RAY MATTER—The Rays have won six of their last 7 games to improve to a season-high 13 games over .500, their most since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71...they have outscored opponents, 49-25, over this 7-game stretch and 103-54 over their last 18 games since Aug 19, going 15-3 over that span for their best 18-game stretch since since July 8-30, 2013 (15-3).

- + The Rays are four shy of 81 wins, which would be their most under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash**...they are five wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 and would need to go 13-8 or better for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays have outscored the Orioles, 24-7, this series...for the record, only three times in franchise history have the Rays reached 30 runs in a 3-game series: May 16-18, 2016 at TOR (31), Aug 29-31, 2008 vs. BAL (34) and Sep 3-5, 2007 vs. BAL (30)...the first 2 games this series was the second time this season the Rays won consecutive games, both by 5 runs or more, following May 17-18 at LAA.
- + The Rays are 28-17 (.622) since the All-Star break, 4th-best in the majors behind the Athletics, Red Sox and Cardinals...they are 23-11 (.676) since the beginning of August, tied with the A's for best in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Cardinals.
- + 14 of the club's remaining 21 games this season are at home.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays have won 10 consecutive home games since Aug 9, tied with April 21–May 4, 2012 for the 2nd-longest home winning streak in franchise history, and one shy of tying the club record (11, April 22–May 13, 2008)...they have outscored opponents, 68-23, in these 10 games...it is the 2nd-longest home winning streak in the majors this season, behind the Yankees from April 21–May 9 (11).

- + This current run marks the fourth time this season the Rays have gone on a home winning streak of at least 6 games (10, 8, 6, 6).
- + Since June 11, the Rays are 31-8 (.795) at home, best home winning pct. in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (25-9, .735)...four of these 8 losses came over a 5-game stretch from Aug 3-8 vs. CWS/BAL...through June 10, the Rays were 12-16 at home.
- + The Rays have 43 wins at home, their most since 2013 (51)...they have clinched a winning record at home for a second consecutive season after going .500 or worse in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion eight times this season, tied for most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit four walk-off home runs, tied for most in the AL.
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 45 games at home: 34 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

SEEKING SWEEP—Today the Rays have a chance to clinch their third sweep in the last six series (Aug 20-23 vs. KC, Aug 24-26 vs. BOS)...the Rays have swept 10 series this season—one 4-game series, seven 3-game series and two 2-game series...the 10 sweeps are their most since a club-record 12 sweeps in 2013, and are 4th-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (14), Astros (12) and Yankees (12)...note the Astros (at Boston) and Yankees (at Seattle) are both in position to finish sweeps today as well...furthermore, the club's eight sweeps in series of 3+ games are 3rd-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (12) and Astros (9 entering today).

- + Eight of the 10 sweeps at come at home...the eight at home is tied with 2008 for the most in a single season in franchise history...it is twice as many as the previous two seasons combined (4), and two shy of matching their total from the previous four seasons (10).

WHERE WE STAND—The Rays remain 8.0 GB of the A's for the AL's second Wild Card...the Rays entered August only one game over .500 and 9 GB of the Mariners for the second Wild Card, and despite improving to 13 games over they have gained only one game on the Wild Card leader over that span...the Rays have a 0.7 pct. chance of making the postseason according to Baseball Prospectus, a 0.3 pct. chance according to FanGraphs and 0.1 pct. chance per ESPN.com.

- + Through games of June 16, the Rays were 13.5 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card, a season-high deficit to Seattle...they have gained 13 games on them since then, and are a half-game from having no other teams separating them from the Athletics.
- + The Rays have gone 25-23 this season against the five AL teams currently positioned to make the playoffs, incl. 16-6 since June 22.

- + The Rays are on pace for 88 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + With 21 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were 8.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL Wild Card, and they passed them in Game 162.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be 0.5 GB in the NL East, 1.0 GB in the NL West and 3.5 GB in the AL Central.

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—Today the Rays are attempting to sweep the Orioles for the second time this season (April 25-26 at BAL) and for the first time in a series of 3 games (or more) since Sep 29–Oct 1, 2017 at home (3-0)...today is the final game of the season series, which the Rays have clinched for a second consecutive year after losing the previous three...the Rays are 10-8 this season, including 6-2 at home, and they have won four of the last five meetings...the Rays have allowed 34 HR in the season series, their most ever against a single opponent...the Rays are outscoring the Orioles, 50-25, in 8 games at home but were outscored, 84-51, and outthomered, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue.

OFFENSE EN FUEGO—The Rays have scored double-digit runs in consecutive games for the first time since July 19-20, 2016 at COL, and for the first time in back-to-back games, both at home, April 18-19, 2014 vs. NYY...for the record, only once in franchise history have they reached double digits in three consecutive games: Aug 29-31, 2008 vs. BAL.

- + On Fri vs. BAL, the Rays scored 14 runs, including 11 via the home run...in comparison, last night they scored 10 runs without the benefit of a home run—the first time they reached double digits without hitting a homer since July 20, 2016 at COL and the first time at home since July 12, 2014 vs. TOR...they have won 26 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors.
- + In the last 16 games, the Rays are averaging 6.25 runs, including 5 runs or more 11 times and 8 runs or more five times...only once over this stretch have they failed to score at least 3 runs: Aug 31 at CLE (3-0 loss)...they have recorded double-digit hits in consecutive games and in 12 of their last 16 games...the 100 runs are their most over a 16-game span since June 8-24, 2017 (101), and the +46 run differential is their most over 16 games since July 1-20, 2013 (+46).
- + The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .258 avg. and 2nd in the AL with a .330 OBP...both their avg. and on-base pct. has increased 13 points over last season, both the best improvement in the majors.

PITCHING PLANS—Today's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 44th time the Rays will use an opener and 25th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 76 of 141 games (53.9 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.35 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 41-35 with traditional starters and 36-29 otherwise.
- + Stanek will be the first pitcher with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a season since PHI **Hugh Mulcahy** (26 starts, 30 relief apps) in 1937, the first AL pitcher since PHA **Eddie Rommel** (31 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1923 and the first rookie in major league history to do so.

MINOR MATTERS—Last night Triple-A Durham won, 3-2, to clinch a series victory and advance to the Governors' Cup Finals for a second consecutive season...the Bulls will face Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) in the Governors' Cup Finals beginning on Tuesday...Double-A Montgomery won, 10-7, to force a decisive Game 5 tonight, with a trip to the Southern League Championship Series on the line...Class-A Bowling Green won, 6-5, to take a 1-0 lead in the best-of-three Midwest League semifinals.

- + Short-A Hudson Valley lost, 3-0, in the best-of-three New York-Penn League Championship Series, and they host Tri-City today...previously, Rookie-level Princeton lost the Appalachian League Championship Series and the DSL Rays1 won the league title.

LAST OUTING—Yesterday vs. BAL, replaced **Ryan Yarbrough** following a 2-out walk in the 5th inning, allowed a stolen base and got a **Trey Mancini** flyout to end the frame, his only batter faced...last started on Tues at TOR, a scoreless 1st inning despite allowing a leadoff double and 1-out hit by pitch, the first hit batter of his career...faced runners at the corners with 1 out and got out of the jam with an inning-ending strikeout/caught stealing...threw 10 pitches (6 strikes) in the inning.

A NEW LOOK—Has made 24 starts, all since May 26 vs. BAL, four more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...with today's start, he will become the first pitcher with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a season since **PHI Hugh Mulcahy** (26 starts, 30 relief apps) in 1937, the first AL pitcher since **PHA Eddie Rommel** (31 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1923 and the first rookie in major league history to do so.

- + This will be the 44th time the Rays use an opener, all of them since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.60 ERA (34.2-IP, 10-ER) in his 24 starts.
- + Nineteen of his 24 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).
- + Has pitched to a 1.50 ERA (24-IP, 4-ER) in the 1st inning.

RUBBER ARM—Will be starting on 0 days' rest for the fourth time this season...on Mon-Tues at TOR, became the second pitcher in franchise history to start back-to-back days, following **Sergio Romo** on May 19-20 at LAA...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first rookie to start on consecutive days since **STL George Munger** from July 28-29, 1943 vs. PHI.

MAKING THE LEAP—Since the start of June, is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (48-IP, 12-ER) and .189 opp avg. (32-for-169) in 40 apps (22 starts) to lower his ERA from 4.66.

- + Ranks among AL rookies in apps (49, 6th) and starts (24, 1st)...min. 50 IP, is 2nd among AL rookies with a .186 opp avg. and 3rd with a 10.77 SO/9 IP ratio.
- + Has only allowed 1 XBH in 87 PA against lefties this season (double).
- + His 0.92 ERA (29.1-IP, 3-ER) at home is 3rd-best in the majors (min. 20 IP).

BRINGING THE HEAT—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

- + Last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Fastball in the organization for a second consecutive season.

vs. BALTIMORE—Has pitched to a 6.75 ERA (8-IP, 6-ER) in 6 apps (3 starts) against the Orioles this season and a 1.99 ERA (49.2-IP, 11-ER) against all other opponents...has allowed 6 HR this season and five have come against the Orioles—and twice they went back-to-back off him...the other was a 2-run homer by **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA, his fourth app of the season.

WATCH YOUR BACK—On Mon at LAD, **NYM Jacob deGrom** tied a single-season major league record, allowing 3 runs or fewer in a 25th consecutive start...Stanek has allowed 3 runs or fewer in all 24 of his starts, tied for the 3rd-longest single-season streak in major league history.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—His 11.68 SO/9 IP ratio as a starter is 2nd-highest for a rookie in a season (min. 20 starts) to **CHC Kerry Wood** (12.58) in 1998.

- + Has made 7 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).
- + From June 7-July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing **LAD Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), **LAD Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and **LAD Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).
- + According to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—Is winless in all 24 starts, passing **Jason Hammel** (17) in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history...his 24 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)—no other pitcher has made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 10 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing **PIT Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
