HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 10-1 at home on Tuesday in 2018.
- ♦ Arizona and Chicago split a 4-game set @ Wrigley Field from July 23-26.
- ♦ 20 of the D-backs' last 28 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 12 times; 2 runs - 5 times; 3 runs - 3 times.
- ♦ The D-backs' 3.71 ERA ranks third in the NL behind the Dodgers (3.44) and Cubs (3.63).
- ♦ **Matt Andriese** is making his fifth start of the season and first since July 4 @ Marlins...previous 4 starts were as an "opener" for the Rays.
- ♦ **Brad Ziegler** owns a 9-game scoreless streak (8.0 IP).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs opened their final homestand with a 5-1 loss vs. Cubs.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** allowed 3 runs and struck out 7 in 6.0 innings.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** hit a solo home run in the ninth inning.

DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 11 games remaining (8 home/3 away) and their opponents' combined .520 winning pct. is the same as the Rockies (.520) and higher than the Dodgers (.483) [source: ESPN.com].
 - 9 games vs. NL West foes: 3 vs. Rockies (@ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
- ♦ Starting on Sept. 6, the D-backs next 17 games were against teams currently in first place: ATL, COL, HOU, CHC and COL, with 12 of those games now complete...per Elias Sports Bureau, if each team leads their respective divisions at the time of those games, the 17-game streak vs. first-place teams would be a Major League record...the current record is 14 by the 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers.

- ♦ The D-backs are 10-1 at home on Tuesday.

PITCHING IN

- ♦ Tonight marks the 11th different starting pitcher the D-backs have used this season, tied for the fourth most in club history and 1 more than both 2016 and 2017.
- ♦ Overall, Arizona's 30 pitchers used this season are a club record, 1 more than the previous record of 29 in 2016.

- ♦ Arizona has recorded an extra-base hit in 52 consecutive games, its longest streak within a single season since a 79-game stretch from April 20-July 14, 2013.

- ♦ Goldschmidt's .709 slugging pct. and 1.184 OPS are also second all-time (min. 150 PA) to only Mark McGwire (.832/1.285).

GOLDSCHMIDT HITTING .300

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached the .300 plateau twice recently after being at .198 on May 22...in 101 games since May 23, he is batting .344 (134-for-390)/.436 OBP/.641 SLG/1.077 OPS with 26 doubles, 28 homers, 70 RBI and 61 walks.
- ♦ Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau, Goldschmidt is the first player in the liveball era (since 1920) to increase their batting average to .300 or higher in a season in which it was under .200 at some point after at least 200 plate appearances.

ANDRIESE AT A GLANCE

- ♦ Andriese is in his first season in the D-backs' organization after being acquired from the Rays on July 25 for Brian Shaffer and Michael Perez.
- ♦ In parts of 4 seasons with the Rays, was 19-22 with a 4.30 ERA, 293 strikeouts and 89 walks in 99 games (48 starts)...made his MLB debut with the Rays in 2015.
- ♦ Selected by the Padres in the third round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft from the University of California, Riverside...was traded to Tampa Bay on Jan. 22, 2014 with Brad Boxberger, Maxx Tissenbaum and Matt Lollis for Jesse Hahn and Alex Torres.

WHAT TO KNOW

- ♦ Making his first start as a member of the D-backs and his first overall since July 4 @ Marlins as a member of the Rays.
- ♦ Has posted a 3.18 ERA (4 ER in 11.1 IP) and .171 opponent average in 4 starts this season...in 48 career starts, all with the Rays, has gone 14-14 with a 4.49 ERA (117 ER in 234.2 IP).
- ♦ Looking for his first win as a starter since May 25, 2017 vs. Angels, a span of 11-starts.

LAST APPEARANCE

- ♦ Allowed 7 runs on 8 hits in 1.1 innings on Sept. 10 @ Rockies.

LAST START

- ♦ Did not factor into the decision on July 4 @ Marlins as a member of the Rays, throwing 2.0 shut-out frames, allowing 1 hit with 2 strikeouts.

VS. CUBS

- ♦ First career appearance vs. Cubs.

REDEFINING RELIEF

- ♦ Has thrown 2.0+ innings in relief 20 times, the sixth most in baseball, behind Ryan Yarbrough/TB (23), Seth Lugo/NYM (22), Josh Hader/MIL (22), Brian Flynn/KC (21) and Jesse Chavez/CHC (21)...thrown 3.0+ 5 times, tied for 11th most.
- ♦ Has 12 relief outings of 40+ pitches, the third most in the Majors behind Yarbrough (19) and Hector Santiago/CHW (13).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ♦ Last name pronounced: "ann-DREESE"
- ♦ He and his brother, David, teamed with Red Sox pitcher Joe Kelly and Cubs pitcher Jesse Chavez to win Troy Percival's celebrity golf tournament last offseason... the event raised money for UC-Riverside's baseball program, where Matt, David and Joe all played collegiately.
- ♦ His brother David played parts of 2 seasons as a first baseman in the Pirates system...they were teammates at East Valley (Calif.) High School and at UC-Riverside.
- ♦ Is close friends with Cubs pitcher Tyler Chatwood, one of his high school teammates, and they golf together often...in college, Matt recorded a hole-in-one on a par-3, 200-yard hole.
- ♦ Selected by Texas in the 37th round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign.

A BENEFIT TO BEING "AN OPENER"

- ♦ Has allowed 3 hits or fewer in each of his last 4 starts since April 29 @ Red Sox...being used as an "opener" (a relief pitcher who starts) with the Rays, he has also thrown 3.1 innings or fewer in each of his 4 starts this year.
- ♦ 3 of his 4 starts this year have come on 3 days rest, pitching to a 1.08 ERA (1 ER in 8.1 IP) and .138 opponent average.

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ Left-handers are hitting .218 (27-for-124)/.279 OBP/.363 SLG against him this season...prior to his last outing on Sept. 10 @ Rockies (6-for-6), lefties had been hitting .178 (21-for-118)/.246 OBP/.305 SLG.

FIRST TIME THRU

- ♦ Opponents are hitting .238 (60-for-252) the first time through the order, as well as .239 (34-for-142) in his first inning of work.

2017 RECAP

- ♦ Started the season in the Rays starting rotation.
- ♦ Had 2 stints on the DL, sidelining him for 76 games (May 10-June 10 with right groin strain; June 10-Aug. 28 stress reaction in right hip).
- ♦ Yielded 16 HR in 86.0 IP...his 1.67 HR/9.0 IP would have been sixth-highest in the majors if he qualified.

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 4th in SV (32), 7th in SO/9.0 IP (12.34), 9th in SV PCT. (82.1).
- ♦ Is the eighth D-back to record 30 saves (fourth different pitcher in last 5 years).
- ♦ Is 32-for-39 in save chances with a .218 opponent average and 50 strikeouts.
- ♦ Right-handed hitters are batting .180 (11-for-61) over his last 33 games since June 6.

#61 ♦ SILVINO BRACHO ♦ R/R 5-10 ♦ 190 ♦ 26 (July 17, 1992) **Homestand: 0 ER/1.0 IP, K**

- ♦ 8 of his last 11 appearances have been scoreless (4.50 ERA; 4 ER in 8.0 IP).
- ♦ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1 (in ninth stint with D-backs in 2018).
- ♦ Is holding righties to a .196 average (10-for-51).

#25 ♦ ARCHIE BRADLEY ♦ R/R 6-4 ♦ 225 ♦ 26 (Aug. 10, 1992) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 1st in HLD (33), 5th in G (71).
- ♦ His 71 appearances are a career high (previous high was 63 in 2017).
- ♦ Needs 2 holds to tie Brandon Lyon's club record (35 in 2007).
- ♦ Lefties have 2 hit in last 16 at-bats (.125) and are hitting .130 (9-for-69) since May 23.

#40 ♦ ANDREW CHAFIN ♦ R/L 6-2 ♦ 225 ♦ 28 (June 17, 1990) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** T-2nd in G (73).
- ♦ Needs 1 game to tie Randy Choate (74 in 2004) for the most by a D-backs lefty.
- ♦ Has a 80-game homerless streak, the longest active streak in the Majors and the second longest streak in team history (95 by Brad Ziegler from 2011-12).

#48 ♦ RANDALL DELGADO ♦ R/R 6-4 ♦ 230 ♦ 28 (Feb. 9, 1990) **Homestand: 2 ER/0.2 IP**

- ♦ Selected on Sept. 15 from Triple-A Reno...was 0-1 with a 2.00 ERA (4 ER in 18.0 IP) in 13 appearances (1 start) for Reno.
- ♦ Designated for assignment by Arizona on July 25, released on July 31, and signed a Minor League contract on Aug. 18.

#41 ♦ JAKE DIEKMAN ♦ L/L (DEEK-man) 6-4 ♦ 205 ♦ 31 (Jan. 21, 1987) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ Had 14 straight scoreless road outings (10.2 IP) from July 5-Sept. 11...37 of his last 39 road outings since Sept. 12, 2016 have been scoreless (1.14 ERA; 4 ER in 31.2 IP).
- ♦ Acquired on July 31 from the Rangers for RHP Wei-Chieh Huang and a PTBN.

#66 ♦ YOSHIHISA HIRANO ♦ R/R 6-2 ♦ 195 ♦ 34 (March 8, 1984) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 2nd in HLD (32), 4th in G (72), 8th in ERA (2.12).
- ♦ Leads all rookie relievers with a 2.12 ERA, ahead of Lou Trivino/OAK (2.14).
- ♦ Has not allowed an earned run in 19 of his last 21 games (1.56 ERA; 3 ER in 17.1 IP).
- ♦ Earned his first Major League save on Sept. 11 @ Rockies.

#55 ♦ MATT KOCH ♦ R/R 6-3 ♦ 215 ♦ 27 (Nov. 2, 1990) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1...was 2-4 with a 5.96 ERA in 11 starts with the Aces this season.
- ♦ Limited left-handers to a .200 average (27-for-135), 13th among NL pitchers (min. 125 BF).

#50 ♦ YOAN LÓPEZ ♦ R/R 6-3 ♦ 185 ♦ 25 (Jan. 2, 1993) **Homestand: 0 ER/1.1 IP, 2 K**

- ♦ Made MLB debut on Sept. 9 vs. Braves...selected from Double-A Jackson on Sept. 3.
- ♦ Was 2-6 with a 2.92 ERA and a .174 opponent average in 45 games for the Generals.
- ♦ Pitched for the World Team at the MLB All-Star Futures Game in 2018.

#30 ♦ T.J. McFARLAND ♦ L/L 6-3 ♦ 220 ♦ 29 (June 8, 1989) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 1st in ground balls (153), 3rd in ground-ball pct. (68.3), T-8th in IP (72.0), 4th in ERA (2.00).
- ♦ Owns a 1.42 ERA (5 ER in 31.2 IP) in his last 25 games.
- ♦ Leads the Majors since June 5 (min. 10.0 IP) in ground-ball pct. (78.6).
- ♦ In June, earned his Bachelor of Science in Business Management as well as a certificate in Financial Planning from the University of Phoenix after 11 years of school.

#54 ♦ JIMMIE SHERFY ♦ R/R 6-0 ♦ 180 ♦ 26 (Dec. 27, 1991) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1...in 38 games with Reno in 2018, was 5-1 with 15 saves, a 1.60 ERA, .190 opponent average and 58 strikeouts (11.6 SO/9.0 IP).
- ♦ Did not allow a run in his first 14 career games, tied for the fourth-longest streak to start a D-backs career (also: Clay Zavada, May 21-June 20, 2009).

#29 ♦ BRAD ZIEGLER ♦ R/R 6-4 ♦ 230 ♦ 38 (Oct. 10, 1979) **Homestand: -**

- ♦ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 1st in G (76), 1st in ground-ball pct. (71.8), 2nd in ground balls (150).
- ♦ Has an 9-game scoreless streak (8.0 IP), including 7 holds, and owns a 1.10 ERA (2 ER in 16.1 IP) in his last 22 games.
- ♦ Became the first D-backs pitcher to ride the OnTrac Bullpen Cart on Aug. 2 vs. Giants.
- ♦ Acquired from the Marlins on July 31 for RHP Tommy Eveld.
- ♦ Played with Arizona from 2011-16, going 21-11 with 62 saves, 65 holds and a 2.49 ERA.
