TONIGHT'S FREEBIE—When gates open prior to tonight's game, all fans will receive a **Carl Crawford** Bobblehead, presented by DEX Imaging, while supplies last.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost consecutive games, both by 2-1 scores, following a modest 2-game winning streak...the Rays have lost 10 of their last 12 games following a come-from-behind, 6-4 win on Opening Day vs. BOS...at 3-10, the Rays hold the worst record in the AL and 2nd-worst in the majors, ahead of the 2-11 Reds...the 3-10 record is the worst 13-game start in franchise history...today the Rays continue a 3-team, 9-game homestand against the Phillies (0-1), Rangers and Twins.

- + The Rays have lost four consecutive home games, dating back to March 30 vs. BOS...all four of these losses have been by 1 run.
- + Yesterday's game vs. PHI was the seventh time the Rays held a lead and lost, most in the majors, ahead of the Royals (6)...the Rays have held a lead in 10 of their 13 games so far (76.9 pct.)...three times they have led in the 8th inning or later and gone on to lose.
- + From the time gates open today until first pitch, Hall of Famer **Steve Carlton** will sign autographs at Gate 1 to benefit the Ted Williams Museum Scholarship Fund...for a \$30 donation, fans can get an autograph and take a photo with the Phillies four-time NL Cy Young Award winner.

DOES NOT COMPUTE—The Rays are 2-6 (.250) when scoring first, tied with the Reds (1-3) for the lowest winning pct. in the majors when doing so...last season, the Rays went 52-30 (.634) when scoring first.

- + Yesterday vs. PHI, the Rays dropped to 0-6 when yielding 3 runs or fewer and 0-4 when yielding 2 runs or fewer, and remain the only winless team in the majors when doing either...in comparison, the other 29 teams are a combined 139-37 (.790) when allowing 3 runs or fewer and 111-23 (.828) when allowing 2 runs or fewer...last season, the Rays were 53-16 (.768) and 40-6 (.870), respectively.

RAYS vs. PHILLIES—This is the first series between the clubs since July 20-22, 2015 at PHI and first at home since June 23-25, 2009...the Rays are 15-10 all-time against the Phillies (6-4 at home)...in total, they have won six of the eight regular season series between the clubs...the Rays also played the Phillies in their only World Series app, losing 4-1 in 2008.

- + Only three uniformed personnel from when the Rays played the Phillies in the 2008 World Series remain with the club in some capacity...**Rocco Baldelli**, who homered in the decisive Game 5 loss, is now the major league field coordinator...assistant pitching coach

Brian Anderson is now the TV color analyst on FOX Sports Sun... bullpen catcher **Scott Cursi** is now part of the clubhouse staff.

COMMON BOND—Five former Rays players have gone on to manage major league teams and three of those were hired this past offseason... among them are Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** (played for Rays in 2005) and Phillies skipper **Gabe Kapler** (2009-10)...the others are former White Sox/Marlins Manager **Ozzie Guillén** (2000), Mets skipper Mickey Callaway (1999, 2001) and Nationals Manager **Dave Martinez** (1998-2000).

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE—Tonight is the Rays second of 20 interleague games this season...they went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-11 in 2010)...they are 110-81 (.576) since 2008—5th-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (.646), Rangers (.600), Yankees (.595) and Angels (.579)—and 184-185 all-time...the NL is 8-7 in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

CLOSE SHAVES—Nine of the Rays 13 games this season have been decided by 1-run margins (2-7)...the 9 one-run games are the most in the majors, ahead of the Indians (7), while the 7 one-run losses are easily the most in the majors...next are the Indians (4) and Dodgers (4).

- + Since 2016, the Rays are 36-58 (.383) in 1-run games, worst winning pct. in the majors over that span.

MARQUEE MATCHUP—In tonight's game, **Chris Archer** will be facing 2015 NL Cy Young Award winner **Jake Arrieta**, who will make his second start with the Phillies...in his last start, Archer (1,066) passed **David Price** for 2nd place on the club's all-time strikeout leaderboard behind **James Shields** (1,250)...he is 3-3 with a 3.22 ERA (81-IP, 29-ER) in 13 career starts against former Cy Young winners, most recently a no-decision last July 27 at Yankee Stadium against **CC Sabathia**.

SEEKING LENGTH—Only twice this season has a Rays starter gone 6 IP or more...the Rays and Athletics are tied for the fewest number of starts of 6 IP, while the Rays are one of six teams without a start of at least 7 IP... last season, Rays starters went at least 6 IP in 88 of 162 games (54.3 pct.), tied for the 3rd-highest rate in the AL...there's been one "quality start" (6 IP or more, 3 ER or fewer) by the Rays this season, fewest in the majors.

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY—Tomorrow is the annual league-wide celebration of **Jackie Robinson**...the Rays will commemorate the 71st anniversary of Robinson breaking baseball's color barrier in 1947 with on-field ceremonies prior to tomorrow's game...see separate press release for more information...for the 10th consecutive year, Major League Baseball and the Rays will celebrate Jackie Robinson Day with all players and on-field personnel wearing Robinson's iconic uniform "No. 42" on their jerseys.

AUTOGRAPH SUNDAY—Tomorrow from 12:00-12:30 p.m. down the right field line, all fans in attendance will have a chance to receive autographs from former Negro League players **Dennis Biddle** and **James Cobbin**...they will be joined by Rays right-handed pitcher **Chris Archer** and first base coach **Ozzie Timmons**.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On April 14, 1999, **José Canseco** hits the 400th HR of his career, coming off **Kelvin Escobar** in the 3rd inning of a Rays 7-6, 11-inning loss in Toronto.

LAST START—On Mon at CWS, wore short sleeves with a first-pitch temperature of 35°F and recorded his first win of the season...allowed 4 runs (3 earned), including a 2-run homer to **Nick Delmonico** in the 5th inning and RBI double to **Omar Narváez** in the 6th (unearned)...his strikeout of **Tyler Saladino** in the 6th inn. was the 1,066th SO of his career, passing **David Price** (1.065) for 2nd in club history...replaced with a 5-4 lead and 2-on, 2-out in the 6th and **Chaz Roe** induced a force out to end the inning...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 102 pit, 68 str.

MARQUEE MATCHUP—Will be facing 2015 NL Cy Young Award winner **Jake Arrieta**, who will make his second start with the Phillies...is 3-3 with a 3.22 ERA (81-IP, 29-ER) in 13 career starts against former Cy Young winners, most recently a no-decision last July 27 at Yankee Stadium against **CC Sabathia**.

INTERLEAGUE—The Phillies are one of three opposing teams he has never faced, along with the Braves and Reds...has gone 6-8 with a 2.79 ERA (116-IP, 36-ER) in 19 career interleague starts, yielding 3 ER or fewer in 17 of those 19 starts, including 14 in a row...only one pitcher has a longer active streak allowing 3 ER or less in interleague games: LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (18)...no other pitcher in major league history has made at least 10 IL starts with as low an ERA and a losing record in IL play.

FRANCHISE FIRST—With his start on Opening Day vs. BOS, he became the second pitcher in franchise history to make four Opening Day starts (**James Shields**; 2008-10, 2012), and the first to do it in four consecutive seasons...is one of five pitchers to start on Opening Day in each of the last four seasons, along with SEA **Félix Hernández**, LAD **Clayton Kershaw**, CLE **Corey Kluber** and ATL **Julio Teheran**.

MR. DURABLE—Since June 1, 2013—the date he was recalled to the majors for good—he leads the majors with 159 starts...DET/WAS **Max Scherzer** ranks 2nd with 155 starts...made 34 starts last season, tying BAL **Kevin Gausman** for the major league lead and tying the club record (Archer in 2015, **David Price** in 2011, **Scott Kazmir** in 2007)...has made at least 30 starts in four straight seasons, one of two Rays pitchers all-time to do that (also **James Shields**, six, 2007-12)...is the third Rays pitcher with three straight years of 200 IP, joining Shields (six, 2007-12) and Price (three, 2010-12)...is one of five pitchers to throw at least 200 IP in each of the last three seasons, along with **Max Scherzer**, **Jeff Samardzija**, **Chris Sale** and **Corey Kluber**.

KING OF THE K—His 249 SO last season ranked 4th in the majors behind BOS **Chris Sale** (308), WAS **Max Scherzer** (268) and CLE **Corey Kluber** (268), and ranked 2nd in club history, behind his own record of 252 (2015)...led the majors for a third straight year in strikeouts on the slider (179), after recording 152 in 2016 and 179 in 2015...last season he made 9 starts with at least 10 SO, tying the club record...he has done that 27 times in his career, most in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** (23)...has not allowed a walk in 8 of those 27 career starts, tying Price for most in club history and as many as Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** compiled in his 27-year career.

K'S FOR KIDS—Every strikeout he records will benefit the local nonprofit Starting Right, Now...its mission is to combat youth homelessness through a variety of personal development programs...for every strikeout, Archer, the Rays Baseball Foundation and Crown Automotive Group will each donate \$25...this is the fourth consecutive year Archer has conducted the strikeout campaign...any Rays fan or local business can join the strikeout challenge by making a pledge at raysbaseball.com/archer.

ELIAS SAYS—Went 1-5 with a 7.48 ERA (21.2-IP, 18-ER) over his last 6 starts last year, from Sep 2-30, increasing his season ERA from 3.66 to 4.07...this stretch also dropped him from 9-7 to a season-ending 10-12...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in major league history with three straight losing seasons despite recording at least 200 SO each year...in fact, he has posted at least 225 SO in all three of those seasons...the only other pitcher with multiple seasons of at least 225 SO and a losing record was Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** (1976, 1978, 1987).

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
