AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 5-0 on their nine-game homestand, having won the first two games of a three-game series vs. Boston and sweeping a 3G series vs. Cleveland last weekend...finish with 3G vs. Oakland (Fri.-Sun.)...following this homestand, depart on an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Have won eight straight games, **the Majors' longest active winning streak**...are a season-high 16G over .500.
- ▶ At 26-10 (.722), **have the best record in the Majors**...is the latest in a season they have had at least a share of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/28/12 (tied with Cincinnati and Washington at 60-40)...last had sole possession of the best record this late in a season at the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ Have sole possession of first place in the AL East for the first time since the close of play on 3/30 (2-0 record, +0.5G)...trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 8-9, the Yankees are 17-1).
- ▶ At 26-10, matches the 2003 season (also 26-10) as their best 36G start since starting 27-9 in 1998...is tied for their second-best start over the last 60 seasons since 1959 (also went 26-10 in 2003 and 1994, and 27-9 in 1998).
- ▶ Their +66 run differential is second in MLB (Houston, +82).
- ▶ Are 11-8 vs. the AL East and 15-2 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ This marks their third straight opponent that led an AL division going into the series (Houston, Cleveland, Boston).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their eighth consecutive game on Tuesday, defeating the Red Sox, 9-6, in a game featuring four lead changes...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (5.1IP, 8H, 4ER, 2BB, 3K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision, remaining undefeated in his last four starts...**RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-4, 3R, 1BB) had a run-scoring single in the first and a two-run HR in the eighth...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4) had a two-run double in the third...**LF Brett Gardner** (3-for-5, 3R, 2 doubles, 1 triple) hit a go-ahead two-run triple in the eighth and tied his career high with three extra-base hits (fifth time, first since 5/2/17 vs. Toronto: 1 double, 2HR)...collected his first 3H game of the season...**RHP Jonathan Holder** (0.2IP, 1BB, 1K) faced the last three batters in the eighth and was credited with the win...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 3K) recorded his ninth save in 10 opportunities.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO BEAT THE BEST: Each of the Yankees' wins on their current eight-game winning streak (5/1-present) have come against teams in sole possession or tied for first place at the start of the game...according to *Elias*, it marks the *second-longest winning streak against solely first-place teams (sole possession or tied for first)* by any club in MLB history, trailing only the Cincinnati Reds, who won 10 such games in-a-row from 6/21-7/1/99.

IT AIN'T OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER: The Yankees have won four of their 11 games (36.4%) when trailing after seven innings this season, marking the best such winning percentage in the Majors and tying for the most such wins (Mets are 4-12 in those games)...went 8-59 (11.9%) in such games in 2017.

- ▶ Have 10 come-from-behind victories this season (tied for fifth in MLB) and six wins having gone ahead in their last at-bat (tied for fourth in MLB), five of which have come in their last eight games (since 5/1).

EIGHT ISN'T ENOUGH: The Yankees (with an active eight-game winning streak and a nine-game winning streak from 4/21-29) and Boston are the only teams with multiple winning streaks of at least 8G in 2018 (Boston had streaks of 9G and 8G).

MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING: According to *Elias*, these are the first games in which the Yankees (26-10) and Red Sox (25-11) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since 6/2/02, when the Yankees entered at 37-19 and Boston at 36-16.

FAMILIAR THEME: The Yankees are 17-1 in their last 18G since 4/21, matching their best 18G stretch since going 17-1 from 6/2-18/1953, which was part of a larger 21-1 stretch from 5/27-6/18/1953...matches the best 18-game stretch in MLB this season (Boston went 17-1 from 3/30-4/20).

- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 110-45, and out-homered opponents, 25-13.
- ▶ Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.28 ERA (162.0IP, 120H, 45R/41ER, 45BB, 182K, 13HR) over the span.
- ▶ Yankees starters have a 2.19 ERA (106.2IP, 26ER) during the stretch...have allowed three-or-more runs just four times while permitting 1R-or-fewer in 10-of-18 starts.
- ▶ Yankees batters have averaged 6.11 R/G over the stretch, hitting .250/.331/.454 as a team with 110R, 42 doubles, 2 triples, 25HR and 74BB.

HOME COOKING: The Yankees have set a current Yankee Stadium record by winning 11 consecutive games (since 4/21)...broke the previous mark of nine straight, set from 5/30-6/15/10...have outscored opponents, 78-33, during this streak...is their longest single-season home win streak since taking 12-straight at the original Stadium from 4/25-6/1/85...is tied with Cleveland (8/24-9/14/17) and Los Angeles-NL (6/7-25/17) for the Majors' longest single-season home streak since the Indians won 13 straight from 6/1-7/5/16.

- ▶ Are 16-5 (.762) at home in 2018, the most home wins and best home winning percentage in the Majors.
- ▶ Since 9/2/17, are 29-8 in their last 37 regular season home games (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 11-1-1 in their last 13 home series (since 8/31/17).
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (138), HRs (35), HR per game (1.67), XBHs (81), OBP (.366) and OPS (.849)...are second in runs per game (6.57) and SLG (.484)...have homered in 14 of their last 15G at home.
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in three of their last six home games.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit a two-run double in Wednesday's win vs. Boston and two solo HRs on Tuesday vs. Boston, marking his first back-to-back games with RBI this season...has at least 2RBI in back-to-back games for the first time since 8/20-22/17.

- ▶ Tuesday's 2HR game was his third multi-HR game this season (also 2HR on 5/2 at Houston and 3/29 at Toronto)...is tied for the MLB lead in multi-HR games with Mookie Betts, Matt Davidson and Manny Machado.
- ▶ His 31 career multi-HR games are the second-highest total through 1,022 career games in MLB history, behind Ralph Kiner (35).
- ▶ The Yankees' nine individual multi-HR games in 2018 through Tuesday tied for the second-most in Major League history through a team's first 35 games of a season (San Francisco, 10G in 1958; Seattle, 9G in 1996).
- ▶ Is batting .293 (17-for-58) with 16R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 7BB in his last 16 games (since 4/23).
- ▶ Is batting .526 (10-for-19) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 7RBI and 2HP in five games vs. Boston this season.
- ▶ Has 9XBH (2 doubles, 1 triple and 6HR) in just 30AB against LHP this season.

WALK THIS WAY: INF Neil Walker is 6-for-15 with 8R, 3 doubles, 2RBI, 6BB and 1HP in his last 6G since 5/3 (was 13-for-80 with 5BB in his first 21G as a Yankee)...over this stretch, has raised his season BA 37 points, his OBP 78 points and his slugging average 65 points.

DOUBLE DOWN: Yankees batters have hit at least one double in 30 straight games (since 4/5), marking the franchise's second-longest streak since at least 1908 (34G, 5/12-6/19/1936).

- ▶ Rank third in the Majors with 80 doubles in 36G.

RISP MANAGEMENT: In 12 games vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium since the start of 2017, Yankees pitchers have held Red Sox batters to a .118 BA (9-for-76) with RISP, including 0-for-6 on Wednesday night.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 10, 2015: Michael Pineda strikes out 16 Orioles in seven innings in a Mother's Day matinee at Yankee Stadium, tying David Cone for the Yankees' single-game record for strikeouts by a right-handed pitcher. Pineda also sets a modern AL record for the most strikeouts in a start of seven innings or fewer.

May 10, 1975: In his first start against his former team, Catfish Hunter tosses a two-hit complete-game shutout in a 3-0 Yankees win at Oakland.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 11, 2006: Hideki Matsui fractures his left wrist and is removed from the game in the top of the first inning vs. Boston. According to Rule 10.24 (c), his 1,768 consecutive-games-played streak as a professional (1,250 with the Yomiuri Giants and 518 with the Yankees) comes to an end. His streak as a Yankee is the longest since Lou Gehrig's (2,130).

May 11, 1903: In the fifth inning of the Highlanders' 8-2 victory at Detroit's Bennett Park, first baseman John Ganzel hits the first home run in Yankees franchise history, an inside-the-park solo homer off Tigers pitcher George Mullin.

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 26-10

- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner... Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/7G

- Is tied for fourth in the Majors with 12 doubles...leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (16) and multi-hit games (11) and ranks second in hits (31).
- In last 21 games (since 4/13), is hitting .326 (28-for-86) with 13R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR and 10RBI.
- Was 1-for-4 in Wednesday's win vs. Boston...has 6H in last 23AB...**on homestand** is 4-for-19 with 3R, 1RBI and 1BB in 5GS at 3B...hit "walk-off" RBI single in the ninth and was 2-for-5 with 2R in Friday's win vs. Cleveland...was his first career "walk-off" hit...at 23 years, 63 days old, became the second-youngest Yankee with a "walk-off" hit since 2010 (Clint Frazier, 22y, 305d on 7/8/17 v. Milwaukee)... Gleyber Torres (21 years, 144 days) hit a "walk-off" HR on Sunday.
- Hit solo HR—the first of his Major League career—in the ninth and was 2-for-4 with 1 double in 4/17 loss vs. Miami...was 4-for-4 with 1R, 2 doubles and 1RBI in 4/22 win vs. Toronto, setting a career high in hits...at 23 years, 51 days old, was the youngest Yankee to have at least 4H in a game since Melky Cabrera (21y, 292d) on 5/30/06 at Detroit.
- Had at least one extra-base hit in seven straight games from 4/13-23 (8 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR), collecting multiple XBH in five of those games...was the second-youngest Yankee in franchise history with at least 1XBH in seven straight games (DiMaggio, 7G, 6/4-11/37, ending at age 22y, 198d according to *Elias*)...was one of five players his age (23y, 52d) or younger to have as long a streak over the last 20 seasons (since 1999), joining Cody Bellinger, 7G in 2017; Corey Seager, 7G in 2016; Freddy Freeman, 10G in 2012 and Albert Pujols, 7G in 2001.
- Is in his first stint with the Yankees this season (4/1-present).
- Saw his first Major League action in 2017, hitting .571 (4-for-7) with 2 doubles and 4RBI in 5G with the Yankees...won the 2017 Kevin Lawn Award, presented annually to the organization's minor league "Player of the Year" after leading all Yankees farmhands in BA (.315) and doubles (36), ranking third in RBI (82) and tying for fourth with a career-high 16HR in 125G w/ Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB.
- Is the Yankees' No. 5 prospect (No. 59 in Baseball) according to *Baseball America*.
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

#26 TYLER AUSTIN—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/5G

- Leads AL rookies with 5HR and 16RBI, ranks second with 11XBH and is tied for second with 13R.
- Did not play in Wednesday's win vs. Boston...is hitless in last 15AB...**on homestand** is 0-for-4 with 1R and 1BB in 1GS at DH.
- Was ejected in the top of the seventh inning of 4/11 win at Boston after being hit by pitch (by Kelly) and charging the mound (first career ejection)...served a four-game suspension for the incident from 4/27-30.
- Of his 12 career HR, 10 have tied the game (3) or given the Yankees the lead (7).
- Played in 20G with the Yankees in 2017...spent more than three months on the D.L. (3/30-6/5, fractured left ankle and 6/29-8/11, right hamstring strain).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/4G

- Was 3-for-5 with 3R, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 2RBI in Wednesday's win vs. Boston, tying his career high with 3XBH (fifth time, first since 5/2/17 vs. Toronto: 1 double, 2HR)...was his first 3H game since 9/19/17 vs. Minnesota and his first game with multiple extra-base hits since 9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay (2 doubles)...was his first multi-hit game since 4/16 vs. Miami...has 7H in last 27AB...**on homestand** is 6-for-22 with 4R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5RBI, 2BB, 1SF and 1HP in 5GS in LF.
- Set career highs with 21HR and a .428 slugging pct. in 2017, becoming the fifth Yankee to hit 20HR from the leadoff spot in a single season (seventh time).
- Has seven seasons with at least 20SB (2009-11, '13-15, '17), the third-most 20SB seasons in Yankees history behind Derek Jeter and Hal Chase (eight each).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#18 DIDI GREGORIUS—SS Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/9G

- Is among Major League leaders with 30RBI (5th), .622 slugging pct. (7th), 21XBH (T7th) and 10HR (T7th).
- Was 0-for-4 with 1BB in Wednesday's win vs. Boston...is hitless in last 19AB...**on homestand** is 0-for-16 with 2BB in 4GS at SS.
- Hit game-winning solo HR (#10) in the 10th and was 3-for-5 with 2R and 1 double on 4/27 at Los Angeles-AL...was his first career extra-inning homer.
- Was named the April AL "Player of the Month," his first career monthly award... hit 10HR with 30RBI in April, both marking single-month career highs...were the third-most RBI in April in franchise history (since RBI became official in 1920), trailing only Tino Martinez (34 in 1997) and Alex Rodriguez (34 in 2007)...was the fourth Yankee with at least 10HR in April (Rodriguez-14HR in April 2007, Graig Nettles-11HR in April 1974 and Aaron Judge-10HR in April 2017)...during the month, led the Majors in home runs and RBI, ranked second in slugging pct. (.739) and tied for fifth in runs scored (22).
- Became the first Yankees SS to homer in four straight games from 4/22-25.
