**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers won the rubber game of their three-game series against the White Sox, 10-2, on Wednesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field. Jeimer Candelario had three hits, including a leadoff home run, while Jim Adduci and Nicholas Castellanos also added three hits and a RBI in the victory. JaCoby Jones, Mikie Mahtook and Ronny Rodriguez all contributed a home run. Jordan Zimmermann started for the Tigers and improved his record to 7-6, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts. The Tigers begin a six-game homestand tonight as they open a three-game Interleague series vs. St. Louis. Following the weekend series vs. the Cardinals, the homestand continues with three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Tigers made the following roster moves on Thursday:

- \* Claimed OF Dustin Peterson off waivers from Atlanta and optioned him to Triple A Toledo.
- \* To create room for Peterson on the 40-man roster, C John Hicks was transferred to the 60-day disabled list.
- \* Released LHP Josh Smoker.
- \* The Tigers 40-man roster is now at 39.

**THE DEUCE IS LOOSE:** Jim Adduci posted his third three-hit game of the season on Wednesday, going 3x5 with a double and a RBI. Dating back to August 1, Adduci is hitting .341/.363/.489 with eight runs scored, six doubles, two triples, one home run and 11 RBI in 25 games.

**NICK THE STICK:** Nicholas Castellanos went 3x4 with a run scored, a RBI and a walk in Wednesday's game to notch his 17th three-hit game of the year. Castellanos' 17 three-hit performances are tied with Cincinnati's Scooter Gennett for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Seattle's Jean Segura (19). Castellanos enters tonight's game ranked tied for fourth in the American League with 47 multi-hit games, while he is fifth with 158 hits, tied for sixth with 37 doubles and eighth with 263 total bases.

**MAH-TOOK HIM DEEP:** Mikie Mahtook belted his seventh home run of the season on Wednesday, a solo shot in the fourth inning off Michael Kopech. After not homering in his first 33 games (122 PA) this season, Mahtook has hit seven home runs in his last 18 games (71 PA). Mahtook has recorded at least one hit in 10 of his last 12 games, and is hitting .341/.426/.707 with 10 runs scored, five home runs and eight RBI during that stretch.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** Tonight's game marks the 36th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 17-18 (.486) against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .263/.317/.408 as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank second in the American League with a .263 batting average vs. lefties. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .400 (52x130) batting average vs. lefties, while he is fifth with a .451 on-base percentage and eighth with a .615 slugging percentage vs. southpaws.

**RECAPPING THE ROAD TRIP:** The Tigers went 4-5 on their recently completed nine-game road trip, going 0-2 at Kansas City, 2-2 at New York (AL) and 2-1 at Chicago (AL). As a team, Detroit hit .282/.325/.500 during the trip, while the pitching staff posted a 4.74 ERA (76.0IP/40ER). Individually, Jim Adduci hit .375/.375/.542 with two doubles, one triple and four RBI over the nine games, while Dawel Lugo batted .345/.345/.448 with three doubles and three RBI. Niko Goodrum hit .333/.412/.633 with three home runs and four RBI on the road trip.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers tonight begin a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (September 7-9) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12). Beginning with tonight's game, Detroit will play 13 of its next 16 games at home. The Tigers are 34-34 at Comerica Park this season, where they are hitting .253/.310/.398 as a team, and the pitching staff has posted a 4.09 ERA (623.0IP/283ER).

**TIGERS AND CARDINALS:** The Tigers and Cardinals begin a three-game series tonight. Detroit has a 21-11 advantage in the all-time series vs. St. Louis, including a 12-3 edge at Comerica Park. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Tigers won two-of-three games at Busch Stadium.

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** The Tigers are 4-10 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 210-187 (.529) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 139-101 (.579) in IL play, which ranks third among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (164-79, .675) and New York (AL) (144-102, .585).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 57-83 (.407) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,125-1,122 (.501) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is four victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS UPDATE:** Single A West Michigan defeated Great Lakes, 2-1, on Thursday night to sweep the best-of-three series and advance to the Midwest League's Eastern Division Finals. The Whitecaps will face Bowling Green in the best-of-three series, which begins on Saturday night in Grand Rapids. Triple A Toledo has split the first two games of its best-of-five series vs. Durham, winning the opener on Wednesday night, 10-3, and losing Game 2, 6-5, last night. The series resumes tonight with Game 3 in Durham.

**ABOUT DANIEL:** Norris will make his seventh appearance and his fourth start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. St. Louis.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Norris returned from the disabled list on Saturday at New York (AL) and took the loss, allowing two runs on one hit with one walk and seven strikeouts in 4.1 innings. Norris retired the first 12 batters he faced and carried a no-hitter until one out in the fifth when Miguel Andújar hit a two-run home run.

**VS. ST. LOUIS:** Norris is making his first career appearance against the Cardinals tonight.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Norris has pitched in 21 career games, including 19 as a starter, at Comerica Park, and is 3-9 with a 5.42 ERA (99.2IP/60ER) and 96 strikeouts. His only start at home this season was on April 20 vs. Kansas City, when he gave up one run on three hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.2 innings.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Norris has made seven appearances, including five starts, in his career during Interleague play, posting a 2-2 record with a 5.61 ERA (25.2IP/16ER) and 28 strikeouts. His only outing against a National League opponent this season came on April 25 at Pittsburgh, when he threw 2.0 innings in relief, allowing one run on two hits with one walk and two strikeouts.

**RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:** Norris has pitched in 20 games, including 12 starts, in his career during the month of September, compiling a 3-2 record with a 3.72 ERA (67.2IP/28ER) and 64 strikeouts. In six outings, including two starts, in September last season, Norris went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (16.2IP/10ER) and seven strikeouts.

**COMING OFF THE DL:** Norris was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list prior to Saturday's game at New York (AL) after being sidelined since April 30 with a left groin strain. He made four injury rehab appearances and had a 0-0 record with a 2.31 ERA (11.2IP/3ER) and 17 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Lefties are batting .250 (64x256) against Norris in his career, while righties are hitting .273 (206x754). In six appearances, including five starts, this season, lefthanders are hitting .261 (6x23), while righties are batting .204 (11x54).

**STREAKS SNAPPED:** Norris had a pair of streaks snapped in his loss at Tampa Bay on April 20, 2017. He allowed four earned runs in his start, ending his streak of allowing three earned runs-or-less at 21 consecutive starts, which was the longest active streak in the Majors. The loss was Norris' first loss in 17 road starts to begin his career. His streak of 16 road starts without a loss to start his career is tied with Todd Wellemeier and Larry Jensen for the second longest streak since 1913.

**HELPING HIS OWN CAUSE:** Making his first professional plate appearance, Norris hit a two-run home run in the second inning on August 19, 2015 at Chicago (NL) to record his first Major League hit, home run and RBI. Norris became the first Tiger pitcher to homer in a game since Jason Johnson on June 8, 2005 at Los Angeles (NL). He also became the first American League pitcher to hit a home run at Wrigley Field.

**EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN:** Norris earned the first victory of his Major League career on April 9, 2015 at New York (AL). Norris pitched 5.2 innings against the Yankees and allowed three runs on six hits with two walks and five strikeouts.

**MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT:** Norris made his Major League debut on September 5, 2014 at Boston and struck out David Ortiz, the only batter he faced in the game.

**BACK TO THE FUTURES:** Norris was selected to the U.S. Team for the 2014 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Target Field in Minneapolis. In the game, Norris pitched a scoreless inning with one strikeout.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Norris was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Matthew Boyd and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015, in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Norris was selected by the Blue Jays in the second round of the 2011 MLB Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Boyd earned his ninth win of the season on Sunday at New York (AL), tossing 6.0 innings and allowing three runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts.

**VS. ST. LOUIS/AT COMERICA PARK:** Boyd will be making his first career start against the Cardinals tomorrow night. Boyd has pitched in 40 games, including 38 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, posting a 13-11 record with a 3.80 ERA (218.0IP/92ER) and 167 strikeouts. In 12 home starts this season, Boyd is 6-3 with a 2.56 ERA (70.1IP/20ER) and 57 strikeouts. Boyd ranks third in the AL with a .256 home ERA.

**AMONG THE AL LEADERS:** Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .224 (127x568) opponents batting average, while he is 10th with a 1.13 WHIP.
