#### AND THAT'S A WRAP:

The Blue Jays completed the 2016 campaign with a 89-73 (.549) record, finishing T-2<sup>nd</sup> in the AL East (4.0 GB of BOS)...Won the top wild-card position & will host the Orioles at Rogers Centre on Tuesday, Oct. 4...Toronto will be playing in it's 7<sup>th</sup> post-season in franchise history (1985, 1989, 1991, 1992, 1993, 2015 & 2016)...It represents just the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in club history to earn a post-season birth in consecutive seasons (last: 1991-1993)...Their .549 win % ranked T-7th highest in club history

#### **ON THE HOMEFRONT:**

- Finished the season with a 46-35 (.568) record at Rogers Centre...It represented their  $3^{\text{rd}}$  straight winning season at home  $\tilde{\&}$  have done so in 11 of their last 12 seasons dating back to 2005...Josh Donaldson led the club & ranked T-4th in the AL with 21-HR at home...Only he & David Ortiz finished the season with an OPS of more than 1.000 points at home (Ortiz-1.108 & Donaldson-1.004)...Among AL pitchers at home, J.A. Happ ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in wins (11) & 3<sup>rd</sup> in ERA (2.90)...Marco Estrada ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in opp. AVG (.213) & Marcus Stroman was 3<sup>rd</sup> in HR/9 (0.69).
- Drew 3,392,099 in attendance for an average of 41,878 which represented the most in the AL & 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Majors (LAD 45,720 & STL 42,525)...It was the 7<sup>th</sup> highest AVG attendance in club history & most since 1994 (49,287)...The 3,392,099 total attendance ranked as their 5th largest in franchise history, most since 1993 (4,057,947)...Recorded 39 sellout crowds this season.

- Finished the year with a 43-38 (.531) record on the road...It was T-8<sup>th</sup> highest win % in club history, best mark since 2003 (.556, 45-36) which was the last time TOR had posted a winning record away from home...The .531 win % ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the AL (BOS-.568) & T-5<sup>th</sup> in the ML (STL-.593)...Hit 114-HR on the road, T-2<sup>nd</sup> most in club history (116 in 1999 & 114 in 1987) & ranked 1-2<sup>nd</sup> in the AL (BAL-122).
- The pitching staff posted a 3.47 ERA on the road which represented the best mark in all of baseball (CHC rank 2<sup>nd</sup> at 3.60)...Is the 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest mark in franchise history (3.07 in 1981 & 3.16 in 1991)...It marked the 2<sup>nd</sup> time TOR led the Majors in lowest ERA on the road (last: 3.07 in 1981) - 3rd time to lead the AL (3.89 in 2008 & 3.16 in 1991)...Aaron Sanchez ranked 3rd in the AL with a 2.48 ERA on the road (Tanaka-2.34 & Hamels-2.40)...Lowest ERA by any TOR player on the road since Roy Halladay in 2005 (2.09).

#### **HOW WE STACKED UP:**

Scored 4.69 runs/game which ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in the AL & had a run differential of +93 – 3<sup>rd</sup> highest in the AL (5<sup>th</sup> in ML)...Finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the AL with 221-HR (BAL-253, SEA-223), 4<sup>th</sup> most in club history (257 in 2010, 244 in 2000, 232 in 2015)...Led the AL & ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Majors with 632-BB (CHC-656) & represented the most in franchise history (previous: 588-BB in 1993).

- STARTING STRONG:

  ◆ Toronto's starting staff led the AL in ERA (3.64), Opp. Avg. (.236), Opp. OPS (.688), WHIP (1.22), H/9 (8.03), HR/9 (1.08), QS (100)...The 100-QS are a franchise high (previous: 93 in 1998)...The 3.64 ERA is 3<sup>rd</sup> highest in club history (3.32 in 1985 & 3.49 in 1991)...TOR was the **only AL team this year with a** starters ERA under 4.00 – next closest team is CLE at 4.08.
- Became 1st team in ML history to lead the league in starters' innings pitched without the aid of a complete game...1st time TOR did not have a single CG in a season (previous lowest: 3-CG in 2014).
- TOR starters held the opp. to 3-ER or less in 24 of their last 29 games of the season...Moreover, held the opp. to 1-ER or less in 12 of their last 17G (1.61 ERA, .200 AVG, 4-HR/106.0 IP).

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The last pitcher to lead his league in ERA at Sanchez's age or younger (24 years, 93 days at the end of the 2016) is Clayton Kershaw (23 years, 193 days at the end 2011)...The last AL pitcher was Roger Clemens (24 years, 62 days old at the end of the 1986).

#### WINNING WAYS:

J.A. Happ was one of just three pitchers to finish the year with 20 wins (Rick Porcello-22, Max Scherzer-20)...Happ became the 6<sup>th</sup> different 20-game winnier in club history (8<sup>th</sup> time) – joining Roy Halladay (2x), Roger Clemens (2x), Jack Morris, Pat Hentgen & David Wells to accomplish that feat...It marked the 2<sup>nd</sup> time that a LHP has recorded 20 wins in a season (David Wells-20 in 2000).

#### YARD WORK:

- Edwin Encarnacion ranked T-3<sup>rd</sup> in the ML with 42-HR & T-2<sup>nd</sup> in RBI with 127 (Arenado-133)...His 127 RBI are a career-high & 5th most in club history & most since Carlos Delgado had a club-high 145 in 2003...His 42-HR matches his career best (2<sup>nd</sup> time, last 2012) & are T-6<sup>th</sup> highest in a season in team history...In fact, the last time a Jay hit that many HR was Edwin in 2012...Became 3<sup>rd</sup> player in club history with multiple 40+HR seasons (Delgado-3x, Bautista-3x).
- Is only  $3^{rd}$  player in club history to record 4 seasons of 35+HR/100+RBI ( $4^{th}$  time) joining Delgado (5x) & Bautista (4x)... $3^{rd}$  player in team history to record at least 42-HR/127-RBI in same season – 4th time (Delgado-2x in '99 & '03 & George Bell in '87).
- Only Chris Davis (197) has hit more HR than Encarnacion (193) since the 2012 season.

- Had 47-XBH out of 98 total hits (48.0 XBH %) this season...38 of those XBH have come vs. RHP (78 total hits vs. RHP)...Seven of his last 12 hits had gone for extra bases (4-HR/3-2B).
- Despite missing 42G due to injury, ranked T-6th in the AL with 87-BB...73 of those BB have come vs. RHP (4th in AL).
- Reached base safely in each of his last 21 road games.
- of his 22 HR this season, 16 have put the Jays ahead...Furthermore, each of his last 6-HR have either tied or given TOR a lead

#### JOSH DONALDSON, #20

- Among the AL ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in BB (109), OBP (.404), 3<sup>rd</sup> in WAR (7.6), 4<sup>th</sup> in OPS (.953), 5<sup>th</sup> in SLG (.549)...Became 5<sup>th</sup> different player in club history with 100+BB in a season (Bautista-4x, Delgado-4x, McGriff-1x, Olerud-1x).
- Is the only 3B in club history to record multiple 30-HR seasons...44 of his 78 HR with TOR have either tied the game or given the club the lead...That represents the most by any player in the Majors over that period.
- Is the first player with back-to-back 120+ run seasons since Hanley Ramirez in 2007-2008.
- 9/27 vs. BAL hit his 37<sup>th</sup> HR of the year...Became the 6th player in Blue Jays history with consecutive seasons of at least 300 total bases, joining Carlos Delgado (4, 1998-2001), Jose Bautista (2, 2010-11), Shawn Green (2, 1998-99), Joe Carter (2, 1991-92) & George Bell (2, 1986-87).
- Became the only third baseman in club history to record multiple 30+HR seasons.
- Recorded 94-BB as a third baseman which set a club record, previous mark was held by Troy Glaus (80-BB in 2006).
- On Sept. 20 at SEA hit his 1st HR since Aug. 29 at BAL span of 17 games.
- Went 3-for-3 with 2-BB on Sept. 15 at LAA, snapping a 0-for-23 hitless streak (2nd longest of career)...It marked the 7th time this year to have reached base at last five times in a game.
- On Sept. 4 at TB had his career high 12G hit streak snapped (.378, 17-45)...Struck out only four times in his 55 PA during that streak...Marked his 3rd hit streak of 10+ games this season.

- Became the 6th player in AL history to score 80 runs & hit 20-HR prior to the All-Star break (Lou Gehrig-1936, Ted Williams-1946, Reggie Jackson-1969, Frank Thomas-1994 & Alex Rodriguez-2000)

#### **EDWIN ENCARNACION, #10**

- Ranked T-2<sup>nd</sup> in ML with 127-RBI (Arenado 1<sup>st</sup> − 133) & T-3<sup>rd</sup> with 42-HR (Trumbo-47)...His 127 RBI are a career-high & 5<sup>th</sup> most in club history & the most since Carlos Delgado had a franchise high 145 in 2003...His 42-HR matches his career best (2<sup>nd</sup> time, last 2012) & are T-6<sup>th</sup> highest in a season in team history...In fact, the last time a Jay hit that many HR was Edwin in 2012.#
- 76 of his career high 158 hits this season have gone for XBH (34-2B, 42-HR)...Vs. LHP has 15 XBH out of 28 total hits (53.6%).
- 9/20 at SEA hit his 42<sup>nd</sup> HR of the season matching his career high (2012).
- Became the 3<sup>rd</sup> player in club history with multiple 40+HR seasons (Delgado-3x, Bautista-3x).
- ♦ Is only 3<sup>rd</sup> player in club history to record 4 seasons of 35+HR/100+RBI (4<sup>th</sup> time) joining Delgado (5x) & Bautista (4x)...6<sup>th</sup> player in team history to record 40-HR/120-RBI in same season (Delgado-3x, Bautista-1x, Bell-1x, Green-1x, Donaldson-1x).
- Is only player in the Majors with 30-HR/100-RBI in four of the last five seasons.
- Hit a walk-off infield single on Sept. 25 vs. NYY to win the game for TOR in the 9th inning.
- On Sept. 11 vs. BOS hit his 25th career multi HR game (22nd with TOR) & 4th this year...His 14 multi-HR contests over the last three seasons are the most in the ML.
- Hit his 35th HR of the season on Aug. 20 at CLE, becoming the 14 different player in club history to have had a 35+HR/100+RBI season...Became just the 3rd Blue Jay to record four or more of those seasons (Delgado-5, Bautista-4).
- Became the first player in the Majors to reach 100-RBI this season...His four seasons of 35+HR/100+RBI ranks T-3rd most among all active players in MLB (Albert Pujols-8, David Ortiz-6, Encarnacion-4, Jose Bautista-4, Miguel Cabrera-4, Ryan Howard-4 & Mark Teixeira-4).
- Became the 7th quickest Jay to 100-RBI (118G) & fastest since Carlos Delgado reached that mark in a club record 102G in 2003 (Joe Carter 104G in '94, George Bell 112G in '87, Delgado 114G in '00, Delgado 115G in '99 & Shawn Green 116G in '99).
- Hit his 300th career home run on Aug. 12 vs. HOU a solo shot off Will Harris in the 9th inning...Became the 12th active player in the Majors with that many HR & is the 11th different Dominican-born player to reach the 300-HR plateau.
- Hit his 30th HR of the season on Aug. 4 at HOU...It represented his 5th straight season of 30+HR which stands as the 2nd most in club history (Carlos Delgado-8).
- Moved past Vernon Wells into sole possession of 3rd place on the all-time club home run list with his 224th on July 24 vs. SEA (off Wade Miley).

- His 80 RBI prior to the break led the Majors and were the most he has recorded in a first half (54-RBI in 2015).

- innings since Fred Norman threw 221.1 in 1977 for the Cincinnati Reds.
- Lost his final five decisions over six starts despite quality starts in five of the six...Club had been shutout in three of five and scored just two runs while he was in the game over his last five starts.
- Ranked 1st in MLB for groundball percentage (60.1%)...In fact, hitters have a groundball percent of 64.7 on the first pitch of at-bats this year - the highest mark among starting pitchers in baseball.
- Since July 1 (16 starts) posted a 3.42 ERA (39ER/102.2 IP), allowing one earned run or less six times and two earned runs or fewer in nine of those outings...Had a BB/9 of 2.02 over his last 16 starts (since July 1), issuing more than two walks only twice...Prior to the beginning of July had a 5.33 ERA (60ER/101.1 IP) over his first 16 starts of the year.
- Since the All-Star break limited hitters to a .200 average with RISP...Issued only four walks to the 87 batters faced with RISP...Comparitvely, in the first half of the season with runners in scoring position allowed a .340 opposition average, while issuing 16 walks, T-4th most in majors.
- Sept. 24 vs. NYY, tossed seven scorless innings allowing just one hit, was the second time in his career to go 7.0 innings while allowing only one hit (July 24, 2014 vs. BOS).
- August 1 at HOU struckout a career-high 13, allowing just 1ER on three hits...Did not factor in the decision as the club would lose 2-1 in 14-innings... Marked the first 10+ strikeout game of his career...Was one of four games to allow three hits or less in 2016.
- Won nine straight decisions from Sep 20, 2014 (10 straight including postseason) to May 1, 2016...Was the longest streak by a Blue Jay since Roy Halladay won a franchise-record-tying (Clemens-2003) 15 straight decisions from May 1–July 27, 2003.
- lacktriangle May 1 at TB had a career-high nine strikeouts, most ever by a Blue Jays pitcher on their birthday.
- Matched his season-high with 8.0 IP July 20 at ARI (5th time, last: July 6 vs. KC)...Had a groundball percent of 79.2 (19/24) in the outing...Did not issue a walk when tossing at least 8.0 IP for the 2nd time in his career (last: Sept. 8, 2014 vs. CHC).
- In the season opener at TB on Apr. 5 (W, 8.0, 6H, 3ER, BB, 5K) came within three outs of joining Jack Morris in 1992 as the only TOR starters with a CG on Opening Day...At 8.0 IP, tied Pat Hentgen in 1997 for the 2nd longest start by a Jay on Opening Day...At 24 years, 338 days is the youngest starter to go at least 8.0IP on Opening Day since Felix Hernandez in 2009 (22 years, 363 days) & the youngest to pitch into the 9th frame since Mark Mulder in 2002 (24 years, 239 days).

#### **FOR OPENERS:**

- Became the 3rd youngest pitcher (24.338) to make an Opening Day start for TOR...Drew Hutchison (24.227) was the youngest in 2015 with Todd Stottlemyre (24.324) being 2nd youngest in 1990... At 5'8", he was the shortest Opening Day starting pitcher since 1971 – Tom Phoebus, San Diego (also 5'8").
- Became just the 2nd pitcher in Blue Jays history to start a Season Opener and a Home Opener in the same season vs. BOS on April 8 (Jimmy Key 1989)...In that start had a 7-2 lead heading into the 6th inning before loading the bases with one out...Reliever Jesse Chavez came on and allowed a grand slam to Brock Holt, leading to an eventual 8-7 loss.

#### **POST SEASON:**

Started three games last season, two in ALDS and one in the ALCS...Picked up the win in Game Three of the ALCS vs. KC...Allowed just 5ER over 13IP in his two starts vs. TEX in the ALDS.
