THE TWINS: The Twins completed their five-game seven-day roadtrip with a record of 3-2, going 2-1 in Baltimore and 1-1 in Pittsburgh...this afternoon the Twins will begin their ninth season at Target Field with a 10-game, 11-day homestand with three against the Mariners (April 5, 7-8), three against the Astros (April 9-11) and four against the White Sox April 12-15)...they will continue on after that with two "home games" in Puerto Rico against the Indians on April 17th and 18th at Hiram Bithorn Stadium.

TWINS BEAT BUGS: The Twins beat the Pirates last night at PNC Park by a score of 7-3... Jake Odorizzi was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on five hits in 4.1 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 4.2 innings of scoreless relief...the offense recorded nine hits, five going for extra-bases as Miguel Sanó went 3-for-5 with two RBI...first pitch temp was 37 degrees with 21 mph winds and snow flurries.

TWINS AND M'S: The Twins went 3-4 against Seattle last season, going 1-2 at Safeco Field June 6-8 and 2-2 at Target Field June 12-15...they have gone 14-9 in their last 23 games against the Mariners, dating back to July of 2014.

☞ Last season the Twins hit .312 (79-for-253) with 16 doubles, 14 home runs and 43 runs (6.1 runs-per-game) against M's pitching, including a 28-hit performance on June 13 at Target Field, setting a new single-game club record (20-7 win).

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .357 (30-for-56) with seven home runs, a .446 on-base percentage and a 1.268 OPS in 16 career games against the Mariners.

SEATTLE'S BEST: Joe Mauer has reached safely in 16 straight against the Mariners, dating back to 2015...he is hitting .320 (98-for-306) with 25 doubles, nine home runs, 47 RBI, 52 runs scored and a .415 on-base percentage against the M's...his .320 average is third-best in baseball among actives, trailing only Jose Altuve (.324) and Victor Martinez (.320)...his .420 on-base percentage is best among actives.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: Of the Twins 43 hits this season, 22 have gone for extra bases (13 doubles and 9 home runs)...the 22 extra-base hits ranks fifth in the AL and sixth in baseball...since August 1 they lead all of baseball with 235.

CLEAR THE WAY FOR THE BULL DOZER: Brian Dozier is one of four players in baseball with four homers (Blackmon - 4, Harper - 4, Davidson - 4)...since 2013, he leads all second basemen in baseball with 147 home runs...lastly, he needs eight home runs to tie Tom Brunansky (163) for ninth on Twins all-time list; Gary Gaetti is eighth with 201.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2014, Ron Gardenhire earned his 1,000th career managerial victory with a 7-3 win at Cleveland, managing his 1,950th career game...Gardy is second on the Twins all-time list for managerial victories with 1,068, trailing Tom Kelly's 1,140.

LOOK OVER TOWARDS RIGHT FIELD: Info on Target Field's off-season renovations: **BAT & BARREL** - The space formerly known as the "Metropolitan Club" was improved to accommodate any fan, making it open to all fans with a game-day ticket...the most expansive renovation to date includes operable glass windows opening the space to the Target Field experience...additionally, the space features state-of-the-art video elements, Minnesota-based artist murals, and major award history on display...**EXPANDED CONCOURSE AND DRAFT 34** - The Twins unveiled plans for expanding the main concourse at the intersection of Gates 29 and 34...this renovation will expand the concourse by as much as 40 feet creating enhanced ingress and egress for fans...it will also cut down on congestion and provide fans with premium new drink rail standing-room locations...also included in the concourse renovation is a new tap wall known as DRAFT 34, which will feature up to 22 unique beers from across Twins Territory...the new capacity at Target Field is now **38,649** (previously - 38,885).

OPEN THE GATES: The Twins will open their ninth season at Target Field this afternoon vs. Seattle...it marks their third Opening Day of 2018, opening Camden Yards in Baltimore last Thursday and opening PNC Park in Pittsburgh on Monday...the Twins are 31-26 all-time in Home Openers, winning last season 7-1 over Kansas City, snapping a five-season Home Opener losing streak...today marks the fifth time they have opened at home vs. Seattle, last April 6, 2009 at the Metrodome, losing 6-1 (F. Hernandez over Liriano)...they are 2-2 when they open vs. Seattle, their last win coming April 11, 1986 by a score of 5-1 (Blyleven over Milt Wilcox).

LAST START: Was the starter and winner in the season's second game March 31 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 no-hit innings, five walks and six strikeouts...threw 102 pitches and was relieved by Ryan Pressly who allowed a single to Jonathan Schoop with two outs in the eighth inning...he extended his winning streak to seven games, his career-long.

AGAINST THE MARINERS: Gibson is 4-2, 3.49 ERA (49.0 IP, 19 ER) in eight career starts against Seattle...in 2017, 2-0, 5.25 ERA (12.0 IP, 7 ER) against the Mariners in two starts...in last start on June 13, 2017, gave up six runs on 12 hits in 6.0 innings...allowed one run on five hits with four strikeouts at Safeco Field on June 8, 2017...career 2-1, 3.96 ERA (25.0 IP, 11 ER) with 14 strikeouts against Seattle at Target Field...is 2-1, 3.00 (24.0 IP, 8 ER) in four starts at Safeco Field.

GRAND OPENING: Gibson is starting his second career Home Opener, the previous coming on a April 11, 2016 vs. Chicago-AL, opposite Jose Quintana...Gibson was dealt the loss, allowing three runs (1 earned) on six hits in 5.2 innings pitched, with three walks and three strikeouts as the Twins lost by a score of 4-1.

SPRING RECAP: In his eighth spring training with the Twins, finished the spring 1-2, 3.55 ERA (12.2 IP, 5 ER) in four starts (1 unofficial vs. AAA hitter)...in his final start on March 25, he lasted 2.2 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits with two strikeouts.

2017 RECAP:

- Was the Twins third starter to begin the season.
- Optioned to Triple-A after six starts, going 0-4 and allowing 24 earned runs over 26.1 innings on 39 hits.
- In return to Twins, recorded his first win on May 22 against Baltimore.
- Won his final six decisions, allowing 11 runs over 31.2 innings in the six wins, notching the longest win streak of his career.
- Made his 100th career start on April 12 at Detroit...the first pitcher to make 100 starts for the Twins since Francisco Liriano from 2005-11...was the 25th pitcher in Twins history to make 100-plus starts for the club.
- **Began season 5-8, 6.29 (87.1 IP, 61 ER) in first 17 starts, compared to 7-2, 3.57 ERA (70.2 IP, 28 ER) in final 12 starts after July 21...enters tonight with career-high six-game win-streak.**

NO HITS, NO PROBLEM: In Gibson's 2018 debut, Gibson didn't allow a hit in 6.0 innings of work against Baltimore on March 31...his six hitless innings is his longest outing in his career without allowing a hit...Gibson's previous career-low in hits allowed in a game was four, which has happened four times, most recently on July 22, 2016 at Boston.
