck out the next two batters to retire the side, stranding men on 2nd and 3rd.

**HEATING UP**...since May 1, ranks 2nd in the Majors with 0.79 WHIP (Justin Verlander-HOU, 0.78 WHIP) and has held opponents to a .152 batting average against (30x175), the 4th-lowest mark in the Majors...has gone 4-0 with a 1.60 ERA (9 ER, 50.2 IP) with 57 strikeouts since May 1.

**LEADERBOARD**...ranks 9th in the Majors with an 11.04 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ratio (101 K, 82.1 IP)...Paxton ranks 6th in the American League (9th in MLB) with 101 strikeouts, trailing Gerrit Cole-HOU (116), Chris Sale-BOS (110), Justin Verlander-HOU (104) and Luis Severino-NYY (102).

**THE RIGHT STUFF**...has held right-handed hitters to a .171 batting average (42x246), while lefties have batted .346 (18x52) with 3 home runs against Paxton this season.

**NO-NO**...pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
- Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.
- Marks the Mariners 4th no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span.
- Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

**KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK**...recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 batters on Aug. 8, 1997, vs. CWS...became the first Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

**WHIFF**...recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernández (1) and Paxton (1).

**2017 SEASON RECAP**...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...spent two stints on the 10-day DL (5/3-30/17, 8/11-9/15/17)...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...earlier in the season, earned two American League awards in the span of three days...named American League Pitcher of the Month for July on Aug. 2...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July...named Co-American League Player of the Week on July 31...marked his 2nd such honor of the season (also: April 10-16)... became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season.

**HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH**...in 6 starts in the month of July, went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 6 wins in a calendar month...his 1.37 ERA for July was the lowest in calendar month by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández posted a 1.22 ERA (6 ER, 44.1 IP) in June of 2014...Paxton's 1.37 ERA in July was 7th-lowest in club history by a Mariners left-hander in a calendar month and the lowest since Jamie Moyer posted a 1.01 ERA (4 ER, 35.2 IP) in June of 2002...earned the win in 7 consecutive starts, July 2, 2017-Aug. 4, 2017...equaled the club record for wins in consecutive starts (also: Jamie Moyer, 5/6-6/8/03, and Scott Bankhead, 6/18-7/20/89).

**CAREER**...is 35-21 with a 3.23 ERA (181 ER, 504.1 IP) with 510 strikeouts in 87 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP WADE LeBLANC (1-0, 2.94 ERA)

33-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 7th start of the season...has allowed just 9 earned runs across his 7 starts this season and boasts a 2.29 ERA (9 ER, 35.1 IP) as a starter...the Mariners are 5-2 in his starts...no decision in his last start, a 5-7 Mariners loss on 6/6 at HOU (4.0,7,3,3,3,HR-1)...recorded a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts and 3 walks in 5 relief appearances this season...signed with the Mariners on March 25 after being released by the Yankees at his request...**SPRING TRAINING:** Was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...**2017 SEASON:** Went 5-2-1 in 50 appearances with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP) with 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...**CAREER:** 10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 31-35-3 with a 4.29 ERA (298 ER, 625.2 IP) in 188 career appearances/84 starts...in 86 career starts, is 23-31 with a 4.38 ERA (226 ER, 464.1 IP), 320 strikeouts and 156 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...**vs. LAA:** Has never faced the Angels.
