THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

1931 - Tommy Bridges has a brush with baseball immortality when he retired the first 26 Washington Senators to face him, before surrendering a hit to pinch hitter Dave Harris. The Tigers won the game, 13-0.

1986 - After Detroit wins the opener, 6-5, game two starts off with the Tigers first two hitters - Lou Whitaker and Alan Trammell - hitting homers off Cleveland's Jose Roman. It is the third time in a month this has occurred. Whitaker adds a second home run as Detroit wins the nightcap, 11-9.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 2-1 loss to the Athletics on Saturday night at Oakland Coliseum. Jordan Zimmermann turned in a quality start for Detroit, but took the loss after allowing two runs on six hits with three walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings. Offensively, Jeimer Candelario had a pair of hits and drove in a run, while Jim Adduci, Mike Gerber, John Hicks, José Iglesias and Victor Martinez each had one hit. The Tigers and Athletics conclude their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the six-game road trip continues with a three-game set at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8).

FOR STARTERS: Jordan Zimmermann turned in a quality start last night, allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 6.1 innings. Since the All-Star break, Tigers starters have compiled a 3.07 ERA (67.1IP/23ER), which is the third-lowest ERA in the Majors in that stretch, trailing only Boston (1.65 ERA) and Houston (2.81 ERA).

TIGERS TIDBITS: Drew VerHagen threw 1.2 scoreless innings, striking out four in last night's game. In eight appearances since coming off the disabled list, VerHagen has posted a 1.56 ERA (17.1IP/3ER) with a 0.63 WHIP and .164 (10x61) opponents batting average...José Iglesias doubled in the second inning of last night's game and has now doubled in five of his last six games.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 35th one-run game of the season last night, falling to 17-18 in those contests with a 2-1. Detroit's 35 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 45 and Seattle, 41). In addition to the 35 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 22 games that have been decided by two runs.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 54th day game of the season (out of 112 games, 48.2%). Detroit has posted a 26-27 (.491) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 21-37 (.362) at night. The Tigers have lost 12 of their last 18 day games.

V-MART GETS ALL A'S VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez has posted impressive numbers in his career against the Athletics. Entering today's game, Martinez is hitting .347 (111x320) with 27 runs scored, 23 doubles, seven home runs and 37 RBI in 86 career games vs. Oakland. Martinez leads all active players with a .347 batting average, while he is third with a .402 on-base percentage and ninth with a .484 slugging percentage. In 41 career games at the Oakland Coliseum, Martinez has a .344 (54x157) batting average with eight runs scored, 10 doubles, two home runs and 16 RBI.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-2 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (0-2) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8). Detroit is 18-37 on the road this season and has lost 17 of its last 22 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .230 (436x1895) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.64 ERA (469.1IP/242ER).

TIGERS AND A'S: Detroit is 0-6 against the Athletics this season after dropping the first two games of this weekend's series. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost 11 straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's longest losing streak against the franchise.

WEST SIDE STORY: Detroit is 10-17 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have

not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 32 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-79, .373).

ON DECK: The Tigers continue their six-game road trip tomorrow as the begin a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL). Detroit is 3-1 against the Angels this season after winning three-of-four games at Comerica Park from May 28-31. The Tigers have not won a series at Angel Stadium since 2009, going 0-6-2 in that stretch. Since 2010, Detroit is 7-21 against the Angels in Anaheim.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 47-64 (.423) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,115-1,103 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks tied for 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 18th appearance overall and 17th start of the season this afternoon in the series finale at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano pitched out of the bullpen on Sunday vs. Cleveland, throwing 2.0 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, one walk and one strikeout. Liriano's last start came on July 23 at Kansas City, when he gave up three runs, one earned, on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts in 4.2 innings.

VS. OAKLAND: Liriano has faced the Athletics 20 times in his career, including 16 as a starter, compiling a 6-4 record with a 4.28 ERA (88.1IP/42ER) and 99 strikeouts. He faced Oakland four times last season, including two starts, and went 1-0 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2IP/6ER) and 11 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Liriano has made 173 career appearances, including 148 starts, on the road, posting a 52-61 record with one save, a 4.47 ERA (836.2IP/416ER) and 830 strikeouts. In 11 road starts this season, Liriano has a 1-4 record with a 4.08 ERA (57.1IP/26ER) and 42 strikeouts.

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Liriano is making his 10th career outing and ninth career start at Oakland Coliseum tonight. In nine previous appearances at the venue, Liriano has a 2-2 record with a 5.57 ERA (42.0IP/26ER) and 41 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Liriano has made 69 career appearances, including 53 starts, against teams from the American League West and has a 20-18 record with one save, a 4.38 ERA (308.1IP/150ER) and 285 strikeouts. In three starts vs. AL West teams this season, Liriano has a 0-0 record with a 2.40 ERA (15.0IP/4ER) and 11 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST: Liriano has made 56 appearances, including 46 starts, in his career during the month of August, posting a 19-12 record with a 4.14 ERA (267.2IP/123ER) and 247 strikeouts. Liriano made 10 relief outings last season and went 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (8.2IP/6ER) and four strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT LIRIANO'S JULY: Liriano appeared in five games, including four as a starter, in July and went 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (18.0IP/12ER) and 18 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded batters to a .217 (309x1424) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .248 (1226x4935). In 17 appearances, including 16 starts, this season, lefties are hitting .113 (7x62), which is the second-lowest batting average against lefthanded hitters among American League pitchers (min. 50 at-bats). Righthanded batters are hitting .265 (66x249) against Liriano.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL: Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters today's game with 1,712 strikeouts in his Major League career, which is the sixth most among Dominican-born pitchers. He is eight strikeouts away from tying Ubaldo Jimenez for fifth.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).
