## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (78-79) vs COLORADO ROCKIES (87-70) Wednesday, September 26, 2018 – 8:40 p.m. EDT – Coors Field – Game 158 – Road 80 RHP Nick Pivetta (7-13, 4.58 ERA) vs RHP German Marquez (13-10, 3.91 ERA)

- LAST NIGHT'S RECAP:** The Phillies fell to the Colorado Rockies, 10-3, at Coors Field in Denver ... Starter Vince Velasquez (L, 9-12) went 3.2 innings and allowed 6 runs on 8 hits with 2 walks and 2 strikeouts ... Scott Kingery went 2-for-4 with two doubles as Odubel Herrera and Roman Quinn also had two-hit games.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** Philadelphia's 561 walks are its most in a season since 2009, when the club had 589 ... **Carlos Santana** (107), **Cesar Hernandez** (92) and **Rhys Hoskins** (84) are just the third trio of Phillies with 80 or more walks in one season in franchise history and the first to do so since 2006 (Bobby Abreu – 91, Pat Burrell – 98, Ryan Howard – 108) ... The only time Philadelphia had four players with 80 or more walks in a season was in 1993 when the quartet of Darren Daulton (117), Lenny Dykstra (129), Dave Hollins (85) and John Kruk (111) did so ... **The Phils are the only team in MLB that has multiple players with 80 or more walks in 2018, let alone three** ... Among all ML teams, the club ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in pitches per plate appearance (4.00, best: LAD, 4.03) and 4<sup>th</sup> in walk rate (9.4%) & walks.
- YOUTH GROUP:** The Phillies began the season with the youngest roster in MLB ... With under a week remaining in the season, the Phillies have collected 957.2 innings from pitchers aged 26 or younger, the second-highest total of any team in the majors (most: PIT, 1078.2 IP) ... Of note, per FanGraphs, Philadelphia has totaled 16.4 WAR from hurlers 26 or younger this season which leads the majors (next: COL, 12.1) ... Further, every Phillies pitcher, not named Jake Arrieta, who has made a start this season has been 26 or younger ... Philadelphia's 127 games started by pitchers 26 or younger lead the majors (next: STL, 119 GS) ... Offensively, Philly's 3,805 plate appearances by players 26 or younger rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors to only the Cubs (3,879) and their 125 home runs are most (next: TEX, 124 HR).
- NOTHING BUT RHYS-PECT:** Wednesday night, **Rhys Hoskins** connected on his 50<sup>th</sup> career home run in his 192<sup>nd</sup> major league game ... In doing so, Hoskins became the seventh-fastest player in the history of Major League Baseball to reach his 50<sup>th</sup> home run, trailing only Ryan Howard (182 G), Aaron Judge (174 G), Ryan Braun (171 G), Gary Sanchez (161 G), Mark McGwire (161 G) and Rudy York (153 G) ... Since he burst onto the scene August 10, 2017, Hoskins' 51 home runs rank 4<sup>th</sup> in MLB, trailing only NYY's Giancarlo Stanton (56 HR), OAK's Chris Davis (58 HR) and BOS' J.D. Martinez (64 HR) for the major league lead in that stretch.
- COLD HARD FACTS:** Since the start of the 2008 season, the Phillies are 44-27 (.620) in 71 games against the Rockies which is their 2<sup>nd</sup>-best win percentage against a club they have played 15 or more times in that span (best: SD, 47-26, .644 win %) ... Currently with a 2-3 record in the season series, the Phils need to win the next two games to avoid only their third losing season against the Rockies dating back to 2008 (2015: 2-5 and 2017: 2-5) ... That said, the Phillies have not won a series at Coors Field since July 13-15, 2012 (2-1) ... Philadelphia has gone 0-3-2 in their last five series at Coors dating back to the 2013 season.
- ROAD WOES:** At 31-48 on the road this year, Philadelphia has assured themselves a sub-.500 record away from home, their sixth-consecutive losing season away from CBP (2013-current) ... From 2004-2012, Philadelphia finished above .500 away from South Philly in each of those nine seasons, posting a combined record of 398-328 with a .548 winning percentage that was the best in the majors (next: LAA, .543) ... However, since that run, the Phillies have gone 184-300 on the road with a .380 winning percentage that ranks 30<sup>th</sup> out of all 30 MLB teams ... Finally, despite their struggles on the road this season, the Phillies are 47-31 at home, 16 games above the .500 mark ... **Per Elias, you have to go all the way back to 1955 to find the last time the Phils finished a season at least 15 games above .500 at home and 15 games under .500 on the road (46-31 at home, 31-46 on the road)**
- WHAT IF TOLD YOU...:** Last night, **Vince Velasquez** made his 30<sup>th</sup> start of the season, joining **Jake Arrieta** (30 GS), **Aaron Nola** (31 GS) and **Nick Pivetta** (31 GS) in the 30-start club for the Phillies in 2018 ... This marks only the sixth time in franchise history that has occurred (others: 2008, 2003, 1987, 1982 & 1968) ... In 2008, Cole Hamels and Jamie Moyer each started 33 games and Kyle Kendrick and Brett Myers both started 30.
- MR. NO DAYS OFF:** The Phils are in the midst of 17 consecutive games without an off day to finish their season ... This marks the longest stretch this year for the club without an off day ... Per Elias, this is the first time the Phillies have finished a season with at least 17 straight games and no days off since the year 2000 when they also finished with 17 straight from 9/15-10/1.
- CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH:** Prior to last Tuesday night's game, the Phillies reinstated LHP Aaron Lough off the 10-day DL ... The Phillies are currently the only team in Major League Baseball without a player on the DL ... As it stands now, this would be the first time since at least 1994, or as far as Phillies internal records go back, that the Phils finished a season with nobody on the DL.
- DALLAS GREEN AWARD:** International Coordinator **Jesús "Chalao" Méndez** has been selected as the 2018 recipient of the Dallas Green Award, the club announced today ... Méndez, a native of Caracas, Venezuela, is in his second year as the international coordinator, and his 22<sup>nd</sup> as a member of the Phillies' international scouting department ... He was hired by the club in 1997 as the Venezuela scouting supervisor, a title he held until his promotion to Latin American crosschecker in 2010 ... He was named to his current position in 2017 ... Notables players he has been instrumental in signing include **Cesar Hernandez, Freddy Galvis, Carlos Carrasco** and **Carlos Tocci**, among others ... "This really is an honor for me to receive this award," Méndez said. "I never could have imagined it. We have so many people that work so hard for this organization, and for me to be the recipient of the Dallas Green Award is incredibly special to myself and my family."

**LAST START:** 9/21 at ATL: ND, 5.0 IP, 4 H, R, ER, BB, 4 SO ... Pivetta vs Teheran ... Philadelphia had a 4-1 lead heading into the home half of the 7th inning when Atlanta rallied for 5 runs ... Seranthony Dominguez (1.0 IP), Edubray Ramos (0.1 IP) and Hector Neris (1.0 IP) all made scoreless appearances in relief of Pivetta.

**TONIGHT'S START:**

- **September Wake Up:** Has posted a 3.93 ERA (8 ER, 18.1 IP) in his 4 starts this month, holding opponents to a .209 AVG (14-67) ... However, he has received only 2 total runs of support in those 18.1 IP (0.98 RSA)
- **Young Guns:** With 185 strikeouts, Pivetta and teammate Aaron Nola (216 SO) are just the second pair of Phillies pitchers age 25 or younger to each total at least 180 strikeouts in a season ... **The only other instance was in 1886, when both Charlie Ferguson (212) and Dan Casey (193) accomplished the feat at age 23 ...** Including Pivetta and Nola, there have only been 14 instances of a Phillies pitcher recording at least 185 strikeouts in his age-25 season (age on June 30), and only 3 other times since 1913 (Brett Myers in 2005-06, Cole Hamels in 2008)
- **Striking: Averaging 10.45 SO/9.0 IP (185 SO, 159.1 IP), Pivetta is on pace to have the 2<sup>nd</sup>-highest SO/9.0 IP every by a Phillies qualifying pitcher (highest: Schilling, 11.29 in 1999) ...** He is 4<sup>th</sup> in the NL (10<sup>th</sup> in MLB) in SO/9.0 IP, and in SO rate (27.5), and is 8<sup>th</sup> in the league in strikeouts overall with 185 ... His 27.5% strikeout rate would be fourth among Phillies pitchers ever in a season ... **No Phillie has finished top 4 in the NL in SO/9.0IP since 2011 (Cliff Lee, 4<sup>th</sup>, 9.21) ...** Pivetta has recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each full month of the season ... Became 1 of 3 Phillies starters since 1998 to reach 100 strikeouts before 85.0 IP in a season
- **vs NL West:** 3-7. 6.20 ERA (37 ER, 53.2 IP) in 11 starts

**ROAD:**

- **2018:** 3-5, 4.90 ERA (37 ER, 68.0 IP) in 14 starts
- **Career:** 7-12, 5.78 ERA (88 ER, 137.0 IP) in 28 starts

**2018 SEASON:**

- Was the first Canadian-born Phillie to pitch in his home country since Phillie to do so since Paul Quantrill started for PHI in Montreal on 7/15/95
- Became the first Phillies starter to start at a neutral site (Bowman Field in Williamsport for Little League Classic) since Jack Sanford on 9/3/57 at BRO at Roosevelt Stadium in Jersey City
- Made his first ML relief appearance, 7/1 vs WSH (W, 1.0 IP)
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters on 6/18 vs STL
- Had a streak of 16 straight starts allowing 6 or fewer hits, 9/18/17-6/7/18, becoming 1 of 4 Phillies since 1908 to do so
- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Became 3<sup>rd</sup> PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game on 5/16 at BAL (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

**2017 SEASON:**

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts

**CAREER:**

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
